CHEYENNE FRONTIER DAYS

JULY 21-30, 2017 • CHEYENNE, WYOMING

CHEYENNE, Wyo. - A hometown victory by claiming the Daddy of 'em All is how saddle bronc rider Brody Cress is continuing his winning streak.

Cress, 21, grew up just down the road from the Cheyenne Frontier Days rodeo, so the grandstands were packed with his family, friends, and thousands of rodeo fans from the Cowboy State.

"This rodeo is hard, and it has so much history, and it's my hometown; so, it's one I wanted more than anything," Cress said. "I love riding in front of my family and friends, and it's awesome to do good for them."

His hot streak for just the month of July alone has added up to more than many saddle bronc riders win all year. Cress kicked off his winning streak during Cowboy Christmas and is showing no signs of slowing down as he's collected weekly paychecks totaling:

- * \$3,418 at Greeley, Colo., on July 3
- * \$4,367 at Belle Fourche, S.D., on July 4
- * \$2,487 at Estes Park, Colo., on July 10
- * \$3,341 in Casper, Wyo., on July 15
- * \$6,930 in Salinas, Calif. on July 23

Cress followed all of that up by raking in a grand total of \$14,241 by going

for 256 points on three head at Cheyenne Frontier Days. A month ago, Cress was sitting at 40th in the WEATHER GUARD® PRCA World Standings, and he was at 17th prior to winning Cheyenne. Now, he's moved up to 14th in the July 31 standings with \$57,766.

Cress gained steam as Cheyenne Frontier Days progressed - he tied for fourth in the first round with an 83.5-point ride, then placed second in the second round with an 84 before nailing the win in the



final round with an 88.5-point ride on Sankey Pro Rodeo & Robinson Bulls' Black Box. "I didn't know it was going to happen - I tried not to get too pressured up or nervous and just have fun," Cress said.

Cress has now burst the bubble and broken into the Top 15, but the race is on for the final two months of the 2017 season, and every cowboy is hitting the rodeo road hard.

"I have a lot of rodeoing left, and it's close through the Top 30, so anything can happen," Cress said. "I've won checks

every weekend, but I've dang sure got to keep it up and keep going."

Although he's excited for his win, Cress isn't letting his most-recent triumph alter his plans. "It's awesome to win it, but I've got to keep it up - there's a lot of winning that has to happen to make the Finals - but, it keeps my confidence up," Cress said. "I love getting on bucking horses and need to keep my head level."

Cress hit the road immediately after Cheyenne to compete at the Wind River PRCA Roundup Rodeo in Riverton, Wyo. From there, he's heading to Iowa's Championship Rodeo in Sidney and the Dodge City (Kan.) Roundup Rodeo.

"There's a lot of good rodeos coming up and a lot of good horses, so it'll be a lot of fun," Cress said.

Other winners at the \$835,283 rodeo were all-around cowboy Trevor Brazile (\$13,949 in team roping, steer roping and tie-down roping), bareback rider Tim O'Connell (254 points on three head), steer wrestler Baylor Roche (26.1 seconds on three head), team ropers Erich Rogers and Cory Petska, and Brandon Webb and Kollin VonAhn (28.4 seconds on three head each), tie-down roper Lane Livingston (38.0 seconds on three head), barrel racer Stevi Hillman (52.44 seconds on three runs), steer roper Brady Garten (51.6 seconds on three head) and bull rider Clayton Foltyn (255.5 points on three head).

PRESENT ON THE USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN

It was billed as a Father/Child trip to tour the USS Abraham Lincoln, at it's then homeport in Everett, Washington. This aircraft carrier is a virtual floating city that displays American knowhow and preparedness for, well, nearly anything.

The Lincoln is a NIMITZ class nuclear power Aircraft Carrier needing 3,200 crew and another 2,480 for the Air Wing to be fully staffed. Nearly 1100 ft. long, and with two reactors, four engines, five blades on each propeller, it can travel over 30 mph. It easily carries 85 airplanes and helicopters and is the pride of the US Navy. Full-blown awesomeness!

The excited fathers and children loaded in vans and drove 50 miles south to the Naval Air Station. Something odd happened as we clamored into the vans. The kids and dads segregated. Dads were up front, of course.


On arriving, we got our orders from the tour guide and our group reunited.

Once on board, it happened again. War stories began to be the chatter between the men. They would arrive at a certain place on the ship before the kids, talking among themselves and hardly noticing who they were "spending the day" with. The younger ones would call, "Hey Dad, look at this!", but the Dads were too far ahead and caught in their own conversations.

Doing my best to hang with my 14 year old son, the other Dads would call occasionally wanting me to notice something. I felt the pull to leave my son, to stop being the odd one out, and hang with the other dads.

Well, eventually the younger ones quit asking for their father's attention. They just gave up.

The day was billed as a Father/Child day to build memories, give a common

bonding experience, and offer conversational "soup starters" for the future. It turned out to be a Dads' tour of the ship with the kids following behind. Not much bonding happened. The trip north to home was segregated just like the trip going south had been.

Point at hand: One can be present, but not present. The Dads were certainly there. But, in so many, and more important ways, they were not. Their bodies were on a Father/Child trip, but their minds were on a buddy's day out.

I wonder if they reported later how involved they were with their children that Saturday? I wonder if they were aware their son or daughter disconnected and gave up hope of enjoying this huge thing with Dad? They wanted to be with their fathers on this tour, but the fathers did not, or could not, find a way to stay connected with them. Being with the kids on most of the tour, I could feel their incremental heartbreaks happen and watch cynicism begin to throw down anchors in

them. Even children start to see hope as a liar after a while.

What can we learn? First: When we say we are doing an event, as much as possible, be sure to deliver on what was promised. Children certainly hear our words, but they feel our words way more than they intellectually process them. All they know is, "Dad is doing what I hoped he would, or he's not." If I say I am going to spend the day with my child, then I had better not spend the day on my phone, in front of the TV, or focused on my buddies.

Secondly: Learn to be present in mind. This has to do with engaging what is going on right now. At the moment. Be present on the ship for sure, and also be present at dinnertime and the moments when we get home from work. If we are with our child, be with them. Be present and present.

Thirdly: Understand our own hearts so we can understand our children's. We must be tough enough to face our heart, find words for the feelings and learn to speak its language. Recalling what our hearts longed for as children, remembering the occasional ache, and processing that into compassion first, and then words, will go a long way toward being able to be present.

They long to connect just like we did.

I don't know about the other children, but that 14 year old who generously shared that day with me, is now an officer in the USMC. Lt. Kyle Eaton may have caught a little vision that day. I like to think his Dad was present. 🙏

MISS RODEO OKLAHOMA TAYLOR SPEARS

A dream came true and history was made when Taylor Spears from Cleveland, Oklahoma, won the 2018 Miss Rodeo Oklahoma title this past July. “The Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Pageant Council has built me as a person. I started at six years old and here I am at 20, it is just amazing that I could be part of something that is so much bigger than myself.” The council offers four titles at the annual pageant: Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Sweetheart, Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Princess, Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Teen and Miss Rodeo Oklahoma. Taylor is the only one to capture all four titles. “When I was six I told everyone that I wanted to be Miss Rodeo America, but every little girl says that. In a matter of 18 months I will be competing for that title. It is crazy when you can put a timeline on a goal like that.” After winning the sweetheart title, it took Taylor four years to become the princess in 2010. “It took me awhile to understand the concepts of a pageant and how hard I had to work for it.” After winning the teen title, she decided it was time to get in the arena for a different type of competition. “I had always wanted to take a break and just rodeo while being a rodeo queen. I ran poles, barrels, tied goats and tried my hand at working cow horse.” Only a month after being crowned Miss Oklahoma High School Rodeo in 2013, she competed for the national title. “I went into it with an open mind and thought there was no way I was ever going to win; it was way bigger than me. Sure enough, the Lord blessed me with the 2014-2015 National High School Rodeo Association Queen title.” A life-changing experience of travel and rodeo led up to her freshman year at Oklahoma State University. Taylor is now setting her sights for her upcoming reign as Miss Rodeo Oklahoma starting in January.

“My job is to promote the sport of rodeo, if that means I have to arrive a week early to a rodeo appearance to talk to schools, radio and TV stations, then so be it. I am 100% dedicated to doing everything I can to help build the sport of rodeo and get people as excited about it as they are about the NFL.” Bullying in middle

and high school led to Taylor's pageant platform and life mantra: Shine Your Light. “Going into any pageant I have the mindset that I would rather lose and get dead last by being myself completely than win by changing myself. Through this title I am striving to show people that is better to be open and real no matter what.” Miss Rodeo USA 2007, Candice Carper, has had the biggest influence and impact on Taylor growing up and competing in pageants. “The first year I competed and did not win the princess title, she stepped up and helped me through it. She is one person that I truly admire, she has always inspired me and been there for me.”

Beyond Miss Rodeo America, Taylor aspires to be a national news broadcaster. Currently, she works for Hodge Productions, a company working with RFDTV and the NLBRA. “I am the on-air personality for the NLBRA week-long finals. I get to interview all the amazing people involved with the organization, from competitors to sponsors and board members.” This past June marked her second year holding the microphone in front of the

camera. An agricultural communications junior with a minor in agricultural leadership, Taylor plans to be a full-time student in the fall but take online classes during her year-long reign as queen. As a freshman she joined the Alpha Chi Omega sorority, allowing her to pursue her passion for all things philanthropic. This fall she will be on the OSU football field with Bullet, serving on the Spirit Rider Team. “I love school so I guess I would consider that a hobby but horses and rodeo are my life.” Through her national high school title, Taylor started doing motivational speeches across the nation and continues to do so today in her spare time. She also hosts rodeo queen

clinics. “I like being in front of people and letting them know it is alright for things to go wrong and for life to happen but that it is how you handle that matters.”

The pageant was held in conjunction with the Woodward Elks Rodeo in Woodward, Oklahoma. “It was neat to have the pageant with a rodeo.

Not only did people get to see girls compete well in the pageant events but the committee also got to experience what it would be like if the girls competing held a title.” The kindness of past rodeo queens when Taylor was little pushes her each day to do and be more as a queen. “There is a difference between a queen that can compete well in a pageant and a queen that can make an impact and change lives.” She places her trust and faith in God's plan, whether that be a title or not. “I study up and pray up for each pageant but ultimately it is God's will. This has carried me through my years of pageants and rodeo.” Taylor is excited to be the face of Oklahoma rodeo and carry on the western tradition during her reign. The next six months she will be building a sponsorship program for her year of travel leading up to the 2018 NFR where she will compete for Miss Rodeo America. “I remember so many influential women who took the time to invest in me, to simply say hi to me as a little kid. It was great to have role models to look up to, I just hope that I can be that for younger girls through this title and beyond.”


He was preceded in death by his grandparents, Arthur and Neva Mosher and Lonnie and Ethel Phillips and his father Donald Mosher.

ON THE TRAIL *WITH* **RYLEE JO MARYMAN**

Rylee Jo Maryman spends her summer days roping the dummy and tying goats. Sometimes she goes swimming, but practice comes first. “I practice to increase how I run when I’m at a rodeo. That’s my favorite sport,” said the 9-year-old National Little Britches World All Around Champion Little Wrangler. She also holds the World Champion title in the Pole Bending, and Flag Racing. Her favorite event is pole bending. “I have an awesome horse and he always does what I ask him – I think I’m very athletic in that event and it’s very challenging and I like challenges. It makes me work harder and improve.”

Rylee Jo knows how hard it is to win, and she feels like she’s got the horse to do it. “If I didn’t have Pistol, I don’t think I would have won so much.” Pistol is a 21-year-old gelding. “You can do anything on him – I use him for poles, barrels, and flags.” Pistol used to be her uncle’s team roping horse and won the Purina Super Horse this year. “He is not the fastest, and he’s not a bucking horse, but if I’m having problems in anything, I go back to him to help me fix it.” She also rides Dally. “She’s fast, but not as fast as my new horse, Smurf. Smurf runs really fast and I’m trying to get him back in my hands.”

She has been in the NLBRA for three years. “I didn’t place at all my first year, and then I got a little better last year and I finally won the world this year. It feels good. I competed against a lot of good kids and good horses,” said the St. Francisville, Louisiana, native. She lives ten minutes out of town with her mother, Casey, and father, Joe and their 10 horses, four dogs, 18 goats, five cats, 6 chickens, and cattle.

She spends her summers at her grandmother’s house while her parents work, but as soon as they get home; it’s off to the arena. “It hasn’t been dry enough lately to do anything, but I still rope the dummy and tie goats under the barn.”

Her mom and dad help her the most with her rodeo. “Now we rodeo for her,” said her mom, Casey. “At about 2 ½ we put her on a horse and we turned her loose by herself. She had it – squeezing with her legs and riding on her own. Since then, she’s ridden every day. Her focus 24/7 is the arena. We go every day. We



competed in two different associations last year since it was her last year in Little Wranglers. She went into the finals winning the barrels and poles and in the top four of all the rest – goat tail untying and flag racing.” Casey, who works during the day as an educator in the prison, started rodeoing when she was young. “We didn’t go as hard as she does when we were young.” She roped – team rope and breakaway. Her husband, Joe, who is a biologist for the Wildlife Fisheries in Louisiana, college rodeoed, calf roped and team roped. “We’re going to do whatever we can to give

her what she needs. Right now she has two new horses she's trying to get with."

Rylee Jo has also gone to three of Martha Josey's clinics as well as Stacy Martin with Next Level Goat Tying. "When I first went to the goat tying school I was tying in 18, now I'm tying in 11s," she said. The Josey clinics have helped her figure out the first barrel. "I'm still trying to figure that out. When I pull, I give back. When I do that, my horse runs by. I'm still working on that." What the clinics have done for this young lady is give her confidence to figure out how to fix her problems in the arena. "I can try to figure it out on my own from going to the schools." The other thing she is figuring out is how to manage her own money. She has a bank account and she pays for part of her entry fees.

When she grows up, she wants to rodeo full time. That's what she's doing now – she's rodeoing all weekend and if she's not, she's in the arena at home practicing."

"Keep your dreams and one day they will come true. But you have to work on them or they won't come true."

Her rodeo idol is Mary Burger. "She always tries to do better." 🐾

Back When THEY BUCKED *with* **Kenny Pfeifer**

Kenny Pfeifer is always on the move. In his earlier days, it was on horseback, whether training horses, or riding broncs and bulls in the ICA and RCA. Today, he's entering his 45th year as a business owner, operating Western States Movers, LLC, out of Nampa, Idaho, and staying involved in the rodeo world with his

granddaughter, even helping at several Martha Josey Clinics a year.

Born in 1947 in Caldwell, Idaho, Kenny grew up northwest of there in Parma, Idaho, riding the horses his dad brought home. "We always had horses around, and I did everything on horseback. The first date my wife and I went on was horseback," says Kenny. "I was riding a bunch of horses for people, and I'd ride one to school, tie it up, and ride a different one home. I didn't even own a vehicle until I was a senior in high school. It was seven miles to town, and my dad told me if I wanted to play sports, I'd have to get myself there and home, so I rode horses there. When I was a kid, there weren't any kid rodeos around," he adds. "Leonard Hamilton produced rodeos around the area, and he had an arena we built. We'd go over there all the time. He bought all the horses from the 'Run, Paint, Run' movie, and we had to rope them all to catch them. Some were like a bull – if you were on the ground, they'd come after you." Kenny even started horses on wagons, mowing and hauling hay. "It turned into a lot of wrecks, but we had a lot of fun!"

Kenny's horse training made him the perfect candidate for riding roughstock. He and his dad put bronc saddles on the horses they started and snubbed them up to a post while Kenny climbed on. "It was just in a big dry lot, and it was harder than a pancake," Kenny recalls. "I went to Polson, Montana, in the winter where the snow was deep and the ground was frozen, and I was riding bucking horses in a building. I never broke any bones, but I had lots of sprains, and I got stepped on and run over. I even fought

bulls a couple of times. I liked riding bulls, but I got hurt too many times, so I quit that."

Kenny started rodeoing in high school, including high school rodeos, jackpots, and local rodeos. Little Britches started when he was a senior, and he competed there for a year. With just one rodeo to qualify for the NHSFR at the time, Kenny often placed just one out of the qualification, though he won several high school rodeos in all his events and the all-around. He also college rodeoed, helping start the Treasure Valley Community College rodeo team with Joe Mayor in the 1960s. "Joe was the first president, and I was the second. I rode three years with them, and I made the ICA finals probably ten times in a row." One cowboy who helped Kenny with his roughstock was Cotton Rosser, the producer of the Caldwell Night Rodeo at the time. "He had a paint bucking mule I rode for him during the rodeo, and he always started the rodeo with a buffalo scramble," says Kenny. "They were all turned out at the same time, and I learned after riding the first one, that halfway down the arena, you'd better get off because they'd turn into a herd and you couldn't get off."



Following college rodeo, Kenny competed in professional and open rodeos around the Northwest, traveling with his wife, Kris. They met in 1965 on a trail ride after her horse – one that Kenny had trained – threw a shoe, and Kenny put it back on by campfire light. They were married in 1970, and Kris college rodeoed and competed in several rodeo queen contests afterward. Their two children, Shawn and Tami, rodeoed when they were growing up. Shawn also played football and went to school on a football scholarship, while Tami barrel raced in the PRCA.

It was at the Days of '47 Rodeo in Salt Lake City, Utah, where Tami was competing that Kenny became acquainted with Martha Josey, holding her horse, Orange Smash, during the rodeo. They met again in Ogden, Utah, and when Kenny learned they were headed to Nampa next, he invited Martha and R.E. to stay at his place. "They'd come to the Northwest and stay with us for two or three nights, any time of day or night," says Kenny. "Right after the Caldwell Night Rodeo, they started doing clinics each year, and my wife and I and both our kids helped. We'd rent the Caldwell rodeo grounds, the fair building, and the Charolais Barn. There was anywhere from 40 to 70 students depending on the year." Kenny has also stayed involved locally judging the Snake River Stampede parade that kicks off the Snake River Stampede Rodeo. He judged the drill teams for many years, and most recently judged the wagon entries. "It's originality for me – no rubber tires," he says. "I also look at condition, cleanliness, and the type of harness. I've also judged horsemanship in some queen contests."

While Kenny retired from rodeo in 1981, he started his moving business in 1972 on 40 acres in Nampa. "I started everything from scratch – it was tough! Back then, you had to have PUC (Public Utilities Commission) authority, which was a license you had to get. It usually took a few years to get them. I invented a machine that will raise a house or any load without jacks or dollies, and it runs wirelessly by remote control and raises and steers hydraulically. We do all our own machining and fabrication right here in the shop." Over the years, they have moved silos, bridges, houses, historical buildings, and tanks – anything heavy or oversized. "It's kind of like rodeo," says Kenny. "They said it couldn't be rode, so you try it

anyway. Every one is different, and that's the challenge. We moved a historical town, Sherman Station, to a park in Elko, Nevada. There was a livery stable, blacksmith shop, creamery, and a schoolhouse. It was 117 miles south of Elko, and it took two and a half months to move because it was in the mountains and we brought (the buildings) down narrow roads and through a creek. We moved another building in Battle Mountain, Nevada, they said couldn't get out, and we raised up a bridge to get the building across it."

Kenny's inventiveness has also benefited the Joseys. Last year, they were in need of more drag dummies, and after putting

together CAD drawings, Kenny fabricated 55 dummies out of half-inch pipe. "They're a little wider and longer, so they don't tip over so easy on the side. There's a little drag to them, and when you rope them, they stand up and lay down when the rope comes back." Kenny makes the 31 hour drive to Josey Ranch often three times a year, helping with their clinics and calf roping reunion, and taking his granddaughter, Kylie, to their roping and barrel racing clinics. "It's Texas Disneyland," says Kenny. "We've been doing that for 17 to 19 years." His goal is to continue working at Josey Ranch and helping his granddaughter – and moving the West one project at a time. 🐾

BUYING SMART

Today's horse market can be overwhelming from the cost of horses to the number of horses that are for sale. There are many ways to help ensure that your newly purchased horse along with you or your child become successful.

*Find a Reputable Seller

If you are looking for a prospect, find a trainer with a proven training program. A great training program does not happen by accident and will have multiple successful horses that are winning or have won. When looking for a finished horse, make sure to find someone who has successfully matched several riders with the right horses. Talk to current and former clients.

*Try at Least Two Horses

If you are new to the horse business, it can be easy to find yourself liking the first horse you ride. The best thing you can do is to plan or schedule trying a few horses either at the same time or within a week of each other. This will allow you to compare the horses between each ride and to make sure you are not caught up in the moment. When you do try a horse, it can be in your favor to try the horse at an indoor and outdoor arena. This is especially important with smaller younger riders to make sure that the horse will listen in a bigger outdoor pen.

*Do Your Research

If this is a finished horse ask to see CURRENT videos of both indoor and outdoor. If this horse is a prospect, ask to see any videos they may have. Also ask the seller to provide results of advertised placements and wins. With today's internet search capabilities, you can find any



horse and rider to see if there are online results listed of the two to give you a good idea of what times the horse may have run. Equistat.com can also provide a report of a horse's earnings at larger shows and rodeos.

*Invest In a Vet Check

If you cannot afford to lose the amount of money you are investing, always do a pre-purchase veterinary examination. A horse that may be winning now could possibly have underlying issue that a vet check and radiographs can reveal. Keep in mind there is no perfect horse and sometimes some maintenance can be done to keep the horse sound and healthy even if he has a small issue of some sort. Full body radiographs including the back may be expensive but can save you from buying a horse with problems or can help you down the road if you do buy the horse that develops problems.

*If It Ain't Broke, Don't Fix It.

After people purchase horses, they sometimes begin to change things and all of the sudden their horse is nothing like the horse they originally purchased. Be sure to ask the previous owner what

bits they used, how they exercised, how many times they worked barrels and what their pre-race routine was. Keeping these things consistent can really help your horse feel comfortable and confident in you.

Try not to change feed right away. Sometimes a new owner may want to add weight to a new horse or put it on the grain they feed all of their other horses for convenience. This can be a big mistake that can cause a horse to colic or have a complete attitude change. Any change should be done gradually and only if absolutely needed. If a previous owner rode the horse every day and didn't feed much alfalfa, then you ride a few days a week and feed lots of alfalfa, you may find yourself with an over energetic horse that's hard to handle.

*Continue Your Education.

Once you have purchased a horse it can really help to jump start you and your horse's career together by taking lessons and possibly doing a clinic. Frequently, the first few runs will go rather well and then things start to get rough. It can take up to a year to get with a new horse completely, but seeking help from a professional can help make the process faster and easier.

The Josey Ranch keeps horses of all price ranges and levels on hand for people shopping for horses to try. Their clinics while helpful to many barrel racers, have become a valuable tool for riders and their new purchases in becoming a team. No matter who you decide to purchase from or what horse you decide to buy, be sure you remember to "Buy Smart" so that you and your horse can be successful down the road. 🐾

Meet the Member Kayley Kennemer

Kayley Kennemer left the National Little Britches Finals Rodeo at the Lazy E Arena as the Senior Girls Finals All Around Champion as well as the Reserve World All Around Champion and the Senior Girls Breakaway Champion. She was the only girl to place in top seven in the team roping in the first round of the National Little Britches Finals Rodeo. The 17 year old from Anderson, Alabama also placed in the top 15 in the pole bending. This is her rookie year in the NLBRA and she came to the finals in six events – everything but the trail course.

“This is my first finals,” she said. “I’ve never won anything bigger.” She and her heeling partner, Laine Moore, have been roping together for about a year. “Our families are very close and he asked if I would be interested in heading for him at the Little Britches in Alabama.” It was her first trip to the Lazy E Arena as well. “I think it’s a great place to have a Nationals,” she said. “I love the indoors and how they have set up the different arenas.” Kayley got her start early. “I’ve been riding since I was so little I couldn’t hold on myself.” Roping runs in the family, starting with her daddy, Johnny. He started roping in 1981 and made the ACA finals in 1983.

“I had two uncles that roped and it looked like a lot of fun,” Johnny said. His father bought him a 2-year-old to train and help with his horsemanship. “I’d been roping a couple years before I got this horse.... he bought him because he liked his color. I hauled him rodeoing for a living for 18 years. I made every association finals there was on that horse except the NFR. I named my first kid after him – her middle name is Bay. I heeled for Herbert Theriot at the Timed Event Challenge and he won second and third.” He doesn’t

go as hard anymore. “It’s all about the kids.” Johnny taught them how to read the barrier. “I take them to the box, and say it’s two foot under, head around the end the end of the gate. If it’s four foot under, right behind him, follow him out.”

Her older sister, Kelsey, 23, is the only girl ever to make the short round heeling in team roping at the CNFR in 2014. “I know this because we were out there and my parents bought me some spurs to cel-

ebate that,” said Kelsey. “After the first few rounds, everyone came up and asked me if I was that girl that heels. We (header Seth Driggers) ended up fifth in the nation.” She graduated with a degree in biology and minor in chemistry. Kelsey came up through the ranks of the National Junior High and High School rodeo. From her 6th grade year until her senior year, she won the All Around in Tennessee. “I practiced all the time – I don’t remember a time when we weren’t all in arena all the time.” She married Zach Mabry last April and the tradition continues. “I love my family – we get to do something we love all together. It’s about all of us – we try to help each other out as much as we can.” She instilled in her sisters to have a purpose every time they go to the practice pen, no matter what it is. “I try

to help my sisters – I’m very competitive and I want my sisters to even go farther than I’ve ever went. I want to help teach them from my mistakes.” She continues to compete in the pro and amateur rodeos in the southeast.

Her mom, Shelley, runs barrels and like Johnny has all but given it up for her daughters. “Now I ride and get horses ready for them,” she said. “My family rode – both my mother and father rodeoed – they met rodeoing. I grew up with it.” She made it to at least 15 amateur rodeo finals. She was the Alabama High



in. She plays softball and is the third base position. “I have fast reflexes and sometimes it’s scary, and when you’re hitting, you have to keep your eye on the ball.” When she’s not at school or a rodeo she’s practicing with her sister. “We are not competitive at all.” Kamey rides two horses. She just got her calf horse and she’s training him to be a breakaway horses. Her favorite part of rodeo is winning. “I like to win – I’m really competitive, just not with my sister.”

Even grandma is involved, sewing all the rodeo shirts the girls wear. “We brought 38 shirts that she made. We buy the material and design the shirts.” Kayley started home schooling last year and will be a senior this coming year. “I’m doing Ingenuity. It’s a program in our school that is meant for kids that miss a lot of school because of a special event. It was a better program for me – I could get it all done and go practice.”

Kayley learned to win from her older sister. “She was 20 and I was 15, I got in the truck with her, I learned how to win off her at the amateur – having to learn to focus and take care of business and learn the start and read the barrier.” Her favorite events are breakaway and team roping.” Mostly I focus on team roping, breakaway and barrel racing, but our pole horse is very nice and it’s easy to pull her off the trailer and go – I practice goats when I can. Ribbon roping is my weakest, if calves hit me, I’m done for. Once I get the ribbon, I’m good. I try to stay in the best shape I can by exercising and doing work around the house keeps me in shape – we’re very active outside.

The family came to the Lazy E with their good friend, Stephanie Bryant, who used to rodeo with Shelly. She is considered a member of the family. “We have gotten to be so close, we’re like family,” she said. “Johnny and Shelly have kids that are a reflection of the type of people they are. They are a good example of how to parent – make sure your child knows how much you love them no matter what. You have to follow through with what you say you’re going to do. I’m here to help the girls do the best they can do no matter what. I’m the behind the scenes person. I try to make it as easy for them so they can do the best they can do.”

Without family and good friends this dream wouldn’t be a reality for Kayley. “God has always sent great people to help us as a family to do what we want to do. The Good Lord always provides a way and His answer isn’t always yes.”

School All Around champion in 1985 and then she switched to barrel racing. “Breakaway didn’t come to the amateur rodeos and when it did (1994), I won the breakaway in the PCA.” Mainly now we try to help our daughters reach their goals. She is a high school math teacher and her dad works for the county, so the whole family leaves every morning except Kayley, who stays home and does her school work. “When I’m done with school, I clean stalls and take care of all the horses. When my family gets home, I have everything ready to practice.” Math is her best subject and she just finished pre-calculus with honors. She plans to go to college in the Ozark region. “I’ll stay home and rodeo from there – East Mississippi Community College. I want to be an architect. I’m good with numbers. I spend a lot time with my dad – working on the truck and trailer and building stuff.”



Her younger sister, Kamey (12) (Dunn) is also named after a horse ... although they don’t have a dunn horses, her sisters picked her middle name. She competed at the NLBFR in the breakaway and pole bending. She has only been roping for six months and qualified, ending up second in Alabama in the breakaway. Kamei shares her sister’s love of math. “I’d like to be a doctor or a PA when I grow up,” said the seventh grader, who attends the same K-12 school that her mom teaches





Meet the Member Cooper Smith

Cooper Smith from Penrose, Colorado, started rodeoing when he was four, and this summer he accomplished one of his goals of competing at the NJHFR. "I had a lot of fun, and getting that accomplishment done and being able to rodeo there is a big deal," says the 13-year-old. Just before the NJHFR, his family had a house fire, so Cooper traveled to Nationals with his grandparents while his mom, Crissy, took care of things at home. Cooper qualified in bareback steer riding and team roping with heeler Seth Anderson, while he also competes in chute dogging, goat tying, tie-down roping, and dally ribbon roping with Makaylee Fischer. "My favorite is probably calf roping. It's fun when you can see a horse you've worked a lot with work for you. Rodeo is part of our lifestyle, and I just love doing it. I couldn't live without doing it, and I try to be on a horse 24/7 doing something."

His main rope horse, Lena, pulled her stifle this year but will be ready to ride for fall rodeos. While she was recuperating, Cooper rode Lil' Roy this summer in the tie-down and dally ribbon roping. The 10-year-old gelding knew roping, but Cooper is finishing him this year. "I rope off of Yellow in the team roping, and I use Festus for goats. A friend of ours, Aaron, let me ride his horse all year because my other horse Red was crippled and he's going to be retired now."

"Dave Hoffman has helped me out a lot in the bareback steers, and my mom, Crissy, helps me a lot. My Granddad, Charlie Smith, rode roughstock and team roped, and my Nana, Eva Smith, team roped and breakaway roped. She

was the world champion breakaway roper in 1988 for the All-Girls Rodeo Association. My Uncle Darell and Aunt Kal help with mounting me and my brothers on horses and make sure we're always riding something."

Cooper is one of four boys in his family, and he's team roping with his younger brother Chestin in the CJHSRA this season. Their older brother, Riley, competes in bull riding and team roping in the CSHSRA and won the average at state in the bull riding this year, while their youngest brother, Rozyn, just started junior rodeoing. "We rodeo together most of the time, and we all coach each other and help each other along," says Cooper. Their whole family, including Cooper's grandparents and aunts and uncles, also enjoy hunting together.

An eighth-grader at Freemont Middle School this fall, Cooper does well in math and just started football practice with the Freemont Huskies. "I cowboy a lot for people – I help move cows and brand – and I'm starting to learn to shoe horses," Cooper adds. "I'll mainly do the junior high rodeos, and I'll probably do Little Britches this year. I won two saddles when I was a Little Wrangler in barrels and goats. I want to win the state finals with my brother, and try to go to Nationals in all the events I do," he finishes. "I'd like to thank everybody that's helped me get this far rodeoing and taken the time to get me to this place. I thank God that he's blessed me with a mom to haul me up and down the road, and my Nana and Granddad for hauling me to Nationals." 📷

Elle Eagles was 7th out in the short go at the National High School Finals Rodeo. She and her gelding, Jag, ran a 17.047. "The girl that was sitting right behind me was fifth out, so I still watched pretty closely." Her game plan going into the short go was a little different than normal - she pushed Jag a little harder on the first barrel. "We have a tendency to blow the first barrel so I usually let him set the pace - it worked. He was firing a lot quicker across the pen. I also went on the track and breezed him real quick and I think that jazzed him up a little bit." As the 2017 National High School Barrel Racing Champion, Elle received several scholarships, buckles for her second go win and short go win and average win, plus two horse blankets and several other things.

The 18-year-old from Penrose, Colorado, has had quite the run with Jag. She has had the 10-year-old gelding from Devers Performance Horses for two years. "I'd only run him five times before he broke his leg last year. That happened right after I came back from breaking my arm." Elle broke her arm falling on the ice. "It was a compound fracture and it required surgery - two bars and 13 screws in my left arm." Then Jag broke his leg and he was out for a year. "It wasn't a good year for me."

She picked Jag because he was the easiest one for her to get along with. "He is stout and I get along better with big horses." Jag is one of eight horses in Elle's herd. She started competing when she was seven and competes in breakaway, goat tying, and team roping as a header. She likes barrels and goats the best. "I just started picking up the roping, so the other two are my better events." She won Colorado State High School Rodeo this year in barrels and goats, and last year, she only qualified in poles because of the time she and her horse lost.

Elle will be a senior this year. She gives her horses the winter off and plays basketball. "I walk them, but that's it. It's pretty hard to get them rode when I get home from basketball and it's so cold," said the point guard. In the summer, she spends most of her time riding. She doesn't have to do anything with Jag except keep him in shape. "I'll go swim him in the canal we have close to our house." Her goal this coming year is to keep herself and her horses healthy. When she graduates, she will go to college. Her older sister, Skylar, is now in

college on a rodeo scholarship at Stillwater.



I was surprised – especially when you see people coming here in five events."

She owes a lot to her horse, Tex, who does both the poles and barrels. "You just have to know how to ride him," she said. The horse came from Mattie Hepp in Gillette, who helped her learn how to get with him. "Tex and I just clicked. When I got on him, I could tell he was going to be a fun horse."

This is her second year in high school rodeo. Last year she made it to Nationals

in the pole bending and brought home an 8th place. "Last year my very first run I was so nervous I didn't make a run up to my potential, so this year, I told myself not to get so nervous. I had my cousin with me before every run and she would give me a pep talk and I told myself it was just another rodeo."

Shay has rodeoed since she could ride, competing in barrels, poles, and goat tying when she was younger. "I started to breakaway in seventh grade and am going to add that and goat tying back into my events this next year."

She spends her days either riding her horses or hanging out with friends. She has two more years of high school and when she's done she knows she wants to go into the medical field but can't decide what. "I'm a people person, and that would be a good fit."

She has a little sister, Grace, 6, who is going to be in first grade and follows her older sister's footsteps. "She already ropes better than me."

Her mom, Holly, rodeoed and her stepdad, Gibby, has never rodeoed, but knows how to run the video camera. Holly, along with Shay's cousin (Sara Reed) and her grandmother, Betty Hough, help her the most. There will be a congratulations party for her during the county fair in a week. 📺

Even though it was her third time at the NHSFR competing in the event, Natalie says she was still nervous being on a new horse. "My first go was really good – I scored a 191, and I had built some confidence going into the second round. I scored a 191.5, which set me up pretty good in the short go. I'd built quite a bit of confidence up in myself and my horse, and being able to trust him. In the short go, I had a plan to go for it all, and we scored a 192. I was very happy, and so happy with how he performed!"

Chili, Natalie's horse, started out as a heel horse. But when Natalie's step-dad, PRCA team roper Bobby Harris, rode Chili and noticed how cowy he was, they switched to the bit they use on their cow horses. "He was a different horse, and he dropped his head," says Natalie. "We didn't have a lot of background on him, so I practiced on him a bit, seeing what he could do. That was right before state, so I rode the horse I'd been competing on all spring, and after state, Chili got better and better and more tuned up, and I thought he was the caliber of horse for Nationals."

Natalie also competes in barrel racing, breakaway roping, goat tying, and team roping as a header, but reined cow horse

and goat tying are her favorites. "In goat tying, I like that you're not just relying on your horse. He can only get you halfway, and you have to do the rest of the work. I really like the horsemanship part of reined cow horse, and being able to show your horse and do all the cool maneuvers. Working the cow is probably the most fun. It's really different from the other events because there's no time at all, and it's about being in position and being correct and showing control. It's definitely a nice change of pace."

While Natalie grew up ranching, she didn't find her love for rodeo until she was 9 and started traveling to rodeos with her step-dad. "He got me interested in the rodeo life, and I got more and more attached and interested in rodeo. It's so fun to go places, and it's awesome to do good, but really it's the people that you meet and the connections you get. I love the competitive side of it, and the stories you hear, and all the friends you're able to meet and know for the rest of your life." She especially looks up to her mom, Colleen, and step-dad, Bobby, as well as her go-to guy in reining, Frank Kenzy. "Bobby practices with me a lot, and my mom helps me, whether it's saddling horses or holding my goat or opening up chutes."

Natalie rides her family's stud, 4P Buzzwood, whom she team ropes, ties goats, and breakaway ropes off of. She rides Cowboy in the barrel racing, and helps keep all the family's horses legged up. Her brothers, Bailey (18) and Brody (13), help their dad, Matt, with the farming, while Natalie helps with working cattle, building fence, haying, and other ranch jobs. She is also a senior at Highmore High School this fall, and enjoys science, along with playing volleyball and basketball. "I'm definitely looking at college rodeo, and school-wise, I'd like to graduate valedictorian. I'd like to qualify to Nationals in more than reined cow horse," she finishes, "and bring home a state championship in any of my events." 🐾

Meet the Committee Sarpy County Rodeo

At least eight years of sell-out performances for the M-SRA-sanctioned Sarpy County Rodeo in Springfield, Nebraska, brings contestants from all around. One of the biggest events of the year for M-SRA members, there is a whopping \$12,000 added up for grabs. "Because of our location and demographics, we are able to get some really great sponsors and that is why we are able to have that amount of added money. I have been on both sides of it, on the production side and on the contestant side. It is important for these contestants going up and down the road to compete for as much money as they can," said Chad Heinert, Sarpy County Rodeo chairman and M-SRA board member.

Held in conjunction with the Sarpy County Fair, the rodeo is an event many people look forward to each year. With good facilities and a great crowd, contestants and spectators alike mark their calendars for the event. "I see the same people come out year after year. They all look forward to it." The two-day rodeo is usually held the first weekend in August starting at 8 p.m. Each performance is full with contestants and slack runs after Friday night's performance. "Our goal for the rodeo is for it to run efficiently and for the fans to feel like they had a great entertaining experience. We pack as much fun into two hours and fifteen minutes as we possibly can. We try to provide the best contestants, stock, announcers and entertainers to keep the crowd engaged." Wild-cow milking has been one of the big draws for the rodeo the last 15 years. gets pretty wild but the crowd loves it." The roar of the crowd has been cited as one of the major draws. "The more the crowd gets into the performance the more pumped up the contestants get, leading to high point rides and quick runs. Everyone just feeds off each other." McKay Rodeo Company has been the stock contractor for many years. "They are good people, easy to work with and they always bring great stock for the contestants." Chad likes to make sure everyone he hires is well taken care of so they will continue to come back.

He grew up on a ranch outside of Mandan, South Dakota, until his family relocated to northeast Nebraska when he was a teenager. "I competed and was around rodeo and Quarter Horse shows growing up." Chad and Denise, his wife, have three children who serve as their

main connection to rodeo today, Taylor, their daughter, and, their sons, Garrett and Dawson. "All my kids went to Iowa High Schools rodeos. I was vice president of that board for several years." Living in Papillion, Nebraska, about as far east in the state as possible meant Iowa rodeos were closer than Nebraska rodeos. "Dawson was the reserve champion bull rider last year and won it this year. Both of my sons ride bulls in the M-SRA as well and have qualified for the finals." All of Chad's kids have competed in the Sarpy rodeo in years past, both boys have brought home their share of the added money in the bull riding.

"It all comes down to the support from the fair board, rodeo committee, local community and sponsors, that is why this rodeo has been such a success."

For fun, Samantha loves going to the Calamus Reservoir near Burwell, where she likes to fish and tube.



This year, he won the state 4-H record book contest and will go on to


represent Nebraska in November in Atlanta at the National 4-H Congress. He also finished the 4-H season in fourth place at state in the heeling.





Meet the Member Staheli Adams

It's the thundering hooves and adrenaline rush sending 13-year-old Staheli Adams down the arena flying towards the goat she is about to tie in record time that wakes her up excited to rodeo each morning. "I like to breakaway rope and heel in the team roping but goat tying is my favorite by far," said the eighth grader from Cedar City, Utah. The fourth place goat tier at junior high nationals this year, Staheli set a goal to make it to the short go after a tough first year at nationals in sixth grade and that is exactly what she did. "I worked really hard and ended up winning the state goat tying. Winning that saddle was probably my biggest accomplishment so far."

Ashlee, her mom, an accomplished team roper, breakaway roper and goat tier, is credited with getting Staheli started in rodeo. Ashlee took her to see Tony Cannon to help with Staheli's competitive edge in goats and breakaway. "Tony and his wife, Cindy, are the reason I got to go to nationals. Anytime I have a problem they just seem to know how to fix it. They taught me a lot about both events." Staheli finished seventh in the state in breakaway this year.

Kirby, Staheli's dad, is a construction foreman for Mel Clark, Inc. but also helps run the 200 head of beef cattle on the family ranch. "We have quite a few acres on Cedar Mountain with a cabin that are all part of the ranch that my family has owned and operated for a few generations." Ashlee works as a secretary for the same construction company but also takes Staheli to all of her rodeo events. "My mom pushed me to try it and I have loved it from the start. She practices with me but does not really compete anymore." Staheli first got on a horse when she was three and learned how to rope and rodeo at six, running barrels, poles and tying goats. "I like to put my three-year-old sister Stevie on my horse and walk her around. She gets

pretty excited about goat tying and I hope she rodeos some day too." Staheli runs her eight-year-old, sorrel mare, Lena, in the goat tying and ropes off her 16-year-old, sorrel mare, Smash. "Lena is a beast, she is stubborn and can be mean sometimes but I love her and she took me to nationals. Smash is my favorite though, she is just a solid horse and I know I can always trust her." Oddly enough, she bought Lena to be a barrel and pole horse but secretly started training her on goats until she showed her mom and that is what they have ran on her ever since.

Staheli's favorite class at Caynon View Middle School is math. "I have had to work pretty hard at it to be good." She started learning the game of basketball and how to "post-up" just last year. "I like how I have made good friends with my teammates and then I really like being a post." She loves listening to music, especially if it is coun-

try. "We are all fans of the Pittsburgh Steelers. My dad has always been a fan and then he just brainwashed the rest of it." If Staheli did not love to rodeo so much she would like to be able to play volleyball and softball but the seasons just overlap too much to make it work. In the summer, Staheli maintains the yard for Mel Clark, Inc. and works at the Cedar City Livestock Auction every Thursday. "Cedar City has a stock show every year in September and I have shown a 4-H lamb at it since I turned eight. I work with my lamb every day and then I sell it for market at the fair." A muddy year at nationals gave Staheli the opportunity to sink or swim. "I just went out there and knew that I could do it." She has hopes and the work ethic to go back next year and win the goat tying at nationals. She would like to rodeo in college and become a dental hygienist one day. "I really like the level of competition in the UJHSRA, it definitely helped prepare me for nationals. I have made a lot of good friends, everyone is nice and they will help with anything."

Utah High School Women's Reserve All-Around Taylour Latham

Taylour Latham is a graduate of Union High School, and competed in the team roping, breakaway, barrels, goats, and poles for her district.

Rodeo has been a tradition in her family, with both of her parents having a rodeo background.

"I entered my first rodeo when I was two years old," Taylour said. "My dad college rodeoed for central Wyoming college in Riverton, Wyoming. Then after he got his associates, he transferred to Panhandle State University in Goodwell, Oklahoma. He competed in the bull riding and saddle bronc riding through college. Then, he went on to ride bulls in the PRCA and won Mountain States Circuit Resistol Rookie of the Year in '94."

"My mom did little britches rodeos when she was little and also competed in the Utah High School Rodeo Association in the pole bending barrel racing and goat tying. She still rides and competes in barrel racing a little bit when she gets time."

Taylour's mom also travels with her to all of her rodeo events, and helps her practice on a daily basis.

"I practice every day, I try to tie my goat and rope the dummy every day," Taylour said. "My mom or my brother holds the goat for me. I try to prepare myself mentally for bigger rodeos like Nationals."

This year, Taylour qualified for Nationals in three events; poles, goats, and breakaway.

"Last year's Nationals was a smooth first round run, and wasn't as good as I wanted it to be," she said. "In the second round, I drew a bad goat and wasn't able to make it back to the short round."

"I won a couple of jackpots throughout that time and walked away with more money than in the rodeo."

Despite her bad luck, Taylour maintains a positive attitude. "Always keep

your chin up and know that there's going to be another rodeo," Taylour said. "If you enjoy it enough, you'll keep striving. The bad days won't get you down."

Taylour has a string of horses that help her remain competitive in all of her events.

"My pole horse is named Sass, she's a Dash Ta Fame mare as solid as they come. We got her when she was 6, and my mom trained her on the poles," Taylour said. "We got my goat horse last year right before Nationals, and I'm borrowing a breakaway horse right now."

These horses will travel with her from Utah to Wyoming, where Taylour will attend Gillette College on a rodeo scholarship. She will compete in the goat tying, breakaway, and barrel racing.

"The thing that I am most looking forward to about college rodeo is there aren't really any parents involved in it. It's just the contestants and their coaches," she said. "Parents help out a lot but they also cause a lot more cluster and mishap down there."

Taylour is looking forward to her independence, but will always be thankful for her parents support.

"Rodeo is my life," she said. "I'd like to thank my mom and dad for all of their support."

Taylour finished the rodeo season as the reserve women's all-around, with 606 total points. The next contestant was more than 100 points behind her. 🏆





This installment was going to be about supplements, but we have already received request from a reader that is suffering from migraines and headaches. Migraine headaches are not uncommon – more than 30 million people in America suffer from migraines and women are three times more likely as men to have them.

There are six supplements that can help YOU treat your migraines.

1. Vitamin B-2: Research has yet to show how or why vitamin B-2, or riboflavin, might help prevent migraines. However taking vitamin B-2 supplements may help you avoid them. *Take one three times a day for the first month, then take one in the morning and evening.*

4. Coenzyme Q10: Researchers have recently discovered that Coenzyme was effective for preventing migraines. According to the Association of Migraine Disorders, a few small studies suggest that Q10 is more effective than placebos for reducing the frequency of migraines. The typical dosage is up to 100 mg of Q10 taken three times per day

5. Tranquil Complex: It's synergistic ingredients relax smooth muscle, support neurotransmitters, and support the nervous system. *Take four before bed nightly*



for the first month, then take two before bed.

Environmental Causes of Headaches

Cellphones, and SmartPhones in particular, along with their cousin's WiFi and cordless home phones, are well documented as presenting significant hazards to human health, and as contributing factors to Sick Building Syndrome (also known as Sick House Syndrome)

Meet the Member Josh Jennings

Tie-down roper Josh Jennings has been competing in the RMPRA since its inaugural year in 2008. He grew up junior and high school rodeoing in Elko, Nevada, but when his parents moved to Utah in the late '90s, he followed suit. "Mom and Dad both rodeoed, so I was brought up doing it," says Josh, 39. "My dad roped calves and rode bulls, and my mom ran barrels and queened. I team roped a little bit and I steer wrestled quite a bit through high school and college, and now I'm just tie-down roping. I think it's the hardest event to master – there's so many things that can go wrong. There's not a lot of guys that do it anymore, and in my opinion, it's the hardest one to get figured out. I know I can only do it for a few more years, so I'd like to do it while I can. I have a good horse, and I feel I'm still competitive against these young guys."

Josh's dad was his main coach, and he also attended several schools, including ones with tie-down roping legends like Dean Oliver and Joe Beaver. Once he moved to Utah, he filled his PRCA permit on the Wilderness Circuit and went to jackpots before joining the RMPRA. He admits that no rodeo is very close to his home in Glendale, Utah. "But I like how the RMPRA sets up their slacks and their rodeos to help the cowboys out. It's more convenient for us to get to more of them in a weekend." Josh has competed in the RMPRA finals several times, but he faces the challenge of his rodeo season being cut short. As a professional hunting guide for Color Country Outfitters in southern Utah, he starts work in mid-August guiding mule deer hunting trips, and every weekend is booked. "It's a little tough to watch your name get bumped down in the standings, but it's what I do. I've been lucky to have enough won to make it a handful of times to the finals." On the flip side, Josh says he gets to work in one

of the best hunting places in the world. "It's a good atmosphere, and I've gotten to meet some really neat people over the years. They let me come hunt with them all over the country."

Josh's main rope horse is Country, a 17-year-old gelding he purchased from Justin Brinkerhoff. "He's the horse that Ryan Jarrett won the world on in 2005. He rode him at the finals several times, and Country's been awesome. He's one of the horses that can fit in any pen. I can ride him in Nampa one night and Cheyenne the next and he's going to be outstanding anywhere."

A rodeo in southern Utah brought Josh and his wife, Marla, together, and they have a daughter, Jane (8), a son, Jack (4), and another son on the way. Marla breakaway and team ropes and enjoys training horses, while Jane and Jack are junior rodeoing. "Marla and I team rope a little bit, but when I get older and quit roping calves, we'll probably start team roping more together," says Josh. "The kids like to ride and rope, and so far rodeo seems like something they want to do. A lot of times

I can be home when they rodeo." The family also enjoys fishing and golfing together.

Josh's rodeo goals include making the RMPRA and Wilderness Circuit finals in the next few years. "I want to thank my wife – she's always willing to run the chutes and untie calves, and she's really supported me," he finishes. "Trampus Quarnburg, my traveling partner, is always real good about cheering me up and encouraging me, and I want to thank the Brinkerhoff family in Corinne, Utah, for letting me stay and put my horses up and rope. They take good care of us." 🐾

In 2013, the Western States Ranch Rodeo Association added a women's division that brought 8 women's teams to the finals. The WSRRA continues to experience rapid growth in the women's division. At the 2016 WSRRA National Finals 22 women's teams had qualified for the finals. The WSRRA currently has sanctioned events in thirteen states plus Canada.

One of these cowgirls that qualified for the 2016 WSRRA Nationals rodeo is Alesa Jones. You can't miss this cowgirl from North Platte, Nebraska. Her smile and never-give-up attitude is contagious. In fact, I have seen this cowgirl get bucked off her horse as she was competing. She didn't throw up her hand, she caught that big Quarter Horse she was riding and finished the rodeo.

Alesa first become interested in ranch

rodeo's about ten years ago, when she decided that watching was a little boring. "I just remember going and watching the guys rodeo and thought to myself it looked fun and exciting and anything that I can do with my horse is something worth trying," says Alesa. That is all that it took for Alesa to hit the ranch rodeo trail. She started competing at sanctioned WSRRA events because of the rules of the association. "The WSRRA follows more of our everyday ranching life and that

everyone on the team has to rope at one point in time. I love the aspect of it and the people that I get to meet," she states.

On the ranch rodeo trail Alesa has a series of rituals that she follows, good luck items, per say. These items include a very special piece of jewelry, a good sharp knife, a written note and a few other little tokens that have been giving to her by a few of her favorite people. horse power. Also a little pray to the Lord never hurts," she says.

Horse training and ranch rodeo have the same aspects as life. Alesha tells me that you have to have drive to make yourself motivated, to push yourself out of your comfort zone to learn more all the time. Ranch rodeo is a very fast paced and things change in a blink of an eye. "You have to learn to except change and adapt quickly," she says.

At the 2016 WSRRA National Finals,

Alesha rode her outstanding bay mare called HCJ NineLiL Buttons AKA Buttons. Alesha got her when she was a weanling from a ranch where she used to break colts. She started her when she worked at a local feedlot. "She is very cowy and extremely athletic. She is sensitive, soft, smooth to ride and gives me her all in the arena," Alesha states. Buttons has been shown in ranch horse shows, ranch versatility shows, American Quarter Horse shows, 4-H, SHOT, team ropings, cut-

tings and at ranch rodeos. I would say that Buttons is an all-around horse. Buttons has been named Top horse at several ranch rodeos including WSRRA Top Horse and Double A Feeds WSRRA women's Ranch Rodeo Top Horse just to name a few. "Buttons is the main reason that I have received several Top Hand awards," states Alesha.

Alesha's 2017 ranch rodeo goals include qualifying for the WSRRA National Finals again. The last couple of years Alesha has just been filling in on teams but this year she would really like to get together a team of cowgirls that have balance. "It is pretty fun just to wing it sometimes, but there is also something to be said about having a good team that you trust and know their strong and weak points," she states. Alesha other goal is to win. "Of course, I would love to win the WSRRA women's finals rodeo at least once, but a major goal of mine is to receive the Top Horse award. "There are a lot of nice horses at the finals and I couldn't be more blessed and proud of the one that I ride," she says. I believe that Alesha has the horse to do just that.




Meet the Member, 2018 National High School Queen Emma Cameron

Emma Cameron left the National High School Finals as the National High School Queen. New Mexico has not had this honor since 1969. This is the second year she has tried for this title. She came in second runner up last year. “The only two categories I wasn’t top five in last year were modeling and appearance,” said the 17-year-old from Santa Fe, New Mexico. She went home and stepped up her game for this year’s competition. “I designed all of my clothes and had them made



to fit me.” She studied what Miss Rodeo America and other queens were wearing and developed her own take on what she thought she would look good in. She worked on her modeling by taking ballet lessons. “It was super hard for me to look comfortable when I had to think about walking. My workout partner suggested I take ballet lessons and so I did. It helped me look so much more relaxed.” Emma works out every day – she prefers running for her cardio and works a lot on her core strength. “When I was little, I

got tossed off a horse and into a fence so the bottom of my spine is aligned funny.” In order for her to ride as much as she does without her back hurting, she has to keep her core strong. “In order to ride it’s super important to keep yourself in shape as well as your horse.” Her horsemanship coach, Julie Wilson, coached both Emma and Madeline Gere. This year she won six out of the eight categories. She won appearance, personality, test, interview, impromptu speech, and horsemanship. She was second in prepared speech and third in modeling.

She has been the New Mexico High School rodeo queen for two years now and her platform is rodeo. “My take on that is ‘Live your passion,’ and my speech was about how in rodeo, in order to be competitive, you have to live it, make it your life.” She had a general idea and outline of her speech, but the final one came out of her head.



Emma lives in Santa Fe, New Mexico with her mom, Karen and her younger brother Jack. She started her queening when she was 9, winning a county title, but wasn’t sure she wanted to continue. She wanted to rodeo, competing in barrels, poles, and now reined cow horse. She decided in high school to get back

into queening. “I realized there is not platform in rodeo like it and that I can help promote this sport that I love.”

The day after returning from Nationals, Emma hopped on a plane to go look at colleges in California. “This is the only chance I’m going to have to do this before next year,” she said. She will meet with the Stanford Equestrian Team, her college of choice. “I want to go to Stanford and become a lawyer - that’s been my goal since I was super little.” She will study international relations and political science and go on to law school and hopefully be part of the equestrian team. “None of this would be possible without the sponsors of high school rodeos – everywhere I’ve gone, they are there to help me.” 📧

This is the first year Trey Holston covered his bulls at the NHSFR, and the 18-year-old from Fort Scott, Kansas, walked away the 2017 NHSFR Bull Riding Champion. "This was my third year out there, and the first two years it was a really big deal and kind of overwhelming," says Trey. "This year, I had a lot of fun and relaxed, and it wasn't as nerve-racking." He also came away the KHSRA state bull riding champion for the second time, stacked up against his friends Brylen Dees, Coy Pollmeier, and Shad Winn in the top four. "Kansas boys are tough to ride against, but I was lucky enough I came out on top." His freshman year, Trey was the reserve state champion in bull riding, even after taking half the season off when a bull stepped on his leg and broke it. "I was at a bull riding in my hometown at Fort Scott Community College and got my leg stepped on. It broke a couple bones in my lower leg and ankle. I got seven screws and a plate put in, so I was out for a while."


Trey says that setbacks like his injury or not covering his bulls lit a fire under him, and drove him toward the national title. In seventh grade, he was the NJHFR Bull Riding Champion, and that accomplishment was addictive. "The older you get, the harder it is and the more work it's going to take," he says. "It's been a long road and I finally got there, and I'll see what's in store next for me."

His dad, Todd Holston, and Trey's traveling buddies, Coy and Tate Pollmeier and Shad Winn, keep him motivated. Todd, whom Trey calls his number one role model, rode bulls in Pennsylvania before being recruited to rodeo for Fort Scott

Community College. Todd later coached the college rodeo team for several years. He now drives truck for Twister Trailers and is a crop adjuster, and he continues to help Trey when he needs advice. Trey also works out and gets on practice bulls with his friends. "Steward Gulager, Jason Marberry, and Mark Pollmeier have a lot of bulls to get on, so that's a big help," he adds.

Trey is also a timed event cowboy, competing in tie-down roping and team roping as a heeler with Hunter Brunson this upcoming season. "It's definitely fun trying some different events, especially calf roping, which was a new one for me in the last few years. But bull riding is my favorite. It's an adrenaline rush and I have a lot of buddies that do it, and it's a good time all around." Trey rides a 7-year-old gelding, Mouse, in the team roping, and rides his friends' horses in the tie-down roping. "Mouse is a little lazy, but he's got a real personality to him, and he's pretty close to humanness for a horse." Trey also rides bareback occasionally to strengthen his legs and gets on his barrel, and he helps his sister, Tacy (15), keep her goat horse legged up. She recently started goat tying and breakaway roping.

A senior at Fort Scott High School this fall, Trey enjoys his Ag. Mechanics class, where he welds projects like square bale and round bale feeders, and horse tack racks. "My Ag. teacher, Kyle Parks, is real good to me, and I can build anything I can think of." Trey also works at Twister Trailers as a maintenance man and helping wherever needed. He's considering getting his welding certification in college, and plans to college rodeo. With the two PRCA

permits he has from his state and national titles this summer, Trey plans to compete in some pro rodeos this fall and hit the season hard come the new year. "Right now, what's on my mind is another national title for high school. Then a college title and on to the National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas. I'd like to win the NFR."

Meet the Member Tegan Kohles

Tegan Kohles returned to the NJHFR for the second time in his junior high school rodeo career, qualifying in the goat tying and team roping this year. In 2015, he was the NJHFR Reserve Breakaway Roping Champion. This year, he was sixth in the first round of team roping, heeling for Logan Mullin, while he was sixth in the second round of goat tying. The 14-year-old from Hutchinson, Kansas, also enjoyed going to the Nashville Shores Waterpark for the first time with some of his family. In the KJHSRA, his favorite rodeo is state finals. "The night before the short-go, they have a dance, and sometimes a volleyball tournament or Fast Lane roping or something fun."

Tegan started competing in rodeo when he was four, inspired by his mom, Kyla, who barrel races, and his step-dad, Troy, who team ropes. He'd also love to spend a day with PRCA tie-down roper Tyson Durfey – and his horse. "I definitely look up to my step-dad and mom," says Tegan. "Troy has taught me everything I know, and he's always been willing to haul me to junior rodeos and everything to help me get better. My mom is always out there running the chute and making sure all the cattle are ready to go, and she videos me a lot." Tegan additionally competed in the summer junior rodeo series CKYRA, and enters jackpots. In May, he won the Hutchinson No. 8 USTRC roping, and he'll continue tie-down roping and team roping in the KHSRA this fall. "My favorite event is

probably team roping," he says. "I like that it's a team sport, unlike calf roping where you're by yourself, and it doesn't matter your size." He also likes the scholarship opportunities in rodeo, and wants to college rodeo on a scholarship.

Practice happens three or four nights a week, and Tegan is often joined by his sister, Kenzie (8), who competes in barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying, and breakaway roping. "I like that it's very sandy here, so that whenever it rains, it sucks up most of the water and we can rope a lot more. We have an arena right out our front door." Tegan ropes calves on his 13-year-old mare, Que, and team ropes on his 6-year-old gelding, Crackhead. "My step-dad trained the calf horse, and he started my heel horse and I finished him," says Tegan. "We raise cattle and have ten or eleven horses. I feed every morning and every night, and I ride some of Troy's outside horses." Tegan also works at his grandparents' steel rod company welding pins.

A freshman at Nickerson High School this fall, Tegan likes history, especially

studying the 1700s and 1800s and the Lewis and Clark Expedition. He plays basketball and runs track, and he also enjoys hunting and fishing with his dad. "I love to snow ski," he adds. "Breckenridge is my favorite resort, but anywhere really is good."

Tegan feels confident about team roping in the high school ranks, and says he never leaves for a rodeo without a good luck Hershey's chocolate bar. Eating it is good luck. "I'd like to thank my step-dad for helping me," he finishes. "I would like to have a 3.8 GPA through high school, and I'd like to make Nationals at least two or three times in high school." 📷

Trinidad Roundup

The Trinidad Roundup has been a Labor Day Rodeo for 107 years. "It started in conjunction with the county fair," said Bill Burh, who has been involved with the rodeo since 1982.. "It was the last big hoorah before school started; we still fill our stands on a Monday afternoon, even though the fair has moved its dates. The people all come back for it – it's a big reunion. The people that grew up there come back to visit."

Bill and his wife, Karen, have been involved with rodeo for more than 30 years. Bill was a rough stock rider before becoming a judge. He judged the Colo-

rado Pro Rodeo Finals for seven year, and had been judging for 25 years when he stopped three years ago. The couple ranches east of Trinidad, living at the same place he's been since 1953. "The Trinidad Roundup has been part of our family forever. We've had McCloy Rodeo Company as the stock contractor the entire time. He's the son-in-law of LD Ward, who had it to start with."

This year is the first year in ten years that the rodeo is KPRA first approved. "We started as a KPRA rodeo, then went to Texas, where we were rodeo of the year. The rodeo was CPRA for ten years until this year. "I like the amateur rodeos because we get the locals that bring people to town."

In addition to the rodeo, there is a parade on Monday morning, with more than 50 entries. "The parade lasts a good hour. The Westernaires have been coming; this is their 57th year. The dance is Saturday night, before the rodeo starts on Sunday and Monday."





Meet the Member Callie Sellers

Faith, family, friends and rodeo sums up 13-year-old Callie Sellers' life in Meeker, Oklahoma. She is a cowgirl with aspirations to one day go on multiple mission trips as well as visit every country in Europe. Callie loves to study math and science at Meeker Junior High School where she also runs track. She competes in the long-distance events, running the two- and one-mile relays as well as the 800-meter race. Callie is a well-rounded athlete, she is a guard for her basketball team and plays second base in softball. This spring she graduated valedictorian of her eighth grade class. Ever since she was little, Callie has wanted to become a neonatal doctor.

Callie first started to rodeo when she was seven years old, her brother Garrett, 16, got into rodeo first and she followed right along behind him. "I went to all of his rodeos to watch and I decided I wanted to give it a try." Callie now competes in breakaway roping, goat tying, barrel racing and pole bending on her three Quarter Horses. Twenty-three-year-old Gizmo, a blue roan gelding, is her oldest mount who she uses for poles and breakaway. Lizzy, a 17-year-old bay mare, is her goat-tying horse and Jojo, a three-year-old red roan gelding, is a colt Callie hopes to use as a future barrel horse. She also has three Australian shepherds: Annie, Ranger and Cowgirl.

"Hard work beats talent when talent

doesn't work hard," Callie lives and rides by this quote. All of Callie's horses live at her house and they have an arena to practice in. She gets to practice with her brother who will sometimes hold the goat for her when she is tying and in return she will open shuts for him when he wants to practice his steer wrestling or roping. "We try to practice everyday but sometimes sports get in the way, with track meets or games." Callie loves to ride fast horses, in fact, when she first saw barrel racing that is what peaked her interest in the sport. Her favorite event now is goat tying because she gets to step off a fast horse. Her dad Michael taught Callie and her brother both how to ride as well as rope. He was once a team roper but stopped after a shoulder injury and joining the Oklahoma City Police Department as a homicide detective. Callie's mom Ashley is the Oklahoma Junior High School Rodeo Association secretary; though she does not have a background in rodeo Callie says she is their biggest fan in the stands.

Corn nuts is a favorite snack for traveling to rodeos, a sort of good luck charm for Callie and Garrett. "We usually go every weekend during the school year but during the summer it dies down a bit so we just go to some open rodeos." Callie's favorite part of competing in the OKJHSRA is the ability to compete with her friends from across the state. "One of my rodeo friends' mom helps me a lot when we are at rodeos." In 2015 she was in the top 15 in poles for OKJHSRA and in 2016 she finished in the top 15 for goat tying. She also competes in the Central Oklahoma Junior Rodeo Association where she won barrel racing in 2014 and reserve all-around in 2015. She recently com-



Bronc Riding Nation and TBRA: Fighting for the Bucking Horse Community

Before the Texas Bronc Rider's Association (TBRA) had issued its first membership, founder Daryl McElroy joined forces with Lori Lee O'Harver, the founder and president of Bronc Riding Nation (BRN).

BRN is a member supported non-profit organization that supports the all facets of the bucking horse community in simple, yet innovative ways to preserve the culture by promoting the truth about this inspirational breed of horse and the people who love them.

"If you love horses that buck, it's time to act to see that they are protected," said O'Harver.

Sounds odd knowing that bucking horses are the most naturally kept, naturally performing domestic horses on the planet. When you know that the instance of injury is less than 0.1%, that the hardest working among them manage to log about 2 minutes a year on the clock. They'll never have a farrier nail a shoe on. They'll never feel a bit in their mouths, much less be asked to collect into shapes defined by fashion or discipline standards. Home is deep, grassy pastures where fences are hard to find and family bands form; retirement in soundness happens regularly at the end of long carefully managed careers.

If humanity for horses means great care with limited captivity and zero micromanagement, the bucking horse is the most humanely treated, employed horse we can point to. But still, they're misunderstood and at risk from political attack by animal rights groups who don't know them at all.

"Statistics show that 90% of the popula-

tion in the United States is urban based, far removed from the reality of the animal world," said O'Harver. "The American Horse Council (AHC) is the horseman's advocacy group operating in Washington D.C. Their last study proved that one out of every 63 people in the United States claimed a 'deep connection' to horses. We'll need each and every one of those people to fall in love with the reality of the bucking horse and not fall victim to the widely spread lies of 'animal rights' regimes who profit from donations extracted from good hearted people who simply don't know the truth."

"If we allow PETA and SHARK to be the loudest, most organized voice out there, we're essentially dooming bucking horses to extinction," O'Harver said. "It's way past time to organize and stand up for our way of life and what that truly entails. Historically, we've done a great job in terms of taking care of our horses on every level. Where we've failed is in giving those who would naturally fall in love with them the opportunity. We have to start the conversation ... the factual one."

"The partnership between the TBRA and BRN is a natural as both organizations serve the interests of the bucking horse community," Daryl McElroy said. "Our community is known for rugged independence. While that needs to be protected it's also time for outreach."

"Early in the developmental stages of Bronc Riding Nation, I visited with Mac Altizer," O'Harver said. "Mac is one of our

community's visionaries. My takeaway was this. 'We'd already be there if we'd have learned to all get in the harness and pull our wagon the same direction.'



Meet the Member Wayne West

A heart of gold with a faulty valve never slowed down Wild Wayne West from Lockwood, Missouri. A name derived from days spent in the Golden Gloves ring now lends itself to a rodeo clown walking the top rail of a rodeo arena. "I fought [Golden Gloves] for almost fifteen years and rode bulls, all while working even though I have a bad heart. Ironically, that put me in great shape." Wayne found a special, but risky, surgery to replace his valve, one of those replacements went bad this year leading to surgery on January 25. "They had to go back in and do open-heart surgery, but by the end of April I was in Mississippi clowning a college rodeo." Clowning at rodeos is one of the only reasons he has been able to pay off his medical expenses from the first surgery. Barnes and Sons Rodeo out of Tahlequah, Oklahoma, hires Wayne a lot. Barnes, along with Wayne's friends and family, put together a benefit to help pay off this latest surgery. "My town and church were overwhelmed by the amount of people and hours traveled to come to the benefit. I was blessed beyond measure." Now debt free from his surgery, Wayne can focus on all his business ventures. "I was born with a wrench in my hand, I changed my first head gaskets when I was about nine. Both my dad and step dad are mechanics, it is just something that I can naturally do." Wayne owns and operates West Automotive, not to be confused with his father's shop, Wild West Taxidermy, High Point Rodeo Productions and Three W Cattle, all on top of being a rodeo clown.

Wayne first entered a rodeo as a junior in high school, riding bareback horses and bulls, as well as team roping and chute

dogging. "The bareback riding hurt too much and I never could afford to practice team roping, but I loved the bulls. Some people fish, I rode bulls, that is what I loved doing." Wayne quit riding bulls in the ACRA and IPRA in his 40s, but never could quit rodeo all together. "I started producing bull riding events in 1992 in Springfield, Missouri, and somewhere in the middle of that I got asked to become a rodeo clown." One of his first big break-out performances was in Billings, Montana. Wayne's signatures at a rodeo starts 30 minutes before the performance, up in the crowd, getting to know people. "What we do is more important than any physical or financial gain; we never know what people are going through. For two hours I can help people escape what is going on in their life and have a little bit of fun and enjoy themselves." This hit home for Wayne four months after the Billings rodeo when he got a letter from the couple he talked to every single night of the rodeo. "It told me the wife of the couple I had talked to had been seriously ill for over ten years and that was the first time she laughed and had fun in ten years."

Married to his high school sweetheart Lisa for the last 36 years, Wayne has acquired more than just businesses. "I have two biological children, Sara and Burley. And then through teaching Sunday school I picked up three more daughters: Ryan, Charity and Lacey. They are my kids even though they have other parents." Wayne has 14 grandchildren, the oldest is currently serving in Kuwait and the youngest is only 17 months. Out of everything, Wayne's great life accomplishment is dedicating his life to Christ. "My biggest accomplishment, through God's guidance, is my family and the lives I have effected because of his grace." Along with Barnes and Sons, Wayne works a rodeo hosted by a church in Locust Grove, Oklahoma. "It is definitely the most rewarding, they do not charge admission and then they preach

a little bit in the middle. But they do not cheap out either, it is a really great rodeo."

Wayne is beginning to fill his pastures with cattle of a different color: spotted and brindled with horns, something most people in the area have not seen much of before. "We are taking the rodeo heifers that do not buck and putting black bulls on them." Wayne is working to build a 500-head herd to pass down to his grandson. "I will keep doing the taxidermy until I simply can't anymore. It is so relaxing and rewarding to see animals come back to life. Especially for the kids when they get their first big buck." "I have always said that I will continue to clown until I can no longer physically walk on the fence. When I cannot do that anymore I will be done but I will never quit rodeo." Barnes and Sons has permanent chute help the day Wayne quits clowning. "I just love that family and the rodeo life too much to leave it. I cannot imagine not being in rodeo in some aspect." 🐾

Meet the Member Jerry Miller

“Harley Tucker taught me how to bulldog and even though I was a rough stock rider, I’m pretty proud of the bulldogging buckle I won at a college rodeo in Pomeroy, Washington,” says Jerry Miller, NIRAA Alumni member from Crane, Oregon. “Harley showed me some wrestling holds and I really enjoyed steer wrestling. Whenever I could borrow a good bulldogging horse, I would enter but most of my college winnings came in the bareback and saddle bronc riding.”

Jerry Miller spent his early years on a ranch near Frenchglen, Oregon, close to the Nevada state line. Like most of the youngsters living in those remote areas of eastern Oregon, he attended a one room school house and later boarding school in Crane, Oregon for high school. He lives and ranches in Crane today but all that ranch work prepared him for rodeo competition.

He went to college at Oregon Tech in Klamath Falls and quickly teamed up with Bill Duffy. Bill Duffy and Jerry Miller were a team to be reckoned with in Saddle Bronc and Bareback Riding in the West Coast Region in 1957 and 1958. In 1957, at the College Finals in Colorado Springs, Duffy won the national Saddle Bronc Championship with Miller taking third place. That year, Miller also won fourth in the Bareback Riding and All-Around competition. In 1958, Miller was joined by Gary Gregg, also from Oregon Tech. Gregg and Miller finished third and fourth in Bareback Riding and Miller, once again finished fourth in the Saddle Bronc competition.

Miller not only credits Harley Tucker

with teaching him to bulldog, but also with producing quality college rodeos in the Pacific Northwest. “Tucker had plenty of the best bucking horses and bulls. I don’t think he ever cleared a dime putting on those college rodeos. I think he did it because he got a kick out of seeing the college kids compete. He had good bucking horses but one in particular I remember. I think his name was Oscar. I had that horse at a rodeo at Moses Lake, Washington. That

horse would go out a few jumps and just come apart. I had seen him go a few times, knew what was coming, and got by him.”

Jerry competed in rodeo for several years after college. Nowadays he stays close to home ranching near Crane. He and his wife Linda have been married for 58 years. Son Bill and daughters

Leeta and Tina are “good ranch hands but were never particularly interested in rodeo.” His son Bill has recently retired from teaching math and Spanish in high school. Leeta ranches near Winnemucca and Tina is her dad’s top hand at the ranch. The Millers have 11 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren, most not living close by but quite a few show up to help at branding time. “During branding we cook for around 50 people” says Linda.

“The best thing about college rodeo was the great people I met, knowing great guys like Bill Duffy and Gary Gregg and traveling with them, those are the things I remember!” says Jerry. 🐾

Meet the Member Chuck Melin

Chuck Melin is the first person to ever serve as both the Canadian Senior Professional Rodeo Association and the NSPRA president at the same time. September marks the first full year he will have lived in the United States. Chuck grew up in Edmonton, Alberta. "I grew up in a farming community and nobody rodeoed. I met a couple of guys that ended up being life-long friends that introduced me to rodeo." Chuck's friends also talked him into going to A.I. school in 1973. "I was selling nitrogen semen tanks for A.I. but then I sold one to the first dermatologist in town at the time. I went into strictly medical nitrogen sales after that." After 43 years of owning a nitrogen tank business, Chuck is now semi-retired. "Bob Stoddard, NSPRA vice president, owns several ranches in Wyoming, he asked me to help with weaning and gathering right after I moved here and now I work for him. I do pretty much whatever needs to be done on the ranches." He is in the



middle of branding and moving cattle at the moment. Chuck has never ridden just for the fun of it, until now. "I have ridden more in the last year than I have in the previous 40 years combined. I used to just ride for rodeo but now I love it."

A steer wrestler from the beginning, Chuck is in the middle of his 44th year of competing in the event. "I have never missed a year. My dad was dead against rodeo but I have done it ever since." Chuck started to rodeo a lot when he was 21 years old in the Foot Hills Cowboy Association. "I have been to several schools for steer wrestling, calf roping and team roping. I hated practicing in the winter in Canada so I took the winter off and then went to a school in the spring every year to brush back up." Everyone cites the adrenaline rush they get from their event as the reason why they do it. "Guys who ride bulls even say steer wrestling is the biggest adrenaline rush there is." At 66 years old, Chuck has been lucky enough to avoid major injuries to his knees. "I don't know many people my age that can throw down a steer in 3.8 seconds like I did at the Canadian finals last year." CSPRA and NSPRA co-approve rodeos, allowing competitors to get points in both

the U.S. and Canada for each association. "I rodeo at all of them on both sides of the border. It's crazy, the miles I put on but it is a passion." In the month of August alone, Chuck will spend 21 days at rodeos all over the U.S. and Canada. "In the last ten years I have been going to anywhere from 40 to 70 rodeos a year." Chuck also judges at some of the rodeos he attends. In 2005, Chuck met his wife, Ruth. "She is a nurse and I got hurt at the Douglas, Wyoming, rodeo. The rest is history really." Once Ruth retires in a few years they want to move to Canyon City, Colorado, since the weather is less severe than Alberta. "Rodeo has taken me a lot of places. I have probably been to at least 40 states."

"I have been a president of every rodeo association I have ever been in. I fully believe in contributing back to the associations." Cowboy of the Year and champion year-end steer wrestler for both associations multiple years in a row, Chuck is dedicated to continuing to rodeo for as long as he can. "The NSPRA allows me to travel and I love that about it. I get to meet so many different people, make friends for life from all over the country and all walks of life." 📺



ROPER REVIEW:

GARY MEFFORD

Gary Mefford found his vocation as a sophomore in high school in 1974, working part time at King Ropes in Sheridan, Wyoming. He started out tying knots and rapidly expanded to tying burners and picking up orders. Nearly 43 years later, he knows the shop like one of his favorite four strand ropes, and co-manages it with Dan Morales. "My brother grew up with Bob King, and they got me the job here," says Gary. "It was just going to be part time while I was going to school, but I went to college in Sheridan and kept working here. I got my degree in mine maintenance – hydraulics and welding – but by that time, I was close enough friends with Bobby that if I needed some

extra time off to go down the road, I could get my work done ahead of time and then take off. There's not a lot of jobs in this world that allow you to do that. You get to enjoy what you do, and you're working

with the public a lot. We get a lot of walk-in trade here, especially in the summer months. We get Europeans in here all the time, and a lot of Argentines, Canadians, and South Africans. We ship ropes all over the world, like Brazil, Australia, and Europe. It's a world-wide operation, but percentage-wise, the majority of our business is in the states."

An average day for Gary at King Ropes starts with picking out ropes for the latest orders, giving the knot tyers ropes to work on, tying hondos, pulling grass ropes down, and working on stock. From June through August, they're stocking trailers for 3 – 4 weeks to go to the NHSFR and Cheyenne Frontier Days, followed by the WNFR in December. "I'll start working on trailer ropes 6 to 8 weeks before they leave for Vegas," says Gary. "We take 1,500 to 2,000 ropes and we might sell 700 to 800, but we've figured out over the years what we sell a lot of. When we have 500 variations of ropes, you never know what people will ask for, between different sizes and materials and stiffnesses and lengths. It's such personal preference on what people like in a rope. Team ropers are always look-

ing for the new fix, but the rope only does what the hand tells it to, and the hand only does what the mind tells it to. We've stayed pretty much with the old style ropes we've had for fifty years."

The YouTube television series *How It's Made* created a documentary four years ago on how ropes are made, featuring King Ropes. "I like the four strand ropes. We buy all our four strands in bobbies and put them through our stretching process, and they feel quite different when they've gone through the stretching process," Gary explains. "The rope is stretched at a field outside of town. The rope comes in 600 feet coils and we tie it off at the end of the field and roll it with the tractor and pull it to the other end. It might take several days or three weeks or three months before they're straight. The poly grass ropes that calf ropers like to use we do in a hot room in the basement that's 130 degrees. But the Nylon comes out better if it's stretched outside in the natural cooling and heating – the whole process makes them better than if we were doing them in the hot room."

While Gary grew up in town in Sheridan, his grandparents homesteaded on

the Montana/Wyoming border in the early 1900s. His dad worked on ranches and later did highway construction. Gary was given an old rope horse by his older brother Dick when he was 9 or 10. "I high school rodeoed my junior and senior year, and college rodeoed locally. I jackpotted and team roped after that," says Gary, who prefers to heel. "It's such a challenge to do it well." He competes in mixed team roping with Miff Koltiska, and competed several times with Mark Moreland at the Reno Invitational. He's also roped at the WSTR Finale in Las Vegas at least eight times. "I cut my thumb off at the Reno Invitational in 2011 – I did it on the biggest stage," says Gary. "They tried putting it back on, but it didn't take. I just reach for stuff differently – I don't even think about it. That was in the spring and I'd only won a few hundred dollars at some winter and spring ropings. After losing my thumb, I won \$3,800 and three buckles. I'd been in a slump, and after that happened, I relaxed and things fell in place. I guess my thumb was just getting in the way."

Gary also puts on roping jackpots and contracts roping steers to high school, college, and cowgirl rodeos. He has 100 head

of longhorn cows and raises his own roping steers at his home outside of Sheridan. His wife, Sara, helps put on the jackpots, works as secretary, runs chutes, and moves steers. She worked at King Ropes for several years, and enjoys team sorting and team roping. Their four-year-old daughter, Londyn, competes on her pony in barrel racing, pole bending, and goat tail untying.

"My mind is always working on what I have to do after work," says Gary, who works six days a week at King Ropes, along with hauling steers and putting on jackpots and team sortings. "I just make sure everything is prearranged in my brain on what I need to do. This doesn't leave me very much time to practice. While working at King's Saddlery over the years, I have met a lot of team ropers and have become friends with several of them such as Bobby Harris, Rich Skelton, Mike Beers who are some of the best heelers in the world. They all have offered me a chance to go rope with them. I just don't know how I would ever fit it in, without my wife having to do all the work at home. But there would be nothing better than to take the time and go rope with them for a month." 🐾

HOW DO YOU CHOOSE?

If you get a chance take some time and ask other fellow ropers how they choose where to go rope. I can bet you'll get every explanation under the sun. With the changes that are occurring in the industry I find it fascinating to ask because each roper has a valid reasoning behind their preferences. I'll put them in three different roping categories, Roper #1, Roper #2, and Roper #3.

Roper #1. He prefers a smaller fee jackpot where he can throw his rope more often. He doesn't care for the marathon ropings where they give away a truck or a trailer or 20 saddles. He likes when he can get in a #8 and there isn't a heeler cap. He's on a budget when it comes to fees so he'd rather take \$150 and be able to stretch that out through a weekend rather than enter one roping. The more opportunities to throw his rope the better.

Roper #2. He's the guy hitting the big World Series, doesn't matter how far away, he'll make them all. He enters up, and most likely wins a few of them too. His goal each year is to enter Vegas and have as many runs as he can to make it worth the trip. He might go to Reno as well, even the USTRC or the Wrangler Championships but he's not the guy you'll see at the backyard jackpots. He'd rather enter up, spend the \$150 on a run for the chance to win \$8,000+.

Roper #3. He's the one that doesn't jackpot. He loves to rope, but doesn't go to town. He rides nice horses, has a great setup, and stays home. He would rather run a pen, drink cold beer, hang out with his buddies, and hear all about people's numbers and how they got raised over the weekend. He also keeps his money together, purely roping for the enjoyment of it and that is all.

Which one are you? Maybe you're a

combination of a couple or all three, or you go through phases of them. This sport is changing and changing for the better I believe. It will be interesting to see what this next year brings; I think we'll be seeing big things again that will hopefully benefit each roper out there. 🍷





I'm hoping to take over my grandfather's ranch (Chester Bench, in Hugo, Oklahoma, right on the border. "Whenever I get a free weekend I go up there and learn as much as I can."

Mason headed from Lebanon to Calgary, where he competed in the steer riding. This is his second trip to Canada – his family made the trip a family vacation last year. "My favorite part was downhill bik-



ing in Montana." They visited Yellowstone, the Royal Gorge and lots of other stops on the way to Canada. He took reserve this year, and won it last year.

Mason got his start at the age of 2 – riding sheep. "My dad rode bulls, and he put me on them and it went from there." His mom, Tina, hauls him to all his rodeos. "We usually go one place every week." He has two sisters, – Mabry (10) and Maddy (17). "My little sister rode sheep and calves, but didn't move up to steers – she's done with it. I wish I had a brother

so I could show him what I know." He keeps in shape by working out whenever he can. I have a stationary bike and dumbbells – I have a little routine– I do some jump rope, dumbbells, pullups, sit ups and pushups." When he's not rodeoing, he has a lot of schoolwork. "I'm a straight A student, so I keep up with that." Mason got a scholarship from CINCH for his grades at nationals.

"Dream big – that's my life quote – you can't accomplish anything unless you think about it."




Meet the Member Josey Murphy

Josey Murphy is 15 years old and ended her first year in high school by winning the National High School All Around Rookie of the Year as well as 11th in the barrels. This All Around title is not new to her – in her junior high career she had back-to-back All Around titles for the Louisiana Junior High Rodeo Association. She competes in barrels, poles, breakaway, goats, and team roping.

“I really wasn’t going for that – I was focused on trying to win the breakaway and be competitive in the barrels. It worked out great.” She won Gist Silver-smith buckle, and a pair of Bex sunglasses, an American Hat certificate and a \$1,000 scholarship. “It’s a great feeling – to be there – 48 states – to be the best one there is an amazing feeling.” Josey spent

many hours practicing before Nationals. In the afternoons when it was too hot to ride, she’d rope the dummy. “We’d rope and ride every night until 10:30 or so. The time and effort paid off. I also believe that if you take good care of your horses – happy horses make competitive horses.”

She started competing when she was three. “My mom (Julie) got a really old horse for me and I started walking and trotting around and pretty soon I could lope the pattern myself so we went to playdays.” She practices everyday on one

of her eight horses. “There are around 35 horses on the place – my family, especially my dad and my uncle, gets horses in to tune on or sell.” Murphy Ranch is located in Keatchie, Louisiana. “There is a little store and a four way red light, two churches, and that’s town,” she said. “I love it – it’s very pretty – green grass and hills.” Josey has one older brother, Macon, 18. “Now that he almost full time rodeos, it’s brought us closer – we help each other out and support each other.” Macon is a senior in high school and was named one of the top 50 basketball guards in the nation. He competes in calf roping and team roping. They practice together at home, and sometimes at the end of the practice session, their dad, KC, will call for a three calf match, and they will compete with each other. “My dad screams, saying ‘you just won a \$30,000 trailer’ to make it fun.” KC has a fence building company, he also buys and sells cows, as well as hay that is raised on the ranch. Everybody in her dad’s family lives on the ranch, her uncle along with her grandparents.

Her first year of high school “was one to remember. I had such a great time with friends and going to Nationals and winning – I had a blast.” There are 150 students at the high school, located in Grand Cane, 20 minutes away. “My brother and I rodeo together and will again this year.” School will start again in a week and she’s not excited. “I would rather be home riding.”

Josey knows she wants to rodeo when she gets out of high school. “I might try for the NFR but I’m not positive. I haven’t thought about what I want to study, but I know I want to rodeo.” Rodeo seems to be in the family blood. “My dad’s side of the family is from Montana, and my mom’s side is from South Texas, so everyone loves rodeo. Just being able to do this sport is a true blessing and I can’t thank my parents and all my sponsors enough.”

Meet the Member Scott Broadaway

For long-time ACA calf roper Scott Broadaway, Jonesboro, Arkansas, is home, regardless of how far away he got in the past. "Every time I leave I end up coming back so I just stayed this time. It is my home." Scott grew up on a ranch. Riding and roping were second nature to him. "I will never forget the day I was sitting with my dad and I told him I wanted to rope competitively." The very next day they went to a cattle sale and bought 12 roping calves. With no arena at home they set them loose in the auction barn arena where Scott would pick one out of the group, rope and tie it. "It got in my blood pretty deep and became my passion. I have tried to be the best that I can possibly be and I got there." At 16 years old he started competitively roping calves, first in the amateur associations and then professionally. From 1978 until 1995, Scott was on the rodeo road full time. "My goal was to be best calf roper from Arkansas. I remember when Denny Flynn was the highest point bull ride at a professional rodeo and I won the calf roping. His bull ride got us both on the front page of the pro rodeo news." At age 25, Scott knew he had made it in rodeo when he shook hands with Bobby Goodspeed after making the best run of his life in the pouring rain. "A drug addiction got me out of the game of rodeo for almost 20 years. I have been clean and sober for 13 years now, but my biggest accomplishment is being

saved. God has allowed me to find myself and to get back into rodeo."

Scott mainly team ropes now, heading for various heelers, including: Steve Reed, Todd Bledsoe, Pat Carmitty and Stan Rider. "I want to be the guy that stays busy in the game of rodeo, whether it be judging or heading steers. I strive to be the best that I am capable of being at heading steers." Scott still holds his original card with the number 400 on it and has seen the ACA grow from its infancy to the as-

sociation it is today. "It has grown to be a great association and they have many more members than when I first joined. I like to help them however I can and that is why I started judging rodeos." Scott and his heelers are sitting in the middle of the pack as they start looking towards making multiple circuit finals. "It was one of my goals when I started back, I wanted to hold myself accountable and shoot for the year-end awards." Some physical limitations held Scott back when he started roping again just last year. A broken pelvis and dislocated hip put Scott on the sidelines but he got back in the pen as quickly as he could. "I almost got to where I felt confident enough to go rope competitively and then I had another colon surgery, making a total of seven." Healthy and ready to rope, Scott is on the road with his neighbor and fellow header

as much as possible. He works as a substance abuse counselor when he is home. "For a long time I wanted to rope but I was afraid of running into old habits. One day I woke up and I just could not take it anymore, I had to

rope. It was a struggle to come back but it has made it that much better." A special thanks goes out to his sponsors: Ryan Liggett from C and L Saddles and Tack, Chase Bigbee from Running P Ropes and Stormi Barger from Short Go Xtreme. Scott is proud of his accomplishments and getting back into roping but there is just one thing missing from his life. "Mimi McKay, will you marry me and make me the happiest man in the world?"





Meet the Member Taylor Kuntz

Not many people can rope with a sibling but 14-year-old Taylor Kuntz from Johns Island, South Carolina, does just that. “He always knows his partner is going to show up and they can practice together,” said Katherine, his mom. Taylor’s 16-year-old sister, Bailey, is the reason everyone got back into roping in the first place. “Chris [their dad] was roping a lot when Taylor was about five and he took the next three years off. We thought we were going to get out of horses but then Bailey said she wanted rodeo so we got back into it.” Katherine grew up in the cattle industry and spends most of her time on the road with her kids. “We travel about 40 week-ends of the year. If we are not at some kind of high school rodeo or JSRA, we are looking for a barrel race or team roping to go.” For the time being, Chris mostly fills in for Bailey when Taylor needs a header. “Professional chute help” is his self-proclaimed title for the time being. “We mostly keep roping steers here for the kids to practice on but we have some Angus cattle also.” Taylor originally started out as a header but switched to the heeling side of things. “He swaps out with his sister sometimes. Roping with siblings can be pretty tough, they get into arguments sometimes. They hold each other to pretty high standards though.”

Taylor thinks roping with his sister helps make him better. “Everything is always the others’ fault. She is a lot harder on me than anybody else and that pushes me,” Taylor said. Their dad ropes with Taylor at a lot of jackpots and US roping events. “I have been team roping for as long as I can remember but I also rope calves, chute dog and tie goats.” He team roped with Bailey in the JSRA last year. “My favorite part about the JSRA is getting to see all my friends and making a whole lot more. I also get to travel

across the country. I go to a whole lot more places than I would if I did not rodeo.” A three-time national qualifier, his favorite rodeo was last year’s nationals. “I probably competed my best out there and met a lot of new people. And this year was just too muddy.” Taylor was the state champion in boys breakaway roping last year, earning him the trip to nationals. Also in 2016, Bailey and Taylor won the first round in the team roping at the JSRA finals. “My proudest run so far was at the Michael Hare Memorial Team Roping this past January. There were 113 teams and we did not get started until two in the morning.” Taylor finished his final year in junior high rodeo as the number four chute dogger, fifth in the ribbon roping with his partner Taylor Pierce and seventh in the breakaway roping.

Taylor will be a freshman this year in South Carolina Virtual Charter Schools where his favorite subjects to study are history and science. “I played football for a year and baseball for five. I was little when I first started baseball but then I decided to focus on rodeo. We could not do both so I have been doing rodeo ever

since.” Taylor has few hobbies outside of roping and rodeo, but he does like to hunt and fish. The biggest game he has brought home was an eight-point buck last November. “I just got my new calf and heel horse, Cheerio. He is a ten-year-old, line-back dun and he is super patient in the box. The horse I had before him I gave to my sister because they got along better.” Staying true to his love for travel and rodeo, Taylor plans to go to school anywhere west of the Mississippi and continue to rope in college and beyond. 🐾

Meet the Member Jim Buckner

Circle J&K Cattle Co. produced its first event six years ago, but the owner, Jim Buckner, foresaw a career as a rodeo producer years earlier while he was still competing in rodeo. "I'm first generation rodeo," says Jim, who rode bulls for 18 years. "We had cattle when I was growing up, but no one in my family ever had the idea of being a rodeo cowboy. I grew up on the south side of Houston, and one of my best memories as a kid was the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. I got the bug then and never really lost sight of it." Jim's parents weren't keen on him being a rodeo athlete, but he started rodeoing when he was 17. He made the Southeastern Pro Bull Rider Finals in the mid '90s and competed in the PRCA for five years, but after some serious injuries and then the birth of his first child, Jim competed locally for several more years but retired from pro rodeo. "I really had no complaints. I got to walk away from my career on my own two feet," he says. "I could see the writing on the wall long before the end was there, and I knew I wanted to be in the business end of it. With the contacts I had with producers and stock contractors, I had lots of insight from them on what to do and what not to do."

Jim and his wife, Kelli, and their four children, Daylee (15), Camryn (11), Dallas (9), and Marley (3), live in Ardmore, Tennessee, and produce full rodeos and bull ridings. They have a full arena set-up and bulls that they lease out all over the Southeast, while Kelli is opening a women's boutique in Ardmore. Jim also has a crew that works for him part time. "If it weren't for the guys that work for me, we couldn't make it happen," he says. He's strictly a bull man, and Jim has taken several of his bulls to the SPRA finals and SEBRA finals. Since he is a fireman, on

duty 24 hours, followed by two days off, he set up the pens and gates so his kids can feed and water stock when he's not home. "They know which bulls they can be around or stay away from, and they take care of their own horses. In between my oldest running cross country, my middle girl playing softball and basketball, and my son playing football, rodeo practice is early in the morning or the middle of the day. There's no such thing around our house as a free minute. My oldest two have paid their own rodeo entry fees for two years now, and they've learned work ethic and business. As far as my wife and children are concerned, I have been blessed far beyond what I deserve.

"The main thing with starting our rodeo business is that we spent a lot of time doing things the right way and positioning ourselves with the right people. I met with the Hall family nine years ago, getting a few bulls from them. They provided me with really good stock, and I give them credit for really turning the business around. We're only producing three events this year, but they are three quality

events. I dedicate a lot of time to them and they draw good crowds and a good number of contestants that will support us. I had the opportunity to bid on my hometown rodeo and we got the contract. It's neat for me because I was a contestant at the first rodeo in our hometown and now I'm producing the twenty-fifth anniversary event." The Ardmore rodeo is SPRA sanctioned, along with the Bulls and Broncs event the Buckners are putting on this fall. They've also done several SEBRA bull ridings and PCA rodeos, and recently landed three rodeos with Dan Phillips of Phillips Championship Rodeo.

"We've got some bulls that I feel like are good enough to go to some PBR's. I recently did some videos and we'll see if we can get our foot in the door," says Jim. "I'd like to have six or seven solid events a year, whether they are rodeos or bull ridings. I've seen 32 of the 50 states and I have friends from the Atlantic to the Pacific, so from that aspect, rodeo has been very profitable for me. Like any business owner, I want to see my business grow. The best part of it is that my family is right there with me." 🐾

Meet the Member Riggin Dailey

If it hadn't been for a broken arm, 22-year-old Riggin Dailey from Gansevoort, New York, may have never stepped into his bullfighting cleats. "When I was younger, I was kind of meant to be a bull rider. I had all the opportunities, but I wasn't very interested in it," says Riggin. "When I was eight, I was fighting little calves at my grandpa's bull riding, but I just wanted to rope. Four years ago, I broke my arm and got laid off the job I was at, and a guy asked me to fight bulls for him, so I started fighting bulls with a broken arm. I was on a horse and it fell on me and broke my humerus bone, and probably without that, I wouldn't have started fighting bulls."

Riggin is the third generation of his family to be involved in the bucking bull industry. His grandpa owns bucking bulls and his dad is a bullfighter. "I think each person has his item, and mine is to step in there and take a hooking for a guy and save them. That's what drives me. My dad has helped me out, and I grew up watching him. He worked fifteen circuit finals and is labeled one of the best up here, so I think it helped me just listening and watching. I grew up around bulls and studying how they move and react to things."

Riggin has worked for Wayne Martin, and last year he fought bulls for Sean Graham, but he's focusing more on his team roping in the APRA this season. "The toughest part about team roping and fighting bulls at the same time is that you have a partner involved and you can't just skip a rodeo," Riggin explains. "This summer I've been basing my schedule around team roping. I bought my APRA card in 2012 and I took a little break from

team roping and went right to fighting bulls, but this year I feel like I'm partnered pretty well and I wanted to give it another shot." Riggin heels for Jacob Rounds and Dan Brown, and he's worked on his roping with Darren Morgan and Jade Edwards. "I work for Darren a bit, and he's helped me a ton. Jade Edwards is a phenomenal heeler, and if I have any questions at all I go to him. Right now I'm around a great group of guys that really help me get to the next level. It really helps being around other people that are winning and rope better. Up here, it's like a small family," Riggin adds. "I think that's really the best part of it. Win or lose, in twenty years I'm not going to remember the steer run, but I'm going to remember the good times I had with people."

Between rodeos, Riggin works for Bob Hoyt training thoroughbreds. "We'll be the first hands on them. Most of the time they're two-year-olds and we start them from teaching them how to lead, to getting saddled and going around the race-track and exercising. I'm learning to shoe horses from Darren Morgan and apprenticing with him. I just started this year and I really enjoy it. He's a great guy to work

with and a good teacher, and I'll hopefully make a career out of it."

Riggin also enjoys riding colts and hopes to pick up golfing more, but his primary focus is rodeo. His girlfriend, Payton Jones, won the APRA in breakaway roping last year, and Riggin heel off her horse when they're at the same rodeos. "It's really been a blessing to have this mare. The way she transitions to each event is really amazing, and she gives me a shot to win every time," says Riggin. "In bullfighting right now, I'm working on getting my PRCA card, and freestyle bullfighting is kind of my next step. In the roping, I'm hoping to make the ARA and circuit finals, and take it one steer at a time."

Meet the Member

There's a saying, 'jump first, fear later,' and there's perhaps no better way to embrace that than to do what Australian cowboy, Josh Barnett, did for his 21st birthday. He got on a plane and headed to America for the very first time to compete for a whole summer season in the International Professional Rodeo Association riding broncs.

"It was kind of a last minute decision really, but it's always been something I've wanted to do," he describes. Josh grew up on his family's ranch with a beef cattle feedlot, baling hay and raising Australian Quarter Horses and stock horses. He credits his family for their support and getting him his start at a young age, driving him around to competitions.


He's grown up competing on the family's horses and rode steers as a kid, before turning to riding bulls and broncs.

"I only started riding broncs probably four years ago, and I will probably stick with broncs now," he says adding that he's come to America to focus solely on riding broncs, and it's been paying off exponentially.

Josh has shot to the top of the IPRA standings since his recent arrival in June.

Back home in Australia, he's still getting his start in the rookie levels as well, so it was a perfect time to cross the ocean and try his hand in the professional ranks with the IPRA, especially with its prevalence in the eastern half of the United States and Canada.

The successes of fellow Australians, Ty Parkinson, Luke Morgan, and Josh's

traveling partner, Ben Maytom, who all have multiple championship titles and IFR qualifications among them, has motivated Australian competitors who have followed their journey, and Josh was one of them.

"I've always been friends with Ben, and we followed him when he was over here the last few years, and he asked me to come over," Josh says. It was a scary choice he admits, having to make the leap and quit his job, but he did it. "It was hard. I didn't know whether to quit my job, but I came and did it while I could. It's always been something I've wanted to do, so I did it."

Josh admits he's been pleasantly surprised by how things are going. "I've had a bit of luck and drew some really good horses, and I've been lucky to pick up good money so far."

Rodeos in America and Canada are bigger than back home, he describes and says he's been impressed by their professionalism. It's also a much busier schedule than he's used to.

"Lots of driving, lots of road nights compared to back home where you can only really do one a weekend, if that. You can do one every day here. We've got, I think, one day off in July," he laughs.

Josh says he's enjoyed meeting so many fellow contestants in both countries.

"It's definitely a good way to meet people. Everyone gets on good. It's a good group of people. It's a good environment to be around that's for sure."

Rodeo overall, especially making this big of a commitment to it as he's done this summer, has impacted the young cowboy and taught him a lot about dedication.

"You've definitely got to give it 100 percent. You can't half-hearted do it. That's probably been my problem for the last couple of years, I've been half-trying to ride bulls, half-trying to [ride broncs], so it makes it a lot easier if you just focus everything on what you want to do and chase it, for sure."

And as far as chasing it goes, Josh is certainly hot on its heels so far with a strong shot at his first International Finals Rodeo qualification come January. 📺



A LITTLE ENCOURAGEMENT

Continued from the August 1 issue on the five things rodeo contestants want their parents to know...

3. Slumps happen! Slumps are the worst! When nothing will fall your way, it seems like the world is ending. The best thing about slumps is that they only last forever if you quit. Parents, keep entering them. Keep going to the practice pen. Keep letting them know this is a temporary thing and try to take off all the pressure on these kids that you possibly can because they are putting more than enough pressure on themselves. Step back and support them through it.

4. Rodeo is HARD! When you mix kids that aren't even old enough to drive with thousand pound animals moving fast enough to get you a speeding ticket in a school zone, things can get hairy. Once you enter the arena or nod your head, things happen quick! If you are a parent that has never entered a rodeo event, it's difficult to describe what your kid is experiencing. Horses and stock don't always cooperate. Plus there are other kids there that work just as hard on just as nice of horses trying to achieve the same thing. Competition in rodeo is TOUGH these days. Be reasonable with your expectations of how your kid should perform each rodeo. They have off days just like we do, especially around those teenage (aka hormones stole my kid) years.

5. They wish you wouldn't compare them to other kids. Every kid's journey is different and each kid will face different obstacles along the

way. You might not see some of these obstacles because many times these obstacles are mental. Mind Gym is a fantastic book that can really help your kids with the mental aspect of all sports. I highly recommend all kids read this book or listen to it on those long road trips! Some kids are not natural athletes and they will have to work 10x harder than other kids. In these kids, acknowledging their hard work and encouraging them for one more tenth of a second faster time will get more out of them than expecting them to perform out of their level of ability. You can't expect Michael Phelps to compete with Usain Bolt and vice versa. We all have our own talents and abilities. Making comparisons between your kid and others makes them feel like you wish the other kid was your kid or you are more proud of one kid than the other and it can be very damaging to your relationship.

This is just my take on things from the points of view I have been lucky enough to see. Many hours in a trailer and late night drives have been a great way to connect with these kids and hear about what they experience and need from us. We are all going to fail at this from time to time but I'm going to attempt to be a good rodeo parent for my little cowboy and enjoy this ride for the short time it's going to last. 🐾

COOK SHACK

CREAM CHEESE FILLED SNICKERDOODLES

recipes courtesy of Samantha Schemper

makes 24 cookies

INGREDIENTS:

Cookies

1½ cups sugar
1 cup room temp butter
2 eggs
1 tsp vanilla
2¾ cups all purpose flour
2 tsp cream of tartar
1 tsp baking soda
¼ tsp salt
¼ cup sugar
2 tsp cinnamon

Filling

8 oz cream cheese, softened
¼ cup sugar
2 tsp vanilla

DIRECTIONS:

Make the cream cheese filling by mixing the cream cheese, ¼ cup sugar and 2 tsp vanilla. I used my hand mixer for this. Cover the cream cheese mixture and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 400°.

Cream butter and 1½ cup sugar until fluffy. Add eggs and 1 tsp vanilla. Mix until combined. On low speed mix in your flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt. Set dough to the side. In a small bowl combine remaining ¼ cup sugar and 2 tsp cinnamon, set that aside as well. Remove the cream cheese mixture from the refrigerator. For each cookie you will need 2 flattened balls of

dough, 1 Tbsp each. (The flattened disk will be approx 2" in diameter) Place 1 tsp of the cream cheese mixture on top of one of the flattened dough disks. Then place the other flattened dough on top of the cream cheese. Pinch the edges together to seal. Carefully form into a ball and roll in the cinnamon sugar mixture. Place on a plate as you finish making each and refrigerate. Before baking the cookies they should chill for 15 minutes. When the dough is chilled bake on a parchment lined baking sheet 2" apart for 8 minutes. Transfer to wire rack to cool. **NOTE:** Store in an airtight container, refrigerate if keeping for more than 1 day

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup peanut butter
1 cup sugar
1 cup corn syrup
6 cups corn flakes

DIRECTIONS:


Heat the corn syrup and sugar until melted, add the peanut butter until it's melted into the sugar. Add corn flakes and scoop onto parchment paper.
