REJOICE

ejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." The Bible. Philippians 4:4-7

Primer words:

- Defeated. Worried. Unsettled. Blaming. Heavy. Depressed. Spun-up. Victimized. Angry. Regretful. Agitated. Vengeful. Contentious. Uptight. Shallow. Cynical. Shame driven. Controlling. Avoiding. Substance numbing. Fearful. Nervous. Edgy. Recycling the past. Obsessing over an unknown future.
- Peaceful. Light. Anchored. Hopeful. Serene. Overcoming. Honest. Courageous. Secure. Relaxed in Grace. Steady. Tranquil. Busy with the right things. Alive. Awake. Sober. Content. Humble. Nimble. Kind. Strong. Authentically at peace with the past. Calm and enjoying the now. Looking forward to the future.

Referring to the Scripture above: Did you notice that Paul doubles down on the "rejoice" thing by repeating it? In my Sunday Sermon Series, I mentioned to our folks in SE Oklahoma, that this rejoice issue is either a Cruel Taunt or a Doable Lifestyle. He doesn't repeat it for nothing.

As I mention often, life is difficult. Remember that Paul wrote from Rome where he was under house arrest. God had not released him and in fact is not going to. He dies in Rome.

For Susie and me, our life is as real as yours. As I type, a relative is undergoing a surgery and another has recently gone through a multiple bypass heart surgery. Oddly, both Susie and I got hit hard with the same virus. Her in April. Me in June. Around us there are marriage issues, financial issues, heartbreak, family squabbles and varsity levels of hard headedness. I am concerned about the world our 13 grandkids will inherit.

Paul knows what he is talking about. He has and is currently living tough

times. The way I read the whole of his letter, he realizes that how one thinks about a situation is how one will experience it. Paul says he has "learned the secret of being content" (*Phil 412*). He is not joking about 'rejoice always'.

The first group of words I opened this article with is a primer of those who refuse to rejoice. They cannot get past the hurtful and painful parts of life without anger or withdrawal. The future is worrisome at best. They have decided this verse is somehow out of a dark place in Paul's head and not really intended to be taken seriously. Even though it is a major theme in this letter, they must believe it's a cruel joke from Paul.

But those who have learned to honestly rejoice have a different energy about them. They are marked by different descriptors. The second primer might be accurate for them. We're not talking about the phony variety of shallow self-talk here. But the real thing. Honest joy.

Paul's rejoicing must come from deep, internal, authentic places of security and trust. Even though the Romans were coming after the Jews and would soon sack Jerusalem. (70AD). Even though he knew he would most likely die in Rome. Which he did (Roman decapitation in 67AD). Even though he had enemies (*Phil 3:2*) who were undermining his work of Christ-centered grace for all. He rejoiced.

He believed that his chains "encouraged" others (*Phil 1:14*). He trusted that "to live is Christ, and to die is gain"(*Phil 1:21*). He knew that his earthly credentials were nothing "compared to the sur-

passing greatness of knowing Christ" (*Phil 3:7-8*). He knew not to trust in his past resume but to "strain forward" in his calling (*Phil 3:13-14*) and that he could do "all things through Christ" who gave him strength (*Phil 4:13*).

"Rejoice always" is not a cruel joke by an out of touch preacher. Rather, rejoicing in everything is a doable reality. We don't need to choose cynicism, stoicism, escapism, depression or other games to cope. To honestly "rejoice always" is to have courage when others panic, to have a calm when others have anxiety and to have a tranquility that rises above all circumstances.

It is to know that Jesus has the past, present and future covered. It is to know the "peace of God which transcends all understanding" (Phil 4:7).

Rejoice my friends. If Paul could do it, maybe we can as well.

Our past is forgiven and under grace. Our future is with Christ. That allows the Christian to rejoice regardless of what life offers. Give it a try. Rejoice.

PRORODEO Hall of Fame WELCOMES 2019 CLASS

tars converged at the ProRodeo Hall of Fame as the Hall enshrined its 12-member class of 2019 Saturday. The class was headlined by four-time world champion team roping heeler Allen Bach (1979, 1990, 1995 and 2006). "I've just been reflecting on how cool our sport has been," Bach said. "Everything about my life is based around rodeo. The team roping schools I do, the business that I do. Had it not been for rodeo, I would not have anything." Bach holds the PRCA record for most qualifications (including invitations) by a team roper to the National Finals Rodeo with 30 (1978-96, 1998-2008). "Our sport represents our nation better than any other - you never see a cowboy disrespect the flag." In 2007, Bach became the 11th rodeo competitor to surpass \$2 million in career earnings. Bach joined the PRCA in 1978.

The rest of the 2019 ProRodeo Hall of Fame inductees included Commotion, one of the greatest bucking horses of all time; stock contractors Elra Beutler and his son, Jiggs, posthumously; two-time world champion steer wrestler Dean Gorsuch (2006, 2010); world champion bull rider Doug "Droopy" Brown (1969); world champion bareback rider Larry Peabody (1984); notable Jerome Robinson; the Cody (Wyo.) Stampede Rodeo; contract personnel Tommy Lucia, posthumously; and three Women's Professional Rodeo Association inductees – barrel racers Jimmie Gibbs Munroe and Sammy Thurman Brackenberry and notable Florence Youree.

In addition to the inductees, Guy Elliott, a former arena director for the National Western Stock Show and Rodeo in Denver and the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo and a number of others, received the Ken Stemler Pioneer Award, which honors individuals in recognition of their groundbreaking, innovative ideas and forward thinking.

Commotion

Bareback Horse

Commotion won three Bareback Riding Horse of the Year awards (1998-2000) when he was part of the Beutler and Gaylord Rodeo Company string. The 1,300-pound, bay stallion, who stood at 16.1 hands, was voted the top bareback horse at his first Wrangler NFR in 1997. He made 10 consecutive trips (1997-2006) to the Wrangler NFR before retiring in his prime at the 2006 Finals at the age of 15. Two rounds were won on him at the Wrangler NFR. Commotion has sired more than 70 horses who have gone on to compete at the Wrangler NFR.

Elra Beutler & Jiggs Beutler Stock Contractor

Elra and his son, John Arthur "Jiggs," Beutler formed Beutler and Son Rodeo Company in 1956. Elra had previously worked with his brothers, Jake and Lynn, to form the Beutler Brothers Rodeo Company. The new company started with seven rodeos its first year. That steadily increased until the Beutlers were putting on about 30 each year across six states. The Beutler name has been part of professional rodeo for decades, from the onset of Beutler Brothers Rodeo Company in 1929 to the collaboration of Beutler & Son Rodeo Company.

Focusing on quality over quantity, they chose rodeos based on the traveling needs of their stock. They sent livestock to the NFR every year between 1959-1962 and

from 1964-1988. "I always thought Jiggs and Elra should have been in the (ProRodeo Hall of Fame) before me," said Bennie Beutler, who was inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in 2010. "Elra taught me all about the stock and being a horseman and Jiggs taught me how to run the rodeos. They were good at what they did, and they lived and bled rodeo. It doesn't get any better than this to get Commotion and Jiggs and Elra in the Pro-Rodeo Hall of Fame." Jiggs was Bennie's father and Elra was Bennie's grandfather. Bennie's sisters, rodeo secretaries Vickie Shireman and Dollie Riddle, gave the acceptance speech for Elra and Jiggs.

Dean Gorsuch

Steer Wrestler

Gorsuch, a steer wrestler with two world titles, eight qualifications to the Wrangler NFR, two Tour titles and \$1.3 million in career earnings has certainly earned his spot in the ProRodeo Hall of Fame.

Gorsuch said it takes complete dedication to compete and be successful in Pro-Rodeo. When his sons (Taydon, Trell and Teagan) got older, his priorities shifted

from rodeo to fatherhood. "Rodeo has been God's plan, and I couldn't have thought it out or dreamed it would be like this," Gorsuch said.

The Nebraska cowboy started his PRCA career in 2002 and rapidly rose to ProRodeo stardom as he made his first Wrangler NFR qualification in 2005 and won his first world title in 2006. He went on to qualify again ever year from 2008 through 2013, picking up his second world title in 2010.



Doug "Droopy" Brown Bull Rider

Brown won the 1969 bull riding world championship with \$27,610. It was one of 13 total NFR qualifications – five in bull riding and eight in saddle bronc riding (though one year he did not compete due to injury). "Rodeo will define who you are," he said. "It's pretty humbling when you go through (the Hall of Fame) displays of all the predecessors who are in here and to think that you're in with this group." Brown said. "I think every cowboy going down the road wants his career to end this way."

Larry Peabody

Bareback Rider

Peabody, a Montana native, made a steady climb in rodeo to his 1984 bareback riding world title.

Within three years of becoming a member, Peabody had qualified for his first National Finals Rodeo. He went on to make five total, all consecutive, and

crowned it with the 1984 bareback riding championship.

Peabody also won the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association bareback riding title in 1981. He won the Montana Pro Rodeo Circuit bareback riding yearend title four times, the circuit team roping title once and the all-around once.

In 1981, that first NFR trip, he set a then-NFR record with an 89-point ride on Growney's Dreamboat Annie. He also split the NFR average in 1983 and finished the season in third place. He edged fellow Hall of Famer Lewis Feild for the 1984 title by \$2,000. The race was so close it came down to the final round of the NFR. Even after he'd been declared the champ, it took a while for Peabody to truly believe it.

Jerome Robinson

Notable

Robinson was a cowboy with many hats – a contestant, contractor, event producer, contract personnel and member of the PRCA Board of Directors. With so many titles on his résumé, Robinson is being inducted to the HOF as a Notable, a word that summarizes his career. "Rodeo is the magic carpet I got to ride for the past 50 years."

Robinson competed with the PRCA for 16 years, starting in 1967, and made 11 trips to the NFR (1970-75, '77 and '81). He mentored several PRCA world cham-

pion bull riders and many others involved with rodeo production. Robinson was instrumental in creating PROCOM in 1975, a system still in use today for entering rodeos. This task, along with starting the Winston Tour, are what he considers to be his most difficult achievements.

"I was a bull rider, but I was afforded the opportunity to get on the board," Robinson said. "It was an educational experience where I learned a lot and was fortunate enough to be around when Ken Stemler took over. He was a linear thinker who could explain things."

Cody Stampede Rodeo

Committee

Cody, Wyo., is often called the "Rodeo Capitol of the World" – and for good reason, as its home to the Cody Stampede Rodeo, which has attracted countless tourists to the small town just east of Yellowstone National Park since 1919. Now in its centennial year, the Cody Stampede was inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. The Cody Stampede won the PR-

CA's Best Large Outdoor Rodeo of the Year in 1998 and 1999.

Tommy Lucia

Contract Personnel

Lucia was a Wrangler NFR Barrelman (1973), three-time Wrangler NFR Specialty Act (1997, 1999 and 2004) and three-time PRCA Specialty Act of the Year (2003-05). For more than 50 years he worked as a barrelman and specialty act, entertaining at rodeos across the U.S. In 2010, he was inducted into the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame, and in 2016, he was inducted into the National Cowboy Rodeo Hall of Fame. Lucia passed away

June 1, 2016, on his 75th birthday.

His sons, Anthony, a ProRodeo announcer, trick rider and team roper, and Dominic knew first-hand the passion their father had for rodeo and success. "We're proud of the way that he was, and we're proud of how hard he worked to achieve the things that he did," Anthony said.

"When it came down to it, he wasn't doing it for glory he was doing it to survive and to provide for his family. He gave his heart and his soul to professional rodeo, his animals and everybody around him so that he could provide for his family. When it came down to it, that's who my dad was."

Jimmie Gibbs Munroe

Barrel Racer

While Gibbs Munroe initially made a name for herself in the rodeo arena, winning a world title in 1975, her love and commitment to the association cemented her legacy in the sport. Munroe was an 11-time NFR qualifier and WPRA president from 1978-93. "I spent a lot of years in the sport of professional rodeo and it was certainly good to me," Munroe said. "It's exciting to be able to join my husband who was inducted as competitor in the Hall (Dan "Bud" Monroe, a 12-time NFR qualifier, 1986 PRCA World Champion Saddle Bronc Rider and 2007 inductee), that's really something and means a lot."

Sammy Thurman Brackenbury

Barrel Racer

Brackenbury was also an all-around talent, even roping and winning money in PRCA rodeos. Brackenbury qualified for the NFR 11 consecutive times, winning the world title in 1965.

During her career she served as the California Circuit Director, All-Events Director, vice president of the Association and in 1975 served as the president of the Girl's Rodeo Association. "My dad rodeoed, and my grandfather even rodeoed. It was a way of life for me. I grew up going to rodeos with my dad and mom – it was my life, it always has been my life, and I was very proud to win the world."

Florence (Price) Youree

Notable


Youree is the first notable inducted under the WPRA umbrella into the Hall of Fame. Youree was among the Top 15 six times and won the WPRA all-around title in 1966. But it was her services to the GRA/WPRA in an administrative

capacity that landed her induction. Youree served the association as a director, then president from 1960-64 and then secretary-treasurer, where she made the biggest impact. It was during that time that Youree worked to get the barrel racing included at the NFR as it is today. "We were very grateful. It was like a dream come true," she said "... I met with Mr. Stanley Draper that day and convinced him that they (the NFR) needed the girls, they needed some color."

his way through middle school into high school and coaching the peewee program. "I love the sport – it teaches great life lessons – I love that kind of competition. You are out there by yourself so there are no excuses. Dedication and teamwork are still in there as far as practice partners – being accountable for your actions on and off the mat. Wrestling teaches discipline in cutting weight, making weight, and grinding it out. It's very rewarding in the success because it's all you."

As a freshman, Jace was a big surprise to a lot as he made it to State finals, and ended up runner up – for the next three years. "It was a rough go for a while, but we got it done." What he concentrated on this year was his mental game. "Honestly in life and in sport – if you can mentally overcome stuff, that will make the

difference in your success."

Jace competes in the Colorado State High School Rodeo Association, where he is this year's All Around Champion. Going into the fall season he would play football Friday night and then immediately head to the weekend rodeos where he competed in reined cowhorse, tie down, team roping, and steer wrestling. Add that to the fall ranch work, Jace kept busy. His family ranch runs 1,300 leased cow calf pairs during the summer and fall gathering on the 12,000 + acres takes some time. Add shipping



to that and the family of three boys has their work cut out for them. "My brothers and I are the cowboys pushing them up to summer pasture and putting out salt and mineral during the summer. Then we gather in the fall."

Jace and his two brothers, Eric, 21, and Kody, 16, started their own cow herd when they were young. "I bought two cows in second grade and same with my brothers. Each year, we've grown our herd." They have around 200 of their own cows now. "Mom and dad treat us good - we work pretty hard on the ranch and they help by taking care of most of the expenses on the cattle." The cattle on the ranch are divided into four big bunches and the boys check on something every day during the summer.

He comes by his love of horses through his parents, Mark and Jeannie Logan, who competed in reining before the boys were born. They started raising horses with their stud, Doc Sugar Catalyst when Eric was just a baby and most of their horses they rodeo on and work the ranch on comes from Doc. Jace and his brothers found their niche in the horse world through rodeo, starting with the local gymkhana club and NLBRA, then climbing the ranks of junior high and high school rodeo. Jace competed in team roping and dally ribbon roping with Eric, and the brothers were crowned the NLBRA dally ribbon roping world champions in 2012.

Jace has been pro rodeoing since last October, running down the road with Eric, who also steer wrestles. They use the same horses and haze for each other. "I pulled a check at my hometown rodeo, the Steamboat Springs Pro Rodeo





series. We hit that ten week series every weekend." One of the horses, the haze horse Skeeter, is one that was raised at the ranch. The steer wrestling horse, Gray, was bought out of Texas when Eric was at Odessa College. Besides steer wrestling,

Jace and Eric also compete in team roping together. Jace heads on Skeeterthe haze horse, and Eric heels on a horse they also raised on the ranch and used in reining. During the week the boys and Eric's fiancee, Shelby-who breakaway ropes, make time to practice everyday. The family put in an arena a few years ago which allows them the flexibility to practice whenever they have free time from the ranch.

Jace is going to the University of Wyoming this fall to study Animal Science with a concentration in livestock production. He plans to apply that later in life as a ranch manager. For now, he's going to rodeo for a while. "I want to see how far I can go in it."





hen you hear the name Martha Josey, two images come to mind. The barrel racing legend who won every championship barrel racers can win, and the hands-on teacher who has mentored over 200,000 students in her 50+ years teaching about her sport.

Martha began her domination of the barrel racing scene in the 1960's. Right out of the gate she qualified for the National Finals Rodeo in 1968, 1969, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1981, 1985, 1987, 1989, 1990, and 1998. Throughout her 4 decades competing at the top of her sport, Martha earned world championship titles in the Women's Professional Rodeo Association, the National Barrel Horse Association, and the American Quarter Horse Association. 



Back When They Bucked with

TERRY PEEK

I LOVED TO GET ON THOSE THINGS," HE SAID. "I JUST CRAVED GETTING ON BULLS. I COULDN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE NEXT BULL, FOR SO MANY YEARS."]

erry Peek craved riding bulls. And although he never made a living at it, it was his hobby, his lifestyle, and where he made many friends. The Bandera, Texas cowboy was born in 1945 in Paris, Texas, the son of Joe Bailey and Robbie Lee Peek. When he was seventeen years old, he was at a rodeo, behind the chutes, when someone asked him, "Son, do you want to get on this bull?" He thought it was a good idea, so he said, "You bet." The man asked, "Did you sign a release form?" "I said, sure I did," he recalls. "I didn't even know what a release form was."

So he found a cotton rope, wrapped it around the bull's girth, and got on. He rode him for six seconds, got bucked off, and "from then on, I said, boy, this is fun and this is what I want to do." The next Monday, he bought a bull rope and a pair of spurs, and his rodeo career began.

Terry, who had worked for local farmers and ranchers around Paris, had broken and ridden horses for people, earning \$35 a head. After his first bull ride, he went to every junior rodeo he could get to, hitching rides with buddies or going on his own. He was friends with Sammy Andrews, Gerald Smith, who owned Wing Rodeo, and Robert Wright. Friends would meet at Robert's, near Talco, Texas, every Sunday, to ride bulls.

He was also friends with Todd Whatley, who introduced him to world champion bull rider Freckles Brown. Freckles' home in Soper, Okla., was just across the state line from Paris, and Terry went to work for Freckles, putting up hay on his ranch. Terry rode bulls at the Paris rodeo, where Freckles was the judge, and when Terry won a go-round, Freckles was "tickled to death," he said. "He said, Terry, did you get your check? I said, I don't even know where to go." Freckles laughed and said, "Son, go right up those stairs to the announcer's stand and there will be a secretary there with a check." It was a check for \$250, "which was huge for me. I came back, showed it to Freckles, and he said, 'that-a-boy."

His parents were not pleased with his decision to ride bulls. His junior year in high school, he declared to his parents that football did not interest him anymore; he'd be rodeoing. His mother had something to say about that. "She said," Terry remembers, "let me explain something to you. You've made a commitment to play football to the coach. You're going to fulfill that commitment. You can ride bulls, but you'll play football." He did, but "I was thrilled when the season was over," he said.


His parents grew to accept his choice to rodeo. "They finally understood, this

boy is going to do what he's going to do. My mother said to my dad, let's just go to some of his rodeos and watch him, so they did."

After high school graduation, Terry was a student at Paris Junior College. He was still rodeoing, and to him, rodeo was more important than school. He declared to his mother that he was going to quit school and rodeo full time. "My mother had this look on her face," he recalled. "She didn't say anything." A few weeks later, his mother told him Sonny Sikes, the rodeo coach at Sam Houston State University, had called, asking him to rodeo for the team. "I said, 'he does?" And she said, yes. "They have a great team there and he's heard about you and he wants you to come and rodeo





at Sam Houston." It was a set-up; Sonny Sikes had never heard of Terry but his mother arranged it so that Terry would go back to college.

It worked. Terry attended Sam Houston State for two years, riding bulls for them and earning a degree.

While in college, he qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo in 1967 and 1968, finishing the '67 season as Southern Region bull riding champion. Terry was in good company, competing alongside the likes of Phil Lyne, Carl Dee-


ton, Ronnie Williams, and other good cowboys.

His parents made a real sacrifice to send him to college. Before he left for Huntsville, his mom and dad gave him fifty dollars. It was what they were able to save for him. His mother told him, "your dad and I have saved fifty dollars and we want you to have it, to get off to a good start." Each week, his mom would put a case of Campbell's soup on the bus to him. Terry would meet the bus at Huntsville to pick it up. "I always had food," he said, even if he did get tired of soup. Sometimes he'd trade a

buddy a can of soup for a hamburger.

In 1968, he graduated from college with a degree in ag education. He enrolled in the master's program at Sam Houston, but got drafted into the Marine Corps. He spent two years in the Marine Corps, stationed in various places on the west coast and in the Pacific, before his honorable discharge.

When he got out of the Marines, he got a job in Coldspring, Texas, teaching agriculture. He was still competing at 35 or 40 rodeos a year, all over east Texas, Louisiana, and farther. They were regional and International Pro Rodeo Association events.

After two years in Coldspring, he moved to Cortez, Colo., spending five years there as an ag teacher and the high school rodeo coach. He was still rodeoing, this time in Colorado, Utah and that part of the country.

In 1979, Terry moved to Ft. Collins, to work on his doctorate in ag science at Colorado State University. After earning his advanced degree, he moved to Glenwood Springs, Colo., to work for Colorado Mountain College as dean of community education. He had worked with Exxon Mobil, getting students jobs with the oil company. When Exxon offered him a

job, he took it. They sent him to Colombia, South America for three years, then Mexico, then back to the States: Houston, Illinois and California.

But he decided he missed teaching, so he went back to the classroom, as ag mechanics instructor and rodeo coach at Texas A&I in Kingsville (now Texas A&M in Kingsville). He loved the classroom and helping rodeo athletes. For the five years he was in Kingsville, his athletes qualified for the College National Finals every year.

It was there that he got on his last bull. Terry had quit riding at age 35, but at the age of 49, he got on one more. During an evening practice, the college bull riders couldn't stay on. "They couldn't ride a milk cow that night," Terry remembered. "I said, 'golly, you boys are pathetic. Let me show you how this works." He got on a bull, rode for eight seconds, and when he dismounted, he fell and the bull stepped on him, breaking his pelvis and separating it three and a half inches. The college kids were laughing. "Yeah, yeah,



Dr. Peek," they said, as the ambulance came. "I was always one to take a dare," Terry said.

After five years in Kingsville, the wanderlust in Terry returned, and he moved to Farmington, New Mexico, where he worked at San Juan College for five years. Then it was on to Roseburg, Oregon, to Umpquah Community College as vice-president. Two years later, he was on to Wenatchee (Wash.) Valley College.

He and his first wife had two sons: Josh Peek and Jason Peek (Terry and his sons are no relation to the steer wrestler Josh Peek from Colorado), and one of his grandsons, Idan Peek, needed some extra attention, so Terry raised him. After his divorce, he was single for many years.

"That was good," he said. "I wasn't distracted. I was able to do my work and do a good job of raising that child."

Then a chance encounter on a plane brought him his wife, Dorene. It was on a flight from Austin to Portland, and he was seated next to her. As they visited, he discovered that she was a barrel racer and her father had raised some National Finals Rodeo bucking bulls. After the plane ride, they stayed in touch, then married in 2008.

Terry retired in 2009 and the couple settled in Bandera, Texas. He still receives phone calls from former college kids who were inspired and helped by him. He was an example to them, that rodeo and a good education aren't exclusive of each other; he was able to get his schooling done yet still ride bulls. He loves to talk to former students. "They appreciate what I did for them, and I was lucky to have them," he said. He also has a high respect for Sonny Sikes, and the two stay in touch.

He is a member of the Rodeo Cowboy Alumni Association, a group that gets together twice a year and raises funds for scholarships for young people. He enjoys getting together with other rodeo friends.

In retirement, he golfs and works in a saw mill he and a friend purchased. He makes furniture, and still attends rodeos, including the National Finals Rodeo, Pendleton, Bozeman, Mont., and others. There are several retired cowboys in Bandera, and they get together. "We talk about how good we were, back when they bucked," he laughed.

Bull riding was his love. "I loved to get on those things," he said. "I just craved getting on bulls. I couldn't wait to get on the next bull, for so many years."

"I wasn't one of the best, but I had a lot of passion for what I was doing."



RESISTOL ROOKIE

TANNER GREEN

feel like how hard rodeo is is what keeps me going. If it was easy, everybody would do it, and I don't do what everybody does," says Tanner Green, the 2018 PRCA Resistol Rookie All-Around Champion. Unbeknownst to the tie-down roper and team roping header from Cotulla, Texas, he clinched the title with \$52,393. Tanner, now 21, rode out his rookie season through several ups and downs with roping partners and sore horses, not learning until the conclusion of the season there was a trip to Las Vegas at the end of the trail. "It was real good, and everybody was nice—I enjoyed the awards," says Tanner, who finished fifth in the tie-down roping rookie standings and sixth in the team roping.

He's no stranger to Las Vegas, where he competed in the WSTR Finale in 2014 before there was an age limit, followed by roping calves at the Roy Cooper Junior NFR in 2017 and team roping at the Junior NFR that same year. Tanner grew up surrounded by ropers and entered his first USTRC roping when he was 7 or 8 before joining a junior rodeo association when he was 10. "I'd always wanted to rodeo since I was little bitty and every year we went to the San Antonio Stock Show," says Tanner. "My granddad Phil Lyne has probably helped me out the most. He won the world twice in the tie-down roping and all-around, and once in the steer tripping. My dad, Chris Green, enters me while I'm on the road and he qualified for the (NFR) finals four times in the heeling. My step-dad, Shorty Gorham, has fought bulls in the PBR since he was 18, and my uncle JB Mauney rides bulls in the PBR, so everybody is involved in it and they're always encouraging me to keep going when I get down."

Tanner junior high and high school rodeoed for Texas, competing in the NJHFR all three years and the NHSFR three years, competing in tie-down and team roping, as well as steer wrestling. He qualified for the NHSFR his senior year as well, but since he qualified in just one of his three events, he decided to enter open rodeos that summer and sent the fifth-place tie-down roper to Nationals instead. During high school, Tanner played around with heeling, but started focusing on heading as he got older. "I like to go fast in the team roping, and I'm known as a reacher," he explains. "In the tie-down, I like the horsepower and what it takes to get it out of them. None of mine are very easy, so I like what it takes to put work into a horse and get it out of them, and it's pretty cool to watch one work.

"I have a solid horse out here called Legend that I've had since he was 6. I messed around with him and got him pretty good over the years, so he's my number one calf Tanner Green - Hubbell

horse. My number two is a roan horse I call Mario. He's my number two but I think I win a lot more on him than Legend. In team roping I'm using a gray horse from Steve Moore. I also ride a big chestnut named Fred from Shane Phillips who I rode at Cheyenne and the Reno and the BFI." Tanner enjoys training horses when he's home and has his eye on several young horses he'd like to take home at the end of the summer. "Around my house I either have a bunch to ride or none at all, so they come and go, but I like riding them," says Tanner. He also enjoys hog hunting with his dogs when he's not working on horses.

He's presently sitting ninth in the PRCA all-around standings and the top 40 in the tie-down and team roping. Tanner had a tough winter, winning around \$8,000 in the tie-down roping and \$3,500 in the team roping, but says he's hoping to hit a hot streak that will send him into the top 15 yet this year. "I really like Cheyenne, and Spanish Fork because it's been good to me—I split first in the average there two years in a row calf roping," says Tanner. "The Livingston, Red Lodge, Cody run is fun, and Saint Paul is one of my favorites. When I was little we went there two years in a row and I entered the junior steer riding and I always wanted to go back, so it was cool when I was older to go back there and rope.

"I feel like in rodeoing your goal changes sometimes, but the main goal is to get to the NFR," he finishes. "My goal is to get into San Antonio and Houston again and have a good winter, and set myself up for next year."

Remembering those we lost



TYLER RICHARD INGO

November 23, 1990 - July 22, 2019

"Just send it."

hose were the three words used by Tyler Ingo when he was ready to challenge his 2,000lb dancing partner on the arena floor. What some viewed as dangerous and reckless, Tyler viewed as a challenge; and an exciting one at that! He was a bull-fighter and his job was to protect the men who he called friends, and even more so, family. Tyler Richard Ingo, son of Rick and Jerri Lynn Ingo, was born on November 23rd, 1990, and on July 22nd, 2019 he rejoined his loved ones who had gone before him to God's Kingdom in Heaven. Tyler was born a cowboy and he died a cowboy.

"He loved all things cowboy," said Jerri Lynn Ingo- mother of Tyler Ingo. "John Wayne, Chris LeDoux, Lane Frosh, Tuff Hedeman, J.B. Mauney- he was a huge fan of them all. He and his dad would talk bulls for hours upon hours. It was something that he was very passionate about, but what he was most passionate about was his family."

Tyler left behind his beautiful bride Kelsey and their two precious babies-Kashley, 4, and Wacey, 16-months. Tyler, described as a known adrenaline junkie, fit the husband and father role perfectly.

"Tyler was the most ornery, funny, caring person that I ever met," explained

Kelsey Ingo. "We had so many great times together, and I will forever have two small reminders of Tyler when I look at our two kids."

He was a family man.

"He was a very proud husband and father. He loved his family more than anything and he would just beam with pride when someone would talk about them," explained Jerri Lynn.


If you ever met Tyler, you'd figure out real fast that he never met a stranger. He was fun-loving, hard-working, outgoing, down-to-earth man with a very big heart. He welcomed anyone who wanted to be a friend into his life, and he was al-

ways there for his friends and family at the drop of a hat.

Ever since he was a little kid, Tyler had a passion for all things cowboy and rodeo. He climbed the ranks from junior rodeo to high school rodeo and then onto college rodeo.

"When we would go to the junior rodeos, I remember the announcer calling out his name over and over again," said Jerri Lynn. "We would be looking for him, only to find him watching a movie in his grandpa and grandma's camper."

Jerri Lynn also fondly reminisced about the days when they were going to the rodeos as a family and Tyler was the designated refreshment coordinator.

"There were times we would go back to our trailer and he had given all of our drinks away. He was also so thoughtful and kind."

Jerri Lynn, and Brice Ingo, older brother to Tyler, specifically remember that the only way that Brice could get Tyler to practice with him when they were younger was if he saddled his horse and got the steers loaded. "Not much had changed, he still didn't really like to practice, but he didn't have to; he was still good at everything," Brice explained.

"We finally let him start riding bulls when he was a freshman in high school, mainly because we had hoped that it would keep him away from racing motorcycles. He was an adrenaline junkie," said Jerri Lynn.

What had started as a 'hobby', quickly turned into a passion. Tyler loved fighting bulls. He started doing it after college and he was really good at it. He fought at the CPRA rodeos, various bull riding series and had competed at bull fighting protection matches with his good friend, Brooks Forsythe. It was in these matches, competitions and rodeos



that he made life-long friends. He got to do what he loved alongside great friends and mentors that he looked up to and admired such as Frank Newsom.

He had a contagious smile that if you ever were lucky enough to see it, you'd never forget it. It was the kind of smile that would light up a room. A smile that will never be replaced.

Tyler was taken too soon. He left so many loved ones behind and so many people asking God why. But what you need to remember is, this is not the end of the trail for Tyler.

He headed out to the light he saw.

Beyond the clouds is a trail he sought, it got straighter the closer

He has family and friends ahead, and they have a place ready for him to rest his head.

There is grass for his horse and the streams are clear. The scenery is special, he will like it here.

If he's thinking it's too good to be true, it's not-the Boss made a promise to you.

If he rode for the brand, always honest and square, God would relieve all his pain, and remove all his cares.

He was mighty pleased with Tyler's life on earth, he always did his best and proved his worth.

So, Tyler, step off your horse, and tie a slipknot, your family and friends are waiting to pour you a shot- of Fireball, your favorite.

You'll talk about the good ole days, as time allows, 'cause startin' tomorrow you'll be back to workin' cows and fightin' bulls.



s a rising freshman, Makaylee Fischer looks back fondly on the three years she spent in the junior division of the Colorado State Junior High Rodeo Association. Starting in the association as a 12-year-old 6th grader, she competed over the past few years in barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying, breakaway roping, and ribbon roping. Her 8th grade season was filled with all of those events except barrels, and she was happy to qualify to nationals for the first time, competing in goat tying and ribbon roping at the 2019 National Junior High Finals Rodeo in Huron, South Dakota. "It was really fun at nationals, I loved competing in the big arena and seeing the large audience. I also really liked all the friends I got to meet from all over the country. It's a big honor to finish in the top 4 of the state, and I really appreciate the opportunities that rodeoing in the CSJHRA gives, like competing at state and national finals."

Makaylee was born in Eagle, Colorado, and has spent her 14-year-old life there with parents, Brian and Dele Fischer. She has two older sisters, Mackinzee Dermody, 16, and Mariah Dermody, 22, that competed in rodeo before her, and Mackinzee is a current CHSRA competitor. "My sister's dad, Bill Dermody rodeoed and got my sisters into it, and they helped me get started in rodeo. Bill also helps train horses for us, and he started the gelding, Jeans, that I ride." Brian owns Fischer Technologies, and Dele works in real estate, flipping houses; purchasing, remodeling, and selling the homes. The family has an arena at home for the girls to practice, and they keep cattle and goats for them to use for practice also. "Every day we have to ride our horses, and we feed, water, clean their pens, and do any work needed in the horse areas. We also help care for the cattle and goats."

Makaylee rides Jeans, a 6-year-old grulla gelding that was born on their farm, in

breakaway roping and pole bending. And, she has ridden a 12-year-old buckskin mare named Sally for goat tying the past two years. She and ribbon roping partner, Colby Runner, were the 2019 CSJHRA Ribbon Roping Champions, and had a great time, but no luck, at the national junior high finals. "We were in the first performance in ribbon roping, and it was so muddy; I had to tie my boots on so they didn't come off!" In goat tying, Makaylee finished 13th in the first round at nationals, but had a heartbreaking 2nd round, with her goat getting up after tying it in a time that would have put her into the short go in 6th place. "I learned a lot and I'm looking



forward to next season in the high school division. It will be fun to compete in the high school association with Mackinzee. I'll be competing in barrel racing, goat tying, pole bending and breakaway roping." Makaylee appreciates the help she gets in her favorite event, goat tying, from trainer, Jill Francis. "She is in Alamosa, Colorado, so that's about 3.5 hours away from us. We try to go there once a month for a tune-up."

Makaylee was homeschooled for her 8th grade year and will use the same World Academy online curriculum for her freshman year. "It is really difficult, but so much more convenient with my rodeo schedule." Besides rodeo, Makaylee has been in 4-H for the past 4 years and is involved in raising and showing Angus-cross steers, and Boer goats. "I have learned a lot of responsibility through both 4-H and rodeo." Looking to the future, Makaylee isn't certain what she wants to do for a profession just yet, but looks forward to competing in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association while she attends college.

Jacobi Larson

acobi Larson started out as a 6th grade member in the junior division of the Colorado High School Rodeo Association. She's grateful for the friends and rodeo family she has made in the association during the past 5 years, and is certain that next year as a senior, the season will be bittersweet as her high school rodeo years dwindle down. Jacobi was born and raised in Fowler, Colorado, where she lives on The Apishapa Ranch, a 100,000-acre family ranch with the Apishapa River winding through it. On the ranch, her family raise cattle and have a feedlot. "We raise mostly Black Angus cattle, and my dad has a purebred Charolais herd; and then we raise any type of customer cattle on the feedlot." Jacobi's parents, Eric and Jennie Larson, have raised Jacobi, 17, her brother Blaine, 22, and her sister, Jessica, 24 on the ranch, where Eric's parents, Bill and Rita Larson, also reside. Although Blaine is now attending college at Colorado State University Fort Collins, he and Jacobi are working at the ranch all summer, doing fence work and taking care of cattle; and Jessica works fulltime for the family business doing office and bookwork." Although Jacobi and her siblings are third-generation cattleman, they are first-generation rodeo athletes. "My brother and sister started competing in the CSHSRA when they were in junior high and high school, and I started competing in rodeo when I was 5 years old."

Jacobi will be a senior at Fowler High School, where she loves biology classes, and has been involved in FFA as well as the Future Business Leaders of America. She has also played volleyball 3 years for the school but doesn't plan to play this next year so that she can focus her energies towards rodeo competition. She competes in barrel racing, pole bending, breakaway, team roping, and reined cow horse. For breakaway roping and heading, she uses

a red roan 11-year-old gelding named Ringo that she purchased from Jessie Jolley last March. And she has been riding a 14-year-old buckskin mare named Cisco, who she's owned since she was 5, for the past 2 years in barrel racing. However, the star of Jacobi's equine team is a 13-year-old sorrel mare named J.J., who she rides in pole bending. "J.J. is like the princess of our family. She is a daughter of Frenchman's Guy, and we bought her sight-unseen when she was 2 years old. She's a great all-around horse that I've been riding since I was 10 years old. My sister and I used to both run barrels and poles on her until just a couple years ago, and my sister also used her in trail horse competitions. I can breakaway rope on her and use her on the ranch. I made it to national finals on her in barrel racing in 6th and 7th grade and have won 4 Colorado state pole bending titles on her. I recently won the 2019 Reserve Champion Pole Bender title on her in Gallup, New Mexico at the Best of the Best rodeo; and won the 2019 CSHSRA Champion Pole Bender title at state finals. At nationals, we ended up 7th place in the world in pole bending, after winning 6th in the first go and 9th in the short go. Because of J.J., pole bending is my favorite event."

Before rodeos, Jacobi is generally listening to old country music, like George Strait; and talking to her best friend, Shyanna Reeves; and she doesn't ever enter the arena without praying before her runs.

While looking forward to her final high school rodeo season, Jacobi looks to the future, where she intends to college rodeo while attaining an ag business degree. She sees herself working in the equine therapy field, but ultimately wants to work on the family ranch and continue to rodeo. "I really appreciate my parents and grandparents, and everyone else that has helped me along the way. Linsay Sumpter, the coach at Otero Junior College, has helped me so much with my events, especially breakaway and team roping. The CSHSRA is honestly my favorite association because of all the great people I've met there, and everyone is willing to help each other no matter what."

They can pay their fees at the rodeo, but with CASH only.

es Bray clinched his goal for his final season of high school rodeo, finishing in the top 20 in the nation at the NHSFR. The 18-year-old from Casper, Wyoming, who is the 2018 and 2019 WHSRA Boys Cutting Champion, finished 18th at the NHSFR. "I was confident going into state, and in the short go everything just happened to turn out good and I didn't lose any cows, and my horse was really good," he says.

Wes started cutting in eighth grade when his family moved to Wyoming, then competed all four years in the WHSRA. "Ever since I was a little kid, my dad, Gordon, has been training cutting horses and I just grew up around it. My dad helps me keep my horse tuned up, and my horse is just a sweetheart," Wes adds. His 17-year-old mare, Lizzie, has won the state cutting title the last four years, twice with Wes, and twice with her previous owner. "She listens really well, and she's lazy until you walk into the cutting pen, and then she knows her job."

Lizzie is one of seven horses Wes's family owns. Many of them are cutting horses, while Wes's 20-year-old sister, Shae, used

to compete in cutting and now runs barrels. "The horsemanship is important—there's a lot more horsemanship in cutting," explains Wes, who will think back on his runs but doesn't like to watch videos of himself. "My dad pushes me quite a bit, and I really like my

horse. I always enjoy seeing her when I go to the barn, and she's always happy to see you. My dad taught me a lot about how to keep her tuned up, and I can feel when I'm leaning or not sitting in the middle of the saddle. My sister and my mom, Paulette, help me out a lot. My mom is probably going to inherit my horse since she wants to start riding again."

Along with the WHSRA, Wes competed in winter cutting shows with the Wyoming Cutting Club, as well as the National Cutting Horse Association. He won bronze in 2018 in the youth class overall for the Wyoming Cutting Horse Association Area 4. And while he's finished with high school, Wes hopes to continue cutting as a hobby, and showing in the NCHA. During the summer, he also stays busy setting up tents for special events around Jackson.

Meanwhile, Wes is continuing his education at Casper College to acquire his machining and welding certificates. "I started there this spring—I finished high

school early and my high school paid for the first semester of my college classes. It's a lot of fun, and I should be done in a year and a half to two years." Wes also enjoys working on machines, particularly his snowmobiles. He has several sleds in various states of repair or upgrades, and loves a challenging project. "We go around Jackson and the Bighorns, and this year I want to go to West Yellowstone. Me and my dad like to go, and Mom is going with us this year too, so it will be a lot of fun," says Wes. Along with continuing cutting on the side and completing school, his goal is to see where life takes him and rise to the challenge. rey Sheets won the steer roping at the Daddy of 'Em All Sunday. "It's something I've always dreamed of," said the 28 year old from Hyannis, Nebraska. "Since I was in diapers we've gone to that rodeo - it dang sure was a dream." He roped against people he considers his friends. "I rope against those guys everywhere. We all cheer for each other and I wouldn't be where I am today without their help. It was great."

His family had a cow calf operation in Nebraska and he grew up team roping, and calf roping through junior high, high school and into college. "I started tripping in college, at Casper, Wyoming. I was there on a rodeo scholarship and got an Associate degree in Ag Business."

His stepdad, Andy Wearin, is a steer tripper and one day in 2012 he taught Trey and he's been getting better ever since. He goes to jackpot team ropings, but in the pro circuit, he sticks to steer roping. His mom, Georgeann, from Pine Bluffs, Wyoming, competed in high school rodeo in breakaway and barrels, going on to Eastern Wyoming College to compete there. Trey has two older brothers - Tucker is the oldest, and he rode broncs in PRCA. Cov ropes but doesn't compete much anymore.

Trey has a winter and summer home. "I don't like the snow that much." He spends his summers in Cheyenne where he trains horses and does day work for area ranches. He starts colts and takes in team roping horses and tripping horses as well. "Growing up on the ranch, we raised a bunch of horses - we had 15 brood mares so we had colts every year to break." In the winter, he moves his operation to Texas where he doctors wheat cattle. He started heading south for the winter a few years ago. "I stayed with Scott Snedecor for three years – he won the world four times in the tripping. He is one of my really good friends now."

He shares a place now and works for his cousin Travis Sheets taking care of wheat cattle.

"I wasn't planning on rodeoeing that much this year, but now I'll go more to make a shot for the Finals. I've got to go win some more to make it." A member of the Wyoming Steer Roping Association, Trey was going locally and competing at the closer circuit rodeos. Winning a little under \$20,000 at Chevenne changed that plan. "There's enough rodeos left for me to have a good shot at going."

He rides a horse that he got as a year-

ling and has trained. "I got him from Pete Becker, I trained him and started team roping on him when he was three; I started tripping on him in 2012 – he's great solid horse, probably the best one I've had." His name - T Pain – like the rapper. His other really good grey horse got crippled and is coming back slowly.

His goal now is to get to the Finals. After that, he plans to start back again next year, get another horse or two and go from there. "Keep working and digging and trying," he said. "I've been at this a long time and I feel it's finally paid off."

t Big Bend Trailers we have been using gooseneck trailers on our ranches for over 40 years. We operate ranches in about five different counties of West Texas (The Big Bend Area). The country is big, and it takes a lot of acres per cow. Therefore, we pull trailers many miles over a lot of rough roads and it is pretty tough on trailers and equipment. We have spent a good deal of time fixing and repairing trailers over the years and have come up with some ideas to make the trailers more durable. These ideas and years of hands on experience have been incorporated into our Big Bend Trailers. I think you will find our trailer a very tough practical trailer that you can use in the harshest of conditions and it will hold up for you."

I believe that one of the most important vehicles on your place is a livestock/ horse trailer. They must carry our animals to and from our ranch, safely and be well built. I personal prefer a Big Bend Trailer. I sat down with Jim Dyer of Big Bend Trailers and learned a little more about the WSRRA Official Trailer.

Jim is a 4th generation cattle rancher. He tells us a little about his childhood. "My great grandpa was a trail boss on the Chisholm Trail. My parents fell in love with the Big Bend area of Texas while they attended Sul Ross State University in Alpine. They decided to move to this area from Baird, TX when I was 7 years old, so I have been here most of my life. My dad was able to pick up some grass leases in this area and eventually was able to purchase ranches in this area, which I have helped manage ever since I was a kid. My wife Kelie and I have 2 girls who have both moved back to this area. Amber is a physical therapist and Amanda helps me manage Big Bend Trailers."

One of the things that I appreciate about Big Bend Trailers is the fam-

and had a list of things I wished trailer manufacturers would incorporate into their trailers to make life easier and more efficient on the ranch. 16 years ago, I was introduced to a group of Mennonites who had a manufacturing company. I asked them if they could build livestock trailers and they told me they could build anything I wanted if I just sent them a design. I put a design together that incorporated the structural components I had found to be the stoutest as well as features I felt would be useful on the ranch. One thing I noticed about a certain trailer we had on the ranch was that though we welded on every part of that trailer, we never had to weld on the sides, which were constructed out of square tubing. I said to myself that if I ever built a livestock trailer, I would use rectangle tubing; and that is one of

the key selling points of our trailers. With

rectangle tubing, there are more places

to weld & you have four corners to give

you strength vs angle iron that just has

one corner, so it increases the strength of

the trailer. One of the other features Big

Bend is most known for is the unlocking

mechanism to unhook the trailer from

outside the truck bed. I always joke that

other manufacturers don't put them on

their trailers because they aren't the ones

having to crawl in the bed of the truck!



hen all that hard work finally pays off there's no better feeling. You work hard all year, and there's traveling and money and the time you put into practice, and when it finally pays off and you place at Nationals, that's as good as it gets really." Talon Elshere, 16, finished fourth in the nation in the saddle bronc riding at his first NHSFR. "I drew a pretty good horse in the first round. It was a friend of mine's practice horse, so I talked to him about it and I was a 65. The second round I was very lucky to draw the horse I did—he was probably the best draw in the pen, and I got by him, so with two down I couldn't have asked for a better long round," says the cowboy from Hereford, South Dakota. "The short round was pretty good on a nice little horse, and I ended up getting three covered. I was pretty blessed with the horses that I drew."

Talon's accomplishment was all the sweeter with his family watching, including his dad, J.J. Elshere, a four-time WNFR qualifier in the saddle bronc riding. Talon's mom, Lindsay, and four brothers, Thayne, Trik, Tel, and Trailon, also cheered him on. "Thayne was out there (at the NJHFR) in the bareback and bull riding, so we all went out there to watch him," says Talon. "Luckily with everyone doing roughstock, we can cram into the suburban and travel to rodeos. We play road games to keep

us entertained, and time usually passes fast when we're laughing and having a good time."

Junior high and 4-H rodeos helped Talon grow in his competitiveness before joining the SDHSRA as a freshman in 2017. "I really got into it from going to all those rodeos with my dad and watching my cousins," says Talon, who's watched

his dad compete at the WNFR several times. "It's been fun. I'm starting to figure things out and do things the way I should, and I've had a pretty good teacher, so that helps out a lot."

He also competes in the SDHSRA in tie-down roping and team roping as a heeler, but Talon says he'll do bronc riding over anything else. "It's what all my family members do. Riding bucking horses is something you can't really explain—it's super fun and once you do it, it's something you can't not do. I'm surrounded by great bronc riders who have helped me along the way and made it fun."

Through the summer, Talon competes in 4-H rodeos and the weekly Heart Ranch rodeo series, and he's looking forward to the Rapid City practice rodeo and 20X Extreme Showcase this season. He also does ranch work for his neighbor Gary Deering. "I'm working cows and doing all that, and I break colts. I've broken quite a few colts for us, and then a bunch of people have asked me to ride their horses and put 30 days or so on their horses," says Talon. Football practice is also starting, and he's playing both football and basketball for Sturgis Brown High School, where he's a junior this year. "We rarely get spare time during the summer, but I like swimming and hanging out with friends, and with the family we play games outside like basketball or football."

Talon also enjoys traveling to rodeos with his dad, and hopes to soon compete alongside him as well. "I hope to make every big finals there is as I come up—high school and college—and I hope to make the NFR one day and rodeo with my dad. To go to all those big rodeos with him would top it all."





Meet the Member

Whitten Hoover

he son of a bareback rider and rodeo photographer, Whitten Hoover was destined to make a go out in the arena. "My dad rodeoed for most of his life, so I was just born into it," said the Ainsworth, Nebraska, native about the man who rode bareback horses until 2002. "I started out in junior rodeos in the summer team roping, then I got on calves." Whitten was hooked and in the seventh grade he added bull riding to complete his trifecta of high school events. His brother rode saddle bronc horses and Whitten decided he wanted to be the bull rider of the family. "Bareback just came a bit more natural to me, but I didn't really care for bareback when I first started. I got dumped on my head almost every time."

Whitten quickly got the hang of it as he made four trips to the NHSFR in the event and made two appearances at the CNFR. As a junior in high school (2007), Whitten won state finals. He finished in the top ten at nationals the year before and competed in a couple of short rounds. "I made the college finals my first two years and as a sophomore I finished tenth in the short round. That was probably my biggest and proudest accomplishment." The previous year (2009), Whitten was rookie of the year in the M-SRA. After two years at Chadron State with Dustin Luper as his coach, Whitten decided it was time for a shot at the big leagues. "I learned a lot of new things from Dustin, he fine tuned my technique. He helped me move on to the next level."

As Whitten makes his way between amateur and professional rodeos, he does his best to help the younger guys along the way. "The most important thing I tell other



guys is to never stop learning." Whitten said he never fully pursued the professional trail, but has been an avid competitor in the M-SRA and NSRA. "There are definitely some talented guys going to those rodeos, it is highly competitive." What the bareback riding may lack in numbers, it more than makes up for in quality. "Not a lot of guys ride bareback anymore but the ones that do sure are tough. You can't just slack off and hope to win."

Pouring concrete for a living keeps Whitten in shape for riding. But he does try to work out on a regular basis just to keep his competitive edge. "I have a spur board that I work on a lot. Repetition is key. I also have a little machine called the

masher that works my core and helps me practice my motion." His motivation to stay healthy is about more than just riding well. "Traveling wears on a person more than the event does sometimes. But staving healthy is the number factor of making a ride fun. If you are sore and bummed up, it's not fun and it just ends up being more like work."

A shoulder surgery in the winter of 2014 allowed Whitten to get back to his full potential after taking the entire year off. He married Alanna that following summer. "My wife is super supportive, she is always pushing me to enter and knows how much I love and enjoy it." Together, the couple has two daughters: Hadley, 3, and Weslee, 1. "I try to take the girls with me as much as possible, but it can be tough to watch them when I am trying to compete." The other branch of Whitten's support system is his parents and siblings. "They still follow me around and go to about as many rodeos as I enter. They have always been there for me."



ebraska is home to the 2019 National Junior High School Rodeo boys goat tying champion. Tate Talkington, Scottsbluff, brought home the title after winning at Nationals with a time of 27.46 seconds on three head.

In junior high rodeo, the fifteen-yearold cowboy competed in the chute dogging, tie-down roping, team roping (heeling for Jace Hurlburt), ribbon roping (roping for Jace), and goat tying, but goat tying was his strength.

He rode a horse that was an unlikely candidate for the event.

Last winter, his horse got injured, so Tate was without a mount.

The family's good friends, Shelby and Libby Winchell, who also help Tate with goat tying, offered one of their horses. Tate could come over and choose one of their three goat tying horses.

The one he chose wasn't, in the opinion of an expert, the best choice.

Tate chose Hardy, an eight-year-old bay mare who had been given to Libby as a gift when she was in seventh grade. Libby had had serious health issues that kept her from riding, so a friend had gifted the horse to her to train, a "project" to keep her mind busy.

Hardy was Tate's first choice. "Right away, he got on her," his mom Brooks said, "and said, 'she feels good so I'm going to use her." Libby schooled Tate in horsemanship and different cues to use to ride the bay, who is "a lot of horse," Brooks said.

Brooks recalls the first time, in the practice pen, that Tate tied goats on Hardy. Libby told Tate for this run, he would dismount and tie the goat. As he made his run, he swung a leg off of her, and swung it right back up. He told Libby, "You mean I have to

get off her when she's going that fast?" But he learned how. "They were pretty unstoppable, those two," Brooks said.

Tate is at the end of his junior high career; in school at Scottsbluff High School, he played basketball, was in the National Junior High School Honor Society and a member of FCA. He's also involved in 4-H and has shown goats and pigs.

He enjoys watching Duke basketball and Nebraska football, and at the top of his list of favorite foods his mom makes is shepherd's pie and ribs. He loves orange sherbet, Arnold Palmers, and Sour Patch kids.

One of the funnest trips Tate has taken was to the National Junior High Finals in Tennessee, because his team roping partner and good friend Trace Travnicek was along.

Tate has qualified for Nationals each of the past three years. When he grows up, he'd like to be a horse chiropractor and rope professionally. He has an older sister, Brayden, who lives in Tennessee.

He is the son of Brooks and Shane Talkington, and the family considers the Winchells, including Mike and Shawna, "like family to us," Brooks said.

It really gets my adrenaline pumping." Macee uses a horse named Lainey for the barrel racing, an incredible athlete trained by her grandmother. Macee's pole bending horse is Mister, her heel horse is Puddin', and her breakaway horse is Dubs. Macee and her horses have accomplished quite

the list of things, including Utah 5th and Under Pole Bending Champion and All-Around Cowgirl, multiple time National Junior High School Finals qualifier, and National High School Finals qualifier.

After finishing third in the Utah High School Rodeo barrel racing, Macee set a goal to qualify for the short go at Nationals, saying, "I wanted to put together two good runs and stay focused. I don't get very nervous, but I just wanted to do my best." She was a 17.474 in the first go-round finishing third. In the second go-round she was a 17.364, placing third once again. In the short go-round, Macee had her best time of the week, a 17.099 second run. When

she came out of the arena her father said to her, "You won," and tears of pride welled up in his eyes. "It was so unreal. You think about all of the incredible things you want to accomplish, and you want them to be possible, but it isn't until it happens that you realize how amazing it feels and how bad you really wanted it." Macee earned the title 2019 National High School Rodeo Association World Champion Barrel Racer. She loved being on team Utah, where some of the hardest working and competitive athletes come together to cheer each other on and hype each other up. Macee has set a goal to qualify for nationals in all her events.

Something Macee's father said to her barrel horse, Lainey, while they were getting ready to run at nationals stuck with Macee. He said, "Do what you were meant to do. Do what you were born to do." Macee's father is one of her heroes, and she is grateful for all he has taught her. One of Macee's strengths is her ability to stay positive and stay focused. She knows that, "In rodeo you don't always win. There are always going to be ups and downs, but it is also going to be OK." Rodeo has taught her that rough patches are just that, patches. They don't last forever and there will always be something good at the end of a hard time. You have to, "try really hard every day, and one day it will work out. Rodeo is not a sprint, it's a marathon."

Meet the Member Saxon Day

odeo is something that I've done for so long now, it's a lifestyle. We don't really do it because we make a lot of money at it, but because we love it," says Saxon Day. "It is a lot of work, but it's cool to see the horses succeed and help us succeed, and I enjoy seeing the progress not just for them, but for me as well."

The 23-year-old timed event cowboy, lately of Provo, Utah, grew up on horse-back with his siblings and started junior rodeoing when he was old enough. He junior high and high school rodeoed for Utah, and is now embarking on his second season in the RMPRA and his final season of college rodeo. Saxon competes in steer wrestling, tie-down roping, and team roping as a header, but steer wrestling is his favorite. "It's been something that I've excelled in more so than the others, and it's a thrill every time you do it, so it's always been something I enjoyed a little bit more," he explains.

Saxon competes in all three events on Utah Valley University's rodeo team, where he's attending on a rodeo scholarship. This spring he qualified for the CNFR in team roping with (partner?) and they finished 18th in the nation. He was just a few spots away from qualifying in the steer wrestling, and hopes to finish his final year of college rodeo with a qualification in that event. "It's a good time, and it's fun to be on a bigger platform, and it's just a fun atmosphere," says Saxon.

During the summer, he enters RMPRA rodeos with his brother Ryland. "I really liked the Alpine rodeo because it was up close to the mountains, and it was a fun rodeo. The association pays out fairly decent, so that definitely makes it a plus to go, and there's a lot of people we've been rodeoing with forever that show up at them. We just have a good time."

Saxon, Ryland and their brother, Jake, rodeo together, and their parents, Austin and Misty, have always supported them. "Ever since I was little, my dad's always been there to support me and help me with whatever I wanted to do, and get to the next level. He's always willing to travel with us

and help us with anything we need." The family also trains their own horses, taking them from green broke to finished. "We've made everything that we have into what it is now," says Saxon. His steer wrestling horse started as a head horse, but loved to run so fast that they gave him a shot at steer wrestling. "He's a pretty dang good bulldogging horse. All our rope horses we got as young horses and worked with them until we could compete on them. Me and my dad and brothers all go out and rope and steer wrestle, and my dad hazes for me at all the rodeos."

Saxon and his family also enjoy hunting together and spotting mountain lions in the winter when they're not rodeoing. They train several breeds of hunting dogs as well. Saxon's time spent around his animals inspired him to be a veterinarian, and after he finishes his biology degree from UVU, his next step is being accepted into veterinary school. "I'll hopefully have a mixed practice, so a little bit of everything," says Saxon, who's working in a cabinet shop to help put him through school. "I want to get into the PRCA probably in the next year and just see where that takes me."

Kyle McCabe

yle McCabe is a two-time GCPRA Incentive Team Roping Champion Heeler. He won both titles—2018 and 2015—with header Bob Pimental, and won his very first title in the association in the open heeling in 2014. At the time, the 41-year-old husband and father of four from Queen Creek, Arizona, had just started working for Earnhardt Ranch. He began rodeoing in the GCPRA halfway through that same season. "I got hired on to help train roping horses, so I got a lot of roping in. I was roping with Myles Payne and we dominated that year," Kyle recalls. "Ever since then I've been in the incentive. Primarily what I do is heeling, but now I'm starting to head because my oldest daughter is heeling and just got her number."

While Kyle rodeoed in the PRCA for a time, he appreciates the proximity of the GCPRA rodeos and being able to make three or four runs at one rodeo alone. Time is an especially precious commodity since all four of his kids, Sadie (14), Jace (13), Stella (11), and Spur (9), ride and rope. They compete in junior rodeos and jackpots, and Kyle's wife, Trish, ropes as well. Their children are the fifth generation on Kyle's side of the family to rodeo. Kyle was swinging a rope before he was even walking, and spent his summers working on his grandfather's ranch outside of Flagstaff, Arizona. "That's where I learned a lot from my grandfathers and my uncles and dad. We did a lot of cowboying out there. You couldn't really miss out there or you'd catch it on the backside." He primarily roped on the ranch until halfway through high school when he started competing in jack-

pots. His number was raised three times in one year. Kyle also competed in tie-down roping and even tried bull riding briefly, but preferred roping in the WJRA and competing in Navajo Nation Rodeo Association as he got older.

"Right now is our off time, but we try to rope at least two or three times a week," Kyle explains. "We have a lot of young horses right now and a couple we're training, and we even have the kids training horses." They raise one or two colts a year. while the gray mare Kyle won the 2018 incentive on is one he raised out of a favorite mare. "She's only six or seven years old and she's already taken me to the Grand Canyon Finals three times, so she's pretty fun. The kids ride my horses too, so I don't really own a horse," Kyle says with a laugh.

He continues to work for Earnhardt Ranch doing cowboy work and raising Corriente and beef cattle. Trish originally helped him find the job in 2014 when she started giving riding lessons to some of the Earnhardt grandchildren and learned they needed another ranch hand. "The Grand Canyon rodeos I enjoy because they're right here in the state and I can be gone for a weekend and then be right back

home and still be hustling," says Kyle. "My main goal now is to get my kids going. I think they have a lot of talent, and they could do a lot with what they know, and learn a lot more. As for me, I've always loved doing rodeo, and next year I'm thinking maybe I'll do the All Indian Rodeos and be a world champion in that."

Kyle also extends his thanks to Earnhardt Auto Centers, L7 Ranch, Desert Mountain Equine, and Foresight Finishing for their support.

rownpoint, New Mexico, cowgirl Kadin Jodie proved she is wicked fast with a rope both aimed at a calf and a steer. At state finals she took third overall in the breakaway roping and fourth in the team roping for her inaugural trip to junior high nationals. This isn't her first trip to nationals per say, but it was the first time Kadin got to compete on the stage. "I was sixth in the breakaway going into state but I won the first round, fourth in the second and I missed the short round calf." The team roping came down to the wire: after missing both their first and second steer, Kadin and Laramie Martinez needed to win the short round. That's exactly what they did and the points were enough to punch their ticket to South Dakota.

"My dad (Sheridan) is the whole reason I am here [rodeo]. He has been taking us to all the rodeos since I was really little," said the 14-year-old. She is the second oldest of her three siblings: Matthew, 19, Kail, 6, and Cai, 2. Her dad is a twotime world champion steer wrestler at the INFR. "My dad taught me to ride and he





has always been a really good teacher." The whole family rodeos except for Lenora, Kadin's mom. "Mom is the video person, but she also supports and encour-

ages us to work hard."

Rodeoing with your brother can be tough, but Kadin has some added pressure because she regularly hazes for him. "He is fun to rodeo with but sometimes when I don't do well in my events he gets on to me." This fall Kadin will be a freshman at Crownpoint High School and will move up into the NMHSRA just as her brother leaves it. "Traveling is the best part of rodeo, it is fun to go to faraway places. My favorite place in New Mexico so far is Carlsbad. The arena is really big and there are a bunch of places around town to go see too." During all that traveling last year, Kadin made a point to thoroughly explore each new place while she was competing in the NMJHSRA. "I have to thank my aunts on the Jodie side of the family, especially my aunt Michaelyn. She is always driving us all night to hit multiple rodeos across several states."

The places may be unique and the people are unforgettable, but what Kadin really loves about rodeo is the time she gets to spend with her horses. "When I was little I used to pretend I was a horse," she said with a shy laugh. "They make everything fun and are just fun to be around." Kadin currently ropes on Piggy and Pixie, but as a sixth grader she also ran barrels and tied goats. "My horse wasn't running well in those two events, so my seventh-grade year

I just decided to focus on roping. And that's what I did this past year also."

During her first year in the NMJHSRA, Kadin wasn't roping all that great either. "I used to miss a lot and I was really hard on myself about it. I just had to buckle down and practice even harder. I roped the dummy all the time and worked with my dad to make myself a better roper." This was the type of lesson that stuck with Kadin: leaving everything at the last rodeo good or bad – and always doing her best to reach the next level. And that she did with a trip to nationals.

"Nationals didn't go as planned, I missed in everything. I feel bad for my heeler but my parents reassured me that I am young and have many more finals ahead of me. I plan to work harder and make high school nationals so I can do better." Regardless of all that happened in South Dakota, Kadin is looking forward to the Navajo Nation Fair rodeo in Window Rock, Arizona, coming up in September. It's a rodeo her dad has entered for the last 20 years. "It's the biggest rodeo there is around here. I got to enter for the first time last year." As she looks toward the upcoming rodeo season, Kadin is simply working towards more consistency. "Last season I started off by missing a ton of calves. My goal is to catch all my calves and rope tough."

This led McKenzie to switch to her smaller, younger goat horse who was a bit of gamble as the spring season got started. "She really moved me up in the standings. I was sitting 12th when I started riding her and she helped me finish eighth at the end of state finals." In addition to those three events, McKenzie is also a team roper.

Heading into nationals, McKenzie was excited about the stiff competition and ready to make new friends. "I think it is so fun to meet people from new states. The last time I was at nationals I had an absolute blast getting to know so many new friends." Being in the NMHSRA allowed

McKenzie to make friends within her state. "This association is tough, I will say that. It has helped me set my goals high and work hard until I achieved them."

One of those goals has been with McKenzie since she was riding a horse as a toddler. "It has always been my dream to get a rodeo scholarship to college." McKenzie graduated from Dora High School this spring, "After I graduate college, I want to become an equine dentist so I can work on horses' teeth for a living. It is all pretty cool, so I am really excited about it."

My parents (Mike and Janeen) wouldn't be able to take me down the road and I wouldn't have the horses that I do to compete on." She's actually met Trevor twice now and likes him more with every visit. "He does not rodeo for anybody, not even himself, it is all for God. He is the sweetest guy ever and so down to earth." He is easily McKenzie's favorite cowboy of all time and someone she has looked up to since she was little.

First gifted with a love for rodeo, McKenzie's dad also taught her to be a sharp shooter. "My dad hunts and I also love to hunt. He was a trap shooter for a long time and thought I might like it too. I have just always enjoyed it." From pushing calves out of chutes to leading McKenzie through the gate, her parents are there every step of the way. "I would not be where I am today without them. They have supported and pushed me to the point where I wanted to quit, but I am so thankful they did."

had Mayfield, from Clovis, New Mexico is the 2019 National High School Champion Tie Down Roper. He grew up rodeoing. "My dad, Sylvester, did it, when we were little we went with them." Sylvester made it to the NFR Finals twice (1985, 1987). "Since I turned 7, my parents took me to the junior rodeo associations." He competed in New Mexico Junior Rodeo Association, making nationals all three years. He won the national

title his sixth grade year in the ribbon roping, with his sister, Shelby. The next year he won the calf roping. Shad went on to high school rodeo, the first two years for New Mexico and then switched to Texas.

This is his first year rodeoing in the PRCA and he has his sights set on making the NFR his rookie year. He got a big boost in that direction

after making enough money at Cheyenne to boost him into the #14 spot. He is traveling with his dad. "He's taught me everything about roping and everything around that. Since he made the NFR, he knows all about how to make a living at it and the mental game." Shad listens to Tyson Durfey about having a strong mind. "That's how you think ... it's a big part of it. Just blocking everything out – the interviews - the other runs, the bad draws and all of it."

He also attributes his success to riding a lot of different horses over the years and having a rope in his hand constantly. "I rope a lot at home," said the 18 year old. "I've roped on a lot of different horses so I know how to ride a horse. I rope the dummy a lot." His main competition horse is a 16-year-old gelding named Jango. "He is probably the most honest horse out there. He's the same horse when you back in the box and never going to cost you anything."

He also likes the road. "There's nothing but a Walmart in Clovis. I like to drive and see different places." He also likes traveling with his dad. "Most people don't rodeo like I do and that's why he's with me. He may think I don't listen, but I do."

Mom, JoEllen, stays home. "I'm the hired hand at home," she jokes. "I worked





as a mortgage loan process up until I had Shad. Once he was born I chose to stay home and be with them. I was able to do that – I'm a substitute teacher now." Sylvester can work on the road – he buys and sells cattle.

She is very proud of both her kids. "I have two great kids – my daughter is at Texas Tech and has a lot of ambition. She is focused on school and her career. God blessed Shad with a talent – and he's worked extremely hard. He sacrificed basketball and other things to make rodeo first. He amazes me – I have all the confidence in the world in him."

The daughter of two horse trainers (Robbie and Angie Boyce), Shayla was destined for the arena but had a number of options of what to compete in. "My dad has always trained reined cow and cutting horses. My mom trains on some of our personal horses, so I have been riding forever," said the high school junior from Marietta, Oklahoma. She started in rodeo when she "roped everything," but it wasn't long before Shayla was working cattle from the other end as well. "I always rodeoed on reject cutters and cow horses that my parents had around."

Originally from Jacksboro, Texas, the Boyces have always been horse trainers. "My parents had their own ranch and performance horse operation down there and when I was probably ten we moved to Oklahoma and they started working for Cowan Select Horses." The horse operation is in Oklahoma while the cattle are up in Montana. Shayla and her 13-year-old brother Brodie spent two weeks up north during calving this spring. "We go up there almost every summer to work horses and help with the cattle. My brother and I flew up there this spring to help them brand and doctor calves." Being involved in three industries - ranching, rodeo and performance horses - Shayla enjoys combining them on a regular basis.

"I really like to be out on the ranch watching all our hard work pay off, whether that is with cattle or seeing our horses work well for someone. I like to watch the horses we start go on to win and have

long, successful careers." Most summer days start around four in the morning to beat the Oklahoma, but Shayla doesn't mind. "If you want to get to the top you have to work really hard and it will pay off. Eventually. Making it to nationals proves that." Last year, Shayla put in the time and effort, but state finals just didn't pan out for her. "I learned a lot and then this year I came back and won, so that shows you have to stick with it and work hard."

Shayla said it was easily the best state finals she has ever had: reserve state champion reined cow horse and champion cutter. "I came into state finals pretty confident; my horse was working really well." She was actually on a client's horse. "I showed a few different horses from the ranch this year, but we have had this seven-year-old

gelding for as long as I can remember and

his owner let me to take him to state." Shayla had only shown this horse a couple of times before heading to state. After winning the first round of cutting, Shayla lost her cow in the second round. She finished third in the world in the reined cow horse and the all-around race.

Heading into the new rodeo season, Shayla plans to continue riding her older horse while also working on some colts. "My goal is to bring those horses further along in their training and eventually help sell them." She also has a filly of her own to be putting rides on. "I am going to start running barrels on her and I thinking she can go a long way in it." Ultimately, Shayla enjoys the landscape of Arizona or New Mexico, but she also likes the sandhills of Nebraska. "I like going to other ranches and learning more about their breeding and training programs and how they run things. At first I thought I wanted to be a vet, but I decided that wasn't really up my alley."





Meet the Member **Brookelynne Whitfield**

८८ ■ just like to ride and be there with everyone. Is like a big family, it is home," said Tipton, Oklahoma, cowgirl Brookelynne Whitfield about her place in the OKJHSRA. It all came to a close when this 14-year-old made her first trip to nationals and promptly transitioned to high school rodeo. Brookelynne is a first-generation rodeo competitor thanks to her maternal grandparents Frank and Carolyn Allen. "Neither of my parents (Patrick and LaKasta) rode or competed at rodeos, but my mom makes sure my entry fees are paid. They always have faith in me and push me to be my best."

Brookelynne actually regards all of her friends and competitors in junior high rodeo as her role models. "They all really introduced me to rodeo and I have learned a lot from them." Two friends that stand out to Brookelynne are Camree Slavin and Chizm Kuykendall. "They both helped me a lot when I first started and showed me everything." Meeting new people while spending time family and friends is the pinnacle of rodeo for Brookelynne. "Rodeo has taught me a lot about relying on my family but also how to be independent. It's a one-person thing so you need to have faith in yourself to be good."

"My papa has ridden ever since he was little and team roped a lot. I went with him all the time and I finnally decided I wanted to rope." That was in the fifth grade. Playdays with her grandparents got the rodeo game started and then they were introduced to the OKJHSRA. "My grandparents said that when I got into the sixth grade, we could do junior high rodeos." Until then, Brookelynne kept herself busy with the HOYRA. She won the all-around cowgirl title in the HOYRAearlier in 2019 and prior to state finals it was the best she's ever done

at a rodeo. Brookelynne picked up barrels, poles, breakaway and ribbon roping. Her favorite is breakaway though. "Ever since I started learning the event I always get really nervous and excited when I back into the box." Her grandparents have raised all of Brookelynne's horses and taught her a majority of the fundamental skills that she has. Her papa turned to Gail Turner almost three years ago to obtain the horse Brookelynne now breakaway ropes on.

Brookelynne entered the state finals as the number one breakaway roper, but she wasn't far enough ahead of everyone else to relax. "I knew I needed to stay focused and catch. I was just consistent enough to stay in the top five for each round that I was able to win it all." Barrels was a bit of a different story. "I came in to state in the 20th hole and I was consistent enough each day that I ended up in tenth place. I was pretty proud of myself for both events. It showed me that I was pretty good and could get where I wanted to be." Going forward, Brookelynne is taking the sport more seriously and has realized it's what she wants to do most in life.

"At nationals I was really nervous but I just got out there to catch and have fun."

After a scorching fast first run, Brookelynne second-guessed herself and went into the short round with seven seconds flat on two head. "I was seventh high call back and as I backed into the box I knew I had to push myself." She finished nationals with an aggregate time of 9.93 seconds on three head which put her third in the round, average and overall. Seeing her name on the big screen at the future stars roping was when it all hit Brookelynne that she was right where she needed to be. As she enters freshman year at Navajo Public Schools this fall, Brookelynne will be even more thankful for rodeo. "Rodeo has helped me become more social because I have had to meet so many new people every weekend. I have become more outgoing and less withdrawn because of rodeo."



Meet the Member John Wayne Giles

any little boys aspire to heel a steer or tie-down a calf, but very few have a burning desire to become a steer roper. Of course, with a name like John Wayne Giles, this Vinita, Oklahoma, native was destined to be a bit punchier than the rest. "When I originally started rodeo I wanted to be a steer tripper and that's just not something you go straight into. You have to start with something else, so I started team roping and really found a passion for it." At thirteen years old. John watched his close friends dive into rodeo and he followed suit. "I have been around horses all my life. When I was just a few weeks old, my parents put me in a basket and took me to my first rodeo. That kind of became a tradition." John grew up riding and roping on the small family ranch, but he's the first generation to find and pursue an interest in rodeo.

"I was interested in the bull riding when I was little and found out real fast that wasn't what I wanted to do. My dad put me on a steer and I got the wind knocked out of me and I decided right then and there that I was done with that." It was all about heading from then on. Growing up, John team roped with his best friend, Casey McGuire. Casey's dad was a steer wrestler and got John into the event through high school and college rodeo. John rodeoed for Rogers State University and obtained his marketing degree. Once in high school and once in college rodeo, John missed making nationals in the team roping by the skin of his teeth.

For the last seven years John has fulfilled his childhood dreams of steer roping. "It probably would have been

an easier transition from calf roping than it was from team roping. I could catch horns sure, but I have always been a reacher and you have to get really close." The finesse of calf roping makes John believe he would've picked up the event quicker if he had already been stepping off a horse to tie legs. "I just watch the other guys to learn and ask questions. One of my neighbors (Jake McCoin) provides the steers for the event and he is a good friend. He has helped me quite a bit." The first rodeo John entered in the steer roping was not only in the PRCA but at the rodeo he grew up attending. "I stepped off to go tie my steer and blew my knee out. I was sidelined for about six months after that," That was in 2013.

The Vinita PRCA rodeo is one of the few that still showcases steer roping in the performance. "Their pro rodeo didn't have team roping for the longest time, it's only been in the last 10-15 years they have added it to the performance. All I remember from when I was little was watching the steer roping." Team roping is an addictive event with many competitors and generally few spectators. "Once you do steer roping it is way more addictive than team roping ever thought about being. Some people like to watch it and others don't just because they don't understand what is going on." John still enjoys team roping and enters both events regularly.

John started this season with big plans to hit the rodeo trail a lot. "I was even going to team rope a bunch this year, but I couldn't find a partner." John's horse had some minor injuries that made John decide team roping was the route to go for 2019 as it would be less demanding, but that just didn't pan out for him this year. "I have just been hitting some of the amateur steer ropings. I am hoping to make the top fifteen so I can go to the ACRA finals." As the ACRA steer roping director, John understands the stiff competition he is up against to reach this goal, "Most amateur rodeos you might get one or two guys that make the NFR, but that's not the case in the ACRA. When you enter a steer roping in Oklahoma you are guaranteed to be roping against at least five of the top guys in the world."



acen Smith of Newton, Kansas, checked off both his rodeo goals for the 2018/2019 season after many months of hard work leading up to state finals and the NJHFR. The 14-year-old won state in both chute dogging and bareback steer riding, also qualifying for Nationals in goat tying and team roping with Mason Stueve. When the season started, he says he knew he had a good chance to qualify in the bareback steer riding and team roping. But he was surprised by just how successful state turned out.

With 11 buckles to his name from state finals alone, Kacen went to Huron, South Dakota, for his second NJHFR, his parents, Kirby and Joni, and brothers, Koy and Kreed, cheering him on. "It went pretty good. I ended up 12th in the team roping with Mason Stueve, 10th in goats, and 15th in the bareback," says Kacen. "We also went to the water park they have there in Huron, and met some new friends and talked to friends from last year. My favorite part was just being able to get up every day and be with other people who rodeo like I

do, and to go and compete every day as well.

"I love the competition and the atmosphere that rodeo has. And I also just like being able to look back at the past and see how I did and improved, and also my goals for the future," says Kacen. He fulfilled his goals of qualifying for Nationals and finishing in the top ten in one of his events, while he also competed in junior high rodeos in breakaway roping. This fall, he's transitioning to tie-down roping in high school rodeo, as well as continuing to team rope. Steer wrestling is also on the agenda his sophomore year, and he's considering bareback riding down the road as well. "My favorite event is definitely team roping. I just like when you can watch a team that's been together a long time and they can be fast." He'd love to spend a day watching Kaleb Driggers and Junior Nogueira rope. "It would be fun to see them rope in person, and learn from them."

Kacen learned to rope from his dad, who pro rodeoed for a time and continues to enter team ropings. He and Kacen enjoy roping together, while Kacen also practices roping with his brothers, Koy (12), who competes in the KJHSRA, and Kreed (9), who does junior rodeos. "We have a friend named Doug Taylor who's been around since I started rodeoing. He's been there to support me, and taught me and helped

keep me going," says Kacen. "My mom and my brothers help with chutes, and Doug comes to all of our practices."

His tie-down and team roping horse, Milo, came from one of Kacen's great uncles, and Kacen and his dad trained him for roping. His former goat tying horse, Lewis, came from another rodeo family, and the Smiths trained him for goats, which he'll continue to do with Kacen's younger brothers. "We have a couple colts we're riding right now, and one is a half brother to my team roping horse."

Kacen will also be a freshman this fall at Goessel High School, where he plans to play football, basketball, and run track. "In football, we lift weights, and I think that helps me with tie-down roping and steer wrestling, and it also keeps me in shape year round," says Kacen. "This next year my goal is to qualify for High School Nationals as a freshman."

annah Hughes led the breakaway roping standings for much of her senior year in the KHSRA, and held on to the lead through state finals to clinch her very first state title. The 18-year-old from Fort Scott, Kansas, roped all three of her calves at state finals, but didn't tally her points until after the short round. "I had a pretty good feeling but I didn't know for sure until after the short round that I had won the state title."

Riding high on her success at state, Hannah entered her first NHSFR with a calm confidence that carried her all the way to the short round and put her fourth in the nation. "Making the short round was a big accomplishment for my first year out there, and ending up where I did was a high point while I was in Rock Springs," says Hannah, who roped a 2.89 in the short round. "It was a fun rodeo. There were a bunch of girls there that I've gotten to know from going to big ropings, so it was cool to rodeo with them."

Over the summer, Hannah is competing in Cody Ohl and Joe Beaver ropings, as well as Rising Stars and Future Stars Calf Ropings. She also run barrels and ties goats, but breakaway is her main focus. "It's an adrenaline rush because today you have to be so fast, and you and your horse have to be spot-on in order to be that fast. The sport of breakaway is getting so big now that I think it's a good sport to keep going with. I just love the atmosphere of rodeo. she adds. "You meet people from all over. In the rodeo industry I feel like everybody is so friendly, and it's good competition."

Hannah's parents, Rod and Donna, both rodeoed and inspired Hannah to compete from a young age, while family friends Greg and Sherri Gentry, along with many others, have also helped further her rodeo career.

She ropes the dummy daily and ropes calves at least three times a week. "The horse that I rope on we call Effie, but her name is Frenchmans Effort. She's a sorrel 20-year-old quarter horse we've had for five or six years. She came from Rick and Dayna Branch and it took us a few years to

click, but it's been good since then. I have a 20-year-old black AQHA horse, Rocket (RH Aamerican Rocket), and he's my barrel and goat horse. He's also a practice horse for breakaway, so he kind of does it all."

Hannah is attending Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College on a rodeo scholarship. She graduated from Manhattan Virtual Academy, and plans to compete on the college rodeo team in all three of her events. She's also working toward her equine management degree and hopes to use that for equine therapy. "I'm very thankful I finished first at state finals, and when I came out of Nationals sitting fourth, I was very thankful. My success at the high school level has been the boost I needed and I'm ready for college rodeo," she finishes.

he Kansas Professional Rodeo Association was a big step up for 12-year-old, Kendyll Miller of Hennessey, Oklahoma; but it was a step in the direction of her goals for the future. Her nearest goal is to make the 2019 KPRA finals and win the champion rookie title for the association. A horse lover from the beginning, rodeo started in Kendyll's life at the young age of 4, and she hasn't stopped since. She competes in barrel racing and breakaway roping and hopes to add team roping to the roster soon. "The KPRA was a big step up for me, and I was a little intimidated at first because I'm the youngest competitor at the rodeos, but everyone has been so nice, and I love competing in the KPRA."

Kendyll was born and raised in Hennessey, with her dad, Daren Miller, late mother, Lori Miller, who she lost in 2011, and brother Kaddo, who is 10 years old. Daren works as a superintendent in construction with heavy equipment. Kendyll will be a 7th grader this year at Hennessey Middle School, where she loves math and science; and she enjoys playing for the

Hennessey Eagle's on the school's basketball and cross-country track team. She would like to become an equine veterinarian in the future. The Miller's also raise commercial Angus cattle, so they spend much of their time taking care of farming and ranching chores. "I love helping work the cattle, we have to help catch and tag the babies, and help load them to go to the vet. I also help drag calves to the fire when we're branding, so my roping skills come in handy." Although she has a busy schedule to keep up with, her favorite thing to do when she has some down time, is draw, "I love to draw horses and goats."

Although the Millers currently have 25 horses roaming their pastures, from babies they're raising for future mounts to older horses enjoying their retirement; there are two special horses that Kendyll uses for rodeo competition right now. Her barrel racing horse is a 10-year-old chocolate palomino mare named Choc she just purchased last year. Reid Weber and Taylor Munsel helped her get started with roping, and Taylor comes to their ranch regularly to help her practice, as well as work with some of their horses. She got help in barrel racing from Brandi Miller, and there've been several barrel racing mamas that have stepped in to offer help and

advice over the years. Kendyll takes her rodeo competition seriously and is currently competing in the Northwest Oklahoma Junior Rodeo Association, NBHA, and BBR, as well as the KPRA; and has competed at qualifiers for the RFD American Rodeo, Junior American, and KK Run for Vegas. Although she hasn't had luck in those qualifiers vet, they are on her list to dominate soon. In the KPRA she's been hitting the rodeo circuit hard, and has competed at over 20 rodeos this summer, with many of them being three to four hours away. "Everyone is always so nice at the KPRA rodeos, they know everyone's name and the rodeos pay good. The other competitors cheer for me and are so friendly with me, it makes me feel like a part of the group. My favorite run this summer was at McPherson, Kansas where I won 3rd; we had a good pattern and Choc seemed like she really enjoyed herself."

Cinderella Storylines Abound at Days of '47 in Salt Lake City

t was life-changing checks all around for the happy champs at the 2019 Komatsu Equipment Days of '47 Cowboy Games & Rodeo. The \$1 million event concluded July 24 in Salt Lake City with the medal round, followed by a grand finale fireworks display fitting for a rodeo so rich in contestant paychecks and compelling storylines.

There were world champions and living legends in the mix, some rallying in triumphant returns from recent injuries. Then there was the teen-aged girl who just last week was competing at the National High School Finals Rodeo. It was an eclectic gathering of gold medal winners who took center stage on that podium and rocked the packed rodeo house.

Perhaps the most popular of all was home-state hero Kaycee Feild, who returned to rodeo battle earlier this month after a three-month injury timeout following a very scary March 31st wreck at Rodeo Austin in Texas. The four-time champ of the world is a crowd favorite coast to coast, but rodeo fans in the Beehive State are flat crazy about him.

In Austin, Kaycee hit his head on his horse's hip, which knocked him loopy and jerked him down. He then hit his face on his bareback riggin', which broke his eye socket, nasal cavity, upper and lower jaw. The rodeo family held its collective breath as the world standings leader lay motionless in that suddenly silent arena.

"About all I did was sleep for four weeks after the wreck," said Kaycee, who lives with his wife, Stephanie, and kids, Chaimberlyn and Huxyn, in Spanish Fork. "If you break an arm or a leg, you can feel it and know when to quit when you're rehabbing. With a brain injury, you don't feel that you've overdone it until it's too late. Then it's back to sleep you go."

Kaycee's the youngest son of late Pro-

Rodeo Hall of Famer Lewis Feild and Veronica Feild Jackson. Lew and Vee's baby boy sure leaned on his dad's wise words when he needed them most.

"The first time I got hurt, my dad told me, 'When you're rodeoing hard, you're going to get hurt,'" Kaycee remembers well. "If you learn to handle being hurt with a positive attitude, understand that God has a plan for you and take advantage of that time at home, you should always come back stronger and better."

Kaycee got on his first bucking horse back after the injury on July 3 at the rodeo in Mandan, North Dakota, and continues to lead the world bareback riding pack. Feild fought back happy tears on the medal podium, which he shared with Caleb Bennett, who currently lives in Montana, but was actually also born in Utah.

"My dad left quite the legacy behind, so to ride in his name is a very humbling honor," Kaycee continued. "And this rodeo is amazing. It felt like maybe somebody on the back of the chutes—my dad—was helping me tonight. To win \$50,000 for getting on two horses is a dream come true. Seeing the sport going in the right direction makes me really happy. The future of rodeo looks better and better all the time. More cowboys and more big rodeos, where it doesn't take so much wear and tear on a guy to make a living is positive progress.

"To win something like this in Utah is amazing, it really is. The state of Utah has the best cowboys in the world per capita, and the rodeos from the south border to the north border are packed every night. You're not going to find better energy anywhere in the world, with the possible exception of Vegas. And that's because there are 18,000 people at the rodeo every night instead of 10,000.

"It's great to be back, and really great to get a win like this here at home. When the announcer says you're from Utah, it gets loud. When the Feild name is mentioned, it gets really loud. My dad impacted so many lives in such a positive way. People find joy in honoring him, and maybe see a little bit of my dad in me. To feel that energy and support is awesome. The love and support sent my way when I got hurt was amazing. I've never felt more humbled in my life."

The 10,000 fans sitting in stadiumseating style in Salt Lake's sellout crowd at the state-of-the-art Days of '47 Arena at Utah State Fairpark saw the bareback riding gold medal go around Kaycee's neck, the silver on Bennett's and the bronze presented to Canadian cowboy Orin Larsen. Feild's 88.25-point score was barely better than Bennett's 88 points, which was originally announced.

When a technical error discovered on audit later in the rodeo revealed that Bennett's score was actually 89 points, the Days of '47 committee had a decision to make. They went with the WCRA way—The Cowboy Way. In baseball, the tie goes to the runner. When in doubt, the WCRA rules in the cowboys' favor.



Because it was too close call and to clear up any confusion in everyone's best interest, the committee opted to step up and name Feild and Bennett co-gold medalists and cut them each a \$50,000 check. The tie between Larsen and fellow Canada native Clint Laye, who now makes his home in Idaho, was broken for the bronze based on Larsen having the higher medal-round spur-ride score.

Like Feild in the bareback riding, bull-dogging gold medalist Matt Reeves is marching on after a steer wrestling scare earlier this month up at the Calgary Stampede. Riding his bulldogging horse Roy, and with 2017 World Champion Steer Wrestler Tyler Pearson on Reeves' hazing horse Beamer over on the other side with the assist, the happy champ felt beyond blessed to be back in action and \$50,000 richer to boot.

"I had a steer stop in the fourth round at Calgary and got hit in the head real bad," said six-time Wrangler National Finals Rodeo steer wrestler Reeves, who lives in Pampa, Texas, with his wife, Savanah, and little boys, Carson, 3, and Hudson, 1. "It almost shoved my mouth-piece through my top lip. There's a good chance I have a broken bone in my face. We're still not sure what all is wrong, and won't know until we get home. But it was pretty scary."

Reeves, who was 3.92 to grab his gold, has been working on buying some adjoining property back home in Pampa.

"I have more cows than I had before The American and Calgary last year," he said. "And we need a disc plow to get some work done to get ready to plant wheat. It's not the stuff I would have bought with a \$50,000 check when I was 20, I promise. But the difference between 21 and 41 will change your priorities a little bit, and we need this stuff now.

"It's a good day when you win \$50,000.

winners of three gold medals at the Days of '47 Cowboy Games & Rodeo.

"It is definitely all Sister," said the beaming barrel racing superstar. "I am so proud of this horse. She tries so hard. Every time I ask her to throw down in a pressure run, she does."

Days of '47 team roping titlists Ty Blasingame of Casper, Wyoming, and Kyle Lockett of Visalia, California, took advantage of roping last on an unusually wild night of roping bloopers, complete with misses, broken barriers, legs and lost ropes ahead of them. In fact, there wasn't a clean run until the last three teams backed in the box.

Cory Clark fished on a half head to stop the clock with Douglas Rich in 8.69 for the bronze. Then Tanner Tomlinson and Will Woodfin were 5.98 right ahead of

That's a salary in one night. An event like this, where they give us a chance to make a living, and get in and out of here is progress. It's hard to get a lump sum of money like this. These big ones change people's lives. Since Calgary last year, Carson's been wanting me to win another trophy. He gets a medal this time."

Reeves was last seen being double dog dared by his bulldogging buddies to get a gold chain and sport the gold medal "Alfalfa Feddersen style." For those of you who might be new to the game, Feddersen was the flamboyant hazing owner of the world-famous steer wrestling horse Catfish, and his fashion sense included a couple extra buttons undone on his shirt and a constant John Wayne cuff on his jeans.

Reigning World Champion Barrel Racer Hailey Kinsel of Cotulla, Texas, rode her blonde bomber and partner in paycheck crime, Sister, to the gold medal in her specialty event in 16.794 seconds. The Sister Act set not only the new arena record with that run, but became the first



Blaster and Lockett, who earlier this year won \$55,750 a man for the W at Rodeo-Houston and ran the same steer they ran the night before to sneak into the medal round as a wild-card team with an 8-second run. This time, they ran him down in 5.35 to grab the gold.

"All we had to do last night was just catch, and now here we were again in the same situation tonight," said Blaster, who looks to be headed to the second NFR of his career and the first since 2010 in

2019. "Kyle and I have roped together at two rodeos now, and we're batting a thousand. He pulled off another awesome shot. That's just what that guy does. To have a chance to win \$50,000 on a Wednesday night is life-changing money for me."

Blaster rode his old faithful head horse, Blacky, who's 20 now. He was actually thinking about selling him last winter to "a lady, a kid or a circuit cowboy," just because he's done his time on the full-time rodeo trail. He's ridden and relied on Blacky at every rodeo since Reno last month, and he delivered yet again with flying colors, just like he did at Houston.

"He's unreal," said Blaster, who's 35 now. "We raised him, and he's just a winner. When the pressure's on, call on old Blacky. You won't be sorry. He always comes through."

So does Kyle Lockett, who roped at the last of his so-far seven NFRs 14 years ago in 2005.

"Roping last is obviously the best spot, but it's kind of nerve-wracking when it's miss after miss ahead of you," said the man they call Meat, who's 41 and rode his sorrel steed Stinky to the gold medal. "I'd just as soon try to be 5 flat as 8 flat. We were last out last night, too, and had the same steer. A clean catch got us back. We were 8.3 in a 5.3 setup. Lots of teams that roped before us had troubles tonight. I was wanting some guys to start catching to get a little roll going.

"We didn't make a textbook run, by any means. Ty roped a neck, and I took kind of a wild shot—about like Houston—and had to reach further than a guy would want to. But it was either throw right there or not at all, so I had to let it fly. It's pretty cool that we're two-for-two together. It's hard to even wrap my fingers around what's been happening this year. It's nuts."

Roff, Oklahoma, bull rider Trevor Kastner, who earned \$58,500 for his 2019 RodeoHouston win, is saying something similar. He drew Matt Scharping's Bad Beagle last night in Salt Lake, and 87.25 points later had a gold medal hanging around his neck. Bad Beagle bucked Kastner off in the short round at the rodeo in Logandale, Nevada, this spring, so Kastner made the most of the muchanticipated rematch.

"It's been a great year—first winning Houston and now this," said four-time National Finalist Kastner, who's sitting second only to five-time Champ of the





World Sage Kimzey in the world bull riding standings right now. "Any night you can add \$50 grand to your bank account rates up there pretty high. It's great to get to show up with a chance to win big money like this."

To see Big Valley, Alberta, cowboy Zeke Thurston take the saddle bronc riding victory lap came as no surprise to anyone. The 2016 world champion saddle bronc rider—who like Kaycee Feild following Lewis' lead is following in his NFR dad Skeeter's footsteps—rode Bar T Rodeo's Son of Sadie for 89 points and the top spot on the Salt Lake medal podium.

"I've been really lucky to win some big rodeos of this caliber with huge amounts of money on the line like this one, Calgary and Houston," Thurston said. "I have no words for it, really. It's crazy. I'd seen this horse lots, but had never been on her. She's been rodeoing way longer than I have, and they've won a lot of rounds on her at the NFR. She was on my bucket

list, for sure. I'm just glad I got my chance.

"I've been to a couple of WCRA rodeos now, and I like the format. Everybody has a chance. And the clean slate at the end causes everybody to let their hair down and throw caution to the wind, which makes for a great show."

After the capacity crowd watched Texan Ty Harris take the tie-down roping title (to be totally transparent, which is the WCRA way, a flagging error cost reigning World Champ Caleb Smidt the gold

in that event), it was time to bring on the breakaway ropers. Sixteen-year-old Jordi Edens of Gatesville, Texas, turned out to be the show stopper.

The National High School Rodeo Association reserve national champ in both 2017 and '19—who'll be a high school senior at White Horse Christian Academy in Stephenville this fall—won it all with a 2.58-second run to edge silver medalist Jackie Crawford's 2.76. Edens grabbed her gold from the back of her horse Honey, who at 11 is just five years her junior.

"This is definitely the biggest day of my life," beamed the elated blonde teen. "We bought Honey from Jackie after she trained her. And Jackie and I practice together a lot. So to stand on that podium next to her was pretty special.

"I've never roped for anything like this. This is the best time ever for breakaway ropers, and for a 16-year-old kid to win \$50,000 is unheard of. The WCRA has opened so many doors, and I'm excited to be a part of it."

aydence Roberts is returning to Las Vegas and the Junior World Finals for the fourth consecutive year in the barrel racing, and she's shaking up her routine with a qualification in the pole bending for the first time. The 11-year-old from Rincon, New Mexico, rode her horse Rapid at the KK Run for Vegas qualifier in Loveland, Colorado, in May to win the junior poles. Primarily a barrel horse, it had been two years since Rapid had seen a pole, with the exception of a review run through the week before, and the pair stopped the clock at 21.0 in Loveland. "I had two horses and my main horse ended up hitting a pole—I didn't even think I'd enter on Rapid," Caydence explains. "When I came out I was just ec-

static that we had a clean run!" Her younger sister, Cylee Jo, also qualified for the Junior World Finals in Loveland in the barrel racing for the first time, astride Caydence's barrel horse Sonny.

"It's really fun walking around at Cowboy Christmas, and all my family on my mom's side lives in Las Vegas. It's really cool because a lot of people from the NFR are there. Jana Bean is my inspiration, and I got to meet Trevor Brazile," says Caydence. She was the reserve world barrel racing champion at the Junior NFR in 2017 and finished eighth in the nation last year.

She's been on horseback since she was 12 days old, introduced to the sport by her parents, Casey and Chancie Roberts, who both compete and team rope together. "I love horses and we live on a ranch, so I've just hung with it," says Caydence. "My mom is out there 24/7 with all our horses and if

we're having trouble she's always telling us how to fix it and helping us with them. Our dad drives us everywhere, and he works to make the money while Mom helps us." Caydence and her siblings, Cylee Jo and Catch, compete in junior rodeos as well, and practice together. Between Caydence and Cylee Jo, they have nearly 30 trophy saddles in the house, and their grandpa Greg Miller has built them several buckle cases. Caydence also does 4-H rodeos, and last year she took home four of the five saddles she was eligible to win, including barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying, and the all-around. "I finished third in goats, so that's a big focus right now."

Along with goat tying, Caydence is focused on riding her horses. She's taking her two of her horses, MPH Black Eagle "Rapid" and No Socks Frost "Sonny," to Las Vegas this December. "My main pole horse is Dumpy (HR Rickety Dumptruck) and you have to drive him down the poles as hard as you can and I like the challenge. Rapid you really have to ride, and you can't miss a beat with him or he'll leave you off the back. It's fun because it's not easy and you have to work for it." Caydence also rides an orphaned heifer named Penelope that she raised from just hours old, and trained her for roping, barrel racing, and carrying flags. Catch also brands off of her. "My mom buys young horses and breaks them and gets them started on barrels. She trained Rapid and he's won a lot of open rodeos and big barrel races," says Caydence. After chores and practice are done, Caydence and her siblings enjoy swimming, as well as playing basketball and soccer with their dad, or going fishing. "I really like working with the colts, so I think training is something I'm going to look into when I'm older," Caydence finishes. "My future goal is to get to the NFR and go pro."

Cal Poly: Raising Rodeo Legends

odeo took California State Polytechnic University by storm on April 8, 1939 when 15 student athletes joined up to compete at the C Bar G Ranch near Victorville, California. Cal Poly has continued this cowboy tradition ever since. In 1949, Cal Poly joined the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA), sending its six-man team to the College National Finals Rodeo (CNFR) in San Francisco, CA. Cal Poly quickly achieved national recognition for the competitiveness of its rodeo teams.

One of the most winning colleges in the NIRA, Cal Poly's rodeo program boasts 46 national titles and has produced more Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association World Champions, Wrangler National Finals Rodeo qualifiers, and ProRodeo Hall of Fame inductees than any other college rodeo program. Cal Poly's legendary alumni include Greg Ward, Monty Roberts, Jack Roddy, Bob Tallman, Sharon Camarillo, Tom Ferguson, Chris Lybertt, John Jones Jr., Nolan Twisselman, and Billy Bugenig.

Cal Poly rodeo received another major boost when Cotton Rosser enrolled as an Animal Husbandry student in 1948. His enthusiasm for rodeo brought many

hidden talents to the surface. Owner of the Flying U Rodeo Company, Rosser has dazzled rodeo audiences with extravagant grand entries, award-winning specialty acts, and quality stock for more than 60 years. In 1951, he was one of the founding students of what is known as the Poly Royal Rodeo. Built of chain-link fence and bailing wire, the modest Collet Rodeo Arena on the Cal Poly campus hosted more than 4,000 spectators in the rodeo's inaugural year.

Today, Poly Royal is one of the largest intercollegiate rodeos in the world, thanks to Cal Poly's rodeo coach and CNFR All-Around Cowboy Ben Londo. The rodeo attracts more than 15,000 spectators in Cal Poly's Spanos Stadium, where the green grass is covered with

plywood, dirt, and animals for two fast-paced exciting performances.

Aside from its impeccable rodeo reputation, Cal Poly remains one of the most prestigious universities on the West Coast. On average, 65,000 students submit applications to the school each year. Less than 30 percent are accepted. This "learn-by-doing, backwater institution" produces captains of industry from its Agriculture, Engineering, Architecture, and Business Colleges. Cal Poly offers students the unique opportunity to not only grow in the arena but academically as well. While society seems to forever be drifting from the cowboy lifestyle, rodeo's timeless presence continues to grow and flourish at Cal Poly.

s the reigning world champion saddle bronc rider in the NSPRA, Ronnie Ward is living out his childhood rodeo dreams. However, the stars in Ronnie's eves were and are actually for bull riding. "My identical twin brother (Donnie) and I always wanted to rodeo growing up, but our parents wouldn't let us. We had some cousins that rode



bulls that we both looked up to," said the Southwest City, Missouri, bull rider. If they hadn't set their hearts on the roughstock events, Ronnie's parents may have let the boys rodeo long before their 18th birthday. "They just didn't want us to get hurt."

When Ronnie first got on a bull it was at Johnny Williams' house just down the road, who operated Tick Hill Rodeo Company back in the day. "On Sunday afternoons Johnny had an open practice pen at his house. We got on his bulls and anything else he had. Johnny helped a lot of people become better competitors." Donnie only stuck with bull riding for two years before deciding he would rather fight them instead. As for Ronnie, he married Candice and they started a family while he began his career in the construction business and continued to rodeo.

He was hitting the trail hard in the 90s for the IPRA, ACRA and CRRA when a torn ACL sidelined him in 1996. After recovering, Ronnie hit a few more rodeos before taking a 13-year break from bull riding. "Life just kind of got in the way of rodeo. I needed to focus on getting everything raised: a family and our small farm." At the same time, Ronnie became a journeyman plumber, master carpenter and a licensed general contractor which allowed him to become an entrepreneur. "We have a small cattle herd - about 50 momma cows - and my wife works in town while I work on a pipeline. I have been in the gas utility business for the last five years."

In 2015, Ronnie found his way back to rodeo through a senior association where he competed for a year before stumbling upon the NSPRA. After attending some performances as a spectator, Ronnie fell in love with the sport all over again. "This is absolutely a professional association for competitors of my age. It was kind of a dream come true for me. I stayed home in my prime and I didn't get to make the circuit finals or NFR. When I made the SNFR that first year, I felt like I had finally

gotten to live my dream."

Ronnie has made the SNFR every year since 2016 and last year was his best yet. After attending a saddle bronc school last November, he decided to give it a shot for a year. "I rode bareback horses and bulls when I first got into rodeo. I love the horse events, I think they are great. But they are way harder on your body. I know I have a longer career riding bulls than I do with the horse events." For the 2019 season, Ronnie is putting everything he has – and a little bit more - into bull riding in the NSPRA. Now that he has tasted the high of winning a world title, he is hungry for one in his favorite event. Ronnie knows he wouldn't have gotten that first one if it wasn't for his family and rodeo friends. Amid all this success, Ronnie keeps everything in perspective. "Put God first and everything else will fall into place."



SPURS OR NO SPURS

purs or no spurs is the question. Many times while I'm at a team roping jackpot I see ropers' horses overrun the cattle. Most of the time it's the headers but I see heel horses acting chargey as well. Whenever I see this happening I look to see if the rider is wearing spurs, ninety percent of the time the answer is yes! Many times not only are they wearing spurs, but spurs with long shanks and sticker rowels. I wear spurs only rarely while rop-

ing but the spurs I like have a one inch one shank and a rowel the size of a dime and as thick as a nickel with a smooth edge. Most people do not ride good enough to wear spurs. If you insist on wearing spurs wear them to town but not when you rope on your horse.

This winter in Arizona I had a friend come and stay with me. He brought three head horses and four steers and his living quarters trailer. We had fun. We would get up early and rope before we went jackpotting and if there was enough daylight, when we got home we would rope again.

My friend is a low numbered guy so he gets to rope in the #8 ropings. As you know, most producers use their slowest cattle in the #8 roping. After the first roping we went to we realized he was practicing wrong. Our practice steers were fairly strong but in competition the steers were slow so my friend's horse was overrunning the competition cattle. My observation was twofold. First off, we needed to ace our practice steers to make them more like the competition steers and then my friend needed to take his spurs off. When I told my friend of my observations he wasn't sure this was a good plan. He was all for acing the steers but he said, "I would rather rope without my Wranglers than take my spurs off." To avoid getting the inside of his legs chafed, he decided to keep his Wranglers on and take his spurs off. It wasn't long, my friend's horse was rating back on the slow steers and my friend was winning. After a month in Arizona he left still competing without spurs.

At one jackpot while watching my friend in the #8 I noticed an old friend named Dennis from California. Dennis was heeling on a horse that was chargy, going down the arena and then when the steer was turned the horse would rush in and go up to the steer's shoulder. I could see Dennis was frustrated because he was missing. When he rode by me I called him over. I said, "Dennis, at the risk of sounding like a know-it-all, I think I can help you." His response was, "Please

help me. I am so frustrated, talk to me." So I simply told him to take his spurs off and tighten his tie down one notch. He thanked me and rode off. The rest of the story is that he placed in that pot and again the next day at another arena.

One more story about spurs. Back in the day when my brother Waltwas putting on lots of schools, he called me to help him with a group of students in Philadelphia. At this clinic there were two head-

ers who were struggling because their horses were overrunning the steers. Walt asked me to single these two guys out and help them. I tried to be as diplomatic as possible when I requested that they both take their spurs off. One guy was especially adamant that he never spurred his horse, other than when he wanted to. So my response was, "Just humor me. Maybe I'm wrong, but let's give it a try and take your spurs off." Both men had spurs with two and a half inch shanks on them. Within two runs with spurs off these two horses were rating back and these two guys were catching. I felt satisfied that through observation skills I was able to help these two headers. But the next morning both of these guys had their spurs back on and their horses were overrunning the steers again. Now I was frustrated so I asked Walt to help me understand what was going on. Walt said, "it's because we are east of the Mississippi River. You see, cowboys are rare and when you are a cowboy you need your stuff. A cowboy hat, long sleeved shirt, Wranglers, cowboy boots and spurs. You are asking these two guys to leave some of their cowboy stuff off." I just shook my head. I thought people went to roping schools to try and raise their catching percentages. But it seems that ego and image are competing forces.

As I look around it seems cowboys have the same problems West of the Mississippi river as well. Ego and image are the enemies of horsemanship and catching percentages. So if your horse is chargy and overruns slow cattle, do him and yourself a favor and leave your spurs in the tack room.

MASON PITTS

here have been years of preparation leading up to the success that Smarty Young Pro, Mason Pitts, has experienced. When the Haughton, Louisiana 18-year-old showed interest in roping at a young age, his dad, Chet Pitts got involved as well, and he and Mason's mom, Kelli Pitts, did all they could to provide opportunities for Mason to grow in a sport he was enthralled by. Mason's parents both work in the oil industry, Kelli for an oilfield company, and Chet as a self-employed contractor. Kelli put aside her barrel racing competition to support Mason's goals when he started getting serious about the rope in his hands at about 9 years old. Mason's older brother, Colton, 27, roped some, but was more involved in other sports. State, national, and world titles have come since those beginner roper days; and most recently Mason and fellow Smarty teammate, Chet Weitz, finished as the 7th place team ropers in the world at the 2019 National High School Finals Rodeo in Rock Springs, Wyoming.

Although Mason was born and raised in Louisiana and spent 6 years competing in the Louisiana High School Rodeo Association, he chose a zip code change to Hamilton, Texas in February to finish out his final high school rodeo season in Region 10 of the Texas High School Rodeo Association. "Chet and I were the 2019 Texas High School Rodeo Association Champion Team Ropers this year, and it felt really good to come to such a competitive state and finish on top my first year there. It is a great environment to be in." After graduating from Haughton High School in Louisiana in December, Mason moved to live and work for a family in Stephenville, Texas helping around their ranch, and putting himself in a prime location for a dedicated heeler with big goals ahead.

During his rodeo years in Louisiana, success became standard for the cowboy. Mason was the 2015 LJHSRA Champion Heeler, roping with Morgan Sparks; and he was the 2014, 2016, and 2018 LHSRA Champion Heeler with partner, Tyler McGuffee, whose dad, Brian McGuffee was a friend of Mason's dad and helped Mason with his roping skills. Mason and Tyler were the 2014 NJHFR world champion team ropers, winning the coveted title in Des Moines, Iowa. The team almost repeated their world champion success at last year's NHSFR and came back to the short round as the second-high call team. "When I

threw my rope in the short round the steer took a big jump and hopped right over my rope and there wasn't much I could do. We finished as the 11th place team in the world in Rock Springs last year."

Mason is currently competing on the 14-year-old bay mare, Belle, that he has owned since he was in 5th grade. But, most of his success came from the back of a red roan gelding he called Junior. "I competed on Junior for 7 years and went from a number 4 roper to a number 9 on him. I just retired him a few months ago at 16 years old. After taking him around the world every year, he had lots of miles under him, and I felt it was time to give him a break."

As a second-year Smarty Young Pro member, Mason is grateful for all of the people he meets on the team and enjoys seeing them at the ropings and rodeos he attends. He also likes getting recognized by younger kids that come up to talk to him at events. "It's been a great thing going to Decatur to camps and seeing Allen Bach and Jade Corkill and some of the pros that attend." Although initially Mason thought being on the team would be a great thing,

he appreciates all the company does for him even more today. "It's become more than what I expected, and I'm grateful for the recognition it gives us in the industry. I love the conference calls and I feel like a better person every time I get off the phone after listening to Trey Johnson."

With youth rodeo competition behind him, Mason looks forward to the big ranks of rodeo for his future. He appreciates all that his sponsors do for him to keep him traveling down the rodeo trail; Classic Ropes, Resistol, and Smarty Young Pros.

randon Ben has been roping for 11 years. He started because his family ropes and he's carrying it on. He learned from his dad, Rawley Ben, who is a 8+ heeler and 7 header. From, Peridot, Arizona, the 17 year old has done quite well in the roping world; he's won two trucks so far – including the one that ZD Cattle is giving away in September. "I am keeping both of them, using them to travel," said the #7 heeler who is also a #6 header. He ropes on a 6 year old bay mare. "She's pretty small, like a kid's horse, but we've been roping on her since she was three." Six of Brandon's eight siblings' rope and they each have a horse they compete on. Whenever they are not at school or traveling, the family can be found in the arena.

He is going to be a senior and fits school into his roping. Sometimes that doesn't always work out - he qualified for the World Series Finale in Vegas this coming December, but can't attend. "I can't miss that much school."

Along with the two trucks, Brandon has more than 500 buckles that he has collected over the years.

He takes the money he wins roping to enter more, buy feed and tack and help support his family. The family trains horses and rides horses for people that send them to them. He learned how to train horses from his dad, and they can have as many as 15 outside horses they are work-

ing with at a time. "If we buy a horse, we

keep it for ourselves," he said.

He and his two brothers help with the training. His five sisters are not as involved in the training, but they rope.

Their place is complete with cattle and a donkey, which they trail.

When he graduates from high school next spring, he plans to try prorodeoing and go to college at Central Arizona College, and focus on college rodeo.



eaving for Rock Springs, Wyoming as the 2019 Louisiana High School Rodeo Association Champion All-Around Cowboy, Brad Hesnor had the confidence he needed for the NHSFR and it showed. Brad finished as LHSRA's champion tie-down roper and reserve champion steer wrestler. "It was great carrying on that success to nationals, and I left Rock Springs as the fourth-place steer wrestler in the world after placing third in the short round with a 4.9-second run."

Ville Platte, Louisiana holds a special charm for 17-year-old, Brad Hesnor, and the cowboy plans to spend his future working on the same 7500-acre ranch his family works and resides on now. Much of Brad's time is spent either helping his grandpa, Thurman Floyed, raise cattle and train young horses; or managing his own field used for farming crawfish. "During the months of February thru June, I take my boat out to my rice field and check my crawfish traps. I collect the crawfish in a sack and take it to my uncle, Robert Floyed, who owns the Central Crawfish Company where he buys, sells, and processes crawfish." Late in the summer, the rice from the fields is

harvested, and they prepare for another season. Even though that sounds like a full-time schedule, Brad also spends a great bit of his time practicing and competing in rodeos and likes to duck hunt when he can.

A third-generation cowboy, Brad started competing in rodeo at a young age, riding and learning the ropes from his grandpa. "My grandpa is from Madisonville, Texas and didn't rodeo much himself but was quite a ranch hand and knew how to rope." Brad's Uncle Robert competed as a team roper in high school, and Brad's mom, Judy, rode cutting horses. Brad's dad, Chad Hesnor, is a building contractor. Brad tries to live by his dad's advice, "Just do what you love." Brad has an older brother, CJ, and two older sisters, Monique and Ashley, who were both rodeo competitors in cutting, barrels, and poles. Brad's little sister, Michelle, is 11 and competes in breakaway roping, poles, and barrels. Brad also has a step-sister, Andee Fontenant, 22, and stepbrother Briar Fontenant, 25, who competed as a team and calf roper in LHSRA and helped Brad a lot when he began roping.

Although family has been his primary support, Brad's very grateful to all that have helped him. His mom and Mr. Chad Fontenot help him take care of horses and haul him to rodeos, "They're always here for me in and out of the arena, supporting me in whatever I do." Bobby Mudd has been instrumental in helping him with calf

roping, helping him know how to handle a bad calf and hustle through a run. "Tom Carney has helped me with steer wrestling; he started me and taught me his style, and that's how I do it." Brad enjoys practicing his favorite event with the Soileau brothers. "Grant and I grew up together and are the same age. We both haze for each other and are team roping partners. Grant hazes for me, and he won the champion steer wrestler title this year."

The horses helping him achieve his success are a sorrel mare named Cat, that he ropes calves and heels on, and a solid sorrel steer wrestling gelding he calls Bobcat. "Cat runs hard to the calf and lets me get to my stirrup and hold my slack. Bobcat was raised on my family's ranch and my grandpa broke him as a colt. I used to breakaway and team rope on him, but I converted him over to steer wrestling and he's done great. It was really special for him to win the 2019 AQHA Horse of the Year at finals. Before every run, I try to visualize a great run on whatever stock I draw, and when I'm done, I make sure I give all the glory to God for what He's given me."

As a rising senior at Sacred Heart High School, Brad enjoys his math and chemistry classes. He plans to attend McNeese College in Lake Charles, Louisiana to compete on the college rodeo team while studying for his ag business degree before returning to Ville Platte to take over management of his family ranch.

inning a champion all-around title is an accomplishment that many aspire to achieve on the paths to the gold buckle circles of rodeo. Although Josey Murphy, of Keachi, Louisiana has made her way to the top of those golden trails before, winning the champion all-around title doesn't get easier the next go round. The 17-year-old, third-generation cowgirl has been involved in the Louisiana High School Rodeo Association since she was a 6th grader and won the 2015 and 2016 Champion All-Around Cowgirl titles in her 7th and 8th grade seasons. She moved up to the high school ranks with immediate success and was named the 2017 LHSRA Champion Rookie All-Around, Champion All-Around Cowgirl and 2017 National Rookie All-Around Champion as a freshman. As a junior, she has once again claimed the title she's grown so fond of and was LHSRA's most recent champion all-around cowgirl after a successful 2019 season.

Competing in multiple events is what it takes to continually clinch the top titles, and Josey recently finished as the reserve champion barrel racer, pole bender, and goat tyer, as well as finishing third in breakaway roping and fifth in team roping, heading for Will Thibodeaux. Another title that Josey is very proud of is her 2017 Champion Breakaway Roper title (that she earned as the youngest contestant ever to win it) in the Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association, that her mother, Julie Murphy, had also won 20 years earlier.

Much of the success Josey has achieved, she credits to the strong rodeo family she is surrounded by on the 500-acre family ranch she resides, along with parents, K.C. and Julie, brother, Macon, grandparents, Gary and Mary Murphy, and aunt and uncle, Marty and Penny Murphy. On the Murphy Ranch, they train and sell barrel and rope horses, operate a fencing company, bale hay, and have a cattle operation. "My mom is originally from south Texas, and my dad is from Montana. They both rodeoed and met in Montana four years before they ran into each other again at a rodeo in Louisiana, where my dad was going to college. They've been married for 23 years now." Josey's brother also competes as a team roper and tie down roper, and all of

the horses and ranch operations are a family affair with contributions by all. Josey's grandpa is also a hat salesman for Resistol.

Josey is grateful to have fantastic geldings, trained at the Murphy Ranch, to compete in her events on. Shorty is a 20-year-old sorrel she runs in barrels and she runs Robin, a 12-year-old palomino in poles. For goat tying, she uses a grey 13-year-old called Casino, and a bay 10-year-old name Pistol Pete for breakaway roping. "It's a very good feeling, and so rewarding to ride horses my family has trained here on the ranch. My parents have hands down helped me the most. My mom trained my barrel horse, and always points out areas I can fix and improve, and my dad helps work the chutes and helps with all my roping events, they are just a great help to me always."

Josev will be a senior next year at Central School, a small K-12 school in Grand Cane, Louisiana. "I love history, and I've been involved in the Fellowship of Chris-

tian Athletes. I was also inducted into the National Honor Society for my grades and service. After high school I'd like to college rodeo and am leaning toward studying to become a dental hygienist."

Josey traveled to Shawnee, Oklahoma for the 2019 IFYR, where she represented Bloomer Trailers on her way to the NHS-FR in Rock Springs, Wyoming, and in the second round of the IFYR, she finished 2nd in poles with a 19.6, and 4th in barrel racing. In the first round of the NHSFR she finished 6th in breakaway roping and in the top 20 in goat tving. She appreciates the support of Stacey Martin of Next Level Goat Tying, Resistol, O'Neal Gas, JWD, Rattler Ropes, and Bloomer Trailers "I practiced and prepared myself for finals and talked to God every day. He's the one who has bigger plans. I know after the summer run that I've done all I can do; so, whatever happened is how it's supposed to be."

give all the glory for my accomplishments to my Lord and savior, Jesus Christ. I have no doubt that he's placed people in my life the past two years that have changed my life for the better," says Tuscaloosa, Alabama cowboy, Jordan Brown. In these two years, Jordan has been a member of the Southeastern Professional Rodeo Association and is experiencing the fulfillment of his lifelong dream of becoming a bareback rider, thanks to the help of some other SPRA cowboys.

The 23-year-old graduated from Alexandria High School in 2014 and spent his high school years as a bull rider. He was the 2012 North Alabama Youth Rodeo Association Champion Bull Rider, and his parents, Jeana Hughes, and Chris Brown were supportive of the cowboy following in his grandfather, Ronnie Epperson's, footsteps. "My mom's dad rode bareback horses and worked as a pickup man and always had stories to tell about his rodeo days. As a kid, you can only imagine what it was like, but I knew I wanted to live that life." Jordan also had second cousins that were bull riders, and although they were past their rodeo days, they and Jordan's grandpa were happy to help the young cowboy get started in a rodeo career. "I rode bulls until I was 18, then I had a car accident and had to stay off of bulls for almost two years while I recovered."

During the time he was getting his physical health back. Jordan obtained his EMT certificate and license and worked on an ambulance for three years. In 2017, once he felt physically ready to get back to rodeo, his life took a turn towards the future he now looks forward to. "I was at an SPRA rodeo in Tuscaloosa, and although I was there to ride bulls, I'd always been intrigued with bareback riding. I saw Trey Moore getting

ready to ride, and started a conversation with him, and he told me about an SPRA rough stock clinic that was coming up. I got on my first bareback horse at that clinic and knew that's what I wanted to do. I had my bull rope sold within a week and have been bareback riding ever since. I'm so thankful to Trey, Blake Arp, and Lance Etheridge, who were helping at the clinic. I believe it was a God thing that I was there, and Trey and I have been as close as brothers since that day. He's helped me in more ways than I can tell vou."

Jordan finished his first season as a bareback rider as the 2018 SPRA Champion Rookie Bareback Rider. "I love living the rodeo life and enjoy being at the rodeos around the other cowboys and being a part of something." This season has had a rocky start for Jordan, "I couldn't really find my groove at the beginning of the year, and with bareback riding you have to be mentally tough, it was taking a toll on me mentally and physically. By spring I started riding better and my confidence started building; and now I 've had a pretty good summer." To help stay mentally strong, Jordan enjoys reading motivational and positive-thinking books. "I encourage everyone to pick up some sort of positive thinking book at least once, it opens your eyes to ways of thinking about life."

Jordan is taking online college classes at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, and is busy as a leather smith, making custom belts and wallets. "I'm blessed with so many leather orders I can barely keep up; that's a good thing, but it can be hard juggling rodeo and school." Jordan is grateful for the opportunity to college rodeo next year and will be attending SWOSU on a rodeo scholarship while studying in the wildland firefighting program. "I'm only eligible for one more year of college rodeo, and this is something I've dreamed about and honestly never thought would come my way. I'm going to try to take in this rodeo experience as much as possible."

Jordan is thankful to his mom, and all that have been supporters of his rodeo endeavors over the years.

he Morrison women of Cheyenne Honigman's family have passed on the barrel racing gene to the 21-year-old Mid-States Rodeo Association cowgirl. Growing up in Seville, Ohio, Cheyenne was surrounded by horses and her mom and aunts racing them around the cloverleaf barrel pattern. "I have been riding on a horse with family members since I was in a baby carrier, and long before I could walk or talk. It has been a constant in my life and the women in my family say it runs in the Morrison blood." Cheyenne lives with her parents, Matt and Anita Honigman, and her

younger brother, Drake, who is 17. Matt works for an excavating company, and Anita works for a dog food company, and has been competing in barrel racing her whole life. Anita and her sisters, Tammy Sutton and Chris Bohman, have been big influences on Cheyenne's horseback riding and although their own competition has slowed down some, Chevenne's Aunt Chris is currently competing in the IPRA. Cheyenne is in her third year of competition with the Mid-States Rodeo Association and is loving the association and

the competition. "When you place in a Mid-States rodeo, you have really done something because it's a tough group of competitors at the MSRA rodeos. It's always more rewarding to pull a check with those girls than anywhere else."

Cheyenne started competing in the MSRA three years ago when she felt her special chestnut gelding, JJBrokeNoMo was ready for the rodeo competition. "JJ's breeding is by PC Lonewood Special, out of Sassy Che Girl, and he was a yearling when we bought him from Hoppel's Farm in Rogers, Ohio. My mom broke him, and I finished him; then we futuried and derbied him some, before starting him at the rodeos when he was 6 years old. I really love the atmosphere of rodeos more than barrel race jackpots, and he has handled it very well. His turning style is pretty easy, and he's a free runner so I don't have to sit there and drive him, I can just ride, and he does his job, he's pretty automatic. est horse you'll ever meet and will stand on three legs to get you to scratch him in certain spots; he loves to be scratched everywhere. And, he's so lovable he'll put his head in your hand and sit there all day to be with you. He hates the speakers at rodeos, but when he goes in to do his job, he just tunes them out and works. He's the only horse I'm riding right now, and I am so grateful for him." Cheyenne plans to enter as many MSRA rodeos as she can this season and is hopeful that she and JJ will make the MSRA finals at the end of the season.

Cloverleaf is not just the pattern that Cheyenne spends most of her time on in the arena, but also the high school she graduated from in 2016. Since graduating from Cloverleaf Local Schools, she has been attending Ohio State Agricultural Technical Institute in Wooster, Ohio, and she'll graduate in December 2020 with an agricultural business management degree. She hopes to work in crop, soil, or water management, and possibly crop insurance. Cheyenne's family raises crops and hay on the family land that they live on, so she is already familiar with her area of study.

Although rodeo, school, and farming keep her schedule pretty full; when she can, she likes to watch professional barrel horses owned by Amberly Moore, Nellie Miller, and Hailey Kinsel. "I like the style of Amberly's horse, Paige. And who doesn't love Hailey's horse, Sister? She's just amazing! I like Nellie's horse, Sister, also, because she's got Driftwood breeding like my horse JJ does."

"I'm so thankful to my mom and the whole army of people that are behind me. I could go on and on listing people, my family is my whole support system." Cheyenne also appreciates the support of her sponsor, One Touch Fly Spray.

CHICKEN-FRIED STEAK

INGREDIENTS:

2 1/4 tsp. salt, divided 1 3/4 tsp. black pepper, divided 4 (4 oz.) cube steaks 38 saltine crackers (1 sleeve), crushed 1 1/4 c. all-purpose flour, divided

1/2 tsp. ground red pepper 1/2 tsp. baking powder

4 3/4 c. milk, divided 2 large eggs

3 1/2 c. peanut oil



Chicken-Fried Steak

DIRECTIONS:

Sprinkle 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon black pepper evenly over steaks. Combine cracker crumbs, 1 cup flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon black pepper, red pepper and baking powder. Whisk together 3/4 cup milk and eggs. Dredge steaks in cracker mixture; dip in milk mixture and dredge again in cracker mixture. Pour oil into a 12-inch skillet; heat to 360 degrees. (Do not use a nonstick skillet.) Fry steaks 3 to 4 minutes. Turn and fry 2 to 3 minutes or until golden brown. Remove steaks to a wire rack in a jelly-roll pan. Keep steaks warm in a 225 degree oven. Carefully drain hot oil, reserving cooked bits and 1 tablespoon drippings in skillet. Whisk together remaining 4 cups milk, 1/4 cup flour, remaining 1 teaspoon salt, and remaining 1 teaspoon black pepper. Add milk mixture to reserved drippings in skillet; cook, whisking constantly over medium heat 10 to 12 minutes or until thickened. Serve gravy with steaks. Garnish with chopped parsley if desired.

DIRECTIONS:

Add oats, vanilla, and chocolate chips. Dough will be crumbly. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes.



Meet the Member

Jason Bergey

ullfighter and rodeo clown Jason "BuckShot" Bergey stepped foot in the arena for the first time twoand-a-half years ago. Not one to do things by halves, the 35-year-old from Green Lane, Pennsylvania, spent his first days in an arena in April of 2017 learning to fight bulls, and two months later, he landed his first bullfighting job for Dave

"Me and my dad used to joke around about trying bullfighting all the time. I signed up for a bullfighting school, and two weeks before the school, he passed away, so I made it a dream and a passion for both of us," says Jason. "That was a brand new world. Other than going to the rodeo with my family, that bullfighting school was the first time I stepped in front of a bull. I raced motocross for 12 years, so I got the adrenaline rush. I traveled to their nationals and then I worked a fulltime job driving tractor trailers and dump trucks. Rodeo is like the racing culture," he adds. "Everyone treats everyone like family, and Shawn Zrowka is my boss and I look to him as a brother. We all look out for each other in and out of the arena."

Jason met Shawn Zrowka, owner of Rafter Z Rodeo Company, two years ago when he learned the rodeo company was hosting a bull riding school. "I asked to come out and step in front of a few of his bulls, and it went from there. I also fought for Shawn Graham of Painted Pony, but Rafter Z is my main company," says Jason, who also transports and cares for Rafter Z's livestock. "I'll probably do about 50 shows this year. This year we went to the APRA, and we do IBR and IPRA."

Along with being an all-around hand behind the scenes, Jason found his niche in the limelight when Shawn encouraged him to try rodeo clowning. "I'm a newschool guy, but I also like to bring the old-school stuff back to the new era. The new-school stuff might be about a new challenge on Facebook, and some of the old-school stuff might be about Roman riding. I like to dance so that's also what I bring in. A guy I've looked up to and watched for years is Keith Isley-he's one of the best in the business I think—and I watched Flint Rasmussen at the PBR."

Jason has learned to blend his roles, from reading the crowd as a clown to reading the bulls as a bullfighter. And while he says the job has its stressful moments, he's usually calm but ready to spring into action. "Shawn Zrowka says he's never seen a guy who can outrun a bull flat-footed, and I've done it multiple times," Jason says with a laugh. "My thing is putting on a good show. It's about reading your bulls and reading your riders, and working with other bullfighters. Clowning wise, you're keeping up with what's good and new and funny. I talk to a lot of different clowns and we swap ideas back and forth. One idea might not work for one guy but it works for another. We try to stick together."

While Jason is his own traveling partner down the road, his family is very supportive, coming to watch all the local shows he's working. "When I'm not working, I try to go home and spend time with family and friends, and I'll take my side-by-side (ATV) out and go trail riding," says Jason. "I want to thank my family and friends and the people in the rodeo world that help me. Shawn Zrowka is a big part of this. He's pushed me a lot and makes me strive for more and more," he finishes. "I'd like to work the APRA Finals and do a couple of PBRs, and basically get to the big shows—that's what I want to strive for."



t just 12-years-old, Cade Tobin of Cynthiana, Kentucky, has already earned a name for himself as an all-around cowboy. The Harrison County Middle School 6th grader has earned three champion and three reserve champion all-around cowboy titles in two different junior rodeo associations in the past four years. Cade started out riding sheep before he even began kindergarten, and now competes in practically every event possible for his age. He competes in breakaway roping, goat tying, both ends in team roping, and is now riding steers after stepping up from sheep and calves. Two years ago, added to the long list of events he practices and prepares for, was miniature bareback riding in the International Miniature Rodeo Association, "It's fun and exciting riding bareback ponies; I like getting bucked off!"

Cade attempted his first miniature bareback ride at an event his father, Mike Tobin, helped put on at the Harrison County Fair, the Kentucky Youth Rodeo Championships. Mike explained, "I wanted to add a cool attraction to the rodeo and feature an event our junior rodeos around here didn't really offer. I found Gus Halev of Rafter H Mini Broncs and asked him to be involved. Cade wanted to give it a try, and even though he bucked off his first one, I knew he had the bug." Now, Cade has made multiple bareback rides and has qualified to compete at the IMRA finals at the International Professional Finals Rodeo in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma in January.

Cade's dad is a team roper who has put his heading and heeling on the backburner while he invests in his children getting their own starts as the next generation of rodeo athletes. Mike and Cade's mom, Lori, met at a rodeo where she was also competing as a barrel racer, and have been together ever since. Cade has a 19-year-old sister, Haley, and 4-year-old sister, Brinlee. Haley is also a rodeo competitor and is starting her second year as a student athlete on the rodeo team at Southern Arkansas University. Lori works in the business office at a local hospital. Mike works for the

Kentucky Farm Bureau; and the family has a farm where they raise a cow-calf herd and farm hav.

The family also trains horses; often buying colts from the Pitzer sale in Nebraska and raising them up to train for their future needs. Mike trains the rope horses and Lori trains the barrel horses. They often show some of their colts at AQHA shows, and Cade recently qualified his two horses, Muffin and Durango, in the heading and heeling for the AQHA World Finals.

While in between seasons in his junior rodeo associations, Cade spent the summer focusing on his bareback riding, and was able to attend several IMRA events

that included the mini buckers. After each one, he is looking forward to getting on the next. He also looks forward to school starting soon, where math is his favorite subject, and he enjoys playing basketball for the Cynthiana Bulldogs. In his spare time, he is a typical kid that likes to play Fortnite and Xbox games, but hopes to be a farmer and rodeo star in the future. For now, he looks forward to the IMRA finals coming up in January and having his chance to spur one out under the big lights of the IFR, like his favorite professional bareback rider, Kaycee Field.

aniel Raynor, a 36-year-old heeler that has sat atop many leaderboards over his rodeo career, is experiencing first-time excitement as he holds a commanding lead as the top rookie heeler of the International Professional Rodeo Association. "I feel like the oldest rookie ever. I've competed in many associations over the years, but this is my first year in the IPRA. I never thought I could travel enough to give it a shot, but this year I decided to give it a go and it's been going well."

Daniel grew up in Benson, North Carolina with his parents, Danny and Judy, and older sister, Wendy. He also has an older brother, Marty Jacumin. Danny Raynor had calf roped in his youth and although he stopped roping before Daniel was born, he obviously passed the roping gene onto his only son. Daniel stumbled across one of his dad's old ropes in the barn and has hardly put one down since. "I found that rope when I was 11 and I just started playing with it and until I got pretty decent at it, and my roping has evolved from there." Daniel's dad, as well as neighbors, Kyle Stewart and family, helped him with techniques to begin with and after roping the dummy every day for years, Daniel's own roping style developed. Although he started out as a header, he's spent more time heeling in the last several years.

Daniel roped in the North Carolina High School Rodeo Association, qualifying for national finals all four years of competition. He won the NCHSRA State Champion Header title with partner Cole Hudgens in 11th grade, and with Josh Austin his senior year. "My dad loved that I roped. He hauled me to rodeos be-

fore I could drive, to national finals three years, to the USTRC finals in Oklahoma, or wherever I needed to be. He really enjoyed it, and it was a real loss when he passed away in 2009 after battling cancer. Although I've won titles in different associations, my dad would love that I am roping in the IPRA this year, and it would mean a lot to me to qualify to the IFR; I'd like to do it for my dad."

Now living in Four Oaks, with wife Elizabeth and daughters, Riley, 12, and Rachel, 7; Daniel works as a supervisor for the North Carolina Department of Transportation, and Elizabeth is an elementary school teacher. Daniel's current header, Daniel McLamb, convinced him to buy his IPRA card this season after the duo started roping together last year. Daniel had been competing at jackpots the past several years, so switching to rodeos again when he partnered with McLamb, was a welcome change. Daniel is grateful to ride his partner's 12-year-old sorrel heel horse, Bullet, at IPRA rodeos.

Daniel is as competitive as they come and claims that over the years learning to lose was a hard lesson to take but was equally as important as learning to win. "I see my daughters get frustrated if things get hard, and I know I have to be an example to them on how to do better. I've learned to enjoy rodeo more than only focusing on winning. No matter how much you want to win, you have to take the good with the bad." Daniel has enjoyed his recent Cowboy Christmas run to IPRA rodeos up north, "It was a good time and we had good fellowship with the other ropers."

Daniel obtained his license to officiate weddings a few years ago to help a friend and has officiated 5 weddings since. He's honored to have been a part of his best friend, Brian Barefoot's wedding. "Brian is the guy that I can talk to if I have a problem and he's been very influential in my life; it was special to be a part of his wedding."

Enjoying the rodeo journey and intent on making as many rodeos as he can the remainder of the season, Daniel is hopeful to make an appearance at the IFR in the end. "I'm especially grateful to my Lord and savior, Jesus Christ, and my family that has supported me through everything." Daniel is also appreciative of sponsors, Lonestar Ropes and Mule City Feeds.

■ia Wallace from Dodge City, Kansas, came into the short go fourth high call. "I made sure I scored sharp and my horse was good," said 17-year-old, who scored a 3.2 on a horse that she's been roping on for 11 years. "We bought her for \$600." Tia learned how to rope from her grandfather. "My granddad, Rusty Looley, has helped me a lot with roping. He was a calf roper and team roper. The hardest thing I had to learn was to make sure I see my start." Tia started roping when she was 6. "I never thought breakaway would get this big." She's made two trips to the IFYR now. Last year she was too long for the short round, but this year she "roped with no fear and rode my horse well across the line." Her parents, Amy and Troy Wallace, and brother Ty are very proud of her accomplishments. "She worked hard for this and deserves it," said Amy. "She rides



and practices every day."

Unfortunately Ty couldn't be at the IFYR. "We have bottle calves – my granddad runs a feed yard and we've got 10 bottle calves." When she's not rodeoing, she's riding horses. "We have 10 of them." She wants to be a veterinarian when she grows

up and hasn't decided on a college. Along with breakaway roping, Tia competes in team roping and barrel racings. She plans on saving the money she gets for her win at the IFYR for future entry fees. "Don't be scared to do what you want to do and follow your dreams."

sen James won the team roping at the IFYR. Coming from fifth high call the duo is used to pressure in the short go. "I didn't know if I was going to catch or not," said heeler, Jessen James. "I told him I was going to follow his lead and he got him fast."

They have won \$60,000 at the United States Team Roping Championship as well as won the Oklahoma State High School Rodeo team roping in their freshman year. "I try not to think about it – I stay calm and focused," said Stran about the pressure of short go. Stran has been roping with Jessen

for four years. They are step brothers and plan to live together in college. Stran's dad (Toby Morris) is married to Jessen's mom (Jennifer Morris). The boys admit to hoping they could be stepbrothers and rope together. "I remember when we were in seventh grade and tried to get our parents to hit on each other because we wanted to be brothers," said Stran.

The boys are done with high school and are headed to Altus College in Oklahoma and will both study animal science. Stran started roping when he was 4 and is currently roping on a borrowed horse.

"My good horse got hurt in February so I borrowed a horse from a buddy. My dad (Toby) helps me a lot, and my mom (Jill Runyan) is the moral support.

Jessen's dad, Dan, got him started in roping. "I was roping as soon as I could walk. I competed in dummy ropings – I won the saddle in 2009." The boys had a little setback last year. Jessen had gone to three rodeos and a few jackpots and fell asleep heading home. He ran off a cliff and wrecked his truck on a Sunday around 2:50 a.m. last August. "I broke my back in two spots and didn't get to do nothing for a long time – I laid in bed for five months. I watched lots of television."

They came back this year though, and the duo plans to make the NFR. $\overline{\ \ \ }$

eagan Davis from Alto, Texas, kept her average lead in the short go, winning the 2019 IFYR Pole Bending with a 19.881 in the short go. She won the second round with a 19.477. She rides a mare that was given to the family. "She was won in a raffle by my uncle when she was a yearling and he gave her to us. She's 9 now; I started training her my seventh grade year when my pole horse went down." Training a pole horse takes hours of work and seasoning. "Even though she's crazy and she bucks all the time, she's a winner anyway, I got lucky." Reagan is 17 and this is her second trip to the IFYR, she was reserve last year. This year she tried to get her speed up. "I've never ran a "4" before – that was a new high for me." She just graduated from a home school co-op and will attend Weatherford College in the fall, majoring in equine sports medicine. Along with pole bending, Reagan competes in barrel racing, breakaway roping and team roping. She made the short go in the breakaway roping as well.

Her parents are Katrina and Jonathan



and she has a little sister, Taylor, 13, who will be defending Reagan's title next year at the IFYR.

Reagan had a rough junior year. She had a horse fall back on her during a pole run in October 2017 and her tibia and fibula broke, coming out of her leg. She had rods placed in her leg and as they were trying to save her leg, she was told she would never ride again. She was riding on crutches in order to compete in her region finals. Then the following March, she re-broke it when

a horse kicked her – it broke all around the rod. "I didn't have a good junior year," she concluded.

This year she came back and won the pole bending and the all around at the Texas State High School Rodeo Association. "I would not be here without my parents and especially God. He has blessed me with great family and friends and I've always been backed by everybody and I wouldn't be here without Him or them."

He competes for Wyoming High School Rodeo and will head to nationals after this week. He started jumping steers his eighth grade year after chute dogging for one weekend. "My dad (Jerrett) rodeoed all through high school and his friend, Jason Lahr, is like my second dad. He's been to the Natioal Finals Rodeo eight times and we called him up." Winston grew up raising cutting horses and a few roping horses. He played baseball and decided he wanted to be like his dad his eighth grade year. He is the youngest in the family, with two brothers, Estin and Brecken, and one sister, Brendan.

Winston has been to the IFYR all four years. He made the short round last year as well as the year before, but never made it to the top. This is his first year on the Bloomer team. "It's amazing – they are the greatest family and one of the best sponsors I've ever had. They keep in contact with you – they care about you – they sent me a graduation card. They better you by having meet-

ings and teaching you life lessons." Along with Bloomer, Winston thanks his family, Clay Logan, Teri and Beau Rappel.

He attributes his success to lots of practice. "We bought some good steers and before Gallup (Best of the Best) I went to Texas and practiced with Jason and sharpened up on a lot of things." Along with practice, he works out. "It helps being in shape and strong," said the 18-year-old who will head

to Cisco, Texas. "Jason is only about an hour away and the assistant coach, Chad Biesemeyer, went to the NFR and started his rodeo career late in life."

Winston hopes to be successful and run his own business someday. "We own a trucking company and I'd like to follow in my dad's footsteps once again – but I want to pro rodeo first."

UNDER PRESSURE

article by C.J. Aragon

very year students ask about developing mental toughness and handling pressure in competition. Some say that certain competitors have the "It" factor and they always seem to do well in high pressure situations. But what is the "It" factor?

I have an old handout that talks about how to handle pressure. It states that most competitors in any sport do not do well under pressure. Those who do well have developed their skills to a high level and are confident in their skills. Because of the work they have put in developing their skills they are able to eliminate the pressure. I think it even goes a step beyond developing your skills. You have to learn how to compete. Most people spend most of their energy on learning the skills that they don't learn how to compete and execute their skills at a high level in competition.

Ask any of the competitors at any big rodeo and they will all tell you that they have butterflies or are nervous to an extent. It is the nature of sports we all want to do well in competition. The advice the Rawhide handout has is that the only difference between rodeoing for fun and rodeoing competitively is the pressure that we put on ourselves.

What amazes me is the amount of time contestants will spend in the practice pen to prepare physically to be competitive. Most rodeo contestants spend hours each day in the practice pen to prepare physically. They will go to the gym and put in work there as

well. I have coached a lot of students that are as tough as nails in the practice pen but always struggle at the rodeos. They simply didn't perform well in pressure situations.

The main problem I see is that they spend 90% of their time focusing on the physical aspect of rodeo. Their horse is in great shape. They have spent countless hours in the gym preparing their body for competition. They have spent even more hours in the practice pen developing their skills. There are a lot of great cowboys at every level of the sport that have comparable skills, what separates the elite athletes is their ability to perform at a high level in competition.

I like to see competition in my students. I want them to learn to be competitive. If they are in the weight room, I want it to be competitive. If they are playing basketball, I want it to be competitive. When they play Ultimate Frisbee, I want a competition. And when we have practices I want them to find ways to be competitive every single day in the practice pen. You only get better as a competitor when you find ways to constantly be competitive. Spend plenty of time and energy developing your ability to compete under pressure. You will thank me later.





