MAD. MEAN. MISERABLE.

ad is often our response when hard words are spoken by someone we love. We get bruised and getting mad offers us an illusion of control.

We choose a mad response, in some cases, because we know no other way. In other cases, it is the appearance of control that has appeal. Or maybe it's because we are scared and want to feel big. Regardless, the pattern is that something happens and the mad gets triggered. The mad might present as a snide smile, a mocking laugh, a look of disgust, an eye roll, an arrogant sigh, a sudden silence or an outright yelling session. Mad often smiles easier than it shouts.

Mad folks tend to be mean folks. In an overt or covert way. Doesn't matter. Mean is mean and intends to right the "wrong" by wronging the wrong doer. Or the universe. Or the dog or the idiots on the road that day. Or everyday. It can be passive-aggressive, the silent treatment, sabotage, gas-lighting, contentiousness, pouting, punishing, plotting revenge or outright yelling hurtful words.

We're not sure why he was mad or what triggered his meanness. However, yet another, in this case a retired Federal Marshal was not mourning his father's passing. I told him I was sorry for the loss of his dad. He said: "...don't be. I don't feel any loss. Dad made sure of that by the time I was 10 (yrs old)." After years of making repair attempts with his father he simply quit trying. His dad was mad and mean.

Miserable. Being mad and mean causes a terrible unrelenting tension. Tightness. Locked up. Can't laugh freely and sure can't cry freely. It's a state of dull miserableness. Isolated and lonely in the rusted tower of self-righteous and self-justified anger. All the while missing out on the best of life. It is self-fulfilling and selfsabotage in its classic predictable form.

His whole life was a "chosen miserableness of his own making and he spread misery to everyone around him". Obviously then, his misery grew deeper. Everyone saw it except him. The loneliness ate away his insides. He blamed the cos-



mos. He doubled-down and re-justified his anger. His misery darkened. Repeat over a lifetime. Failed strategies do not become successful by increasing one's commitment to them. We avoid these folks. Don't be this guy.

Change is hard and gets harder with time and exponentially harder when fueled by fools' blind pride. Mad gets Mean. Mean gets Miserable. Misery multiplies. Mark it down.

There is stronger way. Here's a quadruplet that might be useful.

Hurt. Humble. Happy. Helpful.

When that person we love says a hard thing or fails to come through for us we can get hurt. I tell men to be tough enough to feel the hurt. Don't be such an emotionally driven person and go to "mad" like a week-old calf goes to mamma. Own the hurt and play the adult. Face it. Name it. Feel it. Don't childishly lash out at the nearest weakest thing. This paragraph is my story. This is my speech to myself. It is easier to type about it than to actually do it in the moment. I want to be man enough to admit the hurts.

A better, more courageous, godly and ultimately, bridge-building place, is to go toward humility. Face the mirror and see my part in the issue. See my selfish goals for what they are. Be humble enough to gently talk about it.

This is the work of mature adults. It

seems I have a ways to go. Even Christ, who was always right, lead with humility and the result was....well....reconciling the entire world to God.

Humble is powerful. World changing. Life changing. My father modeled this for me when I was 25 yrs old. I wrote about it 75 articles ago. The strength of his humility grand-slammed my life to a better place.

We want to be happy and not miserable. But some try to get happy through mad and mean ways. It's 100% failure every time. The pathway to happiness is through this idea of being humble when we get hurt.

It is strange counter-intuitive, countercultural and counter to our nature.

So if we want to be happy, we need to give up the pouty mad-mean routine. Have to courage to be humble and build the bridges. Be this guy. This guy is actually helpful to the rest of us. We respect this guy. We let them in. They teach us.

Jesus was. Authentically powerful. For me, I need to humble up a whole lot

HAWNEE, Okla. --- In front of an electric crowd at the Heart of Oklahoma Expo Center, rodeo athletes from across the globe were crowned IFYR (International Finals Youth Rodeo) champions and walked away with upwards of \$250,000 in payouts. The six-day event featured over 930 entries from 35 different states.

California bareback rider Jacek Frost (Browns Valley, CA) landed in the final round after a 77.0 ride in the first go and a 79.0 ride in the second go alongside Luke Thrash (Bastrop, LA) and Bradlee Miller (Huntsville, TX). The California High School Rodeo athlete topped Thrash's and Miller's averages after earning a 74.0 in the round to land the championship position.

The team roping duo Brodee Snow (Bentonville, AR) and Jordan Lovins (Canadian, TX) found themselves in the short round after earning two of the fastest times in the long rounds. Snow and Lovins matched up against Wyoming cowboys Coy Johnson (Buffalo, WY) and Jade Espenscheid (Big Piney, WY) along with Kreece Dearing (Chico, TX) and Beldon Cox (Weatherford, TX). The dominate wave of team roping youth ended with Snow and Lovins recording a 7.0 final round run, besting Johnson/Espenscheid 22.8 second average and Dearing/Cox's 23.6 second average.

The Garden City, Kansas steer wrestler Tanner Meier delivered almost identical times to Newark, Illinois Cowboy Garrett Leathermans in the first two longrounds. The two athletes tied in the short go, but Merier's split second better time from the second go would best Leatherman's 14.6 average with a 13.5.

Being the only saddle bronc rider to cover all three, Statler Wright (Millford, UT) - Who is brother of 3x World Champion Stetson Wright, exhausted the com-



petition earning the high-marked-ride in two out of three rounds at the IFYR and earned more than \$2500.

Point, TX) 2.3-second time and Kaydence Crawford's (Stephenville, TX) 2.4-second run to earn the top time in the average.

After earning one of the fastest times of the week's in the second-go with a 7.7-second run, Trevor Hale (Perryton, TX) backed into the box having to run a 9.1-second time or better to win. The Texas tie-down roper earned the number one spot in the average after notching exactly a 9.1-second time and besting Dylan Hancock's (San Angelo, TX) 25.8 average by one-tenth of a second.

After earning an advancement to the Final Round for landing two of the fastest times of the week, Payton Askins (El Cajon, CA) went into the final round as last to go behind Haiden Thompson (Yoder, WY) and all-around cowgirl Taylor Cuccurullo (Pilot Points, TX). Thompson opened the final round with a swift 16.4 second run which was followed by Cuccurullo's 16.2 second time. Askins had to make a run faster than 16.9 to win the average and delivered an abrupt 16.0 second run to take home the top spot in the average.

Tate Pollmeier (Fort Scott, KS) was unstoppable in the Bull Riding. The former 2x Kansas Junior High School Bull Riding Champion recorded an 84.5-point score in the long round, prior to delivering the highest marked ride of the night with an impressive 88.0 points.

Kaylie Garza (Marion, TX) won the goat tying title at the IFYR courtesy of her 7.4 and 7.6-second run in the long round, and her 7.1-second run in the showdown

In the pole bending high school pole bending record holder Rylee Hardin (New Castle, TX) and expertly navigated the course as her 19.9-second run in the final round was the quickest, distancing runner-up Kylie Cliburn (Prairieville, LA) who recorded a 19.9-second run.



CODY OHL TIE-DOWN ROPER INDUCTED 2020

ody Ohl blazed into the ProRodeo ranks in 1994 by winning Rookie of the Year and his first trip to the National Finals Rodeo. The young Texas roper had been planning his career since he was 15 and winning National High School Rodeo awards.

It would take Ohl a few years to win his first gold buckle. He edged out Fred Whitfield to capture the 1997 Tie-Down World Title by \$5,031. To prove that first win was no fluke, Ohl roared through 1998 and captured a second title.

Ohl had another record-setting year in 2001 as he added steer roping and team roping to his agenda in order to compete for the All-Around title. In the ninth round of the Finals, Ohl missed his calf on the first loop. A second loop caught the calf by the hind legs. As Ohl dismounted, he twisted his knee, tearing two major



ligaments. He managed to crawl to the calf, cut the rope, stand and flank the calf, and finish the tie with a time of 40.3 seconds. Ohl had to be carried from the arena by the Justin Sports Medicine Team. However, he had amassed enough money earlier in the week to secure both the tie-down title and the All-Around title. He accepted both buckles from crutches on the 10th night.

Not one to stay inactive, Ohl battled through rehab and was back on the rodeo trail late in 2002. He continued to win and qualify for National Finals Rodeos, capturing his fifth and sixth tie-down roping titles in 2003 and 2006. He only missed one Finals appearance between 1994 and 2014. He entered an elite group when he passed the \$3 million earnings mark in 2012.

World Championships: 6 (tie-down 1997-98, 2001, 2003, 2006; all-around 2001)

Born September 21, 1973 in Rosenburg, Texas.

From the Induction:

Due to a staph infection in his leg, he was represented by Kendra Santos. Cody roped at 20 National Finals Rodeos, earning 2 of his six buckles after obliterating his knee in the ninth round of the 2001 NFR. It took the better part of the year to recover from that and he came back and won two more titles. In his 20 plus years, his earnings of \$3.5 million, second only to Trevor Brazile, makes him the highest money maker in calf roping history. He has taken home 55 National Finals go round buckles.





SUNNI DEB BACKSTROM CONTRACT PERSONNEL INDUCTED 2020

Sunni Deb Backstrom grew up with a stopwatch in her hand. No doubt encouraged by her mother Ellen, a three-time National Finals Rodeo Secretary and first woman to sit on the PRCA Board of Directors. At age 13, Backstrom made her debut as a rodeo secretary in Augusta, Montana. Since she did not have an RCA card, she had to receive special permission from RCA President Bob Ragsdale to work the event.

Backstrom joined the RCA in 1968 as a timer while she was still in high school. After graduation in 1971, she was issued a secretary, timer, and contract act card. Backstrom quickly rose to become one of the best in the business. She has worked for many rodeo companies over the years including Flying U; Kesler, Ltd.; Rafter G; Jim Shoulders Rodeo Company; Bad Company; Linger Company; and B Bar J Rodeo. She joined the Cervi Championship Rodeo Company fulltime in 1979. In the course of a year, Backstrom works about 120 performances across the country at some of the most prestigious rodeos including Denver, San Antonio, Houston, Nampa, and Waco.

Backstrom is the most decorated rodeo secretary in ProRodeo history. She has won PRCA Secretary of the Year 10 times and WPRA Secretary of the Year twice. She has also worked the National Finals Rodeo 17 years as secretary, three years as timer, and one year as the office manager. She has also worked four PRCA Tour Finales.

Backstrom has dedicated her life to the betterment of the sport of rodeo.

Born May 11, 1953 in Butte, Montana. *From the Induction:*

"I'm not good at this, I'm used to being

in the background. 26 years ago I stood up here and accepted this award for my mom, never thought I'd be here again. Things that are important to me are important to me. My dad bought his RCA card in 1948. Mom bought her timers card in 1960. Dad picked mom up from the hospital when I was 3 days old and off we went to Miles City Bucking horse sale. On my birth certificate, it has a spot for occupation of the father, he was a professional cowboy.

Mom would give me a stop watch and a day sheet, I would time the rodeos when I was 6. By ten, I was in the saddle on a big black horse carrying the American flag in the grand entry. At 13, I secretaried my first rodeo – most rodeo offices were temporary, many in Montana were in bars. I took entries and drew stock in a bar at 13 years old.

I did everything from carrying flags, taking care of the saddle horses, secretarying rodeos and even driving a load of bulls through Montana. I ran the roping chutes, picked up, flanked in flip flops, ran barrels, and team roped. I was one of two in the production department at the first NFR.

That's what rodeo gave me – my friends and my family."

RANDY WITTE NOTABLE INDUCTED 2020

Randy Witte always had an affinity for rodeo but didn't get a chance to participate in the sport till he went to Colorado State University, where he majored in technical journalism and found the CSU rodeo club. He was befriended by Jerome Robinson, a sophomore who was "majoring" in bull riding, and before long Robinson was tying Witte onto bulls, offering instruction and encouragement.

Witte enjoyed his days of competition in college rodeo, and in the Rodeo Cowboys Association, but he knew early on his future was as a rodeo writer, rather than rider. He sold his first magazine article to Western Horseman in 1968. "Judging Rodeo's Bucking Events" was based on interviews he did with saddle bronc rider Jim Wise, World Champion Bull Rider Freckles Brown, and World Champion Bareback Rider Jim Houston.

While still in college he worked a couple summers as a cub reporter for the Denver Post, and got the plum assignment to cover Cheyenne Frontier Days for the paper in 1968. Witte was offered the job



as director of the R.C.A.'s Rodeo News Bureau when he graduated college in 1970, and for the next seven years he enjoyed publicizing ProRodeo with news releases, press kits and recorded radio programs. There was a need for an editor of Rodeo Sports News in early 1976, and Witte was able to also get out the association's paper for the next two years.

In late 1977, Western Horseman magazine offered him a job - they needed someone who could write knowledgeably about rodeo. He that the PRCA not be left in a bind when he left. This was easily granted, and Witte transitioned gradually from one office to the other. By then, the R.C.A. had become the PRCA and Rodeo Sports News had become ProRodeo Sports News. Witte continued to write about rodeo for the next 29 years. During that time he served as editor, and later, as publisher of the magazine.

Born January 28, 1948 in Denver, Colorado.

From the Induction:

"I have many good memories working in a little red brick building in Denver 50 years ago. I had a job as soon as I graduated from college. Our biggest day of the week was Monday; rodeo secretaries would phone me at home Sunday nightand I would record the results and I'd go to the office and I'd bat out a little news release. When the news release was done, we'd stuff them in envelopes and send them all over the country. I had to get the sacks of mail down to the train station before five. I never missed a deadline. I covered the groundbreaking celebration of the PRCA hall of fame. At the time this was the first building that went up in this area of Colorado Springs."

BUTCH KIRBY BULL RIDER INDUCTED 2020


G ary William Kirby, better known as Butch, started his rodeo career at age four when he joined his brothers in a trick riding troupe led by his mother, Mildred. By 16, he had changed his specialty to bull riding. Kirby credits the agility and balance of trick riding as helping with his transition to rodeo's roughest event.

In 1973, Kirby earned his first trip to the National Finals Rodeo at age 18. (At the time, the youngest qualifier in any roughstock event.) It would take a few more trips to the Finals before Kirby earned his world title. In 1975, Kirby and his brothers, Sandy and Kave, became the first three brothers to qualify for a National Finals Rodeo in the same year. Kirby finally won his title in 1978 in a battle against reigning champion Don Gay. He won \$15,000 at that Finals, placing him in the top spot. (In 1978, World Championships were determined by money won at the National Finals Rodeo.)

Kirby would make three more trips to the National Finals Rodeo before transitioning to his third career in rodeo. Kirby began judging rodeos to earn money while recovering from an injury in 1987. He became a Pro Official in 1993 and has served in that capacity at many of the major rodeos in the country. He has been a National Finals Rodeo Official for 30 years.

Through this long and decorated career, Kirby has participated in every major rodeo as either a contract act, bull rider, or judge.

World Championships: 1 (1978) Born April 24, 1955 in Woodstown,



New Jersey.

From the Induction:

My heroes have always been cowboys, and all my heroes are here in the Hall of Fame. Mom didn't realize she was training me to be a bull rider. I don't even know if I was shaving at my first NFR. Neal and Miss Kay helped me get on some practice bulls in Mesquite. Neal nodded for me because he knew I wasn't going to nod. I got on a lot of practice bulls that day.

Mom gave me \$50 to go to San Antonio – ended up third in the world when I left Houston. By May, I dropped to 14th, and realized it was hard. Bobby Steiner got me to the NFR – you're only as good as the company you keep. Bobby was great to me.

G-65 GRATED COCONUT LIVESTOCK INDUCTED 2020

G -65 Grated Coconut is a testament to the Born to Buck Breeding program of the Calgary Stampede Ranch. His mother, Coconut Roll, was a ten-time National Finals Rodeo qualifier. His sire, Wyatt Earp of Northcott Rodeo, was voted Saddle Bronc Horse of the National Finals Rodeo in 1997 and 1998.

Grated Coconut became a dominant force during his career. Of his 114 outings, 37 cowboys hit the dirt, 25 scored in first place, and 29 finished in the money. If a cowboy was lucky enough to stay aboard for eight seconds, he usually won money. His prowess in the arena earned him six Bareback Horse of the Year titles (2003-04 and 2006-09), tying with the great Descent. He also earned six Canadian Champion Bareback Horse titles (2003-05 and 2007-09).

Retired at the top of his game in 2010, Grated Coconut is continuing the Calgary Stampede Ranch Born to Buck program. Of his children, at least 45 are competing at the top level of rodeo athletes with several qualifying for both the National Finals Rodeo and the Canadian Finals Rodeo.

For a horse feared by many cowboys, Grated Coconut was very social and gentle outside the arena. He enjoyed scratches from the cowboys before competition and has even let toddlers sit on his back. Grated Coconut became a top rodeo animal ambassador. Visitors to the Calgary Stampede Ranch were able to socialize with him before watching him explode into a rodeo arena. The pairing of his power and intelligence truly made him one of the great rodeo athletes.

Born 1997 in Hanna, Alberta.

JIM SUTTON, JR. STOCK CONTRACTOR INDUCTED 2020



ames Sutton, Jr. could have chosen a very different path at the end of his college career. The young South Dakotan was drafted by the Minneapolis Lakers and he attended their preseason training camp. However, he believed following his father and grandfather in the ranching and stock contracting business made more financial sense than a basketball career. In 1968, Sutton joined his father in creating the Sutton Rodeo Company. They supplied stock from their Onida, S.D., ranch to rodeos across South Dakota and the Northwest. By the late 1970s, Sutton was raising more than 90% of his own bucking stock and developed a breeding program that is one of the best in the business. The program has produced three PRCA Horse of the Year winners: saddle bronc horse Deep Water (1979), bareback horse Big Bud (1985), and saddle bronc horse Chuckulator (2012). Chuckulator also won Top Saddle Bronc Horse of the National Finals Rodeo in 2012. Their horses and bulls won all three categories at the Badlands Circuit Finals Livestock of the Year Awards in 2011. The program has also earned Sutton four nominations for PRCA Stock Contractor of the Year.

In 1978, Sutton started the Black Hills Stock Show and Rodeo. It has been nominated as Indoor Rodeo of the Year 15 times and won the award twice, 2002 and 2003. To draw attendance to the rodeo, Sutton created the Wrangler Bull Fights, the Bailey Bail-Off, World Championship Wild Horse Race, Bull Poker, and Teeter-Totter. Sutton's pageantry and showmanship earned him National Finals Rodeo Opening Ceremony credits in 1995 and 1996.

Sutton and his wife Julie won the PRCA Donita Barnes Lifetime Achievement Award in 2016.

Born April 20, 1935 in Onida, South Dakota.

From the Induction:

"It all started with my granddad with a rodeo on the ranch in 1927. We had 60 palomino horses and ¾ of them bucked the cowboys off. The whole operation is a family operation – there are three grandsons and a granddaughter putting on a rodeo while we are here. Julie couldn't make the trip and I'd ask for you to say a prayer for her."

ELLENSBURG RODEO RODEO COMMITTEE INDUCTED 2020

estled in the center of Washington State in the Kittitas Valley (land of plenty and no fighting), Ellensburg - called 'the rodeo city' - has become one of the top destinations for cowboys and cowgirls near the end of the regular PRCA season. The rodeo started in 1923 when local businessmen, farmers, ranchers, and townsmen began to feel the tug of nostalgia as airplanes, moving pictures, and automobiles started replacing the Western lifestyle. The Valley was settled in the 1870s – the rodeo came out of the local competition. At the time there were 50,000 head of cattle in the county. The rodeo will celebrate 100 years next year they missed three years, two due to WWII and last year.

Held over Labor Day Weekend each year, the Ellensburg Rodeo is an important stop in the series of Northwest rodeos, hosting around 400 contestants.

The Ellensburg Rodeo is held on

the historic rodeo grounds at the base of Craig's Hill, and the Yakima Indian Nation has always participated. With a fulltime population of 21,000, this "Rodeo City" hosts one of the highest paying regular season rodeos, paying out more than \$486,000 two years ago. Since 2009, Ellensburg has served as the finale for the PRCA Xtreme Bulls Tour.

"We started the first PRCA stand alone single event in 2001(Xtreme Bulls)," said Rick Cole, the longest serving board member and arena director. There are 17 people on the committee and three to four hundred volunteers. "This in an honor for the community – without the selfless dedication of all, this event could not occur."

The committee has had three Justin Committeeman of the Year Awards: Ken MacRae (1998), Joel Smith (2007), Steve Alder (2013). These awards highlight the commitment of the 100% volunteer-run organization. In 1997, the Ellensburg Rodeo Hall of Fame Association was founded to preserve the history and traditions of this nationally renowned rodeo.

"Being named into the pro rodeo Hall of Fame is really humbling and a huge honor. It's a dream come true. We believe we put on the best rodeo," said Jerry Doolin, the president of the committee, who has been a volunteer for more than 20 years.





MARTHA JOSEY WPRA BARREL RACER INDUCTED 2020

Artha Josey qualified for the National Finals Rodeo 11 times on six different horses across four consecutive decades. She won the WPRA barrel racing world title in 1980 on Sonny Bit O' Both, the same year the duo also won the AQHA World Championship, a feat unmatched at the time of induction.

A highlight of her career was competing in the rodeo exhibition during the Cultural Olympiad at the 1988 Winter Olympic Games in Calgary, Alberta, that pitted the United States against Canada. Josey would ride away with an individual bronze medal and helped Team USA win the team title.

Josey was a true all-around cowgirl riding bulls, broncs, cutting horses, tying goats and roping calves while competing in all-girl rodeos. In 1969, Josey won the reserve All-Around World Championship Title in the Girls Rodeo Association.

Not only did she make a name for herself in the arena but also gave back to the sport through her countless clinics. She and husband, R.E. Josey, started conducting barrel racing clinics in 1967 at their ranch in Texas and in 1981 began producing an all youth barrel race aptly named the Josey Jr. World Championship. Many of WPRA's world champions credit Martha Josey with helping them achieve their goals. Her clinics grew to average over 2,000 students annually with students ranging in age from five to 80 and many returned yearly to participate in the annual Josey Reunion Barrel Race.

In addition, Martha and R.E. were involved in creating new and innovative barrel racing saddles, pads, protective boots, knot reins, and combination bits. The result has been increased safety and barrel racing skills for all barrel racers throughout the World. No doubt Josey made a big impact on the sport of barrel racing.

World Championships: 1 (1980)

Born March 11, 1938 in Longview, Texas.

From the Induction: "Rodeo is making America great again – such a great honor.

When I was a little bitty girl, my first word was I want a horse. My dad was one of the first four directors of AQHA, he brought 36 mare to Texas. He passed away when I was 10 and mother had to sell all the horses except one old stallion. I went to a rodeo in Shreveport – saw the American flag come out and I watched the barrel racing and knew then that I belonged in the arena. I wanted to be a barrel racer. I went home and got on my dad's old roping saddle and that stallion and went to the field to run barrels.

I was trying for my fifth decade of running at the NFR, when the gateman shut the gate in front of me. I had a collapsed lung and other serious injuries and was in the hospital for three weeks – said I would never walk or ride again. That was in March, and I made the short go in Greeley in July.

[She was very dedicated, true to her faith and her family and whatever tasks she took on."]

When her parents divorced.

And it brought people into her life and opened doors that wouldn't have been opened, if it hadn't been for a queen title.

The Clovis, New Mexico woman was the first queen for the



New Mexico State Fair, crowned in 1950, and volunteered her time with rodeo queen pageants and other service organizations from then on.

She was born in 1931, the daughter of Lloyd and Pearl Vaughan, in Farwell, Texas. The family moved to Melrose, New Mexico, and lived on a small farm. After her parents divorced, she and her mother and sister moved to Clovis. As a teenager, Wilma delivered newspapers on horseback.

She graduated from high school in 1948 and was offered a job at a switchboard. But offices and sitting all day wasn't her style, so she worked for the Busy Bee Café, waiting tables, from 6 am to 2 pm. After that, she headed to the stockyards to help out in the back pens. She was on horseback, helping with branding and whatever else needed done with the cattle.

It was while she was there that one of the visiting veterinarians, Dr. E.E. Klaus, encouraged her to enter the state fair queen contest. She got horsemanship practice through a couple of professional ropers. World champion Shoat Webster, Troy Fort and Jack Shipworth kept their horses at the rodeo arena. Someone told them Wilma was a good horsewoman, so she got the job of riding their horses, to exercise them.

At the time, she also met a lady, a member of the Girls Rodeo Association, who helped her with her riding. Lena Klebold "took me under her wing and taught me how to set a horse," Wilma recalled. "Before that I rode like a sack of potatoes." Lena also loaned her clothes, and eventually would introduce Wilma to her nephew, Benny Fulgham, who would be her husband.

So in 1950, she won the title of Miss New Mexico State Fair queen, the first time the fair had held a pageant.

After that, she was asked to help with the Pioneer Days rodeo queen pageant, in Clovis, her hometown. The chamber of commerce realized the value of having a rodeo queen representative for their town, so Wilma worked with the chamber, preparing young ladies for pageants.

In the '50s and '60s, each county in the state could send a girl to run for the state fair queen contest. Wilma was superintendent for the Clovis queen contest, which has been very successful; Curry County has had more state fair queens than any other county.

In those days, the girl who won the New

Mexico State Fair queen title automatically went on to represent the state at the Miss Rodeo America (MRA) pageant. But that girl got very little help from the state fair, as she prepared to run for MRA. So Wilma and other women got together in the 1960s and started the New Mexico Rodeo Queen association, patterned after what other states were doing.

As a state director, Wilma helped organize the state pageant, and after each year's queen was selected, she helped ready the young lady for the national pageant.

She served as president of the Miss Rodeo New Mexico Association for several decades, scheduling appearances for the state queen, raising money for her to travel, and connecting queens with people who would be helpful throughout and beyond their reign.

She soon became involved at the national level in the 1970s with the MRA contest when the National Finals Rodeo was in Oklahoma City. She served on a variety of committees, all volunteer, on the media committee, the hospitality committee, and the contestants' scrapbook committee.

It was Wilma who made sure people were taken care of and connections were made. She made sure the newly crowned MRA would be introduced to the media



in the press room during the NFR. She made sure MRA programs and information were put in each VIP box at the NFR, and she brought results from each round of the NFR to the candidates, for anyone who wanted that information. And each year she would take at least thirty pounds of her "world famous" homemade peanut brittle to the media and hospitality rooms, for everyone to enjoy!

She organized a breakfast, working with the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys, for pageant candidates and their families, with speakers, faith-oriented music, and gifts of Bibles to the pageant contestants.

Raeana Wadhams, past executive director of the MRA association, worked with Wilma, beginning when Raeana met her in the mid'70s.

She noted that Wilma was not scared to vote against the grain, if there was something in an MRA business meeting that she didn't agree with. But if she was in the minority, she went along with the majority. "She never complained," Raeana said.

She was always reliable and did what was asked of her, Raeana said. "Any time I'd ask her to do anything, I could always count on her. If she said she would do it, I never had to go back and say, 'Wilma, did you do that?' She was dependable. If it was something she couldn't do by herself, she'd find somebody to help her."

She was an MRA director for more than 25 years and a volunteer for longer than that. She was co-chair of the media committee for the Miss Rodeo America pageant and served on the Hospitality Committee.

Wilma married her husband Benny in

1951.

She worked alongside him for their entire married life, until he died in 2014.

Together, they owned a branding business, branding cattle sold at the stockyards in Clovis, with a railroad siding located in their business, B&W Feedyards, for easy transport of cattle. They fed out cattle and owned B&W Trucking, and they produced team roping jackpots. She was instrumental in promoting the business, bringing in truckloads of cattle purchased at Clovis sale barns, who needed branded, vaccinated and dipped before being shipped to another point.

Together, they served on the Pioneer Days Rodeo committee. Benny was a director for twenty years, and she volunteered her time at the rodeo, too, organizing the pivot riders, helping with the parade, and with the queen pageant.

Benny was a very competent lefthanded heeler who didn't compete professionally but would often rope with pro cowboys. He and three other men formed the Hat Roping Club, furnishing steers and putting on team ropings. Wilma was always there to make sure things were done.

She and Benny had three sons. Jerry lives in Clovis and is a volunteer with Pioneer Days. Larry, married to Vicki, lives in Stigler, Oklahoma. Garry, their oldest, died three days after his college gradua-

tion, in 1977, of an aneurysm. "You get through (the death of a child)," she said, "you just never get over it."

Wilma served in a variety of roles. She was active in the Central Baptist Church, was chairman of the New Mexico State Beef Cook-Off, secretary-treasurer of the New Mexico Beef Council, on the advisory boards for the New Mexico Girls Ranch and the New Mexico Drama Association, and volunteered with the Bi-State Livestock Association, Cattle Growers Association, National Cattlemens, Cattle Capital Cowbelles, New Mexico Press Women, and the Clovis High Plains Hospital Auxiliary.

She founded the Little Buckaroo Queen and Princess contest, held in conjunction with the Pioneer Days Rodeo; she was co-chairman for the Pioneer Days Rodeo Queen and Princess pageants; is one of the founders of the Mesa Redondo Cowboy Camp; developed the pioneer village at the N.M. State Fair in

2007; served on the City of Clovis' Centennial committee; was a director for the Miss Rodeo New Mexico pageant, and was the New Mexico state director for the MRA competition. She was honored with an induction into the Clovis High School Hall of Honor. She was inducted into the Miss Rodeo America Hall of Fame in 2008, was named a Legend of New Mexico in 2014 during the Billy the Kid Celebration, and is in the Pioneer Days Hall of Fame.

Raeana admires and respects her friend.

"She is an awesome, awesome lady," she said, "always a really kind person.

"She was very dedicated, true to her faith and her family and whatever tasks she took on." $\overline{\mathbf{m}}$







KK Run for Vegas

Meet the Member Talia Jaeger



Just a short five years ago, Talia Jaeger was decked out in breeches aboard a lesson horse outfitted with an English saddle. This was her introduction to horses and eventually segued into rodeo. "My stepmom (Linda) got me some lessons for fun," said the 13-year-old from Loomis, California. "I kind of got bored with that and one of our family friends wanted me to try barrel racing on their horses. And I haven't stopped since then." The rodeo bug has taken root and it's about all Talia ever does or thinks about, and she wouldn't have it any other way.

Of course, breaching a new sport isn't always easy. Talia's dad, Jeremy, rode bulls at one point in time but it had been a while since he was around horses. "We've really had to learn everything about horses and rodeo from scratch. We aren't afraid to ask questions and will ask just about anybody for help when something comes up." Talia's inquisitive nature paired with her discipline and determination have likely been driving forces behind her success as a barrel racer. At the 2020 Junior World Finals, Talia finished fifth in the average. That was her first year to qualify in the junior barrels. This year, she's headed to Vegas in the senior division.

"It was actually my first time running that horse in barrels for the weekend. We decided to enter her last minute, but it was a good thing we did because my other horse didn't qualify." That second horse was the one Talia qualified on and ran in Texas for last year's event. That was actually her first time visiting Texas and Talia is a little disappointed the Junior World Finals will be in Vegas this year. "My first time in Texas was a really cool experience. It was really fun to run in the stockyards." Despite the location change, Talia is looking forward to running her mare, Molly, this December.

"I started using Molly for poles and that's what we bought her for, but then we decided to use her for barrels also. We started doing really well and now she's my main barrel horse." The 11-year-old sorrel Quarter



Horse is petite just like Talia, but this duo has a big presence when it's time to run. "I really like that she's a smaller horse and I like her style of running. She rates a lot, which is good because I don't really like free runners." The try hard heart of this mare is a big part of why Molly is Talia's favorite of the entire herd. With several months to prepare for their first appearance in Vegas, Talia intends to continue putting in the work at home while also hitting as many jackpots and rodeos as she can.

Earlier this summer, Talia and Molly proved they have the grit it takes to come back from a setback. At the California Junior High School Rodeo Association State Finals, the pair hit a barrel on the first day. "I really had to ride my horse past the third barrel to fix our previous mistake. We ended up winning the round by two tenths of a second." Talia had been working all season long to do well at state and earning a buckle for a round win was evidence of the time she's been putting in behind the scenes.

This eighth grader is the only one in her family who rodeos currently. Her 15-year-old brother, Sam, is a competitive dancer with little interest in horses, but Talia can't get enough of them. "I really like being able to go out and ride my horses whenever I want to. I also like going to new places to compete." One gift

rodeo has given Talia is her never give up attitude. "When I first started, my barrel horse was ducking the barrel and my other one was running off with me. I used to get really frustrated and almost wanted to give up on it all together. But I kept working at it and I'm really glad I did."







ometimes good things fall apart so better things can fall together," a saying that was hard to believe for then 12-year-old Colt Bass while being wheeled off to surgery after the severe injury he suffered while competing in ribbon roping during the 2019 national junior high finals in Huron, South Dakota. At the time, his world champion dreams had vanished before his eyes but, fast forward to June 26, 2021 in Des Moines, Iowa, and the now 14-year-old cowboy sees that the path led him to the shiny gold world champion buckles he now holds in his hands. Hailing from Statesville, North Carolina, Colt is not only the 2021 Junior High World Champion Saddle Bronc Steer Rider, but after competing in 8 events, earned the coveted 2021 World Champion Junior High All-Around Cowboy title as well. "It was pretty disappointing to finish my 6th grade nationals' competition with an injury. After I roped my ribbon-roping calf in the beginning of the second round, I jumped off and broke my tibia and fibula clean through and my growth plate slid out from where it should be. They took me to a nearby hospital where I had surgery to repair it. But, several months later, when I was able to ride again, I really focused on the mechanics of my events and learned to step off correctly so that wouldn't happen again. Looking back, I now see that it helped me come back stronger not just physically, but also mentally."

Colt's parents, Tori and Derrick Bass, are the epitome of proud rodeo parents raising their family in the rodeo arena. Derrick, a lineman for Duke Energy, is the North Carolina High School Rodeo



Association's president, and contracts stock at many rodeos in the east. Tori is a front desk secretary at South Iredell High School, where Colt will attend as a freshman this year. Colt's older brother Frog, 19, competed in the NCHSRA and now lives in Weatherford, Texas, and his sister, Montana, 16, and brother Gage, 13, currently compete in the association as well.

Colt finished his 8th grade season with the NCHSRA in the strongest fashion possible, winning the all-around champion cowboy title, as well as champion titles in every one of his events; saddle bronc steers, bareback steers, bull riding, chute dogging, team roping, ribbon roping, goat tying, and tie-down roping. Competing at a high level in both ends of the arena for several seasons, helped to prepare Colt for the incredible level of stamina it takes to compete in multiple events at the national junior high finals.

After not getting the chance to compete at the national level in 2020 as the rodeo world was nearly shut down due to covid-19, Colt could not wait to get to Des Moines this year and made sure to get plenty of rest at night, so he was ready for long days in the arena.

"The first few events at nationals this vear went a little rough and I knew I wasn't competing at my true potential and had myself in a predicament. If I didn't turn things around, I was going to have come all the way out here for nothing. I knew which events I had a chance to do well in and strived to focus on staying strong in those, and figured I'd go for go-round wins in the other events." After two full rounds in 8 events, Colt qualified for the short round in saddle bronc steers, bull riding, and ribbon roping with partner, Addi Hunter. His North Carolina teammates, as well as family and friends from back home could hardly contain the excitement as they looked at the all-around standings going into the short-round of finals, knowing Colt was leading the pack and likely to be the first all-around world champion ever reigning from North Carolina. Colt tried to not think about the standings and spent the afternoon in water balloon fights and savoring the time hanging out with friends.


Once the short-round scores were tallied, Colt was named the 2021 NJHSRA World Champion Saddle Bronc Rider, third place bull rider, 6th place ribbon roper, and 2021 NJHSRA World Champion All-Around Cowboy. As the family loaded his awards of buckles, saddles, Yeti coolers, Bex sunglasses, scholar-



ships, and jackpot checks, Colt was ready to get some rest. After an 18-hour-nap, he woke to realize that the world champion dreams he had held in his heart for many years had become a reality, and he could not be more grateful.

Looking forward to next season, Colt plans to compete in 6 events at the high school level: saddle bronc riding, bareback riding, bull riding, team roping, tie-down roping, and steer wrestling. He also plans to continue wrestling in high school, (he was the 2021 champion middle school wrestler in the 138-pound division) and possibly even play baseball if the rodeo and baseball schedules can work together. For now, he can't wait to get home to relax and float down the New River with friends.

"I couldn't do any of this without support. I appreciate my mom for all she does for me and my family. I'm thankful to my dad and Frog for all their help in my roping events, and Jason Brumley and Billy Robinson for all their help with my riding events. I really appreciate all of my family and friends that support me in everything I do. I am also grateful for my sponsors, Fastback Ropes and American Hat Company."


assidy Evans is the 2021 National Junior High School Rodeo Association All Around champion. In 2020 she would have made the finals in all her events except goats. "It was disappointing and frustrating not to be able to go," admits the 15-year-old from Yuma, Colorado. "I kept practicing and ended up making up for it by going to the National Little Britches Finals and the WCRA Stampede at the E." Her practice paid off and she won the 2020 Junior Girls All Around at the National Little Britches Finals and was the only youth to advance to the main event at the Stampede at the E.

Cassidy made it to Des Moines, Iowa, in team roping, barrels, pole bending, ribbon roping, and breakaway. "It was my first time being at that fairgrounds – I've been to Des Moines before because my mom has a lot of family there – and they all came to cheer me on."

Her favorite event is barrel racing. "I have an amazing horse (Hot Shot) and



with him I have a great opportunity and advantage in the barrel racing." Hot Shot was two when the family bought got him and Cassidy was seven. He was used for poles for the first few years by her siblings, but now five years later, Hot Shot is not being shared with anyone. Her brothers are Coy - 16 and Cash - 15 – her twin brother. She also has a younger brother, Cross, 8 years old. Coy was only 20 months old when the family was making the move to Colorado and the twins were born 8 weeks early. Cash was 2 pounds 3 ounces and Cassidy was 3 pounds one once.

The Evans family lives 30 miles from Yuma, Colorado, with a population 3,500

population. "When I go to town I help mom with groceries and sometimes I'll go to pick up ropes and equipment." Her favorite rope is Spitfire for Breakaway and Classic Heat for team roping. When she's



home, she is helping to break some of the horses on the ranch. "They belong to Hickert Land Company and we help train and break the horses." Cassidy wants to be a veterinarian when she grows up. "I enjoy taking care of horses and it would be pretty cool to be able to take care of them on my own and making sure they are getting what they need."

She practices with her brothers and her dad, Chris, who team ropes and calf ropes.. Mom (Megan) team roped for a while with Chris, but now devotes her time to making sure her kids are prepared to go down the road. All of them are home schooled. Cassidy starts her with chores. She is in charge of graining all the horses. "We have around 19 at the house. My brothers take care of water and hay. We all clean the pens." School work comes next – Cassidy's favorite subject is Language Arts and her least favorite is Math. Once school is done, it's off to help on the ranch or practice.

Cassidy made it to the short go at the

National Junior High Finals in barrel racing, pole bending and ribbon roping. "I was nervous," she admits. "You just have to push it to the back of your mind and focus on what you have to do to make a good run." She was grateful she had her parents and siblings there to help her get my horses warmed up and everything was ready to go for her. She didn't know she won it until it was announced. "I felt really good; kind of like I was on top of the world."

Meet the Member Creede Guardamondo

reede Guardamondo finished his state high school rodeo career as a two-time and reigning Colorado High School bareback riding champion.

In addition to the bareback riding, the Avondale, Colo. cowboy also competes in the team roping and tie-down roping, with bareback riding as his strength.

He follows in the footsteps of his dad, Tom, who rode bareback horses in high school and beyond. It's a good event for him, he believes. "It was always easier," Creede said. "When I started it, I found it to be fun."

His favorite part of roping is the horsemanship. His tie-down horse, Scout, is "honestly probably my prized possession." He trained her and her counterpart, his team roping horse Chewy.

Scout "has a lot of get up and go. As soon as you throw the saddle on her, she's fired up and ready to go. You don't have to beg her to do her job; she wants to do it."

Chewy, who is also a sorrel mare, like Scout, has a lot of quirks, Creede said. She has the same motivation that Scout has, and can be used for heading or heeling. "She's extremely good at what she does. She's fun to ride.'

He got both horses as four-year-olds.

Covid-19 has thrown a wrench into the Avondale, Colo. cowboy's senior year at Pueblo County High School. "Honestly, Covid-19 has ruined my senior year, of not being able to do anything fun." The school held only five football games and dances and assemblies were canceled. Instruction is hard, too, when in-person learning is limited. "The whole learning side of things sucks because there's no hands-on experience. It's all digital. It's made it harder for me to understand concepts." During the winter, students attended school in person for two days and virtually at home for two



days. Starting in April, they were back to school five days a week.

He's been on his school's honor roll the past four years and lettered in rodeo one vear. He's also a self-proclaimed "gvm rat," lifting at a gym in Pueblo.

Creede welds for his dad's business, and enjoys the trade. Right now he's welding pipe fencing for someone, but he's also welded structural things, including I-beams for a hospital.

He loves to thrift shop, picking up old cowboy boots for cheap and wearing them.

They're already broken in, are comfortable, and a good bargain.

This fall, he will attend Otero Junior College in La Junta, Colo., where he will compete on the rodeo team. He will work towards a construction management degree, and hopes to transfer to Colorado State University for his bachelor's. After college, he'll come home and work for his dad's steel fabrication and concrete businesses. He's attending Otero on rodeo and academic scholarships.

Creede looks up to other bareback riders, especially Orin Larsen and Logan Patterson. He loves how Orin rides. "It's just awesome," he said, of Orin's riding style. "You never see tall, lanky guys ride (bareback horses), and he's the definition of tall and lanky. It's awesome to watch him ride."

Patterson, who lives in Kim, Colo., has mentored Creede. "He's been one of the best teachers I've had. Honestly, he makes it relatable to me. He goes for broke every time, and it's awesome to watch."

When the 2019-2020 season was concluded early due to Covid-19, Creede was

ranked in the top five in the state in the bareback riding. In 2019, when he finished as state champ, he did not go on to Nationals due to a torn rotator cuff.

He jokes that he should have his own private room in the hospital, because of how much time he's spent there. He had the rotator cuff fixed his sophomore year, and had two plates put in his right ankle after breaking his fibula.

Creede has two older brothers: Justin and Chance.

He is the son of Tom and Laura Guardamondo. 🔚

Meet the Member **Jaycee Yonkers**

aycee Yonkers rides a very special horse.

Charlotte, her barrel racing horse, was purchased by Jaycee's mom, Nicole, as a three-year-old. The bay mare was small and didn't show much potential.

But Nicole trained her, and Charlotte has done very well for both her and Javcee.

The Colorado Junior High School Rodeo Association member also competes in the ribbon roping (running for Cactus Barnes), the goat tying and the pole bending.

She just completed her eighth grade year of schooling online, doing it via computer so she'd have more time to practice her rodeo and travel. It wasn't easy going online, but she got used to it and enjoyed having the extra time in the arena. Most of her work was done individually, but Javcee was able to Zoom with her teachers at Peyton School if there were problems she didn't understand.

History is her favorite subject; she loves learning about the wars fought by Americans. Jaycee has played basketball since the third grade and plays in a competitive basketball league. In seventh grade, she ran track.

The best food her mom makes is spaghetti. She loves raspberries (favorite fruit) and carrots (favorite vegetable), chocolate ice cream for dessert, and likes to wash it all down with a Dr. Pepper. Her favorite candy is Reese's.

She loves listening to all types of music, but especially country. Her favorite country artist is Luke Combs.

The best time she's had on a trip was going to Arizona in December of last year, where she spent time with the Fischer family, running barrels and roping.

Jaycee was bucked off at an event in Utah in May. She landed on her hip and because of that, hasn't been able to do the poles and goats.

Jaycee and Nicole's horse Charlotte

was sold to Mackinzee Dermody and the Fischers, with the agreement that Javcee got to ride her through the rest of the junior high rodeo season. Jaycee is grateful to the Fischers for allowing her to ride their horses for the poles and goat tying.

Nicole has taught her daughter that it doesn't matter what kind of vehicle you're driving; what matters is your horsepower.

Being a single mom, Nicole has worked hard so that her daughter can rodeo. She might be pulling a bumper pull trailer, but that doesn't matter. "I've always told Jaycee, it doesn't matter how you get there. It's what you unload from vour trailer."

She's looking forward to being a high school freshman. She's been encouraged to play basketball and hopes to be on the varsity team. The high school coach has commented that he can tell she's a rodeo kid because she's "gutsy and hard working," Nicole said.

Nicole enjoys Jaycee's determination. "She's very driven, hard-working and determined. She's out there, every single morning, feeding horses and exercising. She's an amazing athlete."

Nicole's dad, Kerry "Crazy Legs" Garcia, was a saddle bronc rider, bull rider and bullfighter and Javcee thinks of him as she's competing.

When she grows up, she'd like to be an equine massage therapist. She loves horses, "because they're such good animals for us. They give their all to us, so I want to give them what they deserve."

Jaycee won the barrel racing in the

of a raging bull and keep the bull riders from harm? Is the barrel really a safe haven when a bull is charging?

August 7th and 8th the honorees will be in Castle Rock at the Douglas County Fair & Rodeo assisting in many annual venues including the mutton busting, and autographing and performing in their rodeos at 7 PM on Saturday, and 1 PM on Sunday.

Since the original 1974 Rodeo Clown Reunion that was held in Roseburg, Oregon, during the Umpqua Valley Rodeo, the Reunion was held there four more years, then in 1991 it was held in Moses Lake, WA. Since that time it had been held in a variety of locales, more centrally located, in conjunction with PRCA rodeos. The 1993 Rodeo Clown Reunion was held in Guthrie, OK; then in Colorado Springs, 1995 & 2000 during the Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo;

Rodeo de Santa Fe was our destination three times, 1997, 2011 & 2017; Deadwood Days of '76 in 2002 & 2009; and once at rodeos at Springdale, AR, 1999; Stephenville, TX, 2004; Pendleton RoundUp, 2006; Sheridan, WY, 2012; Dodge City, KS, 2008; Coffeyville, KS, 2015; and during the Day of the Cowboy weekend, 2018, at the Stockyards at Fort Worth.

During the years the Reunion has been held we adjust the events, other

than the rodeo, to suit the area. At Deadwood we traveled to Mount Rushmore and Chief Crazy Horse Monuments in addition to the rodeo. In Guthrie, OK we toured the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum and had a Clown-Mule Race at Remington Park, the local pari-mutual horse track in Oklahoma City. At Moses Lake we traveled to the Grand Coulee Dam by bus. At Dodge City we caravanned to the town of Greensburg, that had just been totally demolished by a tornado, with a pickup full of books the honorees had gathered together to help start a new library for the ravaged community.

We have second generation rodeo clowns attending this year. Greg Doering, the son of Karl (deceased), has attended each reunion since it's inception. Other multi-generational families attending are: Jerry Wayne Olson, a third generation rodeo clown, who followed in the footsteps of his deceased dad, Jerry, and grandfather, LaRue Olson. Other two-generation honorees are: Don Bowman and his twin step-sons Dan & Pat Ariaz; Melvin Fields and son Devlin, and John Clark and son, Kelly. Dixie Reger Mosley, the only woman rodeo clown who clowned for 12 years and was also a charter member of the Girls Rodeo Association. So far, forty-four rodeo clowns have registered from 17 states and Canada. Their accumulated years in the rodeo arena as a funnyman, bullfighter or barrelman add up to 939 years.



Meet the Member **Tate Pollmeier**

ort Scott, Kansas, cowboy Tate Pollmeier lives and breathes bull riding. If he isn't riding one himself or thinking about his next mount, he's helping his parents, Mark and Jaime, buck one of their 17 bulls at home. "My dad started riding bulls when he was 18 and moved to Fort Scott for college, which is where he met my mom," said the 17-year-old. "They bought some rodeo cows and now we have our own bulls. We raise them, so we're always around it. We buck rider and dummy bulls about twice a week." With so much exposure to the event, it's not surprising that this high schooler has taken his game to the next level by way of the KPRA.

"J&J Rodeo Company provides all our stock for high school rodeos, and their owner also does a lot of KPRA events. He talked me into entering some and I ended up really liking them." Tate bought his KPRA card two years ago and so far, he's made an appearance at the finals both years. He's looking to add a third in 2021. In 2020, Tate was the year end reserve champion and took second in the average at the finals. He's no stranger to the leader board though. He's now the two-time state champion bull rider in the KHSRA. In July, he went to nationals for the second time in his high school career. In 2020, Tate finished in 13th place.

As Tate prepares for his senior season, he's looking forward to balancing both high school and KPRA rodeo through the fall again. "Last year, having the KPRA finals in Dodge City was pretty handy because I had a high school rodeo in Garden City that same weekend. I was running



back and forth all weekend." Luckily, Tate has his older brother, 21-year-old Coy, and their buddy Trey Holston to keep him lined out on those busy weeks. "Trey and my brother have been with me through my entire career. It's really been a family thing for me." For a while, Tate dabbled in calf roping while also trying his hand at both bareback and saddlebronc steer riding in junior high. He finally decided to join his dad and brother by focusing on bull riding.

"Bull riding is something that I really love, and I seem to have a talent for. I love that I get to travel and see new places because of rodeo. I really don't like to sit still for long, I like to be on the move." Of all the places he's traveled so far, Denver is one of his favorites but so is Lovington, New Mexico. When Tate turns 18 next March, he plans to start riding as a professional with his brother and extending that list of favorite destinations. Until then, Tate has his eyes set on returning to one of his favorite KPRAs in Freedom, OklahoTate Pollmeier - Jeff Frazell

ma. "Last year I got on a bull, 5150 from Medicine River, who I had been dreading all year. I ended up winning the rodeo on him, so that was a meaningful ride for me. All year I had watched a lot of people get on him, but not many actually rode him."

Everyone knows what works best for them when it comes to achieving success. And for Tate, it's all about the mindset. "My mental game is probably one of my strongest traits. As long as I have a good head on my shoulders full of positive thoughts, I feel ready for my next ride. I've learned that negative thoughts aren't going to help me so there's no reason to have them. That's seemed to always work for me." This positive mindset will likely carry Tate to more success in the rest of his 2021 season and into the spring as he pursues yet another level of rodeo with his PRCA permit.

eginning today, May 27th, Jimmie Munroe officially starts her Women's Professional Rodeo Association Presidency following the WPRA Special Election.

This is a familiar spot for Munroe having served the WPRA in this position twice before. Her first WPRA President term was from 1978-1993 and then again from 2011 to 2012. Munroe takes over the position left vacant by Doreen Wintermute, who retired early the end of March.

"It will truly be an honor and privilege to once again serve our entire membership as your WPRA President," said Munroe upon hearing the final results of the special election. "Now is the time to come together so that we can move our sport into the bright future that I know lies ahead."

Munroe brings a wealth of knowledge, history and respect to the position. During her previous terms as president she led the association in acquiring equal prize money, obtained national sponsors and advanced the use of electric timers and better arena conditions.

A true all-around cowgirl, Munroe competed in barrel racing, breakaway roping, and goat tying. A Texas native-born in Waco and currently residing in Valley Mills, she entered her first horse show at three, her first rodeo at ten, and had a rodeo career that included three WPRA world titles (barrels, all-around, tie-down roping-all in 1975), 11 trips to the National Finals Rodeo on three different horses, a two-time NIRA National Champion Barrel Racer and an NIRA National Champion All-Around Cowgirl. She graduated from Sam Houston State University with a bachelor's degree in education in which she has used not only as a leader of the Association but in conducting horsemanship and barrel racing clinics worldwide, including Australia, Brazil, Canada and of course the United States.

In 1980, she married Dan O. "Bud" Munroe a 12-time National Finals Rodeo qualifier and 1986 saddle bronc riding world champion. The couple has one daughter, Tassie Munroe.

In 1990, Munroe was named the Coca-Cola "Woman of the Year in Professional Rodeo," in 1996 was awarded the Tad Lucas Award by the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum, in 1999 was named the Pioneer Woman of the WPRA and in 2008 was named a Distinguished Alumni of Sam Houston State University. She has been inducted into the National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame (1992), the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame (1997), the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame (2003), in 2016 was inducted with her husband in the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and in 2019 she joined her husband, who was inducted in 2007, into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame.

"She started taking bulls to the Homestead Rodeo School, which was founded by George Steinberger." It was this rodeo school that got some of the Dees siblings into the toughest sport on dirt. Shayla was introduced to that popular phrase the hard way just three years ago.

"I got hung up when I was steer riding and he drug me around the whole arena because he was too fast for the bull fighters. He stepped on my stomach and my back which gave me a stage four out of five

laceration." Shayla was then life flighted to the nearest hospital in Kansas City. With her mom by her side, Shayla's dad watched the helicopter leave with tears in his eyes. "I had never seen my dad cry, but he did that day. I was winning the CYRA steer riding when that happened. And after that I couldn't rodeo for two months." That accident effectively ended Shayla's career as a roughstock rider. Shayla was neck and neck in the all-around race with her best friend, Lily Henderson, who ended up winning the year-end saddle. Lily gave the saddle to Shayla.

Even though Shayla was disappointed that her year spent behind the chutes was over, she wasn't ready to quit rodeo completely. She now runs barrels, ropes calves and heads on occasion. The 2-second event is Shayla's top pick. "It's my favorite event because it's not girly and roping a calf around the neck is probably the best feeling in the world. I loved watching the boys rope calves and I always wanted to do it too." Roping since 2013, Shayla learned from family friend Cody Porter. "Instead Kansas High School Rodeo Association

of having a dummy to learn on, Cody took one of those bouncing bulls off the frame and set it in the dirt."

Shavla, two of her brothers and her older sister, Marcella, 21, are first-generation rodeo competitors. "My parents were never into horses or roping, so they haven't been able to teach me anything about that. I've had to learn a lot on my own or get help from other people." Some of those other people include Barney Barnett, Dustin Jilek, and Justin Zook, just to name a few. Aside from the two brothers who ride bulls, none of their other siblings-Rachel, 34, Nina, 32, and Logan, 16-ever got into rodeo. "It's usually just me and my mom on the road. The traveling can be hard sometimes, we can drive as far as six hours to get to a rodeo. But I do enjoy spending time with her. Being at rodeos is the biggest, best part of my life."

In the summertime, Shayla is at a rodeo just about every single weekend. Her favorite to date is in Ottawa, Kansas. "It's a one-day rodeo and always during the county fair. There's a lot of people to fill up the stands and cheer you on. And they have slushies, which I get every year." On the trailer, and also eager for slushies, are Steve and Rooster. "I bought Steve from my neighbor, and he was just broke to ride, so I taught him how to breakaway. He's been the best horse I've ever owned." Rooster is Shayla's "freaky fast" barrel horse. There might be only one horse, or pony, that could give Rooster a run for his money. "Shorty was my first horse ever and she was just a pony. We won pole bending my sixth and seventh grade year at state finals. And that first year we were fifth in poles at nationals against 300+ other horses. And she was only half their size."


Meet the Member **Rowdy Nimrod**

hen Rowdy Nimrod was little, he only had eyes for the roughstock events. He wanted to be like Justin McBride and all the other guys slapping backs behind the bucking chutes. "One day I just changed my mind and decided I wanted to rope calves," said the 18-year-old from Hartshorne, Oklahoma. "It was a crazy switch and really shocked everyone. It was like a light switched and I didn't want to ride bulls anymore, I just wanted to rope." Rowdy was just getting into the groove of junior high rodeo when he made this drastic switch. The idea of roping calves was handed down to Rowdy by his grandpa, Johnny Martin, who dabbled in tie-down roping.

The single-man event is now Rowdy's favorite specifically because success is rooted in mastering the fundamentals. "There are so many things that can go wrong in a run that I think it's the hardest event in rodeo. It takes a lot of hours in the practice pen to perfect the small steps to even be consistent." Of all the hours Rowdy's spent practicing, plenty of those were simply roping the dummy or tying a calf on a post. The hard work has paid off for Rowdy as he's headed to Southeastern Oklahoma State University in Durant, Oklahoma, on a rodeo scholarship.

This recent Hartshorne High School graduate will be taking three events to the NIRA Prairie Circuit: tie-down, team roping and bull dogging. "My heeler broke his arm midway through this year and by then everyone had partners so I couldn't really find another partner. I had to drop it for this season." Last fall Rowdy had only jumped five steers when it was time for the first OHSRA event of the season. "In my first



year of bull dogging, my main goal was to adapt and just see how it went." Going into state finals, Rowdy was sitting second in the big man's event. Rowdy competed in his first and last national high school finals last month in the steer wrestling after finishing second at state.

Surprisingly, Rowdy is the only one of his four other siblings–Trace, 11, Kollin, 11, Kage, 87, and Jett, 4–who rodeos. "My mom (Krystal Wilson) competed when she was younger, but my dad (Justin Nimrod) did not. If I need help sorting calves or opening chutes, I can always count on my siblings for whatever I need and that's been a huge help." Many of Rowdy's skills have come from JW Hammons, a good family friend.

"My grandpa took me to JW's house when I first started roping and ever since then he's been a huge help." Rowdy has spent many hours helping JW work outside horses, which has also helped his roping tremendously. "He has helped me fix bad habits and techniques as a roper, but he's also helped me become better all around." ship experience he's gained the most. "You can rope really well and be a bad horseman, but you won't get near as far as you would by being a good horseman."

As Rowdy reflects on his time competing in the OHSRA, he smiles at the friendships he's forged along the way. "The main thing I'll miss next year is all the underclassmen I've become really good friends with and everything that high school rodeo has taught me about competing." Leveling up from junior high and junior rodeos pushed Rowdy to be as tough as his competition. "High school rodeo really showed me how good of a competitor I truly wanted to be. It showed me that I want to be my very best."

nly a month before the NMJH-SRA season kicked off for 2021, Amy Murphy tragically lost her top mount. As a result, Amy was forced to come up with a new game plan for her 7th grade season. "I used to do everything on that horse, so when I had to start a new one it was easier to only focus on one event," the 13-year-old said of her decision to only compete in breakaway roping for the spring. "It's my strongest event and the one my mom (Latasha) competes in." Amy's new rodeo partner, Cowboy, has taken to the two-second event quickly and is picking up on the new ones as well. He was a hazing horse for her dad, Byron, and even lost the sight in one of his eyes this season.

"I missed out on nationals by only four points in the breakaway this year. That's part of the reason why I'm going to be doing all of the events next year." Those other events will include barrels, poles, team roping and goat tying. And even though Amy enjoys breakaway roping, it's actually team roping that's her favorite of them all. "I like that you have to be in sync with your partner and your horse at the same time. It builds a lot of trust between you and your horse as well as you and your partner." Amy found a second mount, Cisco, back in March and is teaching him the ropes for her events also so she always has a backup ready to go.

Born into a rodeo family, Amy's roots run as far back as her great grandpa on her dad's side. The Murphy family is chalked full of steer wrestlers, but they haven't had any boys in recent years to take up the big man's event. That is expected to change this fall as Amy's mom is expecting a boy in October. Amy also has a little sister, Taylor, who is three. Royalty is also in their lineage as her mom was Miss IJRA back in the day and Amy followed in her footsteps as the 2018-2019 Miss Indian Junior Rodeo Association Queen. "My parents, uncles and grand-



pas have all rodeoed and that's helped me a lot. I just hope to leave a name for myself in rodeo someday."

Amy's family has always inspired her to work hard and set her goals high. This year Amy has her sights set on making the Indian National Finals Rodeo in the junior and open breakaway roping. "My whole family has competed there, so it would be a dream come true if I could make it as well. My mom almost made it two years ago when COVID hit." Although Amy enjoys competing in junior rodeo associations, she knows it's the bigger events that are truly pushing her to the next level. "I really like competing in the big shows because the competition pushes me and it lets me know that I can rope with the best of them: that I have what it takes to rope on that level."

When Amy was 7 years old, she first formed this foundation of confidence that would sustain her through the highs and lows of rodeo. "My grandpa took me to a rodeo when I was 7 because my parents were up at a different one. I did the flag event and I actually won it. I was really proud of myself for that. It sticks out to me because that was my starting point. That's when I knew I could show everyone that I belonged there and that I was just as good as everyone else." Part of that


Meet the Member Gabriella Pargas

ery few people get the opportunity to compete on their childhood unicorn through high school rodeo. But that's exactly the case for Gabriella Pargas of Grants, New Mexico, and her mare, Popcorn. "We bought Popcorn when she was a 3-year-old and I was also three at the time," said the now 18-yearold. "We've pretty much taught each other everything we know. I still compete on her in the poles and she's the horse I took to nationals in sixth grade." Gabriella and Popcorn headed to Lincoln, Nebraska, last month for their second shot at a national title in the poles. Throughout her time in the NMHSRA, Gabriella also competed in barrels, team and breakaway roping.

A firm believer in giving credit where it's due, Gabriella is quick to thank Popcorn, as well as her other mounts, for her time with the NMJHSRA and NMHSRA. "I really look up to Jackie Hobbs Crawford because she always gives the credit and praise to her horses. I know I wouldn't be anywhere without my horses. They're always trying their best and rodeo truly is a team event between horse and rider." Gabriella also admires Jackie's outward expression of her faith. As a devout Catholic, Gabriella knows God is always by her side. She keeps Psalm 46:5 handy, "God is within her and she will not fail."

As Gabriella prepares to leave the northern half of the state, she's reflecting on her time in high school rodeo. Like many of her peers, a lot of that time was spent riding with professional horseman Jerry Kimsey. "I've learned a lot of horsemanship skills from Jerry. He taught me how to listen to and become one with the horse. He's local to Grants, but he's trained a lot of people all over the state." Now a graduate of Grants High School, Gabriella is headed south to Las Cruces, the home of both New Mexico State University and her 21-year-old sister, Dominique. The pair will rodeo together for the



next year for the NMSU Aggies.

"I'm really looking forward to living with my sister and being able to rodeo with her again. You have to be out practicing basically every day if you want to be good and getting to do that with my sister who is basically my best friend just makes it that much better." Thanks to Gabriella's dad, Dominick, who is a retired state police captain, this cowgirl has taken an interest in criminal justice. "My dad has told me so many stories from his time with the state police that I just decided I wanted to be a crime scene investigator. I would like to work for the FBI one day." Those career goals also come with plans to continue rodeo for the foreseeable future.

Neither of Gabriella's parents grew up in rodeo, but they both have connections to horses. "My dad mainly used horses for hunting and my mom (Gloria) used them for ranching. It was a little difficult getting into rodeo just because my family didn't know anything about the different events." Both Gabriella and her sister started out on a lead line at 4-H rodeos and gymkhanas. This quickly led to junior rodeos and the rest, as they say, is history. "My parents had me on a horse as soon as possible and I just fell right in love with Gabriella Pargas - Pounding Hooves Productions

them. We basically went into rodeo blind, but that taught me to be very persistent. I'm a very competitive person but it's not just about winning for me, it's about doing the best that I can."





2021 WPRA World Finals Returns to Waco in November

2021 WPRA he World Finals presented by Nutrena will return to the EXTRACO Event Center in Waco, Texas, for the eighth consecutive year this November. Next to the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, the WPRA World Finals is one of the biggest events of the year for the WPRA that attracts the highest caliber of barrel racers and female ropers from across the country.

In 2020, the WPRA partnered with Elite Barrel Racing in co-producing the weekend event which paid out \$375,000 in cash and prizes. In 2021, the WPRA World Finals will run alongside the Elite Barrelnanza, November 11-14.

"We are excited to return to Extraco Event Center and build on the partnership with Elite that was started in 2020," said Jimmie Munroe, WPRA President. "This is our opportunity to recognize and crown our world champions in our futurity/ derby and junior division as well as our all-around, team roping and tie-down roping. It is shaping up to be a great weekend of women rodeo in action."

The WPRA World Finals will once again feature a \$15,000 added card holder barrel race with money counting toward the 2022 ProRodeo Standings. The permit only race will boast \$5,000 added and each of the roping disciplines (breakaway, team roping and tie-down) will feature \$5,000 (\$10,000 total for the team roping). All totaled the WPRA World Finals will boast \$60,000 in added money with the Elite &TOHA featuring a \$20,000 added open race with an additional \$10,000 Texas bred incentive.

achael Cox Arnold has her priorities straight. The barrel racer, a 5 Star Equine team member, spent very little on her wedding dress, knowing that she'd wear the dress only a few hours and the money could be better spent on horses and barrel racing.

The Hutchinson, Kansas cowgirl trains horses alongside her husband, Zane Arnold, futuritying them and competing in the Kansas Pro Rodeo Association, the Central Plains Rodeo Association and the Women's Pro Rodeo Association.

A member of the 5 Star Equine team, the first 5 Star Equine product that she ever used was the saddle pads. The one she uses the most is the Barrel Racer Flex Fit. The horses she has are "bigger guys, and it allows for the movement of the withers to open up, so you're not pinching or creating soreness."

The 5 Star Equine color choices grab a person's attention, she said. "You won't find the vibrant colors anywhere else, that 5 Star has. I have a red and a turquoise (saddle pad), and on Gator, (her barrel horse, who is black), it pops like crazy."

The pads, made of pure wool, have prevented her horses' backs from getting sore. "The pad will make or break your horse's back."

She also loves 5 Star Equine's sport boots. They keep her horses' legs cool and clean. "For us barrel racers, it's important to have their legs in good shape. Five Star allows them to keep their legs clean, keep them safe, and be trendy at the same time."

The 5 Star boots have dual straps, which she also appreciates. "I've tried other brands, and they're bulky. Five Stars' have such a nice conformed fit to the leg, it's a match made in heaven."

Rachael appreciates the company itself. "You're not going to find a company with employees so helpful and willing to go above and beyond. It's a large business, but you can definitely tell they want to keep the family-owned business feeling.



"It was a huge honor to be on the team this year. When you have sponsors like that, it changes you. You want to do good and be better, because you can represent the brand and show them at the highest level possible."

Rachael's main mount is a five-year-old jet-black gelding, Gator, whose registered name is Reeses Peanut Butter.

"He's changed the game for me," she said. He has a lot of heart and try, and when he's excelled, it's been at the bottom of the ground.

She found success with Gator last year at futurities, then took him on the rodeo road at Central Plains and KPRA rodeos.

"He just did phenomenal at the rodeos. He's everybody's favorite one to watch."

Gator loves the rodeo atmosphere, she said, and deep dirt. "He works good at barrel races but the rodeos, he knows something's happening there."

The horse is laid back, with "not a care in the world," she said. Zane heads on him, which is good for barrel horses, she believes. "I like to rope on mine, to get their brains good. I think that's a huge part of having a successful barrel horse because it gets their minds right, and they use other parts of their body."

Zane trains horses fulltime and has a lot of young ones coming up. Rachael works at a surgery center in Hutchinson and helps him. "We start all of our own," above: Rachael Cox Arnold - Springer

she said. "It's both of us, in the round pen on them. That's our moments together."

Rachael's favorite part is the colts, "getting them going and seeing them go on with someone else. That's what I love to do."

The couple, who married on June 18, got engaged in February of 2020. They planned on a big outdoor wedding in October at Zane's grandparents' farm, but they thought the weather in October might be too cold, so they moved it to September. Then the September weekend they chose was the KPRA finals, so it was postponed again.

Rachael said, "enough is enough," and she suggested eloping.

So they decided to get married in June, with just family in attendance, and throw a big party next year.

Within three weeks, they threw together a wedding, complete with a \$70 wedding dress (saving money for barrel racing!). "Our wedding is us," Rachael said, "simple and easy. We didn't want a big show."

"Think about all that money," saved from not having a big wedding, she said. "We could buy a horse with it!"

She and Gator are the 2020 Central Plains Rodeo year-end and average champions.

EVERYBODY HAS A PLAN until they nod their head

66 D verybody has a plan until they get punched in the mouth." Mike Tyson 1996.

I believe you can change this statement can be changed some to fit a lot of young rodeo athletes.

"Everybody has a plan until they nod their head."

I see it daily at high school rodeos, at practices and at college and pro rodeos. Evervone has a game plan, from what start they are going to see to how they will execute a ride. I can ask almost any rodeo contestant before they compete and they will be able to tell you their plan for their upcoming run or ride. The majority of the time contestants have a fairly simple plan to execute to be successful. Almost everyone I know that competes has a game plan that if executed correctly will lead them to the pay window.

It has always been a mystery to me that when you watch certain guys practice, you know they should be able to win if they make the same runs or rides at a rodeo. While you watch others and think that there is no way they will be competitive. Evervone has seen someone or knows someone in this scenario. Some call it nerves. Butterflies. Emotions. Pressure. Whatever you would like to call it, it keeps a lot of people from winning. A lot of people can execute at a high level in the practice pen consistently, very few can do it at rodeos consistently.

So how come so many athletes can not execute their game plan in competition? Because they figuratively get punched in the mouth. When you get to c competi-




CJ Aragon, Coach at Sul Ross, competing in Roswell, New Mexico, two years ago. CJ took second place. - Sull Ross

tive scenario you must be able to execute at a high level to be successful. Those that work on the mental discipline to stay calm in difficult scenarios, tend to perform well in pressure situations. And the major problem is that almost everyone reacts differently to pressure situations.

Your plan is only as good as your ability to execute it. The majority of rodeo contestants I know spend the majority of their time focusing on the physical side of practice. Hours spent in the practice pen honing their physical skills, hours spent in the gym to be in good physical condition. I am a firm believer in hard work in the practice pen, however I believe that you have to be able to be in pressure situations and be able to mentally still execute at a high level.

Great competitors are like great prize fighters, they can get punched in the mouth and still stick to their game plan and execute on a high level. If you are not there yet, make sure you spend time on your mental preparation before competition. Great competitors in any sport work on both the mental and physical side of their game to be prepared to roll with the punches.



or the last several years I had been hearing about this event in Enterprise, Oregon that contestants were raving about. Since it was an 8 Second Whiskey Tour stop it has always been on my bucket list to shoot. So when I was asked to be the official photographer for the 2021 event I immediately jumped on board.

On June 26, 2021 I rolled into Enterprise, Oregon with camera bag in tow ready for some great Bull and Ranch Bronc action. It was extremely hot, but a lot of excitement in the air. The contestants started rolling in, the event was being televised live and so the different crews were busy at work getting the large screen put in place, sound system, and everything else that goes with a huge event.

A long time announcer and friend Lee Daggett whom I truly admire was hustling around making sure everything was going as planned. Then came the production meetings, contestant meetings, wait.... You mean all of these things go into an event??? I thought you just showed up and everything happened magically. Some differences is bareback you having a rigging that looks like a suitcase handle which you slide your hand through. Your free hand cannot touch the animal or the rider for 8 seconds. Also the rider has to have his or her spurs in front of the horses shoulder when the horse breaks the plain of the chute. That is called a mark out. If they fail to do that then there is no score. Saddle bronc has similar rules except they use a saddle with no saddle horn and they hold a rope attached to a halter. Again there free hand cannot touch and they have to mark out.

Ranch bronc is a totally different beast all together. The rider uses a standard western saddle that a lot uses in their every day job on the ranch. It has the saddle horn and most have a lariat or (rope) that

they can hold on to and the other hand has a rope like the saddle broncs. The Ranch bronc began as a competition between cowboys on ranches.

Gabe Mckay is a dear friend and is always a treat to watch and photograph. Gabe and I have a running joke with each other about him collecting frequent flyer miles. I have gotten some great shots of Gabe flying through the air. Gabe is from Haiti and came to the United States and was adopted by a family in Juntura, Oregon. He has been around horses all his life and it shows in the way he handles himself when he rides. Don't think I have ever seen Gabe without a smile on his face, and he is always such a pleasure to speak with and visit with no matter how his ride goes.

As the action heated up Kody Lovgrenn was leading the pack and was excited about his rides. Then Gabe stepped to the plate, and as they say in Baseball the ball

io Nutter, a graduated senior from Rapid City Central, is a fourth-generation cowboy on his dad's side who fell in love with the sport of rodeo at an early age. His roping career started at two years old when he won his first dummy roping. "I actually won it swinging backwards," laughed Rio. "I didn't know how to swing the right way when I was first starting, but I ended up winning the roping and a couple dollars."

Since his first appearance in the rodeo world, Rio has come a long way with his roping skills. He has gathered many titles including winning the WTRC Team Roping Finals Truck Championship in 2018, winning the all-around saddle at the South Dakota Timed Event Championship in 2018, and earning back-toback state championships in team roping at the South Dakota High School Rodeo Association (SDHSRA) State Finals in 2019 and 2020 with his partner Bodie Mattson.

Although the accomplishments that he's most proud of are mostly in team roping, Rio claims that his favorite event is actually the tie-down roping. "It's one of the most individual events in rodeo and you've got to be as equally prepared for both yourself and your horse," he said. Rio also enjoys the event because "it takes the most work to get good at."

While in the practice pen, Rio tries to split up his events throughout the week to help him concentrate on what needs worked on in each one. "I'll try to spend one night focusing on roping calves, the next night team roping, and the next night bulldogging so I can get the most

out of that event in that one night," he ellaborated. Although he tries to work on one event per night, he still finds himself tying and roping the dummy almost every night. At each practice coaching him is his dad, Tim Nutter. "My dad is my biggest inspiration and I aspire to be like him," Rio explains. "He's helped me with everything and him and my mom, Sherrie, have always been there to support me."

To the rodeos, Rio brings three horses: one for each event. "Gunner is my bay calf horse. I've had him since I was a 7th grader. Arnie is my buckskin bulldogging horse and little Johnny is my little chestnut heel horse," Rio says.

When Rio isn't practicing his events or on the rodeo trail, he enjoys playing basketball. Rio played as a guard for the Rapid City Cobblers where the team finished their past season with an 11-8 record, falling five points short of qualifying for the state basketball tournament. Rio was a starter and a key player to the Cobblers who often played for the majority of the games. He still enjoys playing pickup games with friends whenever he gets a chance.

At the SDHSRA State Finals in Fort Pierre, S.D., on June 17-19, Rio accomplished his goal to earn a state championship for the third year in a row. Rio and his team roping partner, Tegan Fite, won the saddles after three rounds of competition. Rio's past saddles were earned from the heading side, but this year he earned his win by heeling.

During his time as a member of the SDHSRA, Rio's favorite part of the rodeos was getting a chance to meet up with friends he didn't get to see during the off season. "It was fun being able to compete against each other weekend after weekend, getting better, and trying to enhance your skills for the next level."

Meet the Sponsor **Touchstone Energy**

ouchstone Energy has been a proud supporter of the South Dakota High School Rodeo Association (SDHSRA) for the past 20 years by sponsoring short-go shirts for each athlete qualifying for the shortgo round at the state finals. Originally, Touchstone Energy was a top sponsor of the Badlands Circuit; however, once Todd was placed on the sponsoring committee, he started to look into the SDH-SRA so they could include the younger generations as well. "We thought okay, now these high school rodeo people, they're our future members of the co-op. What would be a better way to give our money back to our future members than by sponsoring them?"



Touchstone Energy is a national organization that has a network of electric cooperatives in 45 states. Touchstone Energy was created in 1998 and currently has over 700 members nation-wide. Touchstone Energy raised the bar in power sourcing by raising the standards to be met by each cooperative to guarantee that customers had a power company that could be trusted if customers moved locations. These cooperatives can be found all over the nation which makes it a power company that is easily recognized by consumers.

Todd Eliason, the Assistant General Manager of the Rushmore Electric Cooperative, explains the importance of cooperatives in rural communities: "If you look at the co-ops right now, a lot of them aren't right in the middle of the big cities, they're on the outskirts because nobody wanted them [at first.] But now, with the population growing, the co-ops are starting to see the growth and benefits to the rest of the members."

Each cooperative across the nation is member owned. Todd elaborates that the importance of member owned cooperatives is that the members "have a say in what goes on in the membership." Touchstone Energy's headquarter cooperatives have annual meetings that are open to the members where they vote on directors, bylaw changes, and more. The cooperatives are also non-profit organizations that gives profit back to the members in a capital credit check.

Rod Moon was the man who reached out to Todd in search of a sponsor for the short-go shirts in 2000. "We had a conversation one day and we were thinking about what [Touchstone Energy] could do. He asked if there was any way that we could sponsor the short-go shirts," Todd said. "[After our conversation,] I took it to my board and tried to sell it. Low and behold, we sold it!"

By sponsoring the short-go shirts the past 20 years, Todd has helped introduce the kids to their local cooperative. After the long go's are finished, short-go qualifiers are asked to fill out a form prior to the short-go in order to re-

ceive their shirts. On that form, kids are asked who their co-op is. "How we [distribute the shirts] is I get all the shirts at Rushmore Electric and then I divvy them up within the co-op that each kid is in. And then that co-op gets the shirts and dispenses them to their members." By introducing the kids to their local cooperatives, Todd hopes that Touchstone Energy will stick in their minds in the future when they are looking for their power distributor.

"To keep this program going, [it would be great] if whoever gets one of those shirts could tell their local director how much they appreciate it," Todd expresses. "That comes back to me and then that makes it much easier to sell to the board each year. It's a trickle effect."



Meet the Member **Golden Horse**

Special Mount Makes Steer Wrestling Easy, Has Won Countless Buckles.

here's a pretty special horse in Dane Pokorny's barn. Shorty, a red roan gelding, is the Thedford High School cowboy's steer wrestling mount.

Shorty isn't just any horse. On his back, three Nebraska High School Rodeo Association steer wrestling titles have been won, and countless buckles and saddles.

The Pokornys got the horse eight years ago from the Kasselder family near Ericson. Shorty was raised by Dean Pelster, who considered using him for ranch work but thought his personality was better suited to steer wrestling. Shorty had also been used for a bit of heeling in the team roping.

Jake Kasselder had ridden Shorty for college rodeo. Dane's older brother Cauy rode Shorty in high school rodeo, and so did several other steer wrestlers, including Lane Day, who won the state title in 2011 and Zane Patrick who was co-champion in 2017. And just this year, Dane won the 2021 state title on the horse. He wishes someone had written down how many firstplace buckles Shorty has won for his riders.

Shorty makes steer wrestling easy for his riders, Dane said.

"He'll put you in the same spot (during the run) every time. Having one that

does that, makes it easy to practice on him and get your technique down. He's never failed me, not once.'

Dane's dad Brad called Shorty "honest." Steer wrestlers often share horses, and the Pokornys make Shorty available to anyone who needs him at high school rodeos. "Anybody can get on him," Brad said. "We had a kid last week that didn't get along with his horse, and we put him on Shorty. He gives you the same shot every time."

Shorty is old, as far as horses go, although the Porkornys don't know his age and have no registration papers for him. They estimate he's in his upper twenties.

But he doesn't act his age. If Dane hasn't practiced for awhile, Shorty feels his oats when they try to catch him. "He trots around, he bucks, he does this skipdi-do," Brad said.

He can be hard to catch, Dane said. "When you go to catch him to ride him, he acts like he's four. Sometimes a switch will turn on and you'll have trouble catching him. Other times, you can walk right up to him.

"Shorty doesn't act up, he just knows that he's smarter than most. He's old and wise."

The horse has one more year of competition, Brad says, then he's earned his retirement. Dane is a junior in high school and will ride Shorty for the 2021-2022 school year, and then Shorty will retire to green pastures.

The horse gets special treatment at the Pokorny ranch. They know his worth.

"He's golden," Brad said. "He's a golden old horse." 📅

Meet the Member Parker Nokes

arker Nokes is the 2020-2021 Nebraska Junior High School Rodeo Association breakaway champion. The McCook cowboy, who just completed his first year of junior high rodeo, finished the rodeo season a halfpoint ahead of the reserve champion, Jackson Wykert.

He competes not only in the breakaway, but the goat tying, team roping (heeling for Taylor Drueke) and the ribbon roping (roping for Sophia Schemper.)

For the breakaway, he rides his dad, Garrett's, former team roping horse, Scout.

He and his dad, who passed away on February 14 of this year had made a deal concerning Scout.

Garrett roped at the World Series Finale in 2017, winning the Ariat World Series No. 12 with Scott Smith.

"Our deal was," Parker said, "if he did good in Vegas, I'd get to start using Scout full time. And he did." Scout had been Garrett's primary horse, till his backup won the World Series for him and he was able to hand Scout off to Parker.

This was not only his first state junior high finals (he just completed sixth grade), but his first finals without his dad.

It wasn't easy, but Uncle Justen Nokes stepped in to help.

Justen has been attending all of Parker's junior high rodeos, offering advice and helping out.

Garrett, who was a steer wrestler, tie-down roper, and team roper in the PRCA, Nebraska State Rodeo Association, Kansas Pro Rodeo Association, and Mid-States Rodeo Association, worked extremely hard at his craft, not only physically but mentally.

"That's what Garrett was so good at, how to overcome the mental part of it. Garrett knew how to win," Laura, his wife, said. "I'm sure there were steer wrestlers and calf ropers that were more talented than him, but he knew how to win and how to prepare himself to win, and that's why he did so good at it."

Garrett worked to instill that in his boys, Parker, age thirteen, and his older brother, Trevor, age sixteen, she said, in both the boys' interests, rodeo for Parker and golf and tennis for Trevor. "It's the same in golf," Laura said. "When you make a bad shot, you have to move on so you can make a good shot. Garrett was working with Trevor on his golf and tennis game."

Parker's state finals win didn't come as he would have liked.

He went into the finals in second place, five points behind Jackson. He won the first round with a time of 2.56 seconds, then missed both loops in the second round.

At finals, points are calculated differently than during the regular season. The finals rounds are double the points of regular rodeos; hence, winning first is twenty points. And the average is ten points.

Wykert won the average, but Parker won the year-end by a half-point.

He was nervous watching the second round, after he'd missed. "Luckily some kids were playing defense for me, that didn't have much luck during the year but were making good runs that day."

Garrett and Laura instilled in their boys that when things went wrong, they could dwell on it briefly but then had to move on.

"That's our rule," Laura said. "Do a pity party for 15 minutes then it's over and we move on and look at the next run."

Parker has a set of cheerleaders in the Mid-Plains Community College rodeo team, where Garrett was timed event coach.

He practiced often with the team and especially enjoyed roping with Danielle Wray, because she always caught. Danielle, who was a two-time breakaway roping champ for the Great Plains Region, came to the state junior high finals to watch him rope. Landon Sivertsen, another Mid-Plains rodeo athlete, stayed in

McCook an extra week to practice with Parker before finals.

"I think Parker has an advantage," Laura said, "because he's been able to practice, since he was little, with the college team. They've mentored him." The rodeo team is a big family at Mid-Plains, Laura said.

He's ready to go to Des Moines in June for the National Junior High Finals. Justen and his family, wife Ashley and daughter Halli, will be there, to help out and cheer him on.

Parker has his goals set for Nationals. He wants to place in a round and in the average.

When Garrett did things, he was 120 percent into them, Laura said. "Parker is the same way. He has that drive and determination. He's a fierce competitor like his father."

He also won the reserve rookie of the year title.

Meet the Member **Brenda Howard**



66 The have wanted to rodeo my entire life," said Brenda Howard from Helena, Missouri. "I rode horses growing up, but nobody in my family ever rodeoed. My husband, Marty, and I started team roping just after we were married." At the time, Brenda was in her 20s and continued honing her skills at team roping jackpots for the next 10 years before branching out to the rodeo world. "Jesse Marshall, who is now 87 and still rodeos in the NSPRA, got Marty calf roping in the 90s and was always talking about the senior pro rodeos. It was something we always wanted to do and then Glen Hollenbeck hosted one in Nebraska in 2017. That was the closest one they ever had to us, so we went, and we loved it." The NSPRA is now Brenda and Marty's main focus for rodeo.

Even though the NSPRA is chalked full of people who competed at the NFR and what Brenda would call a "somebody," she's never felt out of place. "I would say that Marty and I are the 'never weres.' All these successful people have always accepted us and made us feel like family." This will be Brenda's fifth year in the association and 2020 proved to be monumental for this budding barrel racer and breakaway roper. "Last year I won the all-around title, which was a bizarre time to win the all-around saddle but I'll remember it forever." Brenda has dreamt of winning an all-around saddle through rodeo for the last 30 years.

Built by Tres Rios, Brenda had her gelding measured by a local saddle maker so she could use her trophy saddle every day. "Even though I won a barrel saddle in 2019, I had them make me a combo saddle so I could rope in it. I've been waiting for this saddle for 30 years, so of course I'm going to use it instead of keep it in the house as a trophy." Even though Brenda considers herself a late bloomer, she's making a

name for herself as both a competitor and a horsewoman. She attributes her success to learning how to make her own rodeo horses rather than buying them. "Training a rodeo horse takes years, so you have to like the horse you're on because you have so much quality time together. You have to work at it every day, but it's such a joyful journey."

Her training philosophy isn't built on the traditional foundation. It was Palm Sunday many years ago when Brenda concluded that Jesus must be the best horse trainer ever as he rode through a parade on an unbroke 2-year-old donkey. "Now for all my training questions I don't seek out people, I ask for the Lord's advice. It's amazing how he brings the answers to me: from other trainers in passing, the internet, the TV, all over," As Brenda gets rolling on a new season, she's still riding the high of 2020. "I feel like I got the icing on the cake last year and now everything is just gravy. My goal for the year is to have clean barrel runs

and catch my calves and just to do the best that I can with every run."

Brenda works for her church each weekday morning and then rounds out her time as a real estate agent and farmer. "The morning job feeds me, and the afternoon job provides my fun money, but it's super flexible. Marty works for a farmer and then we have some row crops and 40 head of cattle of our own. Our busy time is the spring and fall, so we can rodeo in the summer." This flexibility of work schedules is what allows Brenda and Marty to travel further than they ever have in their lifetime. Being part of a national association ensures they have every opportunity to explore the western United States. "We love that we get to travel for the NSPRA and we're at the same location for multiple rodeos. That affords us the time to get to know people on a social level rather than just from a competitive standpoint. It's been quite an experience so far."

uring the College National Finals Rodeo (CNFR) at Casper in June, the 2021 National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association Alumni (NI-RAA) Reunion was attended by about 50 people. 15 NIRA Alumni from the years ending in '60 and '61 were honored for their past achievements as champions, finals champion, winning team members, and presidents and introduced during the Friday night performance of the CNFR.

Jack Burkholder (deceased) was the 1957, 1958, 1959, and 1960 NIRA Champion Tie Down Roper for Texas A and I (now Texas A and M). At the 1960 CNFR, his younger brother, Kenneth, was winning the calf roping until he broke his ankle in the steer wrestling. Kenneth managed to rope his last calf, hobbled to it, and placed second, but Jack had a faster time and won the title. Jack has had the honor of holding the record of his four consecutive wins for 61 years.

The 1961 NIRA Men's Championship was won by the University of Wyoming Rodeo Team including Jim Moore, Fred Wilson, Jerry Kaufmann (deceased), and Frank Shepperson.

Jim Moore grew up on a ranch between Midwest and Wright, Wyoming. He was the National High School Rodeo Association President in 1956 and then rodeoed in college and the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA), going to the National Finals Steer Roping in 1972, 1975, and 1978. He served as the PRCA Steer Roping Director in 1978 and 1979. Jim now lives in Douglas, Wyoming and spends winters in Nevada.

Fred Wilson, another member of the 1961 University of Wyoming Championship team, and his wife Clara ranch south of Newcastle, Wyoming where they have been honored by the American Quarter Horse Association (A.Q.H.A) for over 50 years of breeding and raising fine horses. Fred was also the 1962 NIRA Champion



Bareback Rider and is a Gold Card Member of the PRCA.

The late Jerry Kaufmann, represented by his wife Amanda Kaufmann, was also on the winning University of Wyoming Men's Championship Team in 1961. Jerry was a director-at-large of the A.Q.H.A. and was a Gold Card Member of the PRCA. The Kaufmanns were recognized by the A.Q.H.A. for raising Quarter Horses for over 50 years. In 1971 he was the Steer Roping Champion at the Cheyenne, Wyo. Frontier Days Rodeo.

Another University of Wyoming team member, Frank Shepperson, grew up in the Midwest, Wyoming area and rodeoed in high school and college and went on to win the PRCA Steer Wrestling Championship in 1975. He currently ranches about 40 miles northwest of Casper, Wyoming. At the reunion, Frank told some interesting stories about learning to fly from a World War II veteran pilot and getting lost over Los Angeles.

Don Reichert, President of the NIRA Alumni, Inc., stated, "It was a blessing to honor so many past NIRA members in person at our reunion. Watch for stories about other honorees in Rodeo News in coming months. Plan to attend the NIRA Alumni Reunion during the June 2022 CNFR at Casper, Wyoming."





Notes from Italy

021 horse camp rodeo is in the books! Finally, we have been able to make it happen again.

The rain and the Covid forced to shoot down our best event for 2 years in a row; but we are come back with probably the best rodeo of them all!

After 5 weeks of horse camp, we turn a group of city kids that never rode a horse before in to a bunch of little cowboys and cowgirls! They learned to ride and rope and to be good "ranch hands" by mucking stalls, feeding livestock and painting fences.

t just nine-years-old, Jace Westbrook of Blue Ridge, Texas is already an International Miniature Rodeo Association (IMRA) award winning bronc rider. He also rides bulls. Of the two events, bull riding is his favorite. He likes them best because the PBR is "so cool." Jace was named the IMRA Reserve champion bareback bronc rider in 2019. He has been a member of the association for three-years. He is also a member of the Texas Junior Rodeo Association (TJRA), the Southeast Oklahoma Junior Rodeo Association (SOJRA), and the International Miniature Bullriders Association (IMBA).

Jace is the son of Samantha Westbrook, a stay-at-home mom, and Ty Lynn, who is employed in the foundation drilling industry. He has two siblings, four-year-old Lathan Lynn, and two-year-old Raelee Lynn. However, it is his grandfather, Papa John Lynn that helps Jace with his rodeo endeavors. Jace says Papa John is his biggest supporter. "He hauls me to rodeos and bull ridings," Jace said. They go to at least 35 rodeos a year, and maybe more. The farthest Jace has traveled to a rodeo is Las Vegas, Nevada, for the International Miniature Bull Riders Association (IMBA) finals at the Plaza Hotel and Casino. His favorite road trip meal is chicken strips.

Jace comes from an extended rodeo family. His dad was a state high school rodeo finalist and now flanks for the Big L Rodeo Company. His aunt Harley Lynn has qualified for the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA) finals this year in the breakaway roping. Harley has also qualified as a Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association (CRRA) and Arkansas Rodeo Association (ARA) finalist. Papa John is a rodeo announcer.

As so many cowboys do, Jace got his start riding sheep in the mutton busting event, then moved on to bulls and broncs. Papa John helped him get started in his rodeo career. Jace decided to start rodeoing when he was "hanging out" with his





family members at rodeos. The young man is lucky enough to have his own practice string. Red Rock is his bucking pony, a nine-year-old paint. He also has three miniature bulls that he practices on, including one named Showtime. While most children would probably name a dog or cat as their favorite pet, Jace said this bull is his favorite pet. "He is gentle and fun to practice on," Jace said. As they say, practice makes perfect. The young cowboy prepares for each rodeo by spending plenty of time in the practice pen.

Jace is in the third grade at Leonard Elementary School in Leonard, Texas. He says the best part about school is his friends. His favorite subject is Physical Education. Jace loves all sports, and is very athletic. In addition to bull and bronc riding, the young cowboy also participates in baseball, basketball, and football. When he is not rodeoing or playing one of the other three sports, he likes to go swimming and fishing, along with hunting and gardening.

Jace's career goals currently include becoming a professional bull rider, and a

professional bareback rider.





PROFILE: WILD TIME PRODUCTIONS SEPTEMBER 10-19, 2021

lthough he retired from his bronc riding career at a young age, a career in rodeo is exactly the life Sylvain Bourgeois has enjoyed for the past 25-plus years. As the co-owner of Wild Time Productions and 2 Wild Ranch, Sylvain also works as the rodeo manager for the renowned Festival Western Saint-Tite, held in Quebec, Canada each September: and he has been instrumental in the growth and development of the sport of rodeo across Canada. "I started riding broncs as a 15-year-old in 1985 and loved it. However, the distance you had to travel back then was great and you often spent 50-60 hours a weekend traveling between rodeos. Although I sometimes regret letting go of bronc riding, I wouldn't trade my life for anything, I love what I'm doing. I was still riding broncs in 1995 when I was hired by the festival, but once I started Wild Time Productions with a friend in 2000. I decided to focus on producing rodeos." When Sylvain began producing rodeos, there were only about 5 or 6 in the province. Within 5 years, that number had increased to over 12 rodeos each season, and after working with the festival as the rodeo manager all these years, the numbers have steadily multiplied and there are now over 40 rodeos in the province for cowboys and cowgirls to compete. "In 2005, my partner decided to go a different direction, so I bought him out and ran things alone for a few years before selling half of the company to the festival in 2008. They had the office, accounting, and marketing to offer me, and I was able to promote rodeos for them. It has been a wonderful partnership and things have grown incredibly for us both."

In 1997, Sylvain married Tania Daudelin, a barrel racer from strong barrel racing lineage. A close friend, Gary Seutter, gave Sylvain and Tania a bucking horse, Wedding Band, as a wedding gift. "I bought 5 more bucking horses to go with him and started having rodeos in 2000 so that I had places to buck my horses. At the time I wanted to raise bucking horses, but we had too many rodeos and an immedi-



ate need for horses; so my partner, Eric Desjardins and I partnered and found land and started buying bucking horses from wonderful contractors all over north America. Ten years ago, we started our breeding program and we currently own approximately 60 to 70 horses. We have horses we've bred that are ready to buck right now, so having all of the rodeo cancellations this season has been overwhelming." Sylvain leases all timed-event stock and bucking bulls for the rodeos he produces. Sylvain and Tania have two sons, Micheal, 30, who has worked for the past 10 years in Wild Time Productions as a sound man and DJ, and Zach, their 20-year-old bull and bronc rider.

In 1999, Sylvain produced his very first International Professional Rodeo Association co-sanctioned rodeo and has produced only IPRA first-sanctioned rodeos ever since. The relationship with IPRA has

led to many positive changes for rodeo in Canada. The IPRA Canada branch started out with 100 members and has grown to over 700 members attending over 40 rodeos across Ontario and Quebec in the IPRA Canada circuit. The Festival Western St-Tite is now a 10-day event that draws over 600,000 spectators and visitors to the area as well as the top cowboy and cowgirl competitors across Canada and the United States. Although they've had to cancel the event in 2020, they have plans for a virtual Festival Western St-Tite, with 10 days of performances being aired on the Wrangler network, and virtual concerts, dance lessons, and other exciting events available on an online platform. "It's a way that we can still keep in contact with the fans, partners, volunteers, and the cowboys and cowgirls. In 2021, we will celebrate the 53rd event. I look forward to life getting back to normal and getting back out there to all the committees that are a part of our family. It is hard not seeing them all summer, but we look forward to working with them and making their events successful in the future."

Days of '47 Cowboy Games & Rodeo Officially Back in the Saddle in 2021

t was an action-packed opening night performance at the Days of '47 Cowboy Games and Rodeo presented by Zions Bank in Salt Lake City.

Richmond Champion gave the fans a show in the bareback riding spurring Sankey Rodeo's Shoutin Shoes for 87 points to win the first performance and punch his ticket to the Gold Medal Round on Saturday evening. Champion of Stevensville, MT, has competed here in Salt Lake City in the past but has yet to land on the medal podium. He is hoping to ride the momentum into the final round with all eyes on the gold medal. Wyatt Denny, who won the gold in 2017 and again in 2018, finished in a tie for second with an 85 point ride aboard Flying U Rodeo's Misplaced Insanity. He will have to wait to see if that ride holds up to advance to the final round following the fourth performance on Friday night.

A total of 288 competitors will take their shot at a share of the \$562,500 in prize money and a Gold, Silver, or Bronze medal that will be awarded on Saturday, July 24. There will be 32 competitors in each of the following events: bareback riding, steer wrestling, team roping, saddle bronc riding, tie-down roping, women's breakaway roping, barrel racing and bull riding.

The full field of 32 competitors is divided into four groups of eight each and compete in one of the first four performances (July 20-23). The one (1) highest score/fastest time from each discipline of each performance will advance to the Gold Medal Round along with the three (3) highest scores/fastest times overall, from all four combined Semi-Final performances that have not vet advanced. In addition, the #1 ranked athlete in each discipline (for team roping it is highest ranked team after pairing) of the final audited standings of the WCRA Segment 8 Leaderboard will be automatically qualified for the Gold Medal Round making a total of eight (8) contestants in each discipline to compete in the

Gold Medal Round. Scores/times from the Semi-Final performances will NOT carry forward to the Gold Medal Round (only to break ties). The 8 competitors in each event in the Gold Medal Round will compete in a sudden-death format with the winner collecting a Gold Medal and \$25,000 cash.

In 2019, Lefty Holman went home with a bronze medal and he will be back in the hunt for a medal in the Gold Medal Round on Saturday after winning the first performance at the 2021 Cowboy Games and Rodeo. Holman, of Visalia, CA, posted a 88.5 points aboard Flying U Rodeo's Yeti Rambler to pocket \$1,600 on opening night and punch his ticket to the Finals. He will be looking to improve on his finish from two years ago.

Cody Devers of Perryton, TX was the fastest in the steer wrestling tonight with a 6.09 second run earning him a check worth \$1,600 and a chance at a \$25,000 payout on Saturday.

Taking the victory lap in the team roping on opening night was the first team out. Joe Mattern of Magnolia, TX and Lucas Falconer, of Summerset, WI, finished in a time of 5.44 seconds out roping WCRA's No. 1 team from the segment 8 leaderboard Kaleb Driggers and Junior Nogueira, who finished in a time of 5.45 seconds. Driggers and Nogueira had already earned a spot in the Gold Medal round due to their No. 1 status. Therefore both teams will be back to rope on Saturday night, July 24 on Pioneer Day.

It was a rough night for the majority of tie-down ropers on opening night in Salt Lake City but Westyn Hughes took care of business and finished in a time of 7.94 seconds to earn a spot in the final round. The next closest competitor was Cory Solomon with an 11.63 second run.

Tibba Smith took the win in breakaway roping in a time of 2.28 seconds. Smith of Hobbs, NM was by far the best roper tonight with Jenna Lee Hays Adams finishing in 4.61 seconds.

It was an epic night in the barrel racing with Kassie Mowry riding her great mount CP He Will Be Epic stopping the clock in an impressive 17.623 seconds knocking Anna Jorgenson of Hudson, Colorado, off the top of the leaderboard who turned in a 17.728-second run. Mowry will return on Saturday night and Jorgenson's time is in a good position to return as well.

Utah's own Keyshawn Whitehorse was the only bull rider to turn in a qualified ride on opening night. Whitehorse of McCracken Springs, UT, posted an 84

on Matt Sharping's Hi Jacked and will be looking for his second consecutive medal after collecting bronze in 2019.

The Days of '47 Cowboy Games & Rodeo presented by Zions Bank, is taking place at the \$17.5 million state-of-theart Days of '47 Arena at the Utah State Fairpark, custom designed and built for rodeo. The venue—an outdoor arena located in the heart of Salt Lake City—features over 10,000 stadium-style seats.

For only the sixth time in the history of rodeo, riders will have an opportunity to compete for Gold, Silver or Bronze Medals. The first two times were in conjunction with the Olympic Winter Games in Calgary (1988) and Salt Lake City (2002), when rodeo was part of the Cultural Olympiad and the other three times being the Days of '47 Cowboy Games and Rodeo 2017-2019. This will be the second time for breakaway ropers as their event was added to the roster in 2019. The medals that will be awarded at the Days of '47 Cowboy Games & Rodeo will be produced by OC Tanner, the same company that made the Olympic medals for the champions of the 2002 Olympic Winter Games.


