EMPTY TOMB

This last April 1st we celebrated Easter at the little church Susie and I attend in Oklahoma. Like yours, most probably, it was filled with families, some new faces and thoughts of dinner afterwards.

The first portion of my message was focused on the cross of Jesus. This is typically done at the end of an Easter service with a salvation crescendo. The cross is the symbol of the sacrifice Christ made. The cross represents the death of sin, guilt and shame, as we had known it. It tells the story of Jesus who became that final and complete sacrifice. It is the means by which we can go directly to God without the necessity of an intermediary human priest. It means the fulfillment of the law.

All need the work of Christ on the cross. There is no other way.

However, to most of the listeners that morning this was familiar news. Here in the Bible Belt, my audience has heard the Gospel and most have accepted Jesus as Savior. So, I covered it first as a reminder to all of us.

After that, a few of the Elders thought the guy behind the microphone may have slipped a gear on his way to the second half of his message. I'm not saying that I haven't slipped a gear once in a while. I am saying, that in this case, on this morning, my gears were synched and clutch was not slipping.

My premise was simply this: for those of us who already know Christ, the cross might not be our most accurate symbol. (Small gasp from the theological gatekeepers of "the way we've always thought of it" section)

Knowing that the next thing I said had better be good or I was going to get easter-egged immediately. With a deep breath, a calming smile and quiet voice, I said: "Could it be, think with me on this now, the empty tomb might be a better symbol for the Christian?" The smiles and nods began to return. Whew.

Jesus's death is of highest importance. Yet, without wanting to parse nomenclature unduly, it is not a stretch to appreciate that His resurrection is of the highest relevance to believers.

The empty tomb as it turns out, represents an ongoing story of life. It speaks of victory over shame and guilt to offer us hope for tomorrow.

The empty tomb says that in Christ you are enough. In Christ your guilt has been taken care of. In Christ, death is not final. The empty tomb speaks to the future. It speaks to the "now what" and to on-going life in the flesh. It speaks to active, real and dynamic faith that moves into the unknown with full confidence that through Jesus, the price is already paid and there is an abundant life. We can live a hopeful faith. We can move through suffering with confidence knowing that He lives and we can too. Guilt and shame do not control us. Gratitude and joy do.

The empty tomb says Jesus has lived his full life and full mission. He is seated with God in the heavenly realms now. He went to work fulfilling His ultimate role of ruling at the right hand of the Father. The empty tomb says to follow Jesus and get on with what's next. Shake the church frown and embrace the true joy. Die to self. Then get up. Rise up. Go on. Live.

And so, with the empty tomb in mind, we need to continue on and find our calling. To live with hope knowing that suffering is not fatal. To live in a way that calls our children to freedom, grace and the knowledge that their debt is paid. To reflect God in a way that calls out and encourages the goodness in them, instead of looking for the badness to be punished. To say to our spouses that they are more than their bad days. To believe deeply that there is life and

hope, joy and freedom by living in the light of the empty tomb.

Like Jesus suffered, we suffer. Life can be very hard. But there is life after death. There is hope in the darkness. Joy in the struggle. Motivation to keep at it. The cross is not the end. There is the empty tomb of a risen Savior.

We thought the grave would bring death and finality. It actually brought life and eternity. 📖

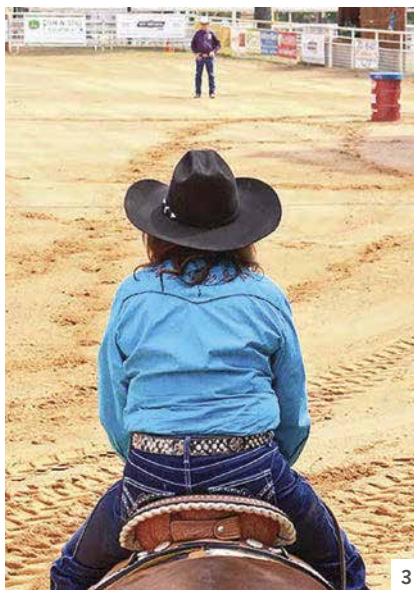
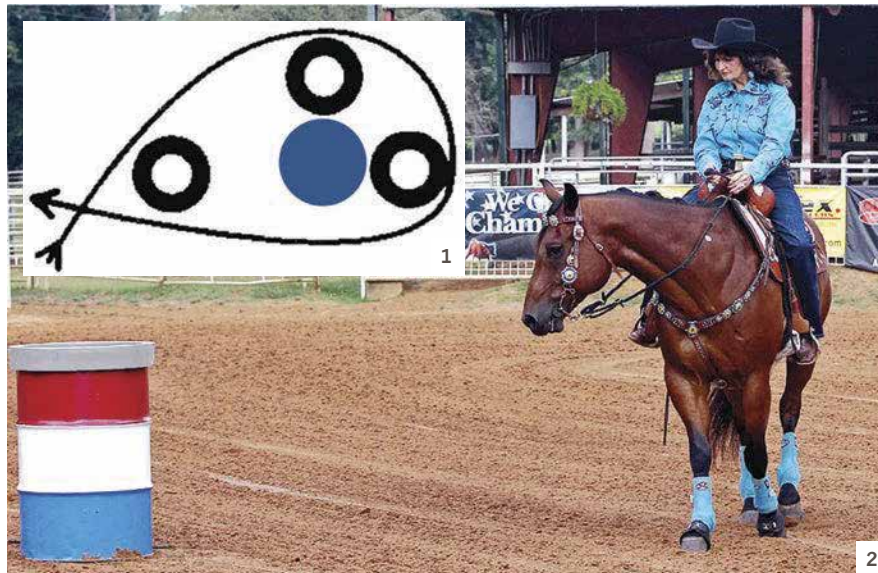
From the moment you pull up to the rodeo it's time for business. Parking in a good spot so your horses aren't standing on rocks or pavement or next to a shade tree if it's hot, will help ensure your horse is 100% comfortable until they call your name. Part of the secret to being a winner, is about strategizing for success. After your horse is taken care of, it's time to pay your fees and get a feel for the arena and the alley way.

Try not to let the moment you run in the arena, be the first time you see where the first barrel is sitting. Prior to the start of the race or rodeo, stand in the alleyway and look for the markers if the barrels aren't up. Get your bearings and start visualizing the run you want to make.

Check to see what type of alleyway the arena has. If it's a center alley, I like to line up with my third barrel. Focus on looking at the ground where you want to take your horse. This could be 8-12 feet out from the barrel depending on your horse's style of turning. While you're on foot, study the ground and check the dirt. Is it loose or too deep? Is there hard ground underneath the top layer? Knowing the conditions of the ground will help you know how to make the run to the first barrel. If the ground is deep, you want to go in there fast and keep your turns as tight as possible. If you are concerned because the ground is somewhat hard, then plan to keep your horse square and collected.

How you send your horse from the alley has a lot to do with knowing your horse and how they feel that day. Orange Smash was a horse that I really had to wake up and get his blood pumping prior to a run. As a big horse, he needed his momentum to be up so I would start him early in the alley. CeBe always ran his hardest to the first so I would bring him further up the alley before he took off to conserve his energy. Study your horse to see how he needs to come down the alley.

Since I was so consistent with my slow work and where I rated my horses, I always had great first barrels. If I happened to be on a horse that would get by the first barrel sometimes, I would stop them and back them up in the alley before letting them go. By doing this it

helped to get rating on their mind. A big part of leaving the alley way correctly means having your horse in the correct lead for that first barrel. I like to walk a step or two, move into the trot then pick up his shoulder for the correct lead as we hit the lope before leaving the alley which helps him successfully run to his first barrel.

Do not get into a rushed state of mind the moment they call your name. If you begin to feel nervous, your horse will do the same. Many times riders squeeze with their legs and pull back with their reins in the holding pen. This confuses your horse and can start causing alley troubles. Learn how to relax your entire body and mind picturing your perfect run as you are waiting for your turn.

If your horse has developed bad habits in the alley, one of the first things I think of is stomach issues. Proper nutrition is vital to your equine partner and I've always fed Purina. Outlast can be added as a supplement or a pre race snack to help with digestion. When I was going to different rodeos, I did everything I could to keep my horse's stomach happy. I would keep hay in front of him all the time in the trailer and I even split my grain up into 3 smaller feedings to make it easier to digest and help keep his energy level stable. Stomach upset doesn't always mean you have full blown ulcers. Stomach acid can slosh around and irritate the stomach in your warm up prior to a run so it's always important to provide some stomach soothing paste like Gastro-Plex by MVP prior to a run. If you have ruled out stomach issues and you are still having trouble then it's time to go to the vet. It's always important to resolve the problem quickly before bad habits are developed.

The alleyway is a vital part of your run. How you position your horse as you enter the arena, sets up your entire run and will help you nail that first barrel which RE Josey calls the money barrel! 🐾

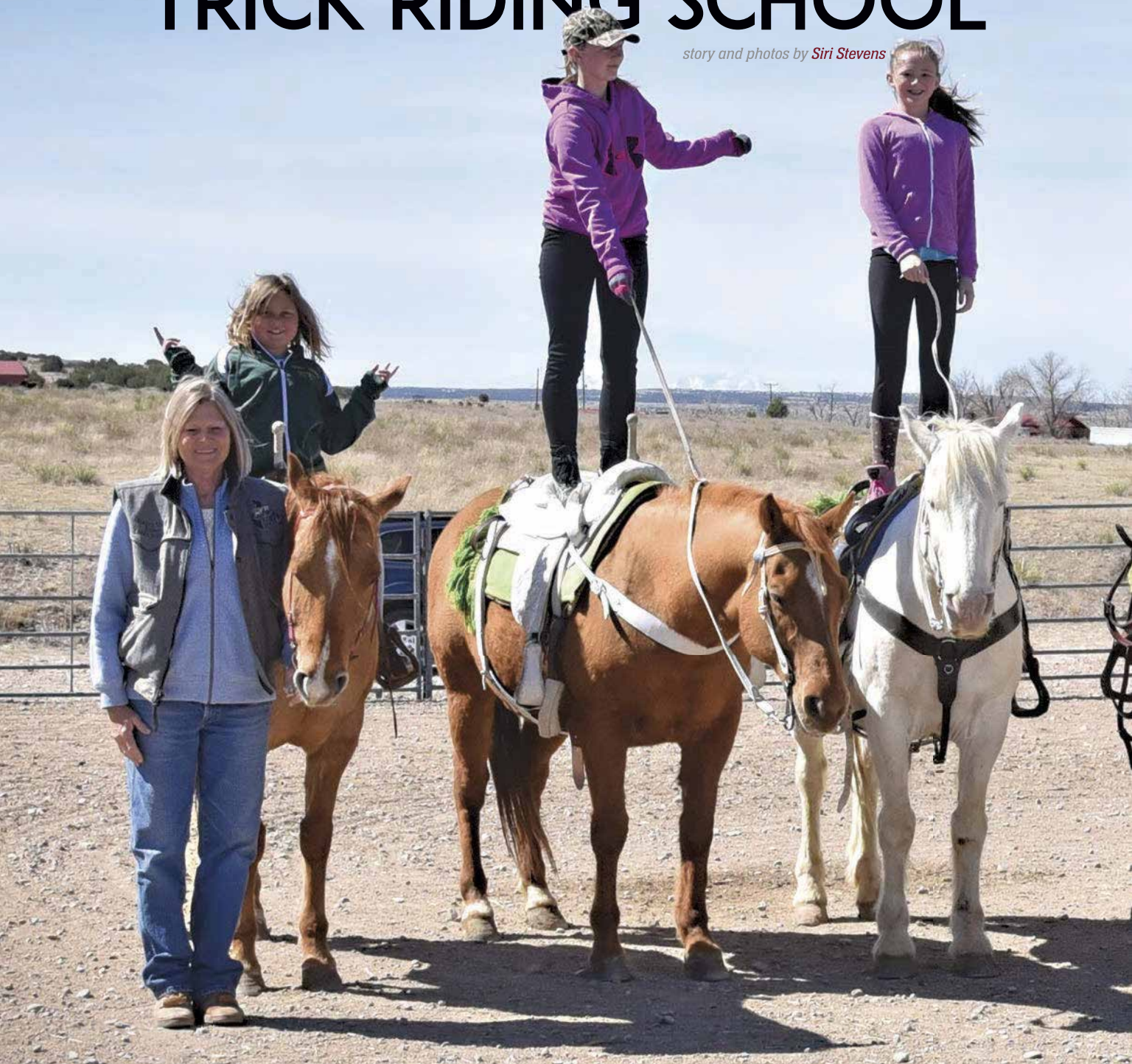

Red Top Ranch Trick Riding school celebrated its 30th years at the Vold Ranch in Avondale, Colorado, this past March. Taught by Karen Vold and Linda Scholtz, a total of 28 students attended one of the four schools. Students traveled from Alaska, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, and New York and several other states to attend the three day school.

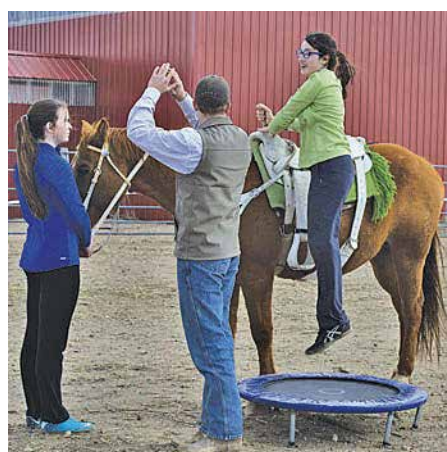
Karen learned how to trick ride when she was young, "I learned from a lady that worked for us at the riding stables. I trick rode for a living from 14 to 27, when I went to work for Harry," said Karen. "When I started going on the road, I didn't have time to do it, so I started teaching."

Linda came to work for Karen when Karen and Harry's daughter, Kirsten, was 5. She and her husband, Paul, did the church services and Linda taught Sunday school. She learned to trick ride from Karen in 1978. "I was watching Karen teach Kirsten and I'd never seen it before. I wondered what it was." Karen told her that she would teach them both. That went on for a year before Linda decided to ride professionally and she got her card in



1980. She and Paul took off for 27 years, part of the All American Trick Riders (Vickie Tyer and Lori Orman). "I fell in love with it," said Linda. She and Paul continued their ministry at rodeos all over the country.

Linda rode with the All American Trick Riders for 14 years, and during that time someone wanted a lesson. "We started with one lesson in 1987. After that it started rolling along. It started with one weekend," said Linda. "When we became an official school, we did them for a week. We coordinated it with the local spring break. We advertised a little and it snowballed from there."

cleaning the tack." She works so she could buy a trick riding saddle.

Many of the staff were former students; one from Scotland, who came as a student, is still coming over once a year to rekindle friendships and teach the next generation. Lorna Campbell, from Trinty Gask in Scotland, came ten years ago. "I used to do vaulting and I was too old, and I'd seen it and it looked fun. I ended up getting a couple horses at home and continued." She shows her talents at Agricultural shows and Highland games. Unfortunately rodeo is illegal in Scotland, so she isn't able to trick ride at those

events." Now the clinical trial monitor takes almost a month off to come over and visit and help train the next generation of trick riders. One of her trick riding friends, Mellissa Pfaff, from Broomfield, Colorado, started coming to the class when she was 15.

The school is open to anyone seven years old and up and any level of experience. "We've had students as old

Oas 48,” said Linda. “In the past, we’ve had several mothers who gave it a try.”

“It’s harder than it looks,” said Karen. “But by the end of every school, everyone has mastered at least one trick. “We have people from Wisconsin who say this is the best vacation we had as a family.”

Bob Brenner, from Pikes Peak Saddlery, comes one day during the school to help with straps and whatever the students need for the saddles, which belong to Karen and Linda. Linda brought all the horses.

The staff consists of Aaron and Isaac Johnson—brothers. Mellissa and her sister, Mimi, and Lorna, Cory Young, Aaron and Isaac’s mother, Debbie, is one of the cooks, along with Karen’s lifelong friends, Bobbie Fritz. Gail Shivelry also helps in the kitchen along with Cindy Robinson.

“We started this in the first place so the art wouldn’t die, and we’re still doing it,” said Karen. “We have really and truly a fabulous staff and they come back every year. I don’t know why they keep coming. Cory finds ways to share the Word through the avenue of trick riding. “We always have a church service at the last day of the school - It’s shocking when you see students that you had and they introduce you to their kids. It’s hard to imagine it’s been that many years.” 📺

HISTORY OF TRICK AND FANCY RIDING

Trick Riding School

Trick riding, in the 1920s, began as a standard and very popular contest event. In the formative years of the rodeo/wild west show era, women competed along with the men in all events. These events included trick riding, trick roping, and roman riding. Trick riding, which demanded calm, steady, quieted horses and daring acrobatic contestants, was adapted largely from the stunts of Russian Cossack performers in

early Wild West Shows. Trick riding originated as battle technique - many of the tricks were used as a weapon for the Russian Cossacks who adopted it from the people of Caucasus and called it dzhigitovka. Cossacks were nearly unconquerable because they could easily hide from their enemies.

As the riding and roping events became more specialized and women's barrel racing became a standard event, many of those cowboys competing in several events claimed that the bucking horse and bull riding and the roping events were much less physically demanding than the trick riding event. Most of the die-hard trick riders wanted to continue to compete in the trick riding as well as compete in the other events. These competitions required athletes with skills beyond those of normal rodeo cowboys.

These early trick riders found that their time was divided between rodeo competition, circus performances, and Wild West shows. Many such as Yakima Canute and Ken Maynard, did stunt riding for movies, when the rodeo season was over.

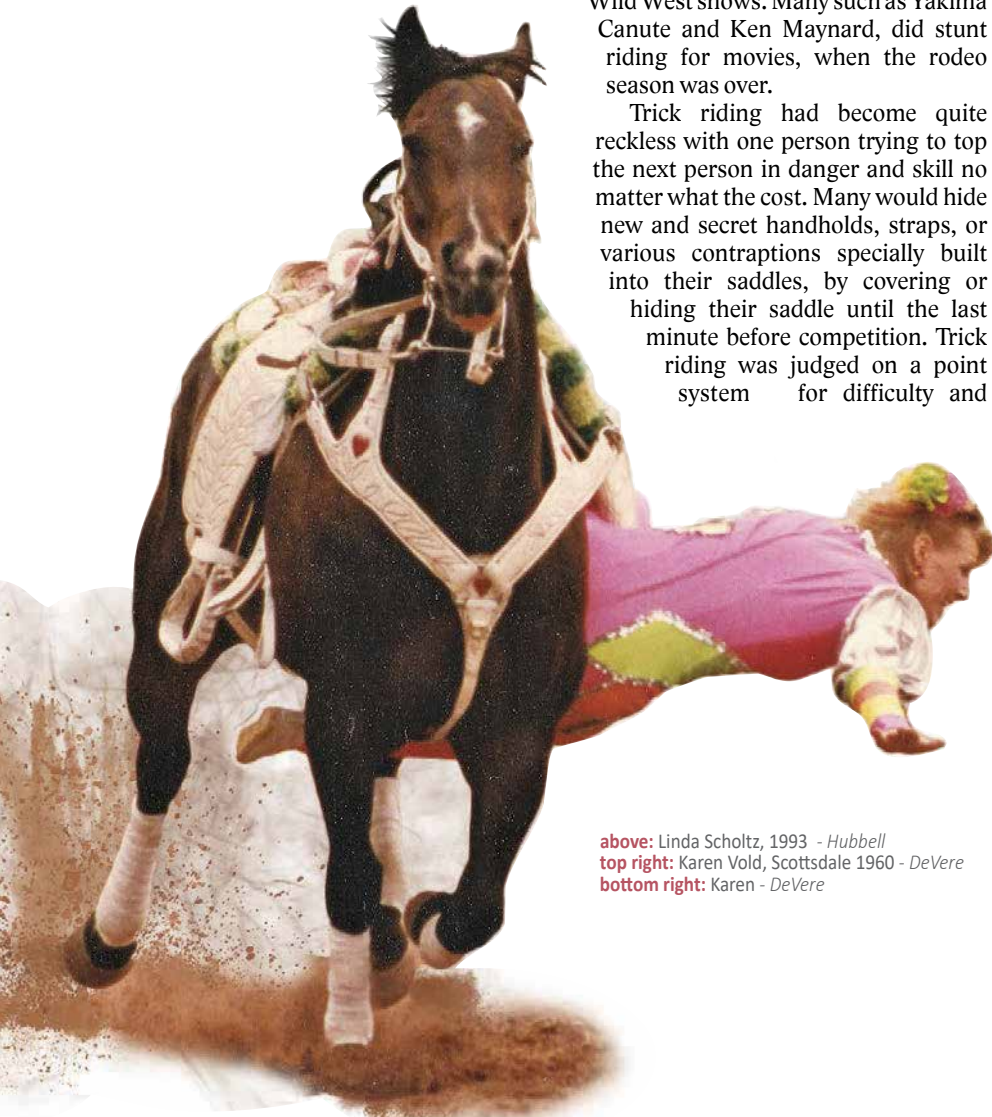
Trick riding had become quite reckless with one person trying to top the next person in danger and skill no matter what the cost. Many would hide new and secret handholds, straps, or various contraptions specially built into their saddles, by covering or hiding their saddle until the last minute before competition. Trick riding was judged on a point system for difficulty and

danger. The tricks ranged from 10 point tricks such as spinning around the saddle or standing on the side, to 90 point tricks such as going under the belly of the horse from between the hind legs, or the headstand on the saddle horn.



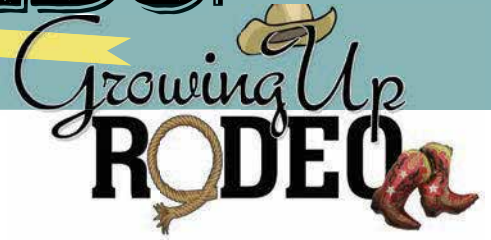
By 1929, with the death of Bonnie McCarroll from the result of injuries in a bucking horses contest at Pendleton, Oregon, and the onset of the Depression and the stock market crash, the competition for the cowgirls alongside the men in all events ended. After 1933 trick riding, trick roping, and roman riding started becoming contract entertainment and gradually lost their popularity and place of competition in the sport of rodeo.

Trick riding today has evolved much as the sport of ice skating or gymnastics - much more attention is given to poise, grace, balance, and control, with an emphasis on the safety of both horse and rider. Most rodeo athletes describe trick riding as "gymnastics or ballet on horseback." The main idea is to make the most difficult tricks look effortless and precise. 🏇

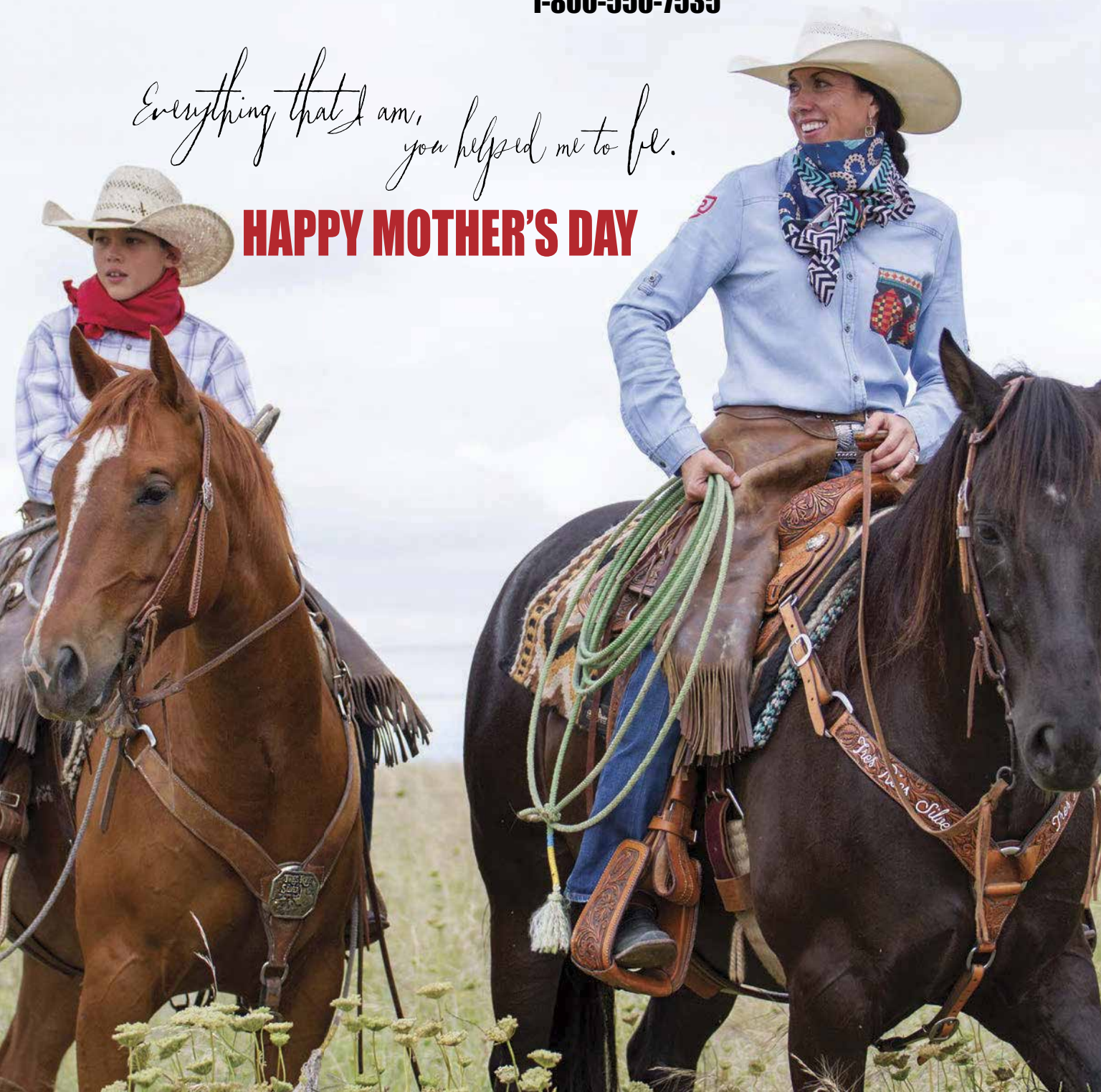

Each day, Wendy Suhn, works to keep her roles as wife, mother, and barrel racer in balance. When she does get time to herself, you'll find Wendy Suhn working with her horses and preparing for the next race. Sometimes just getting to the races is a victory. She is married to Todd Suhn and they have 2 children, Slate (10) and Zoey (7). They split their time between their residences in Weatherford, TX and Hermosa, SD. She raises, trains, and runs her own horses for barrel racing competition at the futurities, jackpots and rodeos.

Currently she is running two horses by A Streak of Fling and has an estimated \$50k in earnings between them. "She B Astreakin aka 'Sheba' (A Streak of Fling x Wild Fast Bar Girl) is out of a mare that I



used to run barrels on. When we decided to breed her, I was still running her so we wanted to do an embryo transfer. We tried to flush an embryo but when it was implanted in the 'recip', we were told that it didn't take. I continued to run my mare until around March and I took her to the vet because I wanted to rebreed her to A Streak of Fling in the spring and I jokingly remarked about the fact that she looked bred already. It turns out, she was bred and had her baby (She B Astreakin) in May! 'Sheba' was my 'mistake' baby and

it turns out she was the only foal we got out of that mare, so she will probably never leave the place. She has a lot of grit and try like all the 'Streakers' have. 'Sheba' has her own opinions and strong personality and when you ride her outside, it's one hand on the horn with her because every now and then she'll jump in the air and spin around. She is all of 14.2 and I joke that she is as wide as she is tall but she's a catty little thing and loves to run on harder ground. Right now, at twelve years old, she is running as good as ever!"

"We bought HLH Streakin A Fling aka 'Redbeer' (A Streak of Fling x Tinys Gay Jet) as a yearling and he is 9 years old now. He has had to overcome some injuries including most recently, a medial collateral tear on a front leg but since he is so tough, his injury wasn't easy to determine initially. He runs best in deeper ground and is a bigger, powerful type horse. He has a stiffer style of turning and doesn't like his face pulled on. We also own his full brother who I am excited to start running."

"I think the 'Streakers' have heart, grit and try and they have the ability to do anything. I'm thinking about getting my WPRA card again this year and hauling both of my horses." 🐾

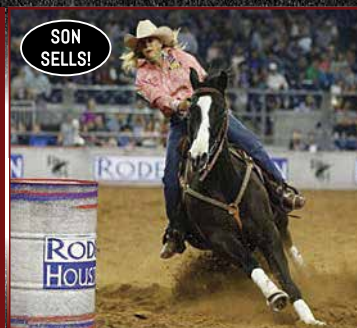

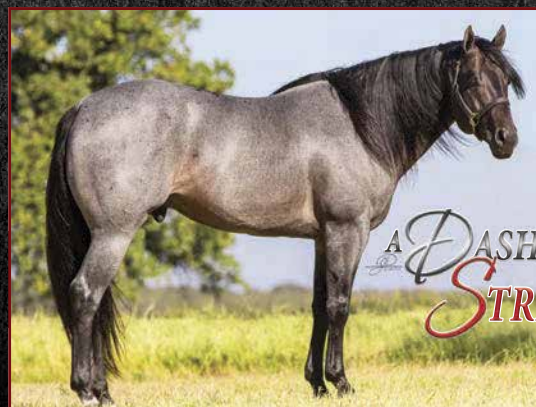

Back When They Bucked with
ROLLIE GIBBS

Rollie Gibbs has played several different roles in the sport he loves. He was a bull rider and bulldogger, competing for thirty-plus years, served as chairman of the Helldorado Days Rodeo in Las Vegas, president of the Wilderness Circuit, president and advisor for the Nevada High School Rodeo Association, and chairman of the Old Timers Reunion.

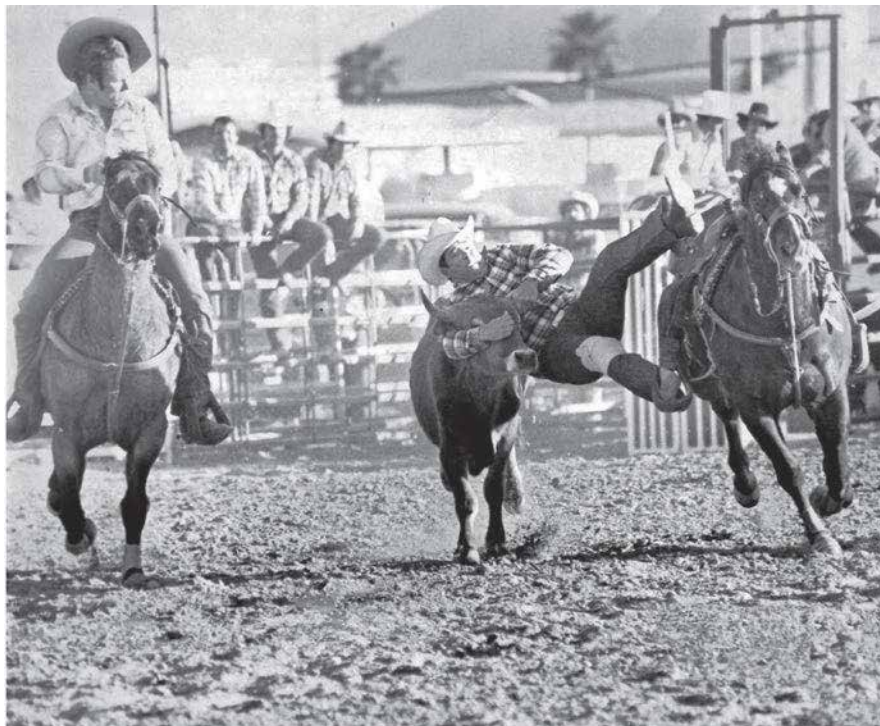
It all started in 1935, when he was born in Las Vegas, the younger son of Bert and Cecilia Gibbs, on the old Miller Ranch, which is now Sunset Park on Eastern and Sunset Roads, back when Fremont Street was gravel.

He was a year old when he was in the Helldorado Days Parade, in the back of a little cart while his older brother Delbert drove the

cart with a pair of goats. When he was a kid, he and his brother would ride their horses to Bonanza and Second Streets, where they would watch the rodeo and the horse races.

In high school, he rodeoed, riding bulls. One Monday morning, he was up in slack and had to cut school to ride. His parents did not approve of his rodeo; they didn’t want him to get hurt and they did not know that he competed. That evening, he was working with his dad in the front yard, when his dad said, “I hear you can ride bulls.” Father Kenny, from the local parish, had seen Rollie ride and reported it to his dad. The cat was out of the bag.

After graduating from Las Vegas High School in 1954, Rollie went pro. For a while, he didn’t have to buy his Rodeo Cowboys Association card; Chuck Shepard, a judge, would waive the fee for

him at the rodeos Chuck was at. One time, in Salt Lake City, June Ivory cornered Rollie, telling him Shepard wouldn't be there, so he'd have to buy his card.

In his high school days, Gibbs rode bulls. It wasn't till '55 that he started steer wrestling, and he won the first rodeo he entered. Wide World of Sports was televising that event, and "I was twenty feet tall and bullet proof," Rollie laughed. He competed at rodeos from Cheyenne, Wyo., to Denver, Salt Lake City, Ogden, Spanish Forks, Prescott, Phoenix, Scottsdale, and more. And when steer wrestling greats like Willard and Benny Combs hazed for him, he was on top of the world. "I thought, man, I was King Kong."

He competed, on and off, for 36 years, and won his hometown rodeo, Helldorado Days, in 1977. A year later, he was asked to be the chairman for the rodeo. Rollie also served three years as chairman of the Helldorado Rodeo Queen pageant. During his year at the helm of Helldorado Days, he had a midnight performance for the workers on the graveyard shift.

Gibbs served as president of the Wilderness Circuit from 1979 to 1982, and helped with the Nevada High School Rodeo Association as an advisor and as president. He worked to bring the high school state finals to Las Vegas. The first

time, it was hosted at the Star Dust arena. But when the arena was turned into an RV park, there was no other outdoor facility in Vegas to host it. Rollie went to the county commissioners and worked with them to build Horseman's Park. Gibbs, in his ingenuity, used local supplies: drill stem pipe from the Nevada Test Site (now the Nevada National Security Site) for posts, left-over lights from the airport, and

more. The high school finals was televised for several years by the PBS station, and Rollie secured a Las Vegas High School alumnus; Pam Martin Minick, to serve as commentator. Supporting youth was a big part of his life, whether it was in rodeo or through high school scholarships.

During this time, Rollie had been working for a crane company, with an understanding boss who allowed him to rodeo. When the company passed to the son, he decided to form his own company: the Rollie Gibbs Crane Service. After 26 years

with the first company, he took many of his customers with him. He worked on many familiar buildings in town: Caesar's Palace, the Mirage, the Riviera, the Stardust, at the Nevada Test Site, and more. His skills and dependability were in high demand; when Rollie did a job, it got done quickly and it got done well. "I was working seven days a week, around the clock," he said.

An example of his hard work was the Landmark Tower. The tallest structure in Las Vegas when it was begun, he and his crew built 26 concrete floors in eleven days, pouring a foot an hour.

As owner of Rollie Gibbs Crane Service, he donated much of his time to charities, helping build the Ronald McDonald House, a Salvation Army warehouse, and more. He's volunteered his time with Habitat for Humanity, and served as Cub Scout leader, receiving the Meritorious Service Award.

Rollie worked as a pickup man for Cotton Rosser and Flying U Rodeo, and served as a judge as well, judging rodeos

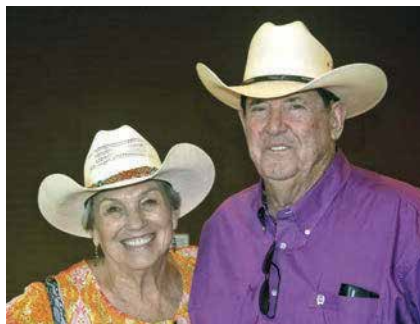
from the 1960s into the '80s. He was on the board of the Miss Rodeo Nevada organization, produced a Little Britches Rodeo in Overton, Nev., and a high school rodeo in Pahrump, Nev.

Since 2008, he's been president of the Las Vegas High School Alumni Association, and with his guidance, the association has paid out nearly \$100,000 in scholarships for high school youth.

Rollie is currently on the board of directors for the Original Cowboy Reunion, begun by Buster and June Ivory and Liz Kessler. The group meets every year in Las Vegas during the National Finals Rodeo.

He built his own home in the early 1980s in a prestigious part of town, Section 10. He and his wife host parties and events at their home, weddings, memorials, Rollie's high school reunion, church gatherings, and, each year, their rodeo friends when they are in town for the Cowboy Reunion.

A few years ago, he ran into a classmate from high school. Naomi Lytle had



been a Helldorado Rodeo Queen, but after marriage, had moved out of town. Her husband died, and when she visited Las Vegas, they reacquainted and got married five years ago. "She dearly loves the same things I do," Rollie said. Together, they're spending their retirement days traveling the world, visiting Ireland, Scotland and England; Alaska, the Caribbean, Montreal, and more.

Rollie has had tickets to the NFR since it moved to Vegas in 1985. Four seats in the fourth row belong to him, and he goes to all ten performances. He also loves to visit the Gold Card Room, where the PRCA's gold card members visit.

Looking back on his life, he recalls the good days. "I can't say I've had a bad part of my life," he said. "I've lived in the best of times." And at the age of 82, he's not done. "I'm not dead yet. I've got plenty of other things to do." 🐾

Meet the Member L.J. & J.C. Yeahquo

L.J. and J.C. Yeahquo are almost precisely one year apart — 361 days to be exact — but they might as well be twins. Their full names are Luke Jarrett and Jeremiah Cole but L.J. and J.C. rolls off the tongue faster than they can rope a steer, which gets faster every year. They rope together everywhere, from winning the team roping at the Cavalcade Rodeo in Pawhuska, Oklahoma, last year, to competing in the NLBRA and the OHSRA. They also enter WSTR and USTRC ropings, roped at the 2017 Junior NFR, and most recently, The Patriot. “That was one for the books for sure!” says J.C., the younger of the two at 17. “We got fourth in the average in the #12 championships.”

The brothers, who hail from Crescent, Oklahoma, are carrying on their family’s rodeo tradition along with their oldest brother, Jessy. They also have an older sister, Sierra. “I look up to my dad, Luke Yeahquo,” says L.J. “He’s taught us everything we know, and on my mom, Jennifer’s, side of the family, everybody kind of rodeos.” Two of L.J. and J.C.’s uncles are also in the National Cowboy Hall of Fame — Pete Fredericks and Joe Chase. “I live and breathe team roping,” says L.J., the heeler, who also competes in tie-down roping and ribbon roping. “It’s what I’ve worked at pretty much every day since I was a little kid.” Likewise, team roping is J.C.’s favorite since he gets to rope with his brother, and he too competes in tie-down and ribbon roping. He shook up the family’s roping trend by entering the steer wrestling this year. The brothers joined the NLBRA when they heard the finals were moving to Guthrie, Oklahoma — just 30 minutes from home — and qualified in all their events the past two years.

J.C. and L.J. practice daily, using a

study hall hour to tackle homework at school so they have more time to ride. “Our teachers are real lenient with us. They know how hard we work at rodeo, so if they know we don’t have anything going in school, they’ll let us leave so we can go home and practice.” J.C. also works on a ranch nearby, working cattle and riding colts. He trained his head horse, Hank, and he and L.J. share a calf horse, Little Man. Both brothers had horse troubles just before the Junior NFR when L.J.’s main horse, Fuzzy, injured his stifle, and J.C.’s horse got sick. L.J. rode Little Man, and J.C. borrowed Jessy’s horse, Joe Money. Like his brother, L.J. trained one of his horses, Little Gray, whom he’s ridden at several NLBRA rodeos and hopes to turn into an all-around horse since his best horse passed away in February.

Both brothers are juniors at Crescent High School and agree that math is their favorite subject. They were homeschooled for several years, but decided to return to

public school this year. “Most of the time we have the same classes — I’m sure the teachers don’t like that some days,” J.C. jokes. “We have a really good math teacher this year, and math makes you think a lot more than the other subjects.”

When they’re not roping with each other, the brothers rope with their family, holding contests in the front yard. Their brother Jessy enters USTRC jackpots with them, and their dad also team ropes. L.J. and J.C. occasionally trade their ropes for pool cues and play pool with their neighbor, and family time also includes going to church.

Following graduation next year, J.C. and L.J. plan to college rodeo together. They’re considering Tarleton State University, and hope to share a house and an arena. “One of my biggest goals since I was in middle school is to be a 9 heeler by the time I graduate. I’m currently a 7-plus,” says L.J. J.C. adds, “I want to make the Junior Ironman next year and The American, and I’d like to be an NFR cowboy and win the world. L.J.’s been holding off for me so when I turn 18, I can get my permit and we can start hauling to pro rodeos. It’s an awesome feeling to go out there and win with my brother.”

She continues to be active in her community through working in the world of water policy as the Outreach Specialist for the Rio Grande Basin Roundtable. Helen is also a Committee Member for the San Luis Valley Ski Hi Stampede (Colorado's Oldest Pro Rodeo held in Monte Vista, CO) as well as an intern for the office of US Senator Cory Gardner. She also still competes in barrels when she gets an opportunity. Rodeo and the western way of life will always

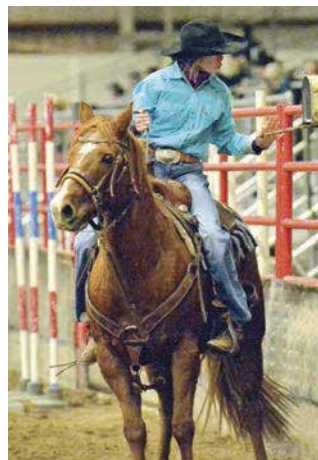

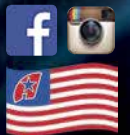

2018-19 Rule Change

- Page 75, Section C, 5a- delete out the statement that no wraps are permitted in the Jr. Boys Bull Riding.
- Page 27, Section 2a- Add line 7 - The same person cannot serve in the capacity of announcer and timer.
- Page 41, Section 7, Para B- Add- All chain, metal and wire headstalls, nose bands, tie downs and bosals must be completely covered where it comes in contact with the horse's skin. Any inhumane equipment used by a contestant as deemed by a rodeo official will result in disqualification for the contestant. If a mounted helper is used

in an event he/she must be in compliance with subject rule or it will result in a no time to the contestant. A fine will be assessed to working personnel/ stock contractor in the amount of \$25 per incident for violation of this rule.

- Page 82, Section C, Para 4- Crossfire- if the heeler throws his loop prior to the steer completing the initial switch, (which is when the steer makes any move from straight to being towed or in tow to the left as defined by PRCA); the team should be flagged out by field judge.

- Page 16, Section 10A – In the case a Board Member resigns or cannot perform duties, or is removed from the board, the first Alternate will be appointed by the President to the remaining

portion of the term. If this is required again during the same year the next Alternate should have received at least 20% of the votes voted. If not, that position should be appointed by the board.

- Page 39 Article II, Section 17, Para B- Rule Change- Every new franchise is required to submit an application for membership at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the rodeo. Renewal rodeo franchises must submit their rodeo dates (30) thirty days or more in advance to the National Office for approval. Secretaries are responsible for creating their rodeos on the website at least (30) thirty days before entries close.

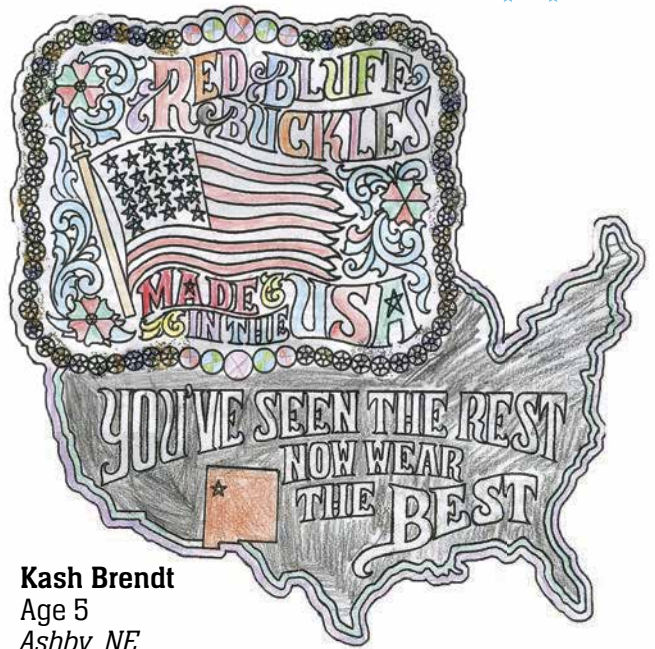

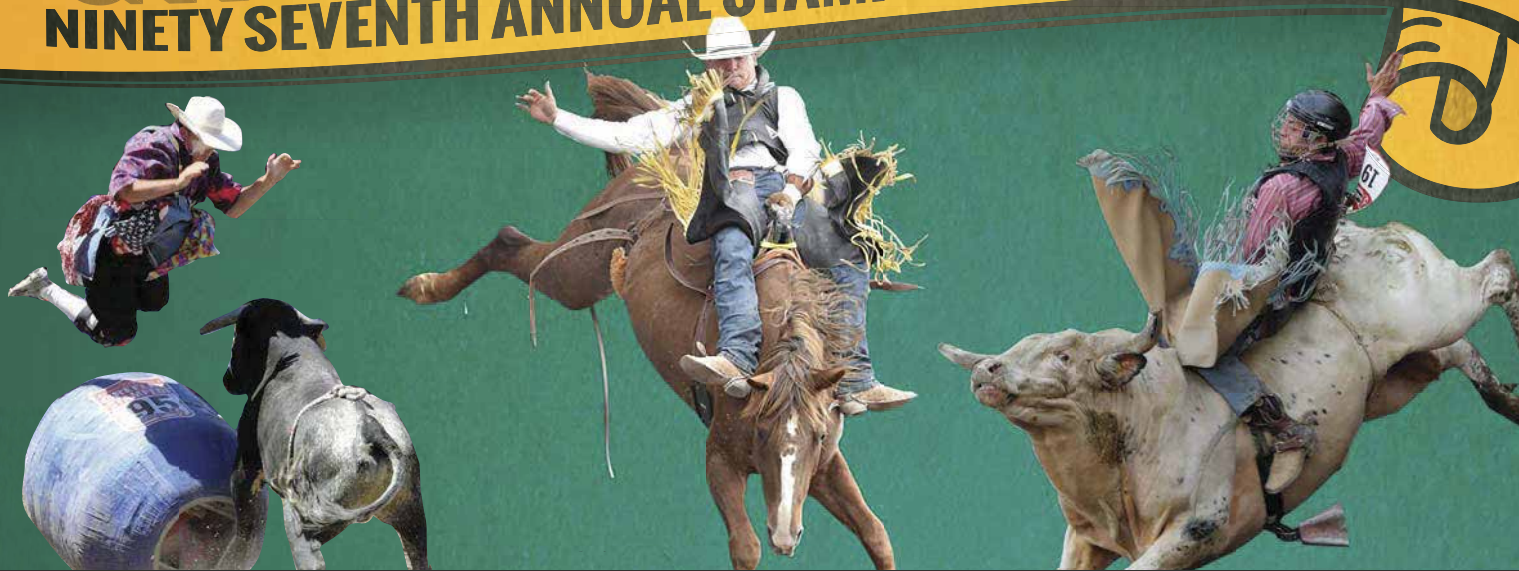

Meet the Member Leo Veatch

“I just really enjoy that I get to ride and rope, and shoot now, and I get to be around kids doing the same things as me,” says 13-year-old Leo Veatch. The cowboy hails from Agate, Colorado, and is competing in the CJHSRA for the second season. Leo, a third-generation rodeo competitor, has always loved to rope and ride, and when he learned that the CJHSRA had rifle shooting, he was quick to join the association in the fall of 2016. He qualified for the NJHFR in the rifle shooting and finished just a few places outside of the top 20 last summer. “I really enjoyed the competition and the shooting range, and the dances,” says Leo. He enters the 50 meter and shoots from three positions—prone, standing, and kneeling—while the Veatch family’s indoor barn does double duty as an arena and a shooting range. “We put a round bale in the heading box and we shoot from the other end of the arena,” explains Leo, who uses a .22 CZ 452 rifle. “It’s really accurate, and I practice as much as I can. I also joined the junior program of the National Training Center Shooting Club at the Olympic Training Center, which we just started doing this winter. I go down there (to Colorado Springs) twice a week to practice.”

Leo is leading the rifle shoot in the CJHSRA, and sitting in the top ten in breakaway roping and goat tying, while he also team ropes with header Harley Baas. The junior high rodeo in Cortez, Colorado, is a favorite since he won the rifle shoot there last fall with a score of 300, the highest score of the weekend in both the junior high and high school shooting divisions. When he’s not practicing his shooting, Leo ropes several nights a week with his parents, Casey and Carrie Veatch, who both rodeoed for Colorado in their teens and continue to compete.



Leo’s 8-year-old sister, Dot, does goat tying at gymkhanas and enjoys shooting as well, a family tradition started by their grandpa Dale Purdy. “I look up to my mom and my dad and my whole family,” says Leo. “They help me practice and support me through all this, and haul me to all these rodeos. It’s just really inspirational.”

The Veatches live on a cattle ranch, where Leo helps his grandpa with his cow/calf operation. “Right now we’re pulling calves and calving, and we haul hay and check cattle and brand.” Leo enjoys riding on the ranch, along with practicing on his 18-year-old breakaway and goat tying horse, Nay Nay, and his 18-year-old heel horse, Babe. “We’re out in the country quite a ways, and I can hunt and shoot and rodeo. I really like it.” Duck and goose hunting are part of Leo’s love of the rural lifestyle, and he says the game is best cooked wrapped in bacon and cream cheese.

It’s a 25-minute drive to Limon Middle School, where Leo is a seventh-grade stu-

dent. He works hard to maintain his 4.0 GPA, and especially enjoys history and math. “I like United States history, but this year we’re doing world history. In math, we’re doing different angles and shapes for geometry.” Leo also played basketball this winter, and he loves competing on the school’s seventh grade Knowledge Bowl team, which competes against other teams in the state through rounds of written and oral questions on a variety of topics.

Along with rodeo and school, Leo is passionate about church and hopes to be a pastor someday. He acolytes at his church, lighting the candles on the altar, and enjoys taking part in Cowboy Church during rodeo season. “I’d like to get back to the Junior High Nationals because that was really fun last year,” he finishes, “and I’d like to get in the top 20 of rifle shoot.”

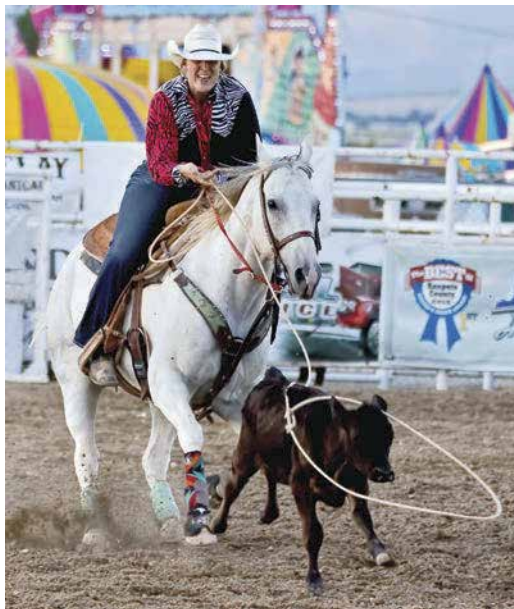
Meet the Member Kinzie Robins

Rodeo has taken Kinzie Robins to the four corners of the sport. From backing into the roping box, to covering the CNFR and WNFR, and most recently, entering the world of entertainment as a rodeo clown, the 26-year-old from Cedar City, Utah, wants to experience it all.

"I've been rodeoing ever since I could walk," says Kinzie. "My family owns a livestock auction, so I've always been around cattle." With a rodeo background that includes her grandpa being one of the first tie-down ropers in Utah to dismount from the right, Kinzie started out competing in 4-H and rodeo queen contests. Other sports, such as basketball, held most of her interest through junior high and high school, but after a year of playing college basketball for Southern Utah University, Kinzie decided to switch to the college rodeo team. "It was a whole different world, going from rodeoing every once in a while to doing it every day," says Kinzie, who joined the RMPRA in 2013. "My performance alone went through the roof. I felt like it helped me with my schooling in college to have my horses and have that relief—it helped my academics."

Kinzie competed primarily in breakaway roping in college, along with some barrel racing and team roping, and graduated from SUU with her master's degree in broadcasting. "When I was a senior in college, I got an internship at the College Finals (Rodeo) with Susan Kanode, and I loved it. The first year I worked the NFR, one of my professors at SUU was doing a documentary on the Wright brothers, and we did that the year Spencer won." Kinzie also had the opportunity to intern with Wrangler Network for two years, where she helped produce the Wrangler NFR Countdown Show hosted by Jennifer and Stran Smith.

While she hopes to return to the media side of the WNFR and rodeo in general, Kinzie presently works at a residential treatment center for teenage girls doing equine therapy. She's working on a piece about the center for Wrangler Network, capturing the very things she loves about her work. "The girls raise dairy calves, and they spend two hours with the horses once a week for therapy. Growing up with horses and animals, you think you know them until you get them in a setting with girls with traumatic pasts. They're just in awe. It almost will leave you speechless what those horses can bring out in the girls."

Kinzie's coworker is Lee Bingham, a CNFR goat tying champion and a team roper, while Kinzie hauls to rodeos with fellow RMPRA ropers Megan Burbidge, Codi McPherson, and her roping partner, Jessie Brinkerhoff. "I'm definitely a team roper at heart, but I compete in breakaway more. I like the partner aspect of team roping, and knowing that I can trust somebody enough to enter with them and trust that we will do well together." Kinzie also ropes with her

younger brother Colton. They have two older sisters, and their parents, Scott and Diane Robins, are their biggest supporters. "We still call my grandpa Gary Robins when we rodeo anywhere, because he's always wondering how we're doing, and my dad's been a big part of my rodeo career and always put us on really good horses."

Kinzie's horse Dino is a retired racehorse who recovered from a slab fracture in his knee to become her head horse, while Toby is her other mount in the team roping, and eventually, breakaway roping. She breakaway ropes off Rambo, who is also one of the family's best ranch horses. Kinzie clerks at her family's livestock auction, 'R' Livestock Connection, in Elsinore, Utah, and she also wants to attend auctioneer school in the future. Her latest venture, however, is working as a rodeo clown. She's putting acts together and plans to work several local rodeos this summer, along with making a run at the RMPRA finals. "Last summer was the first time I actually made a run at it," she finishes, "and it's definitely what I'm going for this year." 🐾

Meet the Member Sam Carson

Sam Carson does a sport he doesn't enjoy because he knows it makes him better.

The Utah High School Rodeo Association member, a resident of Lindon, Utah, loves steer wrestling, tie-down roping and team roping. But he participates in wrestling in the off season, to stay in shape.

He's a big boy, standing 6'4" and weighing in at 220 lbs., which puts him in the heavyweight class when it comes to wrestling competition, and sometimes matches him up against wrestlers who are thirty, forty or even fifty pounds heavier than him.

"Honestly," he said, "I do not like wrestling. The reason I do it is to stay in shape for rodeo." There are some definite benefits to the sport, he believes. "One thing about wrestling that I feel I can't get anywhere else is it teaches you to be mentally tough. It makes you have self-control and to keep going when things get hard. Because wrestling is hard, especially when you're tired. It's an intense sport."

The eighteen-year-old cowboy comes from a long line of bulldoggers in the family. His horse is a sixteen hand sorrel named Cougar who was a former heading horse but got sour in the box. Sam switched him to bulldogging and he took to it naturally. "He's been one of the best horses I've ever had." In the tie-down roping, he rides a fifteen-year-old sorrel named Bud, and when he heels, he rides another sorrel named Ariel.

Sam is a senior at Pleasant Grove High School, where the best part of the day is diesel class. It's a college credit class, where students work on semi-trucks and

heavy equipment.

His hobby is collecting and restoring old trucks. He has two 1970 C10 Chevies, one which is two wheel drive and the other is four wheel drive. He likes to drive them around. He also likes to trap coons with his hound dogs. The family lives near Utah Lake, in an area that has a lot of open water and wetlands.

He's rodeoed since he was young, but last year, when he practiced with Hayden and Caleb Andersen, he thinks his steer wrestling improved. The Andersens, who are twins and juniors in high school, live in Wasatch and came to Sam's house to improve their bulldogging. The three practiced together, and Sam's skills got better as well. "Now we're pretty good competition," he said. "They win some, I win some, and we still stay friends. One thing I like about the steer wrestling is everyone's friends. It's a close community. We cheer for each other, we push each other's steers."

Sam is currently number one in the state high school standings, and has competed at state finals three times, always in the

bulldogging. Last year, he finished fifth and won Silver State, which is one of his favorite rodeos. "It's a blast. Everyone's not so serious, and there are a lot of fun activities they plan for us." His favorite rodeos are the Dixie Six, in November in St. George.

After high school, Sam will spend two years on his LDS mission, then hopes to compete in college rodeo. He's had rodeo scholarship offers from several places.

He has five older siblings: Benjamin, Marcia, Aimee, John, and Hannah, and is the son of Todd and Melissa Carson. 📧

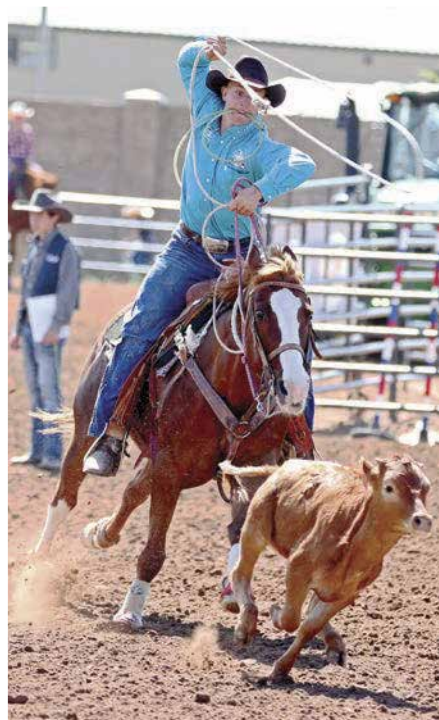


USA and is on high honor roll with a 4.0 grade point average.

BIG PICTURE LISTENING

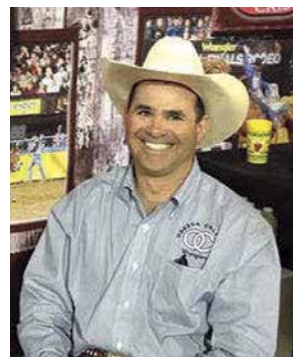

One of the most important qualities of a great athlete is the ability to listen. It is a very difficult skill to learn, but one of the most important if you want to be able to improve. You need to be able to listen to your coaches, your peers, judges and many others to be successful.

Here are some problems I see with young athletes when it comes to listening.

First, listening to reply, not to learn or improve from what they are being told. The only reason they hear what you are saying is so that they can reply. When you listen simply to reply your comprehension of the message plummets, simply put you do not hear what is being said. When you are listening to reply you do not hear what is being said because you are thinking about your reply. You are thinking of the justification for your actions or you are just thinking of an excuse. Listen to hear the message.

Second, being able to remove emotion. What do I mean by that? Most of the time when you have a good performance you get plenty of praise and it is easy to listen to how good you are. Where it becomes difficult is when you don't do well, when things don't go your way. Most of the time you will be upset after a poor performance or practice and many times this is when your coach will be there to help you. This is the time when it is important to remove emotion. You might be upset, angry or disappointed, but you need to be able to hear the message your coach has for you in these circumstances if

you don't want to repeat the performance.

Third, listen to get the big picture. This is the tough one for many people. Many people hear only what they want to hear. Some will hear only the positive things a coach has to say and ignore the things that they need to work on the most. Some will hear only the negative things and think their coach doesn't like them. I am pretty sure some don't hear anything. Whatever the case may be, try to listen to get the big picture. Many times young athletes only see the actions of their last run or ride, and don't understand why they are being coached a certain way. A good rule is to ask yourself why it was important enough for my coach to tell me that, and how will it make me better. If you don't understand, ask. The most important part of being a good listener is to understand the message.

Everyone has different ways of relaying messages to you. How well you are able to listen and understand the message will be very important in how you develop as an athlete. 🐾

Meet the Member Jake Stephens

For fun, Jake likes to ride Shotgun while shed hunting in the mountains. He's found some big elk antlers, some that measure into the 360s and 370s. Sometimes the family keeps them and decorates with them, sometimes they sell them. Jake also likes to help his dad with the cabin they've built.

He loves to hunt elk and deer with a bow, and got a bull elk last fall at 40 yards. On occasion, he helps local ranchers with their cattle in the summer and fall.

Jake is a good cook; he can make sloppy joes and spaghetti (sometimes with the meat from the deer and elk he's shot), and he's exceptionally good at cooking breakfast. His mom puts him on supper duty, starting the meal cooking as she's getting home from work.

An eighth grade student, Jake does his schooling online. He loves studying history, especially the 1800s when the cow-

Last year, Jake finished second in the state in the goat tying and qualified for the National Junior High Finals Rodeo, where he finished in the top 25. He enjoyed his time at Nationals, participating in the dummy ropings, goat ropings and water balloon fights.

When he grows up, he'd like to be a hunting guide and have an outfitting business.

He has an older brother, Jaden, who is

seventeen, and two younger brothers: Jett, age eleven, and JJ, who is four. 🐾

Meet the 2017 Producer of the Year Shellie Newman

The eighth-annual Western States Ranch Rodeo Association National Finals was held November 2 - November 5 at the Winnemucca Events Complex in Winnemucca, Nevada. The Western States Ranch Rodeo Association (WSRRA) continues to experience solid support in thirteen states and Canada with teams coming from as far away as Nebraska and Wyoming plus, four teams from Canada. Established in 2010, the WSRRA has experienced incredible growth, each year growing in number of events and members. The association currently has more than 700 members.

Throughout 2017, WSRRA sanctioned more than 49 open ranch rodeos, 20 women's ranch rodeos, 25 women's steer stoppings and over 100 ranch bronc riding events. The top open and women's teams from each of the ranch rodeos, the top 15 women's steer stoppers, and the top 15 ranch bronc riders competed for cash and prizes at the National Finals. Prizes included Gist buckles, Yeti coolers, custom made gear made by Ricardo's Saddlery and John Mincer, halters, stirrups, and custom made hats donated by Chaz Mitchell Hatz.

Behind the scenes of the WSRRA are the ranch rodeo and ranch bronc riding producers who sanction their events with the WSRRA. These fine folks do not go unnoticed. At the 2017 WSRRA National Finals, we recognized Idaho's Shellie Newman, of the Rexburg Ranch Rodeo, as one of our 2017 WSRRA Producers of the Year. She has been on her local ranch rodeo committee since 2002, and has produced the



Rexburg event since it started in 2010. "We wanted a night of rodeo for the county fair. I think people look forward to it."

The Rexburg Ranch Rodeo has been sanctioned with the WSRRA every year. "Sanctioning it with the WSRRA really helps draw cowboys who are trying to get qualified for the national finals." Doctoring, branding, team roping, trailer loading and steer tying are the main events for her ranch rodeos. "We sometimes have ranch bronc riding and sorting, too," Shellie adds. "Running a smooth ranch rodeo can be challenging at times, especially outdoors. You never really know what strange things can happen, but for the most part, our events run smooth with little to no problems. I have found that having a fantastic ground crew with the cattle is the most important. If the books are in order ahead of time and you have a crew that keeps your cattle moving, things go really smooth. We have been lucky enough to keep the same crew over the years, so they know their duties. Shaney Cheney works right alongside me at every rodeo, and I couldn't do it without her help," Shellie says.

The Rexburg Ranch Rodeo is held on a Tuesday night, which draws a good crowd and draws cowboys/cowgirls in August. "I have teams from Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, Montana and, of course, Idaho."

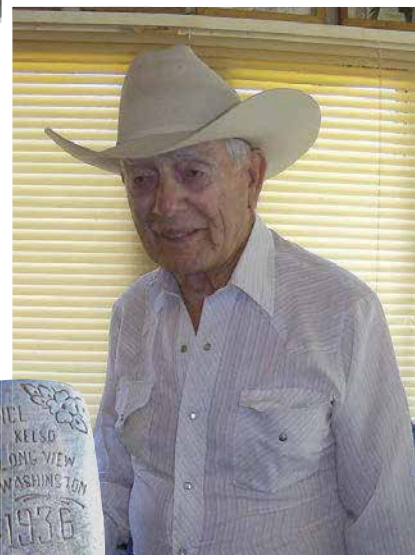


EARL "BUD" BATTEATE

Nov. 20, 1918 - Mar. 28, 2018

[Remembering Those
We Lost]

An end of an era came on March the 28th. Bud passed away following complications from the implant of a pacemaker. At 99, he still was not ready to go. He routinely complained that all his old friends from his generation had died and there was no one left but him. That was true but he had friends too numerous to count that he made over the years all over the West coast from the Mexican border into Canada. Earl was born in Oakland Calif and spent the early part of his life competing in rodeos. Bud once he said that he either won the event or was bucked off. He was considered to be one of the best until he quit the circuit to be with his family. Bud spent the early part of his youth learning his trade as a cowboy breaking horses for Harry Rowell and competing in rodeos. He then joined with his father in the cattle ranching business which merged into 'Batteate Livestock Transportation Co'. After the closing of the trucking business, Bud continued in

cattle ranching in Hayward and later in Northern California and Nevada. Earl was also the oldest living member of 'Turtles' which was the precursor to the PRCA, Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association. Bud was preceded in death by his brother Alfred, ex wife Patricia Batteate, his oldest son Dan and his wife June and grandson Daniel and great grandson Ronny. Left behind to grieve his passing are his two sons Mike and his wife Kathy, Nick and his wife Carolyn, grandchildren Gino, Vito and Dom Batteate and their families. Additional grandchildren Norman, Patty, Dennis, Cathy and Vincent and their families as well as many great grandchildren and great great grandchildren and many cousins. 🇺🇸

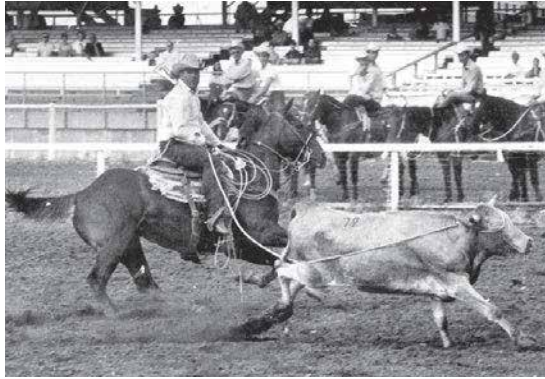

CROCK POT CHICKEN ALFREDO

INGREDIENTS:

Makes 4 servings

6 chicken breast halves sliced into 1 inch slices

¼ c chicken broth

1 c sliced fresh mushrooms

1 can cream of mushroom soup

Salt and pepper

1 16 ounce jar Alfredo sauce

2 cups broccoli florets

16 to 18 ounces mixture of spinach and plain fettuccine noodles

DIRECTIONS:

Place chicken in crockpot – sprinkle with seasonings and top with fresh mushrooms. Mix broth and soup in separate bowl then pour atop chicken and mushrooms. Cover and cook on low for 8 to 9 hours. Stir in Alfredo sauce about 30 minutes before serving. Steam broccoli and add to chicken mushroom sauce. Cook fettuccine noodles according to package directions. Serve chicken over bed of fettuccine noodles. Sometimes I cook my chicken separate – boil – then put in sauce and it doesn't take 8-9 hours. 🍴

TATER-DIPPED VEGGIES

INGREDIENTS:

Serves 6-8

1 cup instant potato flakes

1/3 cup grated parmesan cheese

2 eggs

4 to 5 cups raw bite-size vegetables (mushrooms, peppers, broccoli, cauliflower, zucchini and/or parboiled carrots)

3 medium firm bananas, sliced

2 medium navel oranges, peeled, sectioned and chopped

In a large bowl, dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Stir in the strawberries until thawed. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Transfer to a 4 quart serving bowl. Cover and refrigerate for 3-4 hours before serving. 🍴

DOUBLE CHOCOLATE BANANA MUFFINS

INGREDIENTS:

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1 cup sugar

1/4 cup baking cocoa

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. baking powder

1 1/3 cups mashed ripe bananas (about three medium)

1/3 cup canola oil

1 large egg

1 cup (6 oz.) miniature semi-sweet chocolate chips



Double Chocolate Banana Muffins

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Whisk together the first six ingredients. In a separate bowl, whisk bananas, oil and egg until blended. Add flour mixture; stir just until moistened. Fold in chocolate chips.

2. Fill greased or paper-lined muffin cups three-fourths full. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 20-25 minutes. Cool 5 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack. Serve warm.

Optional streusel topping: Combine 1/2 cup sugar, 1/3 cup all-purpose flour and 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon; cut in 1/4 cup cold butter until crumbly. Before baking, sprinkle over filled muffin cups; bake as directed. 🍴

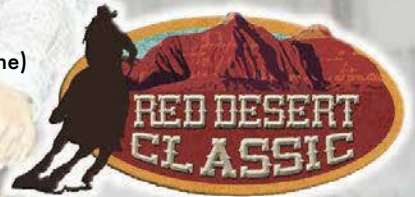

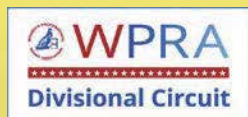

Meet the Member

Savannah Krogman

"I've competed in a lot of things, but nothing compares to rodeo," says Savannah Krogman. "It's a rollercoaster—you can be high and up on top, but next weekend you can be on the bottom again. It's just the thrill of going out there every day and knowing it can go either way, but it's up to you to be the best prepared for it. It really brings you back and shows you what life is about—even when things are not going well, you still work hard and put in practice."

The 18-year-old breakaway roper, pole bender, and barrel racer from White River, South Dakota, started her rodeo career in the NLBRA when she was 5. Following in the bootprints of her older sisters, Mariah and Alyssa, Savannah worked her way through NLBRA and junior high rodeos before joining the SDHSRA. Qualifying for the NHSFR in breakaway roping last summer was a highlight of her career, and she was awarded a scholarship for \$1,000 by the Black Hills Stock Show this winter. "That was really a good blessing for me. It's the first scholarship I've been awarded," says Savannah, who competed in the SDHSRA 20X Extreme Showcase during the stock show in breakaway roping. "Breakaway is my favorite, mostly because a good horse always helps you, but it comes down to you too, and how you compete on that day. It's a lot of self-motivation."

Savannah qualified for the 2017 SDHSRA finals in breakaway on

Roanie. "He's over 20 years old now and you wouldn't even know—he's a spitfire. I have a barrel horse, Queen, and you get those good runs you're excited about and sometimes have those setbacks, but it's all about moving forward and embracing the good ones. My pole horse is Brownie, and he's quite special to me. We raised him from a colt and both my older sisters competed on him at the high school finals. I look up to my sisters for guidance in this because they've been through it all and they're my best coaches. They try to make it to every rodeo, and when I made it to Nationals, I was pretty excited, but I think my family—my support who has really been there for me—was just as excited if not more than I was! I'm really thankful for my parents, Neil and Kathy Krogman, because rodeo wouldn't be possible without their support."

Raising horses for the family business, Louie Krogman Quarter Horses, also pulls the Krogmans together. Last September they held their 65th annual horse sale on Labor Day Weekend, originally started by Savannah's grandpa, whom the business is named after. She plays a large role in halter breaking the colts, gathering them for sale day, and leading them in the sale arena. "I'm 18 now, so I can remember colts that are now older horses and broke to ride that I've competed on. It's nice to see how well they develop from a

tiny colt that maybe was difficult to break at first, and how far they come to be a great breakaway prospect or barrel horse. I'm truly lucky that I was able to grow up in the family lifestyle I did—I wouldn't trade it for anything." Their business website is www.kquarterhorse.com

Savannah, who recently finished her high school basketball season, is also involved in Student Council and the National Honor Society, jazz choir, and FFA as the student chapter president. Following her graduation from Jones County High School in May, where she's working to be valedictorian of her class, Savannah plans to attend South Dakota State University and rodeo in the fall. "I plan on studying animal science and taking pre-vet classes, and hopefully after that, apply for vet school and study large animal. And I'm working to make it back to Nationals—that would be a great accomplishment for me this summer if the cards fall right." 🐾

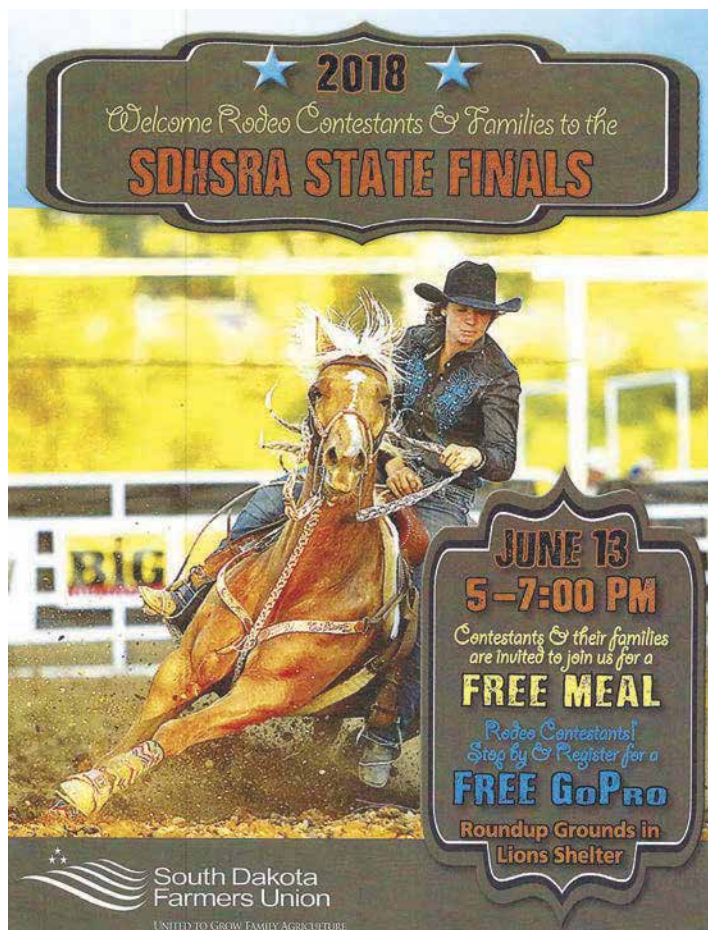

We were opening up new territory for church services at pro rodeos that previously hadn't had cowboy church in the mornings of their Sunday performances. Ray had been entering the bull riding at these rodeos for a few years and we asked the rodeo committee if we could simply have church in the stands. They gladly allowed us that privilege and little did we know that it would continue for a couple of decades.

At some of these rodeos, people would start finding their way into the grand stands an hour before each performance and this gave us an idea. I offered to sing horseback for free as entertainment for the people arriving early. We figured this would be great advertisement for Sunday morning as the announcer would advertise the church service at the end of the concert. It worked great and a service that began with 12 people grew to several hundred fairly quickly.

Problem was, after years of doing this, I began to cop an attitude over doing so much for free and never getting anything more than a rare "thank you" from the committee. After a few years I gotta say, I'd had it. My attitude sucked. I had lost sight of the reason for offering it in the first place. Some years the contract

acts would be great, but some years they were pitiful and knowing that they were getting paid a few hundred dollars for each performance and I was still doing every performance for free, it really chapped my hide.

I remember leaving that rodeo, thinking I didn't want to go back and even worse, I was actually ticked off enough to consider not doing the next rodeo that following weekend for the same reason. Thankfully, I figured I'd better keep my word and show up but my attitude was..."bless God, this was gonna be my last year to put out all this effort for free!"

I'd been saving money for my own horse, as I was singing off of horses borrowed at each rodeo and all I had saved was \$800. That wasn't going to buy the kind of horse I had pictured in my mind. Things looked depressingly hopeless. After pulling into town for the next rodeo, someone told me about a paint stallion a local family owned that was for sale. I drove out to their place and saw him. He was standing in a pen, in mud up to his knees and hocks. He was beautiful! I immediately felt he was my horse. I drove back to the rodeo grounds and tracked down his owner and asked about the horse. He began telling me how this horse had been shown in halter and had won the state title in MN. My hopes in buying him were quickly circling the toilet. He said he was priced at \$10k. Well, now my hopes weren't just circling the drain.....they were flushed entirely. The man asked what I wanted to do with him and I told him, but quickly and politely excused myself so as to go cry somewhere.

Isn't it something how a "sucky attitude" just seems to attract more "suckiness"? My miserable attitude had just descended to a brand new low. The next night, I was to do the music for a Bible study held in someone's barn. Low and behold the man who owned the stallion came walking in along with his wife. He approached me and proceeded to give me a framed picture of the horse when he won the MN title. He then began telling me that he had always felt this horse was destined for something special and God had laid it on his and his wife's heart to give me the horse! I burst out in tears over this great sacrificial gift! God later spoke to me about how I could never out give Him. My former sucky attitude was instantly replaced with repentance and great thankfulness along with renewed humility. If I'd gotten paid every perf for the last several years, I couldn't have saved enough money to buy that horse. You simply can't out give God! 🙏

Meet the Member Jamie Molesworth

An animal science graduate of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Jamie Molesworth now owns a chiropractic clinic in Burwell, Nebraska, the town she grew up in. “My dad rodeoed so it was a family affair from the beginning. My parents started taking my brother and I to junior rodeos when we were little. We both have always done it essentially,” said the NSRA barrel racer. Jamie tied goats in college while also barrel racing. “I bought a breakaway horse, so I am hoping to back get into that this year. Barrel racing is my favorite event at the moment, because I have a really nice horse.” Jamie was supposed to ride and season a mare for Ruppel Performance Horses and then sell her but they got along so well she bought her. “Her name is Bernadette, just like the girl off The Big Bang Theory. She is not real big, but she is really feisty making Bernadette the perfect name for her.”

Jamie said her last good year of rodeo was in 2000, when she was the goat tying champion in both the Great Plains region and M-SRA as well as the all-around cowgirl in the mid states. “My proudest moment was winning the all-around in the Great Plains region in college. That was the first time I had won a year end saddle, in the goat tying, and then the all-around title with it was just incredible.” Jaime was the 2017 year-end champion bar-

rel racer in the M-SRA and runner up in the NSRA. “It was an accomplishment to win the barrel racing because it seems to be such a tough event. People have really great horses and that was the first year I was running Bernadette. I did not expect to do that well so it kind of shocked me.”

Part of her success has come in the last few years as Jaime has worked on her mental game. “I have gotten better about visualizing what I wanted to accomplish and setting goals. There are so many external factors that come into play with rodeo that having a mental plan makes all the difference.” Now a director for barrel racing in the NSRA, Jaime develops her game plan but still makes time to answer

questions before her event. “I try to focus on two things in my run that I need to do. When things go wrong I just go back to my game plan and try not to let the little things get to me. Essentially, I focus on having a good run for that day, whatever that might look like.”

A NSRA member since her senior year of high school, 1996, Jamie has been in and out of the association ever since. “After I graduated from UNL I went to Northwestern Health Sciences University in Minnesota for chiropractic school.” Graduating in April 2005, Jamie started her clinic in Burwell that June. “I like setting my own hours, so I am flexible enough to still rodeo. I help people with a lot of different things; I do nutritional counseling to help people develop healthier lifestyles.” Jamie takes an adjustment table with her to rodeos, so she can help fellow competitors on the road as well. “It is important to stay healthy and at the top of your game, especially in this sport.”

Living in Burwell puts Jamie within a two-hour drive of almost every NSRA rodeo in the state. “Our board is amazing this year and our secretary is incredible at her job. She is always on top of everything going on in the association.” With the association making changes for bigger and better events, Jamie thinks it is headed in the right direction. “They definitely pay better than they used to when I first started. But most of the changes have to do with promotion and finding out what the competitors want and need done. It is a great association to be a part of, that is for sure.” 📺

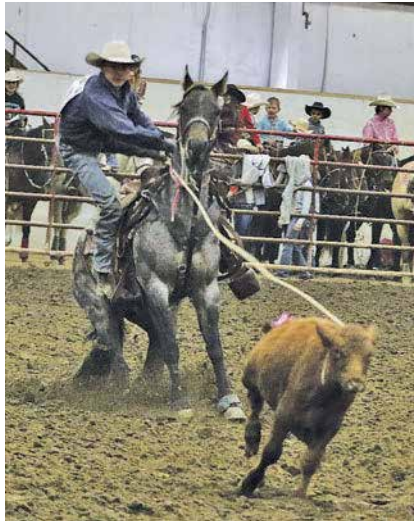

Jacie is pretty laid back, and she'd rather trot than walk or lope. Karmen has mood swings, Jate said. "She'll go from being happy to being really mad all of a sudden, and you won't be able to catch her in the pen." The Saults family raised both horses and Jate and his dad trained them.

He is an eighth grade student at South Platte Public School, where he enjoys math and history. His favorite time period to learn about is the 1800s in the U.S., and if he could choose one person from history to meet, it would be General Patton.

Jate is a member of the National Junior High School Honor Society, Quiz Bowl, and qualified for the State Geography Bee this spring. He played football, basketball, and ran track.

His favorite teacher is Mr. Miller, his ag teacher. The eighth grade class spent a quarter in ag class, and Jate looks forward

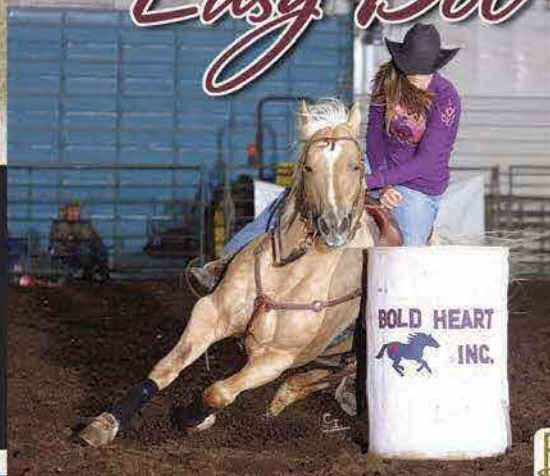

Meet the Member Maureen Hollenbeck

Maureen Hollenbeck from Winner, South Dakota, has held a stopwatch in her hand at the M-SRA finals 28 times and counting. An accomplished rodeo timer and secretary married into the life as a rancher's wife in 1963. "I married Squeek Hollenbeck and I became part of a third-generation ranching family. He was a competitive steer wrestler and calf roper, so I was bound to get involved in rodeo somehow. Both of our kids, Scott and Dori, and granddaughter Sydney are also avid rodeo competitors also," said the M-SRA, NSRA, SDRA, NRCA, and MRA secretary. "I have had the privilege to time with a lot of amazing people, including Nancy Sell and Beanie Hollenbeck." Maureen learned the skill of timing and knowledge to be a rodeo secretary from Squeek's aunt, Sally Hollenbeck, who was a long-time secretary for the NSRA. "Timing can be intense, it takes a lot of complete focus for the entire rodeo. One one-hundredth of a second can mean the difference between someone winning a check and losing one, championships are on the line and essentially in my hands."

In 1968, Maureen and her husband started H&S Rodeo Company, leading Maureen into her career as a timer and secretary. "I figured it was a good way for me to step up and be more involved in rodeo. I love all of the people I get to work with: contestants, committees, personnel. I look forward to seeing my friends every weekend all summer long." Along with their rodeo company, Maureen and Squeek run a cow/calf ranch only 25 miles from the Nebraska state line. "Our livelihood is ranching, but we also get to rodeo in the summer in Nebraska and South Dakota. The winter is



quiet, we take care of our livestock: cattle, bucking stock and goats. In the summer I work in the hay field baling. That is my quiet time after a busy weekend, my escape." Dori used to tie goats, so Maureen started a goat herd for her to practice on. Dori no longer ties goats, but the herd is still around. "We used to furnish goats for the M-SRA when they still had the event, but now it is mostly for South Dakota 4-H and SDRA rodeos. It does not take the goat herd that I have but we have just always had them, so they stick around."

Because of the longevity of her timing career, Maureen is starting to see third and fourth generation competitors from when she first started. "My husband's friends from when he competed, now have kids and grandkids in the rodeos that I time and also that we put on as stock contractors. I love that we can keep that connection with our rodeo friends. We all have a common love and respect for the livestock and the sport." Honored as the M-SRA timer and secretary of the year several times over, Maureen is beginning to step down from the stopwatch and secretary full time. "There is a lot more bookwork for the secretary than there ever used to be.

There is only one rodeo that I both time and secretary for: Clearwater. And that is only because I have a couple that do some of the book work on their computer while I time."

A long-standing member of both the M-SRA and NSRA, Maureen enjoys spending her summers rodeoing at home and in Nebraska. "I have been in the M-SRA since they organized in 1974. The people involved in rodeo is what keeps me coming back year after year." Maureen jokes that she probably knows more people in Nebraska than in South Dakota because of how much time is spent on the road and with her rodeo family. 📷

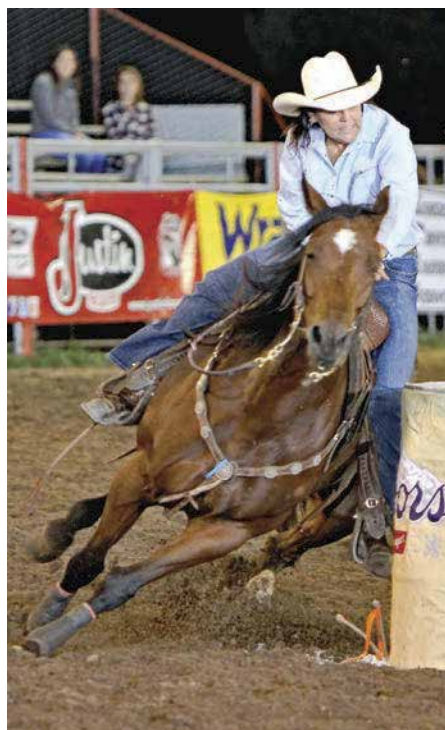


Meet the Member Tammy Peterson

“When you’re born into it, you just love it,” says Tammy Peterson of rodeo. “I can’t imagine doing anything different. I have an aunt who’s 80 years old and still saddles a horse every day, and I hope to be like her.” Tammy, 51, of Cimarron, Kansas, won her third barrel racing title in the KPRA at the 2017 finals, and she’s lived the rodeo and ranching lifestyle since childhood. Last season, however, Tammy’s goal was simply making the finals; the year-end title was far from her mind. “I was riding a 5-year-old mare I had just bought the year before, so I hadn’t had her very long. I didn’t have a very good winter at the jackpots, but then she really came on. She and I really started clicking midway through the year, and she started winning quite a bit for me. Her name is Papablond, but I call her Sita,” says Tammy. “She was trained by Kiley Weast, who does an awesome job training horses. She trains horses for Namgis Quarter Horses, who raised Sita.”

Tammy joined the KPRA in high school when it was the Kansas State Rodeo Association, along with entering high school rodeos, and later, college rodeoing for Dodge City Community College and Oklahoma Panhandle State University. Her dad rode saddle broncs and Tammy’s brother team roped, but Tammy was inspired to barrel race by two of

her aunts and a family friend, whom she grew up watching as they chased cans. “My aunts, Caroline Degnan and Mary Smith, were always there, and that really helped. We also had a family friend, Sue Hoss, that helped me a lot as well. My dad, Laton, was very much a role model for me, and if he were still here today, he’d still be going with me I’m sure. My mom, Sue, likes to go with me, and she’s always been a big support.”

Tammy and her husband, Tom, and their 19-year-old daughter, Camron,

make their home not far from where Tammy grew up outside of Cimarron. Her dad managed a ranch north of town, and she and her brother helped with every aspect, from working cattle to running tractors. Tammy met Tom in college at OPSU, where she majored in biology. After they graduated, the husband and wife moved back to Cimarron, where Tammy taught biology and chemistry for 14 years in Dodge City. Currently, she teaches high school special education and co-teaches two science classes in Dodge City. Tom sells animal medicine and team ropes, while he rode bulls and bareback horses in college. He and Tammy used to team rope together, and their daughter is a breakaway roper, competing on the DCCC rodeo team. “She plans on going to the KPRA rodeos this year, and she’s going to cosmetology school,” says Tammy.

As soon as she’s home from work, Tammy saddles up horses and rides at her neighbor’s arena, or takes her horses down the road or through the pastures and fields. “All we do is ride, but I do love basketball. I like all sports—I watch football and basketball, and I played basketball in high school.” She’s rodeoing in the KPRA again this season, and always looks forward to the KPRA rodeo in Lakin. “I always like going there—I know a lot of people there, and I love going to Wellington, Texas, and Canadian, Texas. Those are some really good rodeos that I enjoy going to. I really want to continue to be consistent, and I do plan to go to some circuit rodeos again this year. I have my (WPR) card. I made the (Prairie Circuit) finals in 2010, and it’s been a goal of mine to make the finals again.”

Meet the Member Jentry Schell

Jentry Schell of Wymore, Nebraska, lives just six minutes from the Kansas border. She and her family load up every weekend and turn south to rodeo in Kansas, where the KJHSRA and KHSRA gives them the opportunity to rodeo together. Jentry, 14, competes in barrel racing and pole bending, and her 17-year-old brother, J.W., competes in team roping in high school. This is their first year of junior high and high school rodeo, and Jentry loves traveling. "I like the Cowboy Church every Sunday morning, and I get to go to a lot of new places I've never been before. I liked Garden City because it was challenging. It rained and most of the events were moved into a small building. I like meeting the new people along the way. They're really nice, and I like getting advice to better myself in life and rodeo."

Jentry also loves the challenge of barrels, the event that inspired her to start junior high rodeoing. "I was doing 4-H pleasure and speed events, and I started getting into barrel racing and wanted to do more of that," she explains. "I'd gotten a new horse, Cowboy, and he taught me so much and boosted me up to that next level. I like the thrill of running barrels every time and there's so much that goes into each run—it's very challenging." Jentry, who continues to do 4-H, is also expanding her skills to the roping box, where she's learning to breakaway and team rope. "Steve Milam is a family friend and a great role model. He mentored my brother in roping and has started giving me roping tips. He gives great advice and he's not afraid to tell it like it is. Right now he's fighting cancer. He's very encouraging to a lot of people."

Jentry fought her own battle against cancer when she was diagnosed with leukemia four years ago. She went through two and a half years of chemotherapy and is now cancer free. "The first three months I couldn't ride because my platelets were low. I couldn't wait to ride again," Jentry recalls. "I spent a lot of time around my horse Cowboy. He and my dog Frosty helped me through it, along with my family."

Jentry's Australian Shepherd, Frosty, also travels with the family, and is known for his tricks, including playing dead and leading Jentry's horse with the lead rope in his mouth.

When she's not with her animals, Jen-

try can be found at Southern High School. An eighth-grader, she enjoys social studies and recently studied the American Revolution. She also played volleyball and basketball this school year and plans to continue volleyball in high school. "When I get home from school and the weather permits, I ride, do chores, and then I do homework. Coming into high school, I want to get honor roll all through high school, and in rodeo, I want to make it to the National (Junior High) Finals." 🐾

Meet the Member Max Mathis

Max Mathis of Ben Wheeler, Texas, is entering his second season in the AJRA. Last year he competed in team roping, tie-down roping, and breakaway roping, and this year, the 15-year-old moved up an age division and is entering the steer wrestling, tie-down roping, and team roping as a header. "I just really like how the rodeos are run. I've got some good friends out there, and the calves and the cattle are good," says Max.

He competes in the same events in the THSRA Region 4 and the CTYRA, and won the tie-down roping at the San Antonio Youth Rodeo this winter. Starting with his regional finals at the end of March until the AJRA NFR at the end of July, Max reckons he'll be on the road every weekend. He often travels with his mom, Chantay Mathis, or his brother-in-law, Jeff Odom, who's married to Max's sister Morgan. Max saw much of the rodeo trail even before he started competing, traveling with his dad, Chad Mathis, who is a professional steer roper. Being familiar with the larger rodeos and traveling served Max well when he made his debut at the NJHFR last year in tie-down roping and chute dogging. He placed second in the average in the tie-down roping, while he placed fourth in the short-go in chute dogging.

Of his three events, tie-down roping is easily Max's favorite. "I've got a good horse this year and we're doing good, and I've worked at it more," he explains. Max's brother-in-law hazes for him and

they practice together at least four days a week. "We rope every night, and when my dad gets off work, he'll head or heel or trip steers. I've entered a few Lone Star steer ropings — I started tripping about a year ago." Max also practices with his team roping partners from the AJRA and high school rodeo, Chisum Allen and Grant Gilbreath, and he's hauled with steer wrestling expert Butch Myers and worked with professional tie-down roper Jerrad Hofstetter. "I was going to a bunch of Ultimate Calf Ropings and I met Butch and we started hauling to all those ropings, and Jerrad has helped me a bunch.

The horse I'm riding now I bought from Jerrad, and we go up there every three or four months and rope with him."

Max bought his calf horse, Bam, from Jerrad last winter. "Shane Hanchey has a horse called Bam Bam, and the way my horse stops reminds me of him. He's real easy to get along with, and he does the same thing every time. My dad was in Pendleton one year and he bought a horse we call Duke from a friend. We knew he was going to be good, but we didn't know how good, and over the last few years he's been doing really good. I just bought a steer wrestling horse, Tyrone, a few weeks ago from Cole Barringer, and I was 3.8 the first time I ran him at a high school rodeo."

Just this year, Max switched to home-schooling so he can keep up with school on the road, and have more time to rope and even take in outside horses. He enjoys all kinds of history, and also shows cattle in 4-H. "My sister Macee helps me out, and I really like spending time with her and hanging out. My heifer won her class at Fort Worth this year," says Max, who also enjoys going to the lake or golfing with his family. He'll even travel to Las Vegas this December to compete in the Junior NFR, which he was invited to by Roy Cooper.

"I would like to win the AJ's this year, and I would like to make it to Nationals again this year," he finishes. "I'd like to do good at Shawnee (IFYR) and the Best of the Best this year, and I want to give a thank you to Van Zandt County 4-H and Tommy Phillips for all of their help."



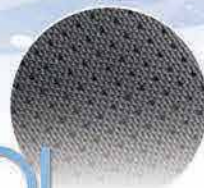

Meet the Member Ry Clark

Morse, Texas, transplant Ry Clark is an avid competitor in the OHSRA steer wrestling and team roping. "My freshman year I team roped with Yaleigh Yarbrough, the daughter of my dad's friend Yandy, and we both competed in Texas. Yandy and Yaleigh lived in Elk City, Oklahoma, but competed in Texas up until our sophomore year. I went to Yandy's house to practice and somehow he convinced me to compete here," said the 17-year-old. Ry competed in Oklahoma while he was still living in Texas his junior year but moved in with Yandy about a year ago. "There are a lot of competitors at every OHSRA event and we are all there to help each other. All the parents are great too, they cheer for everyone no matter if their kid is in the event or not." With more bull doggers in Oklahoma than Texas, Ry can afford to go to more events.

"I like the challenge of steer wrestling the best. It is different than any other event, because each of us is helping out by hazing or pushing cattle or whatever it might be. We are a very close-knit group." Roney, his dad, used to be a pickup man and a team roper. While his mom Veann never competed in rodeo she has always supported Ry and his brother Reece, 23. "I have been around rodeo my whole life, so what else would I want to do really?" Once a bull dogger himself, Yandy coaches Ry in the event. "He looks at the positive side of everything, all he wants for the kids he coaches is that they have fun. He tries to make us the best we can be."

Ry seems to have the best luck at Shawnee, making it his favorite rodeo to attend.

He is looking forward to competing in Cheyenne one day. "It is such a challenge to give a steer that much of a head start and how fast the horses are going when the bull doggers jump off."

Ry came close last year to accomplishing his long-time goal of winning at Nationals but fell short. He won steer wrestling at state last year sending him to Nationals to take third overall. "That has been my proudest moment so far. It was such a big rodeo to do well at and I accomplished the goal I had set for myself that year."

Both Northwestern Oklahoma State University and Southeastern have caught Ry's eye for his college degree. "I like that Altus is a smaller school and I already know the rodeo team coach, Stockton Graves, so it would be a good place to start." His plan includes working as a pharmaceutical sales representative right out of school until he can run his own cow/calf operation. Being home-schooled through Epic Charter Schools

allows the senior time to practice and day work for surrounding ranches. "I work for a lot of different ranchers around here. They just call me when they need something done. I can do anything from branding and farming to building fences. Just about anything that needs to be done on a ranch I can do."

The value of a good horse in the bull dogging is not lost on Ry. He is thankful for the support of his family in his rodeo career so far, but also the opportunities he has gotten. "Yandy is friends with Josh Purcell. When Josh hurt his shoulder last year I got to ride his horses for the past year and a half. They were the ones that I won state and went to Nationals on." Ry's best advice to younger competitors is that nothing replaces a solid foundation in your event or an experienced and consistent horse. "Yandy and my dad always remind me, there is always another rodeo so not to sweat the small stuff or when something goes wrong in the arena." 📺

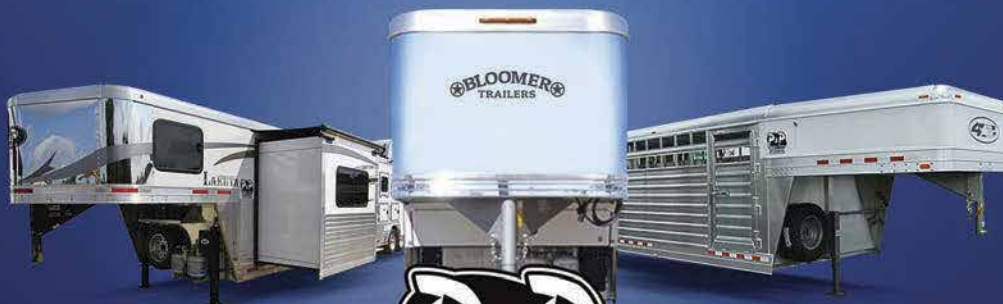

“Rodeo is what I want to do, and I want to make the National Finals,” says Tyler Milligan, of Pawhuska, Oklahoma. “It’s what I’ve always wanted to do since I was a little kid, and that’s what keeps me practicing every day and going up and down the road.” The same goal spurred him on for the 2017 rodeo season along with the rookie race that kept him neck and neck with two other tie-down ropers, Justin Smith and Lane Livingston, from Cheyenne Frontier Days until the end of the season. “Basically after Cheyenne, that kept us all even, and all through the Northwest we were within a thousand dollars of each other. Within the end, I pulled away a little bit, but it wasn’t until the last week or two that I knew I had it won.”

Tyler won \$53,869 overall and took home the hard-earned title of 2017 PRCA Tie-Down Roping Rookie of the Year. While the 21-year-old is no stranger to professional rodeo, having qualified for the IPRA finals twice after high school, he had never traveled in the West until last year. “I like the Northwest a lot, and I like the weather up there a lot better than down here,” he says. Winning the Hermiston, Oregon, rodeo was one of Tyler’s larger wins of the season, and he plans to return

there this year. One of his first wins of the 2018 season came from Rodeo Houston with a \$56,000 paycheck, while he won The American Semi-Finals Shoot Out and \$20,000. He’s traveling with tie-down roper Timber Moore from Aubrey, Texas, this year, whom he rodeoed with in the Northwest last summer. “It’s definitely good to always travel with somebody that knows more than you, and you can pick up things from them.” He also stays in close contact with his parents, Steve and Tammy Mil-

ligan, who both rodeoed and now run the family ranch in Pawhuska. Tammy is also a dermatologist. “I talk to my mom every day, and my dad probably once a week,” says Tyler. “My mom could be my motivational book. She’s always texting or calling and giving me good motivation.”

Competing in junior high and high school rodeo in Oklahoma also prepared Tyler for his professional career, as well as qualifying for the NHSFR with the top athletes from across the nation. He won the OHSRA state title in tie-down roping and won the same event at the IFYR in 2013, while team roping took him to the USTRC finals. “Rodeo is pretty much always my main focus. I was homeschooled in high school so I could rodeo more and practice more,” says Tyler.

He eventually whittled his events down to tie-down roping, which has always been his favorite event. After Tyler sold his head horse, he bought his 15-year-old gelding Big Time, who carried him through much of his rookie year. “He’s the same every time—you know what you’re going to get. I bought him from a guy named Ronnie Austin, and I have another horse name Propane, who’s also 15. I bought him from Caddo Lewallen. We have a covered arena right here in Pawhuska that I rope at every day when I’m home.”

When he’s on the road, Tyler often starts a game of basketball with his fellow competitors to stay active. “Most of the time somebody has a basketball, and I bring an extra set of shoes to go to the gym.” He keeps his packing for the road to the basics, but went a tad too basic when he left for the Fourth of July run last summer without a spare pair of contacts. “I just had to make sure I took good care of the ones I had!”

With \$15,000 under his belt so far and a spot in the top 25 in the world standings, Tyler is focused on roping true to his style this year in pursuit of a WNFR qualification. He’s also working to qualify for the PRCA Prairie Circuit Finals this year. “I’m just wanting to rope my roping wherever I go. Last year—I guess it’s part of being a rookie—I would try to change my roping up when I would go somewhere. I was trying to prove myself and feel like I belonged, and I was pushing every step of the way. There’s still going to be some pressure, but I’ve learned for the most part how to handle it better.” He passes that insight along to other rookie athletes. “Just rope your roping. You don’t have to do anything special—just rope the way you rope and let it come to you.” 🐾

Meet the Member Raesh Casebolt

Raesh Casebolt catches cattle in two ways; either with a rope or his Black Mouth Cur dogs. The Ryan, Oklahoma, cowboy competes in everything involving a rope, including ribbon roping, tie-down roping, team roping, chute dogging and goat tying. "Calf roping is easily my favorite. I like that it is just me and my horse. I feel bad when I let someone else down, so calf roping does not have that kind of pressure," said the 15-year-old, who started on a pony when he was five years old, pen roping calves with his dad. He competed in the MRCA of Texas when he was 8 and competes alongside his brothers Foreman, 12, and Crosby, 8. "Our parents are our biggest supporters, they pay for everything and haul us everywhere we need to go."

Todd, the boys' dad, taught them to rope at an early age and continues to be their coach today. "My mom, Heather, helps us anyway she can. If we go to a rodeo on a weekend and I have homework she will sit in the back seat and help me. I appreciate them both so much, there is no way I could ever pay them back for what they do. I am forever grateful." Todd was a tie-down roper back in the day, now his rodeo friends' kids compete alongside Raesh. "I love getting to hear all the stories from back when my dad was rodeoing."

His one rodeo goal is to win high school nationals in the calf roping, just like his role model, and dad, did. Last year he finished fourth in the boys breakaway roping, sending him to Nationals for the first time. "When I think too, much I have bad runs, so I just try and do what I already know how to do.



At home I practice like every steer is for a \$20 million jackpot."

The Ryan High School eighth grader is also a football and basketball player, serving as a quarter back and safety on the field as well as a wing and post on the court. "My football team started with a bunch of kids that did not play a whole lot and this season we only lost two games. It has been fun to be a part of that and is why football is my favorite." He is also involved in his FFA chapter at school and plans to start judging livestock in the future. Two years ago, Raesh started hunting pigs and baying cows with his dogs. "Baying" cows with dogs is just simply "herding" them...keeping them bunched up together with the use of dogs for the purpose of moving cattle.

"Gage Williams introduced me to it and I have had anywhere from 10 to 13 dogs here at a time. I like to get them as

puppies, so I can train them the way I want to." He teaches his dogs to mind and then instinct takes over when they go out looking for hogs or bay cows.

Running cattle on winter wheat pastures keeps the Casebolt family at home most of the winter, but they jump back in for the spring season of OKJHSRA events. "It is a good association to be a part of, everyone knows each other, and they are all good people. The best part is getting to represent my state at Nationals though." His favorite events take place in Guthrie, Oklahoma, at the Lazy E, where the boxes are underneath the upper bleachers. Raesh hopes to follow in his dad's footsteps and run a ranch one day. "My dad works for my grandpa now, but he is slowly building his own herd. Ranching is what I have grown up doing." Naturally, the best advice Raesh has gotten comes from his dad: "never give up and think smart." 🐾

STEVI HILLMAN

With warmer weather comes barrel racer Stevi Hillman's favorite time of year. Outdoor rodeos are her and her horses' forte, and while the two-time WNFR qualifier from Weatherford, Texas, pulled a check in Houston, she won the first two outdoor rodeos of the year at Los Fresnos and Goliad, Texas. "The horses are really ready to be outside," says Stevi. "I like Cheyenne, it's a big outdoor rodeo, but I just like the summer run. We get to go from one outdoor rodeo to the next. Some people don't like it because the weather can change from one run to the next, but I like the challenge, and the travel is fun."

Stevi took her horses Truck and Layla with her for the California run in April, and she'll load up Sharpie, the newest addition to her barn, for the summer run. Whether at work or at play, Stevi always saddles up with a 5 Star Equine pad, which she started using even before her rodeo career took off in 2016. "I'm a firm believer in the pads—they last a long time. I really like the quality of the pads. There are some other good pads out there, but with hundredths of seconds' difference between you and your competitors, going from a good pad to a great pad makes all the difference. I like to represent companies that stand for a good cause and are good people." Since using the pads, Stevi also noticed her horses needed fewer chiropractic adjustments. "I feel like the pressure of a saddle and the pressure of a pad over time is a huge impact on the horse's body condition."

Her latest venture, which Stevi embarked on with her husband, Ty, is raising their own colts and training them. She's been training horses since childhood, learning from her step-dad, Dave Salzbrenner. They got an embryo out of Martini, the mare that helped Stevi get to her first WNFR in 2016, and bred to Dash Ta Fame, which gave them Pendleton, now a yearling stud prospect. "We flushed our Dash Ta Fame mare this last year to Slick By Design, which gave us our baby this

year. We're not really wanting to get into the breeding business, but our goal is to have a great mare to sell embryos from. I went from training full time with 17 head of horses around here, including our own, to having our own colts, and I have one of the Dunn's 3-year-olds here in training."

Horse training led Stevi to the rodeo world when she trained an off-track quarter horse Im A Royal Design "Hammer" and ran him her rookie year in the PRCA, winning Reserve Barrel Racing Rookie of the Year in 2012. He went on to the WNFR with Carlee Pierce and Jana Bean, while Stevi's mare she trained, Perfectos Dually "J-Lo" took her to Houston, and later, J-Lo ran with Christina Richman at the 2012 WNFR. "A huge part of my rodeo career was getting into Houston for the first time, and I'm very thankful to be able to train such an amazing animal to do so well," says Stevi.

She grew up with a strong work ethic that included animals' needs coming first, but Stevi says setting aside time to take care of herself is also important. "It's (rodeo) a 24/7 job. I talked to someone recently about being out at 11 at night flexing my horse or giving a massage. It really comes down to your passion. At times, you get mentally or physically tired from going 24/7. It's all about the horses all the time, which is important, but so is taking time for yourself to refresh." Hot yoga is

her favorite way to shift her focus for a few minutes, along with jogging with her husband. "My motivation lately has been that I'm truly blessed to be doing what I love, and how many people get to be in that position? I not only get to do what I love, but I help other people do what they love, and that's the dream life in my opinion."

Stevi's husband feels similarly. Ty, formerly a professional roper, started his business Prepare To Win in 2016. A success coach, he helps clients reach their peak performance in life and in the arena, and his work allows him to travel all year with Stevi. "We listen to all kinds of motivational books, and that definitely sparks conversation around that, and it helps me," says Stevi. "We're both very competitive. He's been my motivation through my competitive years, and my step-dad is a huge inspiration to me and put that fire in me at a young age. Being able to watch people like Lisa Lockhart and Sherry Cervi growing up and being able to talk to them whenever I want has helped, and Jana Bean has been a great help to me.

"My future goals are always to become better, physically and mentally. Competition wise, I always want to win. I know that's always in God's timing in what you win and where you'll go, and I hope for more doors to open this year for me to help more people." 🐾

Meet the Member Acey Pinkston

Acey Pinkston went to her first WNFR before she was even a year old, traveling with her mom, Liz Pinkston, who qualified in 2004 and 2005. Now Acey is chasing her own cans in Las Vegas at the Junior NFR this December. The 14-year-old from Stephenville, Texas, won the KK Race for Vegas in Waco, Texas, at the Diamonds and Dirt Barrel Race, where she also won the 1D. "It was set up great, and the ground was great also. It was just a blast," says Acey. "They kept it rolling all day and always had something going, which made it fun to watch, especially the futurity derby and open."

Qualifying for the Junior NFR was Acey's main goal for the 2018 season, and since she accomplished that at her first KKP event, she's set goals to qualify for the UPR and CPRA finals this year as well. She and her family recently moved from South Texas to Stephenville so Acey could have more opportunities to rodeo in a central location. Her older brother, Bradford Loeffler, also lives in Stephenville. "Acey was ready for the next step, and her mom has done great keeping good horses under her," says Wade Pinkston, Acey's dad. "Now her mother and I are trying to move her toward bigger opportunities."

Maya, an 11-year-old mare, is Acey's main barrel horse and the one she qualified on for the Junior NFR. Acey also competes in all of the TJHSRA events and loads up at least four horses for her junior high rodeos. "My pole horse is Chico, and he's full of himself but he always gets us there," Acey says with a laugh. "I have two breakaway horses,

Lexus and Slingshot. Lari Dee Guy and Jackie Crawford trained Lexus, and Slingshot came from my brother's girlfriend, Abby Medlin. My goat horse is Nelly, and she came from Cayla and Jane Melby. I also cut, and my grandparents are into cutting. I just got one of their amazing horses, Snow Ray, who I'll ride in high school rodeo."

The Pinkston's place is also home to a pigmy goat, seven dogs, two cats, a handful of cattle, and a pet deer. "We've raised Shorty Jack Russell Terriers for 10 or 12 years," says Acey. "Our deer, Rolo, showed up at our house, and he thinks he's a dog. If we go down to the pond, he'll go down there and he's very protective. He loves it whenever we go down to feed in the morning, and he has a deer feeder in the pasture."

Acey has more flexibility to practice and travel to rodeos since she does school through White Horse Christian Academy. "That's where most of the rodeo kids or people who show or cut go to school. It's four days a week, and you can go in every day or just a few days. I go as many days as I can to get my work done so we can go to more rodeos. I'm in eighth grade and I've always enjoyed history, especially American history." Acey also plays basketball and volleyball with the Faith Knights. Both won their state tournaments this season, which was the

basketball team's first tournament win since the team was formed.

Acey and her family further enjoy going to the beach and off-shore fishing, but she's especially excited about her rodeo travels this year. "Being able to have fun motivates me, and being around all these amazing animals. I like being with my parents and learning new things and meeting new people. My main goal, especially for this year, is to qualify for The American Semi-Finals and from there, go to the next American." 📺

Meet the Member JC King

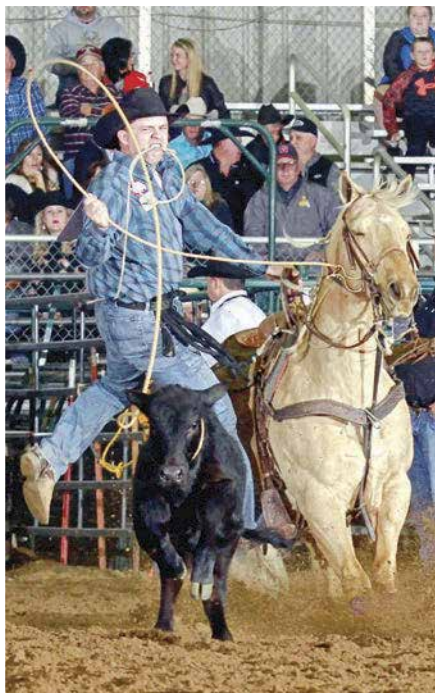
JC King cut his baby teeth on a pigging string, riding and roping for the past 20 years. "I have always roped calves, I team rope a little. It is a rewarding event because of the work that goes into it, even just being physically fit enough to compete." Learning almost everything from his dad, Doug King, who rodeoed for more than 20 years, JC credits him with shaping his rodeo career the most.

His calf roping went from the OKJH-SRA straight to the ACRA, never competing in a single high school rodeo. "I was 16 when I started in the ACRA, my dad was still competing, so we decided to jump feet first." The oldest of three, Garrett now 25 and Katelyn now 19, it made more sense for JC to go with his dad to amateur rodeos. "I got my butt kicked for about two years and then I made the finals the summer after I graduated high school in 2009." The tight-knit King family was all over the state going to rodeos until Garrett also moved up into the ACRA. "We were crazy busy back then, but thinking about it now I just think about the number of horses we had at one time. My dad sure had his hands full just with the horseflesh around our house."

Back then, rodeoing in the ACRA was competing with "the big boys" of rodeo. JC has been back to the finals every year since his first appearance, with his first finals win in 2016. "That was an especially proud moment for me because my dad and I talked about it a lot through my learning years. To this day, anytime I make my parents proud of me is when all the work through the years truly pays off."

The family tradition is to attend Northeast Oklahoma A&M College in Miami, Oklahoma. "My dad was on the very first rodeo team in the 1980s there. That is where I went to college in 2009, Garrett in 2011 and Katelyn is in her freshman year."

Married to Taryn for the past two years, JC runs 200 yearling cattle on



their ranch in Stilwell. "That is what my dad did when I was growing up so when I got my own place I just kept doing the same thing." He also works for Allied Solutions, installing various electronics and security systems in houses bigger than 3,000 square feet.

In May 2015, JC took off for the summer to try his hand in the PRCA. "I won quite a bit of money, but not enough to keep going so I went home in August,

slipped into the ACRA finals to salvage the year and I have not looked back since." Competing in Reno during a performance is easily the largest rodeo JC roped in to fulfill one of his childhood dreams. Though JC got to compete in a lot of his dream rodeos that summer, the ACRA is where he feels most at home. "It is essentially where I learned how to win. It is a comfortable atmosphere and where all of my friends are at. Being from Oklahoma, there is not anything better than the IFR because it is in our backyard."

JC King of Stilwell, Oklahoma, once again found himself backed in the calf roping box at the Jim Norick Arena at the Oklahoma State Fair for his third appearance at the IFR. "The first year I made the IFR, 2014, I won that very first round. It was a proud moment for me, mostly because my parents, Doug and Elizabeth, were proud of me," said the 27-year-old. 📷

Rodeo Spotlight Poteet, TX Strawberry Festival

For the last 70 years, the Poteet Strawberry Festival has been growing like spring-fed berries in the Artesian belt of Texas. Founded in 1886 and named for its blacksmith and postmaster, the town that today is still under 5,000 in population soon gained another visionary citizen in Henry T. Mumme. Mumme donated land to the Artesian Belt Railroad, a line built by land developer Charles Simmons to provide transportation for prospective property buyers and investors. Mumme built a general store next to the railway station and his wife planted a few rows of strawberries next to an artesian well for the store's produce section. Sharp marketers, the lot of them, San Antonio headlines read 'Crimson Berries Beckon Hungry Tourists to Poteet'.

That's how it all began, the festival that attracts nearly 100,000 visitors annually to the town. George Strait grew up in. Several stages will feature headline music acts from Tanya Tucker to Foghat, there are parades and carnival rides. A large, local contingency of strawberry growers see that the berry that made the town famous is represented in all its splendor. There are parades, but most importantly, there's bronc riding and a lot of it.

With two performances at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on both Saturday, April 14, and Sunday, April 15, the cowboys and cowgirls of the Texas Bronc Riders Association are set to take the stage. While the bareback, bronc riding and ranch bronc riding are open events, the ladies ranch

bronc riding is by invitation.

"Our tour stops are growing for the Texas Bronc Riders Association and we're very proud of the traction our organization is gaining," Daryl McElroy, TBRA president said. "The Poteet Strawberry Festival is one we look forward to and are proud to keep Texas traditions of bronc riding front and center at this iconic event."

The TBRA was founded to create more opportunities for bronc and bare-

back riders to showcase their skills and provide quality competition, a world class finals, increased prize money and scholarships. To date, TBRA members and past members have qualified for RFD TV's The American, are in the top fifteen in the pro ranks, have gained national media attention and been great ambassadors for the sport.

HUNTER HERRIN

Nine-time WNFR qualifier Hunter Herrin has been involved in a variety of sports, especially rodeo, since childhood. Within the last few years, the 33-year-old from Apache, Oklahoma, has added a new pursuit—hunting—to his list of interests thanks to his son, Houston. “I’m learning more from him than he is from me,” says Hunter. “He’s 11 and he really enjoys deer hunting. I’ve done a whole lot more of that in the last three years than I have in my entire life.” Hunter is no stranger to long nights on the road and admits that he’s not the deer hunting kind of early riser, but he’s enjoyed the new experience nonetheless. “If you are out there when the earth wakes up, it seems to be refreshing, the way the animals move and the birds wake up when the sun starts to rise. It’s pretty cool. You can reflect on this, that, and the other, and enjoy the moment.” Houston, who learned about the hunting lifestyle from his grandpa, has harvested several deer. The meat is often shared among the family, and Hunter enjoys a bowl of deer chili.

Tracking calves is still his favorite pursuit, however, and rodeo is another thing that Hunter and Houston enjoy doing together. Family has often cheered him on from the stands at rodeos like the WNFR and The American, which he won in 2016, while Hunter and Houston spend several weeks in the summer on the road together. “He enjoys getting to hang out with his buddies that I’ve rodeoed with, like Shane Hanchey and Marty Yates. He’s a big fan of them and they spend time with him on the road.”

Hunter made a run at the winter stock shows and rodeos, working to find the balance between recovering from his October 2017 hip surgery but still getting a start on the 2018 season. “With a surgery or injury, you change your goals and double down and work harder like I should have in my 20s,” says Hunter, who first qualified for the WNFR in 2006. He was his son’s age when he started roping, encouraged by his step-dad, Bob Nunn.

Hunter junior rodeoed and focused more on basketball and football in high school, but rodeo was back on his radar in his late teens. “I went to three semesters at Weatherford in Oklahoma and did college rodeo there, and in the winter of ’05, I started rodeoing full time. My parents bought my PRCA permit for me in ’04.” When Hunter stepped up his competition in 2006, it was the first of four consecutive qualifications to the WNFR. He went through a pattern of getting horses ready for the finals every other year, and in 2014, his horse Dualin Demon “Rambo” won PRCA Tie-Down Roping Horse of the Year.

Presently, Hunter is working on several horses that he anticipates being ready to rodeo on in the fall. “But I’m looking for that kind of rodeo horse now. Clint Akin has a horse that I rode in Houston and there’s a possibility I can rodeo on him some, but we’re still keeping our eye out for one that fits the mold of what we’re looking for.” Hunter and his dad train horses and have three in particular they’ll start hauling this summer. With the exception of his first year at the WNFR, Hunter has qualified for the finals every time on a horse he trained. What fuels

his horses is equally as important as their training, and he recently started feeding Nutrena’s SafeChoice horse feeds. “My horses have done really well on it, and they have a whole lineup of different products to feed depending on what you’re looking to get out of your horse. One thing I’ve noticed is that it does keep their weight on them without them getting overly hot. We have six to seven horses out here and ride four or five of them every day and we haven’t had that problem.”

Along with horse training, Hunter also enjoys going to his son’s baseball games. Houston plays on a summer league but loves any sport that involves a ball. “He’s previously been in football and basketball, and now it’s baseball,” says Hunter. “If it’s a sport, he’s into it.”

Hunter anticipates competing in several rodeos in Texas or California in the next month, such as Corpus Christi and the Red Bluff Round-Up, but he’s mainly focused on being ready to go by June. “If the health comes along and I find a horse, I’d like to rodeo this summer and try to get back to where I was in the past and make the NFR again. If that doesn’t happen, I’ll just try to get everything squared away and for sure go for next year.” 🐾

South Dakota Cowboys Win Big in 1988 Ken Lensegrav

In 1988, South Dakota cowboys won three National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association Championships and the All-Around. Winning the bareback riding and the all-around was Ken Lensegrav, Meadow, South Dakota. Saddle bronc riding winner, Eudell Larson, and steer wrestling winner, Cory Ferguson, were featured previously.

Lensegrav was two weeks old when he attended his first rodeo club meeting with his dad, Dave, an NIRA contestant in the mid 1960's at South Dakota State University, Brookings, South Dakota. In 1988 when Ken won the NIRA Bareback Riding Championship and the All-Around, he was riding for Montana State University. In 1989 he was again NIRA Champion Bareback Rider.

He was the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association Bareback Riding Rookie of the Year in 1987. In 1988 he made his first of 10 trips to the PRCA National Finals Rodeo with his highest placings in the world being second, two fourths, sixth and seventh.

During his bareback riding career he won the PRCA Badlands Circuit Finals Rodeo five times, was year-end champion three times, and won the Ram Na-

tional Circuit Finals Rodeo in 1988 and 1992. In 2004, the year he retired from bareback riding, he was honored as a Cowboy Great at the Casey Tibbs South Dakota Rodeo Center Tribute Dinner in Ft. Pierre, South Dakota.

Ken says he married a "good gal," his wife Kim, who stayed home and worked while he rodeoed and used his rodeo earnings to get into ranching near Interior, South Dakota. When asked which was easier, riding bareback horses or ranching, he chuckled and said "Riding bareback horses, but it's a young man's game!"

They now enjoy watching their children Katie and Kelsey rodeo. Katie rodeoed at Black Hills State University, Spearfish, South Dakota and Kelsey is at the University of Wyoming, Laramie, Wyoming.

He is a Kadoka, South Dakota area school board member and is on the South Dakota High School Rodeo Association Board of Directors.

Ken has fond memories of college rodeo where he loved every minute. He says "Montana State was a good college that helped me become independent and make lifelong friends." It prepared him to pro rodeo and he wouldn't change a thing. Ken encourages anyone who has an interest in college rodeo to do it.

Ken along with Eudell Larson and Cory Ferguson will be honored as Champions at the NIRA Alumni "8's" Reunion June 15 and 16, 2018 during the NIRA College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, Wyoming.

Meet the Member Roger Rasner

From the Little Britches to the PRCA and now the NSPRA, Roger Rasner of Peyton, Colorado, has seen all levels of the rodeo world. "I started by roping calves like my dad did, and then I took up heading since there were so many team ropers." In 1984, Roger switched to the heeling side and never looked back, while still calf roping of course. "My good head horse was getting old, so I bought some young colts and a burro to start heeling." Roger and his wife Micah have trained rope horses for the past 35 years. "Micah does 90 percent of the starting work, getting the colts broke and looking at a cow. She has made my job of training rope horses much easier. We have sold some top-notch horses over the years." Roger is a jack of all trades when it comes to ranching: he is a farrier, trainer, roper and cattleman.

"I have worked on the ranch ever since I was old enough to do so with my parents. We run a few hundred cattle and farm a little bit." Micah worked in law enforcement for a majority of her career while helping Roger with the ranch and training horses. "We never really had a full-time job, we had several jobs that were full time. Micah cannot sit still for long, so we are always doing something." During the winter, the couple makes their way to Wittmann, Arizona. "We've had this place for the past twelve years, but it has only been recently that we have spent a lot of time here." Micah likes the heat while Roger enjoys all the roping. "I have always been awfully lucky, especially with the horses I

have ridden over the years." In a matter of three rodeos, Roger filled his PRCA permit in 1978, leading him to win the Mountain State Circuit team roping and Rookie of the Year titles in 1979. "I never got to pro rodeo hard, because I had the ranch and all the responsibilities to stay home for." Roger joined the NSPRA in 1992.

"Rod Pratt and I went to more than 20 rodeos in 1993 and we won the world team roping title at the finals. We had a great year even for just competing in the Midwest." Roger still runs into people he met 30 years ago, and they always pick up where they left off. "I don't think anybody in the NSPRA is trying to make a living at it, they are people who just want to rodeo. We are all out there for the friendship and competing against people we know we will be competitive against. That is what makes the association so much fun." JD and Dick Yates

lived in the same area as Roger when he was growing up. "Everybody looked up to JD, so it was neat to get help from him and his dad. They were the big influences that helped me be competitive."

Roger has dedicated his entire life to roping and rodeo, because it is what he truly enjoys. "That is my hobby, so it is what has made my life fun. I am very competitive though, it does not matter if I am playing for a nickel or a ton of money, the winning spirit is the same." About the time Roger thinks he has the sport figured out, it humbles him. "You need that competitive edge and drive to win to be successful at this sport, no matter what."

2018 Team Roping Pick/Draw Format

It has been decided to use a pick one/draw one format for the team roping beginning this year. Here is some basic information, but if you have questions or comments, please contact our team roping director, Mike Brewer, at 530-519-2587, or Susi Kaufman at the National Office 928-684-9566.

- There must be at least four teams entered in the age category. If there are less than four teams the team roping in that age category will be a straight team roping at the same entry fee as other events.
- There will be separate pick one / draw one for the 40-59 age category and the 60+ age category.
- Fees will be \$100 per man (for both runs) plus the NSPRA fee and stock charges
- There will be no drop down in the team roping. A 60 team cannot drop down and rope in the 40-59 age category; however, - Rule 12.2.1.4 is still in place – a 60+ team roper can designate his points to accrue in the 40-59 age category and could win a world championship in the lower age category, as long as his partner is age appropriate and an Event Age Category Designation for Points form is signed and received by the National Office before the first rodeo is entered. (You cannot enter both age categories at the same rodeo)
- A pick team cannot draw up together in the draw pot.
- Points will be given for the pick team only.
- You cannot draw both partners.

PRORODEO HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCES 2018 INDUCTION CLASS

Team roping stars Speed Williams and Rich Skelton had no equals from 1997-2004, as each won eight consecutive PRCA world championships.

Now, the duo will be immortalized in rodeo history.

Williams and Skelton headline the 10-member 2018 induction class for the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. The ceremony takes place Aug. 4 at the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Williams and Skelton join gold buckle-winner Deb Greenough (bareback riding, 1993), contract personnel recipient Leon Coffee, stock contractor Billy Minick, rodeo notable Walt Garrison and the committee for the Black Hills Roundup in Belle Fourche, S.D., as the PRCA inductees.

For the second time in the history of the ProRodeo Hall of Fame - 2017 being the first - barrel racers from the Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA) will be among the class of inductees, and their class includes Kristie Peterson, Billie McBride and a WPRA equine inductee, French Flash Hawk (Bozo).

In addition to the 10 inductees, former PRCA Chief Operating Officer Kay Bleakly will receive the Ken Stemler Pioneer Award, which honors individuals in recognition of their groundbreaking, innovative ideas and forward thinking.

Williams and Skelton were the pinnacle of team roping for nearly a decade. "I remember going to the high school finals and stopping in the ProRodeo Hall of Fame and I was blown away with the history of ProRodeo," Williams said. "It's a great honor to be inducted into the Hall of Fame."

Skelton also was taken aback to receive this prestigious honor. "This is cool, and I don't know when this will sink in," said Skelton, who still competes on the PRCA circuit. Williams qualified for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo 15 times (1988, 1994, 1996-2008), and Skelton has 22 NFR qualifications on his résumé (1990-2006, 2009-10, 2013-15).

Peterson, a four-time world champion, and her great horse French Flash Hawk, better known as Bozo, will fittingly go into the Hall together. Following on the heels of Charmayne James and her great horse, Scamper, it was Peterson and Bozo that ended James' streak of 10 straight world titles, capturing their first of four world titles in 1994.

McBride joins Peterson and Bozo in the Hall as another four-time WPRA champion. She will be inducted posthumously having passed away at the age of 90 on May 10, 2017. McBride first saw barrel racing at an open rodeo event in 1937 and decided at 10 years old that it was the path she wanted to travel.

Greenough, 54, qualified for the National Finals Rodeo 13 consecutive years (1988-2000), tied with Joe Alexander for the fifth-most overall NFR qualifications in PRCA history. His 15 career NFR go-round wins at the NFR is also fifth most in his event. Greenough won a bareback riding world title in 1993 and a NFR average title in 1992.

Greenough was also known for his success within the Montana Circuit, where he went on to win five circuit titles. Greenough remains tied for the most National Circuit Finals Rodeo wins among all bareback riders with three career wins.

Coffee cried tears of joy when he found out he was selected for induction into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. "To know that my heroes, my friends and heroes, who are in there, and I'm in there with them - that's just something I dreamed of."

As a PRCA Gold Card Member and

NFR barrelman, Coffee has enjoyed a long and lively career in ProRodeo as one of only three cowboys to be both a barrelman and a bullfighter at the NFR.

Since 1973, this Texas cowboy has fought bulls at the NFR twice (1979, 1984) and was a barrelman at the NFR in 1991, 1994 and 1997. Coffee also worked at the first National Circuit Finals Rodeo in 1987, the Texas Circuit Finals Rodeo (1980-82, 1992, 1996-97, 2003-04) and the Canadian Finals Rodeo twice (1985-86).

He was featured in many movies, including "8 Seconds" and "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys."

Garrison was two different types of cowboy, a fullback with the Dallas Cowboys and a ProRodeo competitor. He went on to combine his stardom with football and rodeo to raise more than \$4 million for multiple sclerosis with his Walt Garrison All Star Rodeos over the course of 20 years.

The Texas cowboy was instrumental in the U.S. Smokeless Tobacco and Winston sponsorships in ProRodeo and the programs those sponsors provided - such as the Winston Scoreboard, sponsorships for individual cowboys and helping college rodeo athletes get scholarships.

Minick was short on words when he received the phone call that he was being inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, only because he hadn't had time to process his new place in immortality.

Minick, born and raised in Fort Worth, Texas, began his professional rodeo career in 1959, enlisting in the Rodeo Cowboys Association after winning titles both in high school and college. Minick qualified for the National Finals Rodeo as a bull rider in 1966. In 1968, Minick purchased the Harry Knight Rodeo Company from Knight and legendary entertainer Gene Autry.

The Billy Minick Rodeo Company eventually produced top NFR bucking stock, including the bucking horse Streamer in 1972 and the bull Tiger in 1973. Tiger would also win Bull of the Year in 1974.

This summer marks a historic year for the Black Hills Roundup in Belle Fourche, S.D. Not only can the rodeo now boast being an inductee to the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, but this year will also be its 99th annual competition.

With the 2018 class included, the ProRodeo Hall of Fame will have enshrined 267 people, 34 animals and 29 rodeo committees. 🐾

OVERCOMING WEAKNESSES

My daughter does not like to miss. She's very cautious, will take extra swings to make sure she catches, and follows instructions to a tee. I have to challenge her to rope fast. Since she doesn't like to miss, she has trouble taking a risky throw. I really have to push to get her out of her comfort zone.

My son, on the other hand, is the complete opposite. When Kaleb and Junior came and roped with us before the NFR, Junior quickly became Gabe's hero. I decided to practice a little reverse psychology on him. To head for Junior, I put him on one of my horses and told him he could come over the top of the chute and rope as fast as he wanted. I truly thought he wouldn't want to miss for Junior and it actually had the opposite effect. He probably missed the first 10 or 15 steers and I kept thinking any minute he was going to just go catch one. I bet he ran 100 steers in three days and caught less than 30% because every run was two swing and then fire.

Now in the practice pen he has to catch three "high teamers" and once he does that, he can come over the chute and throw fast. If he doesn't catch three in a row, he doesn't get to throw fast. It's completely different scenario with Hali. If she catches three, then I make her rope fast once. Miss-

ing makes her want to catch the next one, where it doesn't affect Gabriel at all. They are complete opposites with completely different mindsets.

The both have their weaknesses and I'm always encouraging and pushing them to overcome. Don't get me wrong... I don't really get onto my kids in the practice pen. I think it's important to praise them when they do well. Some parents really get mad and onto their kids when they miss in the practice pen. I find it ironic that they then expect so much of them in competition. As someone who has roped their entire life, and for a living, I understand how complicated it is and how many things can go wrong.

However, I'm huge on preparation for competition. I expect my kids to watch the roping and pay attention to the steers to give themselves a chance to win. That comes from how I was raised. The only thing my dad ever got mad at me for was when I floated my heel loop... or when I was playing football during the roping. I

got in trouble for that a lot. I loved football and there was always kids playing football at the ropings. Other than those two things, I don't remember getting in trouble for failing. One the way home, my dad would ask what I learned, and what do we need to do next week to better prepare ourselves. Understanding why you failed at competition, and how to prepare yourself or your kids for it not to happen again is key.

As a young man, in my late teens or early 20's, I would be gone every weekend and make as many rodeos as possible. One weekend I hauled my back up heel horse and my calf horse, and left my good horse home. When I got back my dad asked me why Medicine Man was standing in the stall. I answered that he was missing the corner and I couldn't see my shot. My dad's response was, "Really?" We saddled horses and my dad got on Medicine Man, laid the reins on his neck, and held onto the saddle horn without roping. He did this behind three steers and the horse worked perfectly. He rode up to me and said, "Now do you think it was the horse, or pilot error?" I have never forgotten it and had he not shown me that it was pilot error, I may have quit riding the best horse in the barn.

My point is you need to have access to someone who understands the sport and horsemanship to recognize the weaknesses, and show you how to work on it and progress.

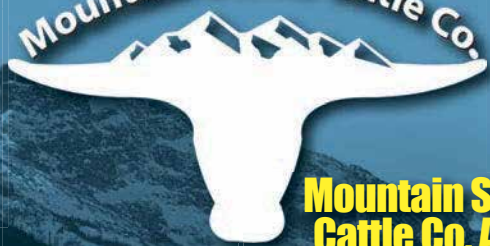

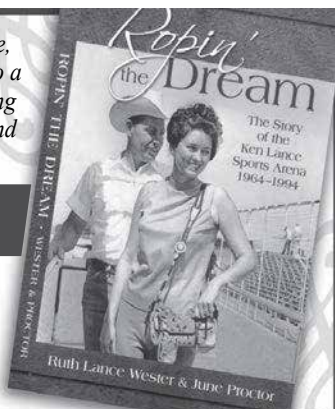
"My favorite thing about this job is the relationships I've built over the years. It's more of a friendship than a business relationship at this point."

times. He was crowned state champion calf roper during his sophomore and senior years.

"When I was 18, I moved to Texas. The weather was more favorable for roping and I knew I could rope more often against some great ropers. Shortly after moving I realized the calf roping was very competitive – more so than I had anticipated. Later I met Shaun Burchett, a world champion steer roper, and started roping with him. I grew to love the sport, mostly due to the horsemanship involved. In 1990 I was the PRCA Rookie Steer Roper of the year."

Stickley's first job in Texas was working in a warehouse for a company that sold pneumatic tools. In the early 90's he went to work for Jimmy Smith, of Smith Brothers, in Denton, Texas, putting on team ropings. He also helped manage the 1,800 head of steers Smith owned and leased.

Scott soon found himself working "road shows" for Smith Brothers such as Congress and the NFR and eventually went to work in the store full time. There he met visiting sales reps and decided it was a pretty cool profession.

"At one of the road shows I met Monty Crist, Professional's Choice, who convinced me to step out of retail and try my hand at being a sales rep," explains Stickley. "My first lines were Professional's Choice and Dutton Bits. At the time PC only had about five products so sales were nothing like they are today."

Now, years later, Scott has seen a lot of changes in the western industry.

"Sadly, the smaller 'mom and pop' stores are dwindling. The Internet has a lot to do with it, and the larger companies keep expanding. The changes I find exciting is the development of new materials used in sport boots, and rope making. High tech is making its way to the western industry."

When not traveling, Scott enjoys spending time with his wife, Regale, and two daughters, Jaci, 19, and Jesi, 14. He also ropes steers and team ropes.

"I still enjoy this hobby very much. I enjoy roping and like keeping current with the needs, ideas, and changes in products. Staying in the loop helps me service and relate to my customers' needs. 🐾"

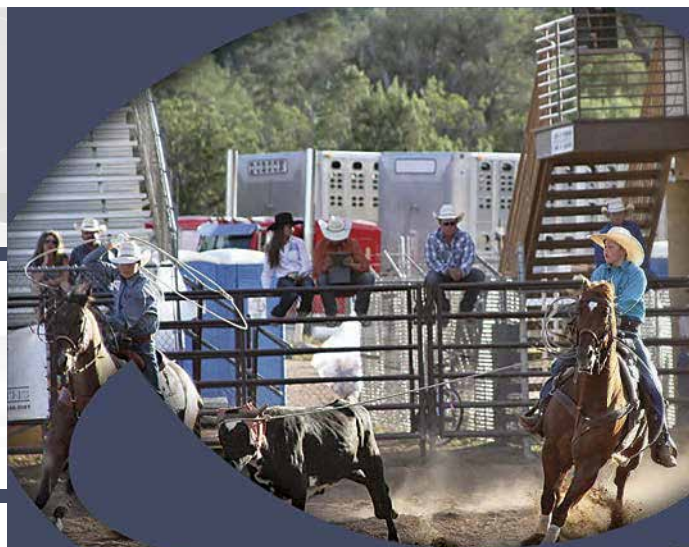

ROPING PHILOSOPHIES

article by Dale Woodard

This article is about roping philosophies. Do you consider yourself an aggressive roper or a conservative roper? I consider myself a conservative roper I have trained myself over the years not to take a bad shot or low percentage shot, however you want to label it. But I am always striving to be more aggressive. I do that through more speed on my rope and riding for better shape going down the arena and my entry.

I went to a roping thirty years ago that was a pick one, draw one. I drew a guy that I had seen rope for years who roped very conservatively. We ended up winning third in the roping and he was elated. As we rode out of the arena he said, "If I had a good heeler like you in the ropings I enter I could win more than I do." I thanked him for the compliment and we continued to ride back up the arena. And then he said out loud but sort of talking to himself, "I don't understand why I can't get good heelers to rope with me." At first, I didn't say anything and then I asked him, "Is that a question?" He paused for about thirty seconds and then he looked at me and said, "Yeah, that's a question, why don't I get better partners?" Now sometimes people say they want to know things but they don't. But I tried to help him. I told him that in my opinion it was because he roped too conservatively. I pointed out that he was always off of the barrier six inches to a foot on his starts. Then I said your horse runs good, but not exceptional so that puts you down the arena on ninety percent of your runs. Also, your handles are a little rough so it's hard as a heeler to throw until the steers kind of catch their balance and straighten out. Because of these two factors when he did win it's in the bottom places like we did today. And then if you draw a bad steer or a heeler slips a leg you finish out of the money. This guy just looked at me and said, "Hum," and rode off. My observations were true and right on and I tried to say it in a helpful way. Unfortunately, this information was not what this guy wanted to hear because he never spoke to me for two years after this conversation. Now, I'm reluctant to share my opinion to guys who ask why they don't win more.

The match rolled along and there was a lot of laughter and trash talking as you can imagine. When it came down to the last steer my partner and I were the last team to go and all we had to do was catch to win. Of course, the trash talking increased as we rode in to the box. I told myself to ignore the trash talk and do my job so I was focused on that. To my amazement my partner nodded for the steer, took one swing, threw and missed. Of course, everyone hooted and hollered when he missed. Everyone that is, except me. I was wondering why on just steers or medium speed when all you had to do I catch, would only take one swing. As we rode over to the other ropers my partner said with satisfaction, "Well, I told myself I wasn't going to safety up and I accomplished that." I didn't say anything but I wanted to say "Yeah, but you missed." Now to my way of thinking, there has got to be a happy medium between roping too conservatively and taking a dumb shot just to prove to yourself that you rope aggressively.

So I guess this article comes down to the question I asked in the beginning, do you consider yourself an aggressive roper or a conservative roper? Remember, the first rule of winning is, don't beat yourself. In this case that can go both ways. One guy ropes so conservatively that he catches but hardly ever wins and the other guy takes dumb shots and misses. My goal is to rope more aggressive and try not to take dumb shots. 🐾

Meet the Member Hadley Dunnehoo

Whether it's one of the Zac Brown Band songs, like "Chicken Fried" or a catchy rap song he knows the lyrics to, when Louisiana cowboy, Hadley Dunnehoo hears it playing as he backs in the box, he's feeling positive. "I just zone everything out, back in the box and just say to myself: this is it, I'm about to have a good run, I know I can go rope this steer."

Hadley is a sophomore at Reeves High School, in his hometown of Reeves, Louisiana, where he lives with his supportive parents, Ryland and Michelle Dunnehoo. Rodeo comes naturally to the 17-year-old cowboy, and he doesn't remember much of his life that hasn't included having a rope in his hand. "Since I was at least 2-years-old, I have been carrying a rope around, roping my toys or anything I could." Both Ryland and Michelle had some influence on that, as Michelle competed in barrel racing in the Louisiana High School Rodeo Association during her youth, and Ryland team ropes, mostly heading. Hadley's uncles, Josh Dunnehoo and Reggie Dunnehoo, both team rope, and Reggie used to ride bulls. Reggie's son, Bryce was Hadley's roping partner in junior high. The whole family gets together at Hadley's home arena to practice and enjoy roping together.

Hadley entered his very first rodeo, when he was in 6th grade, and competed all three years in the Louisiana Junior High Rodeo Association, as a team roping heeler. During those years, he was a 3-time state finals qualifier, 2-time average champion at state finals, and he qualified and made the trip to the national finals in Lebanon, Tennessee his 8th grade year.

This year in the LHSRA he is heeling for his new partner, Morgan Sparks. Be-

cause they live two hours apart, they each practice separately, but are coming together as a team quite well at the rodeos. He has a positive outlook for what the year will bring for the team.

Most of Hadley's chores around his family's ranch include taking care of horses and cattle. He generally feeds before school, and after school he and his cow dogs will pen the steers up so he can get ready to rope. He's grateful for his friend, Paul Hebert who comes over quite often to head steers for him. The horses he rides are both bay Quarter Horses that mean a lot to Hadley. Roxanne is 13-years-old and is the mare that he rode when he won the average champion titles and went to nationals. She was given to him by a special family friend from Whitesboro, Texas, Seth Jordan, who is like an uncle to Hadley. "He means a lot to me, he has helped me a lot with my roping, and everything." Hadley says Roxanne knows her job and does it well. "Nobody wants to mess with her when it's time to rodeo, she's all business." Snoopy is Hadley's 19-year-old, back-up heel horse, that can be grumpy sometimes, but overall has a great personality and Hadley feels like he can do anything on him.

U.S. History is the class that Hadley is most interested in while he's at school. He loves learning about the wars of our country's past; how they started and finished. Other than that, he is more focused on getting the days done, so that he can get back to the roping pen. When he isn't roping, Hadley and his friends enjoy fishing for Bass and hunting for Whitetail Deer, as well as mud-riding on their 4-wheelers.

Once he graduates, Hadley hopes to go to college, and is considering becoming an electrician. He first wants to give the path to the WNFR a shot, as he dreams of being one of the top heelers at the pro-level one day. There are a couple professional ropers, Patrick Smith and Ryan Motes, that inspire Hadley to work towards that dream. "I've learned from them to stay aggressive, and not get lazy with my rope. No matter what, don't give up, keep on pushing." But, they're not who Hadley looks up to above all. "God has helped me out in my life the most, and He's got me where I am with my team roping." 🙏

Meet the Member Ronnie Jackson

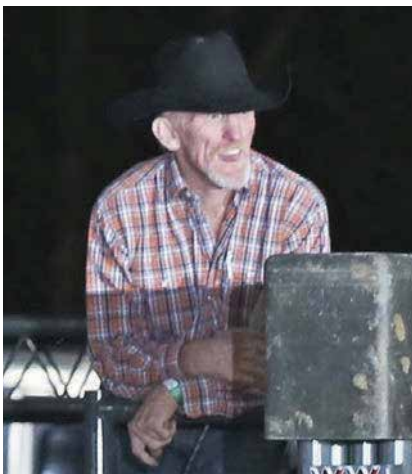

While working at the 2017 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas, Nevada this past December, Ronnie Jackson suffered a traumatic brain injury that has changed his life. Ronnie's only child, 24-year-old son, Tyler Jackson, spoke with us about Ronnie's life as well as the details of the devastating injury.

Ronnie is a long-time cowboy that was born and raised in Salem, Arkansas. His father, Homer Jackson raised and traded cattle; and handling cattle and later riding bulls, has been a lifetime career for Ronnie. He began riding bulls in the Arkansas Cowboy Association, when he was just 16 years old, and although he's not riding bulls now, he's been a member of the association for nearly 40 years. In the early 90's, Ronnie won the ACA Championship Bull Riding title a couple years, and started riding bareback horses, so that he could win the all-around champion title in 1991.

To say working with and around bulls has been a major part of Ronnie Jackson's life, is quite an understatement. When not competing as a bull rider, Ronnie has made a living working in various capacities at many bull riding and rodeo events. Ronnie has worked as a judge and in the back pens at many ACA, PRCA, PBR and CBR events all over the country, and has been a well-respected, experienced cowboy for the job. He has also worked loading and hauling cattle at the Salem Sale Barn, which was previously owned by son Tyler. Tyler did try riding steers when he was younger, but once he started roping, he did not follow with the same rough stock passion that his dad had, and instead stayed with team roping. He has been a member of ACA and made the season finals in team roping every year since 2010.

This past WNFR was the third year that Ronnie had traveled to Vegas for the honor

of working the prestigious event, and it was Tyler's second year working at it alongside his father. It was during the calf roping in the 10th and final round of the finals when the accident happened. "My dad is very experienced and was always extremely careful, that's why he was chosen for the job, but sometimes things just happen out of your control." Tyler was working just down the arena from his dad, helping take ropes off the calf-roping calves, while also opening the slide gates to let bulls through to the chutes. Ronnie was working down further, pushing bulls down the alleyway to be loaded in the bucking chutes. Ronnie saw one of the bulls turn around in the alleyway, heading back towards him instead of loading in the chute, and quickly latched the gate between them to keep him from coming further. The bull smashed into the gate, causing it to come unlatched and hit Ronnie in the head. It was a harrowing scene, as they waited for the paramedics to come to his side.

Ronnie was immediately transported to the UMC Trauma Center with a trau-

matic brain injury, several fractured bones in his face, and a fractured eye socket and skull. Ronnie remained in a coma-like state during his care at UMC and then Kindred Hospital, for nearly 50 days, before regaining consciousness. Ronnie has since been moved to a rehabilitation facility in Benton, Arkansas, which is about 3½ hours from home, to continue his recovery. Tyler does his best to keep working and everything cared for at home and makes the trip over to Benton so that he can consult with the hospital staff and visit with his dad every couple weeks. "I've seen a lot of improvement in the past month, he was confined to the wheelchair but when I saw him yesterday he is getting around really well with a walker, he's gained some weight back, and looks much better." Tyler is hopeful that Ronnie may possibly be able to come home from the rehabilitation center in another month. Tyler mentioned with appreciation, that the Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund, and some other private donations, have been a great help to Ronnie. "There have been so many calls and offers to help, just too many to possibly mention, and they are all so appreciated." 📺

Meet the Member Randall Pringle

If it's got four feet and a heart-beat, let's get him caught," is the mindset that Randall Pringle, of Lowndesboro, Alabama, has when he sees cattle in the arena or out on the open range. Whether he is looking after his own herd, doing day work for local ranches, working at the Montgomery Stockyards, or entered at a Southern Pro Rodeo Association event, catching cattle is a big part of his day to day life.

Randall grew up in Lowndesboro and is happy to be raising his own family there now, surrounded by lots of family, and friends of a lifetime. He and his wife, Cynthia, met while they attended rival high schools and have been married for 10 years. Cynthia drives a bus used for collecting and transporting blood donations. They are raising their 11-year-old son, Tuf in the same lifestyle Randall grew up in. Tuf competes in junior rodeos and loves to ride rough stock but has been picking up his rope a little more, starting to lean towards team roping like his dad.

Randall has found that when you love what you do, you never work a day in your life. He lives just 12 minutes from the Montgomery Stockyards, where he has worked since he was in high school; and has spent most Mondays there since, filling every position that's been needed along the way. He is usually horseback to run cattle thru the sale, works as an agent

to buy cattle for others, and often drives truck for the sales barn as well. The days he's not at the sales yard, he travels all over to help customers that need cattle caught. Although it started as a fun weekend job as a teenager with his friends, it is common for him to travel as far as Florida and Tennessee with his cattle dogs, to track down and catch rogue cattle for pay. It makes perfect sense that with all the riding Randall does at work, that he has a pasture full of horses to ride. Most days he is training young rope horses of his own or riding outside horses for customers.

Randall's brother, Thomas Pringle Jr., is 16-years older than Randall, and brought him into the competitive sport of team roping. After high school, he helped him make the transition from roping cattle in

the open, to roping steers out of the chute, and Randall found that he really enjoyed going to jackpots where he could make several runs with several partners. He went to mostly USTRC jackpots for a few years, and in 2014-2015 he started trying more rodeos. In 2016, Randall ended the season as the Reserve Champion Heeler in the Southeastern Rodeo Association.

This is his rookie year in the SPRA, where he is heeling for Jesse Cook. Randall and Jesse have been roping together for quite some time, and although Randall used to head for Jesse, they have swapped ends. "Jesse has been rodeoing all his life, he grew up in the rodeo environment, and I grew up in the working environment with wild cows. We're like 50 and 50 to make a 100-percent team." One of Randall's favorite pro-ropers is Kollin VonAhn, "He helped at a clinic I went to. He is really tremendous, my caliber of fellow, and he taught us a lot."

Randall's main heel horse is a 5-year-old Quarter Horse named Sparkplug. Randall purchased the flashy dun gelding as a yearling from the Bartlett Ranch. "He is laid back, but if you ask him for a bunch, he'll give you way more than you asked for. He'll just sit an idle like a car until you ask him for more, he's a real cool little dude."

The biggest difference Randall has found between roping cattle in competition and in the open, is time. "In the pasture you're going to have a second shot most of the time, and you have all day to do it. I'm not usually called on the job that we don't get the cattle caught. At the rodeo, you may have to beat a team that was a 4 the night before, so there's pressure to catch fast, and if you miss, that's it."

Meet the Member Kevin Wickey

Sometimes, it can't be explained why the heart yearns for the things that it does, but Kevin Wickey of Mendon, Michigan, has a heart that was drawn to bull riding in a way that he knew he couldn't ignore. At just 16, against the wishes of his parents, Kevin stepped on to his first bull, at a rodeo in Ohio, and his passion for bull riding has only grown, since. Kevin has been riding bulls for four years now, and although initially against the idea, even his parents have joined in on his cheering section.

Kevin was born and raised in Michigan with his parents, Amos and Clara Wick-ey, as the second-oldest of four Wickey brothers. They are each about 1½ years apart in age, and include, Steven, the oldest, followed by Kevin, LaVon, and LaWayne. The boys didn't grow up in a rodeo or bull riding atmosphere, as they were raised in the Amish community, until the family left the Amish when Kevin was around 14 years old, but now in addition to Kevin, his brother Steven rides bulls and his younger brother LaVon started riding in Michigan High School Rodeos last spring.

After the family left the Amish, Kevin worked construction for a few years, and then worked at Lakota Horse Trailers, where his dad is a manager, his mom works making cabinets for the trailers, and his brother Steven works as a welder. Kevin now works building campers for Dutchmen RV.

Kevin won his first buckle at a local bull riding series put on at the Triple D Rodeo Arena, winning the Open bull riding division, when he was 17 years old. He also bought his first SEBRA card that year and went to many rodeos all over

the eastern border. He lost a little of his confidence during that year, and started to slow down a bit, hitting some of the smaller rodeos until he was able to boost his riding confidence again.

Kevin decided to join the Mid States Rodeo Association, with the goal of winning the 2017 Rookie of the Year. Although he was not able to go to many of the early season rodeos, he did quite well at many of the summer rodeos he went to between July and October and came in to the 2017 season finals in good position for it. He traveled to many of the rodeos with his bull riding coach, Marcus Mast, and although Kevin looked up to Marcus for guidance, they also enjoyed the rivalry of competing against one another. At the 2017 MSRA season finals, Kevin's favorite ride was on a black-and-white, beast of a bull that hadn't been ridden by any others to attempt it all year. That ride helped him finish the finals, riding two of his three bulls, winning second in the average, and accomplishing his goal of winning rookie of the year. After a tight race,

he and Marcus ended up just about \$100 apart at the season's end, with Marcus winning the championship at the finals.

One of Kevin's other rides he likes to remember was at an IPRA rodeo in Charlotte, Michigan, when the chute boss dared him to ride his bull wearing a blinged out barrel racing helmet. He not only rode the bull in stylish attire but won second place on his bull while he did it.

Kevin loves to watch professionals like J.B. Mauney, admiring his moves, "I really like his style, but it's hard to do it his way, I watch him and some other pros and use a combination of what they do to make my own way of riding." When Kevin isn't riding bulls, his favorite hobby is to spend time with his girlfriend Colby Robertson at her parent's ranch. He's grateful to Travis and Terry Robertson for all the time he gets to spend there at the ranch riding horses. "My best bull riding practice isn't actually getting on a bunch of bulls. I think riding horses helps me a lot." 🐾

Meet the Member Danielle, Dakota, & Kiowa Tempest

Rodeoing and competing in the APRA is a family affair for brothers Dakota and Kiowa Tempest and Dakota's wife, Danielle. This is her first season in the association, and the brothers' third. All three have their eyes set on making AFR 41, but it's more important that they reach that goal as a family. "My brother, Paul Kerrick, is bull riding, and Dakota and Kiowa are bronc riding, and I'd be at home taking the kids to a jackpot," says Danielle, who barrel races. She and Dakota make their home in Branchport, New York. "I thought one day I should give rodeo a shot, and my first day out I pulled a third-place check. This year I actually got my card, and it's easier all going together. We keep it a family thing and everybody supports everybody, and we don't have trailers going in two different directions."

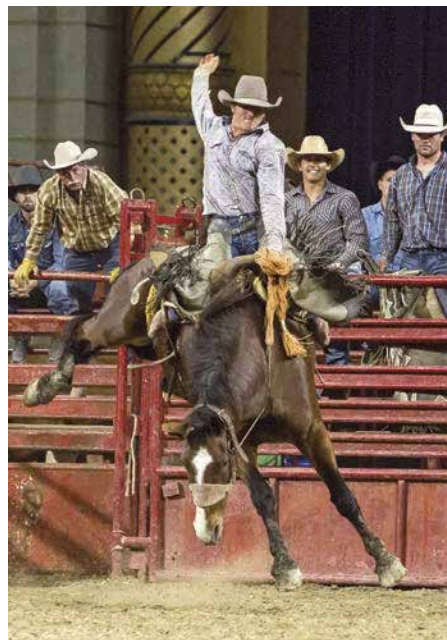
Danielle, 32, grew up barrel racing, while Dakota and Kiowa grew up riding horses and branched into team roping when they were 7 and 9. Both brothers trained horses, and didn't mind the occasional wild ride. "I think saddle bronc has appealed to me more, which is hard to believe because Chris LeDoux is one of my favorites," says Dakota, 23. "It's the most cowboy sport," adds Kiowa, 20, who lives in Beaver Dams, New York. "That's the original event, and that's why I really wanted to do it."

A friend and fellow APRA saddle bronc rider, Justin Rhoads, helped Dakota and Kiowa get on their first bronc. Another APRA member, Theron Seeley, gave Dakota his first bronc saddle, and the brothers put in hours of practice at Sam Swearingen's arena in Attica, New York. "That first year was a lot of miles we put on



getting bucked off, but it's gotten better the more we get on." Dakota and Kiowa are stacked first and second in the APRA standings, and they both competed in AFR 40 last year. "We're happy if the other one wins," says Kiowa. "We're there to help each other, and we're not jealous of each other. I get on my spur board a lot, and I'd like to start roping more, but I'd like to get the broncs figured out more first, and get faster with the feet. Bar 55 of Rawhide Rodeo is a nice horse to get on—he's pretty honest."

Dakota and Kiowa still team rope together occasionally, Dakota heading and Kiowa heeling, and they entered NTRL ropings before focusing on bronc riding. "We've been going to Ty Eglin's jackpots at Lucky E Ranch to practice our bronc riding, and when all else fails, we take our sister's bucking horse out of the pasture," says Dakota. "It's a saddle horse

that likes to buck." He helped Danielle train her barrel horse, Wimp, who liked to buck at the start, and Danielle finished the quarter horse gelding, who is now 11. "I got him three years ago, and he's kind of my diamond in the rough. He came a scrawny little thing, and we started slow. I trotted him for a whole year and then loped him for a whole year, and here we are trying to make it in rodeo. From when I was a kid, my dad was the one on the top of the fence helping me, and my mom hauls with me when I go to local shows and jackpots. If it weren't for Dakota, I would never have gotten my card. Once I started in the APRA last season, Julia Prebula, also a barrel racer in the APRA, was a big help giving me advice and showing

me the ropes.”

Danielle, Dakota, and Kiowa all agree that the APRA rodeo in Attica is one of their favorites. “They put on a really good show, as well as being family-oriented, and it’s local and good added money,” says Danielle. “What we like most about it (the APRA) is that it’s a family event. No matter if it’s Pennsylvania or the Adirondacks, everybody comes to us saying they’ll take the baby or take care of our daughter. They’re great.”

Dakota and Danielle have a 6-year-old daughter, Rhiannon, who loves horses and was a peewee barrel champion last year, and a 1-year-old son, Ryder. Rodeo is their family and vacation time, along with camping and trail riding in the state forests around their home. Danielle is an office manager, and Dakota works in construction and concrete, and he also shoes



and trains horses. A big goal for their family is building an arena at their house so they can work horses from home.

Kiowa is also in the construction field, working for a roofer between rodeos. “The guy I work for lets me take quite a bit of time off to rodeo, and when I’m not doing that, I’m training horses at the house. They’re mostly for myself. I have two I’m working on right now.” He also loves spending time outdoors, fishing, and bow and deer hunting. “My goal for the finals this year is to make the finals again and maybe get a chance at winning it,” he says. Danielle is working toward the same goal of qualifying, and so is Dakota. “I’d like to try to win the AFR this year. I came in the middle last year and the last hole the year before, so we’ll make a pretty good run this year and see how the season goes.”

Meet the Member Chelsie Clingen

While Chelsie Clingen has grown up around horses and barrel racing her entire life, it was only last year that the Canadian cowgirl from Ontario made a concentrated effort to foray into rodeo. The move was admittedly a bit of a culture shock for Chelsie, primarily a futurity horse trainer and rider, but it was a new world that clearly had a lot to offer.

"Rodeo changed my mindset and gave me a whole new appreciation for anyone who rodeos," Chelsie says, adding that getting used to riding no matter the weather, even when that meant driving 16 hours to draw up on the rainy day, took some time.

That being said, Chelsie has been accustomed to perseverance all along, coming from a horse family. Chelsie's grandparents had working cow horses, and her mother barrel raced, passing the love of the sport on to Chelsie who even met her husband and now co-trainer through the sport.

"It has definitely taught me a lot about myself. It has probably made me a lot stronger and to have a lot more passion for the sport and the respect of horses and rodeo in general, and it's really taught me even though you can be in the lowest of lows,

you can usually get out of it. It only lasts a little bit, and then you'll be back on top," she says of barrel racing's life lessons.

And one thing Chelsie learned last year about rodeo in particular is the built-in support system. "No matter where you go, it's a huge family. Everyone is so friendly and supportive, and you're all doing the same thing. You're all wanting to win, even though you're competing against each other, you're all there for the same reason and in it for the same passion that you have," Chelsie explains.

Last year as a rookie in the International Professional Rodeo Association, Chelsie got to experience that rewarding roller-coaster ride.

"I started out with a young horse actually that I didn't have an intention of going really far with him, but he proved me wrong and really stepped up his game and started winning some bigger rodeos, which was great, and then mid-season started to do very well," Chelsie says. That run of wins helped Chelsie to finish in the top-four of the rookie of the year race, but

an injury caused Chelsie to just miss qualifying for the International Finals Rodeo held in Oklahoma City.

"In September I actually made the Northeastern Region Finals, and [Chelsie's horse] slipped, and I broke my foot. I was sitting 16th and I probably would've made the IFR, so that put a kibosh on the whole entire rest of the season," she laughs adding earnestly, "so last year was a lot of ups and downs, and a huge learning curve for me and that horse as well."

But Chelsie credits the support of her husband and family with helping her get through the year, and gives thanks to God for the ability and opportunity to ride horses and rodeo. And no doubt, she'll be gearing up as soon as the snow melts in Canada to return to the IPRA's circuit in Quebec and Ontario this summer in another bid there for IFR. 🍷

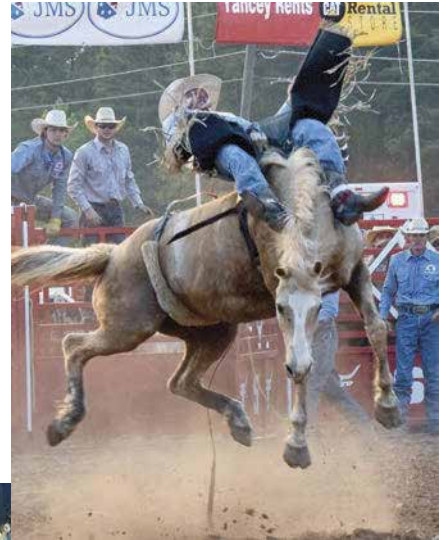
Meet the Committee

American Hero Pro Rodeo

The IPRA-sanctioned American Hero Pro Rodeo in Evans, Georgia, has been around for more than 14 years, but the meaning behind it has evolved in the last three. “Dr. Joseph Still started the rodeo back in the 80s as a way to raise money for the burn victim’s foundation. The rodeo kind of fizzled out over time, but the new director of the burn center Dr. Mullins decided he wanted to

to educate kids about how to escape a burning building, along with mechanical bulls, a free-kid zone and entertainment each night, there is truly something for everyone. “We try and bring in local bands to play each night and are lucky to have Coriander Blue back this year. You get a lot of entertainment, fire safety and education, you get to see a rodeo, band and this year a car show, all in one place in one weekend.”

start it up again,” said David Speight, nurse and chairman of the rodeo committee. The name changed from Rodeo Nights to what it is today, and so did the beneficiary of the funds raised: Ronald McDonald House. The committee is made up mostly of hospital staff. “One unique aspect of our rodeo is that the people putting it on do not have much experience with rodeo, except for my wife Wendy and I. We have all really come together and made it a successful event.”

As a past roper and a current rodeo judge, David takes ideas from the events he attends and brings them back to implement. “We are always trying to add things to make it bigger and better. We have created an entire festival around the rodeo. We have the typical vendors set up outside of the rodeo and then some things we do during the performance.” The two-day event held each April invites the fire department

Hedrick Rodeo Company out of Madisonville, Tennessee, has been the contractor for the past three years. “Danny Hedrick is great to work with. He is the kind of contractor that doesn’t just tell me what he is going to bring, he really works with me to bring what we want to the rodeo.” David can remember having over 300 competitors some years, enough for slack every night. “I can remember one year waking barrel racers up at two in the morning to run in the slack. We always have a great turn out for both the competitors and spectators.” With seats packed tight, standing room only reaches all the way out to the midway. “Before the name change, we would have a hero night to honor our military, policeman, fireman, EMS, and burn victims from the center. They would get in free that night. Now that we have changed the name, they get in free both nights. It hurts us at the gate, but it is something we will always do.”

Entertainment during the rodeo includes

a calf scramble, Guinness World Record Trick Roper Ray Kozak and the chance to win a Honda side-by-side. “Street and Trail donated a Honda side-by-side to be given to one lucky spectator during the Saturday performance. We have a boot toss and whoever makes it in the barrel will drive away in it. We are trying to get a Dodge truck donated to give away at some point in the future. We also do cash prizes for shorter tosses.” In years past, there have been ring tosses, wheelbarrow and relay races during the performances. “I like to give things away: money, prizes, admission. A lot of people get in free to this rodeo, probably more than should, but as long as we have a good donation to give to the Ronald McDonald House, that is what truly matters at the end of it. It would take a lot of space to recognize everyone who helps pull this event off. Without our sponsors and the community support we would not be here year after year. The goal is to keep building it and to put this event on for as long as we can.”

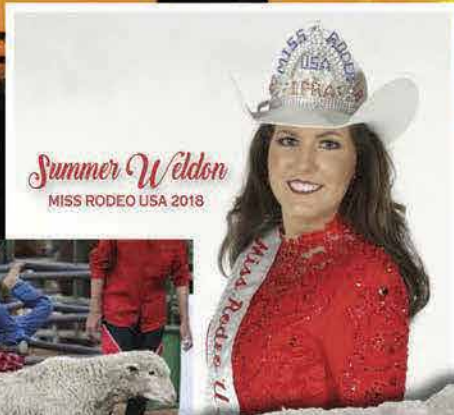

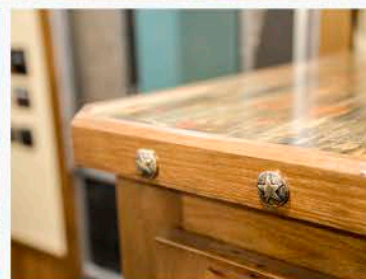
