





KEITH MADDOX

June 1, 1945 – September 4, 2019

eith Maddox, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, friend and businessman, passed away Wednesday, Sept. 4, 2019. CELEBRATION OF LIFE: 10 a.m. Friday, Oct. 4, 2019, at the Cowtown Coliseum in the Historic Stockyards of Fort Worth, Texas, with a reception to follow. MEMORIALS: In lieu of flowers, a scholarship will be set up through the National High School Rodeo Association in memory of Keith Maddox or you may donate to a charity of your choice.

Keith was born June 1, 1945, in Weiser, Idaho, to Dwight and Marjory Maddox. The oldest of three, Keith left the home ranch at the young of age of 16 to follow his dreams. While putting himself through school and competing in professional rodeos at 13, Keith was determined to live his life to the fullest. Due to Keith's skills and ability to win in the rodeo arena, he was recruited by many colleges. Keith first attended Casper Community College where he competed on the rodeo team and roomed with Chris LeDoux. He graduated

in 1971 from Eastern Oregon University. Keith was a man of many traits and talents, working with the world's most iconic western brands: Tem Tex, Bailey Hats, Tony Lama Boots, and Larry Mahan. He was one of the first salesmen to travel his territory as his own pilot in his plane, to beat the competition. He was never one to fail.

While in Torrington, Wyo., he made an infamous name for the Broncho Bar, as the owner. Keith married Susan Stear on March 19, 1988, and their love flourished for 31 years, there was no greater love. Pri-

or to the marriage, Keith went out to build his own companies with Susan by his side, first Sierra Oil and Gas, which was established in 1987, in Keller, Texas. Later, The Best Hat Store established in 1996, in the Historic Stockyards of Fort Worth, Texas. The store is still operating to this day. Always aspiring for more, in 2003, Keith purchased a long-sought after hat company from Conroe, Texas. Later known to many as the world-renowned American Hat Company, of Bowie, Texas.

Keith was an active member in highly regarded organizations, including Ranchero Visitadores in California, Tejas Vaqueros in Texas, the Verde Vaqueros in Arizona, where he was instrumental in building the membership with key people from around the world. In Keller, Texas, he was a charter member of the International Rotary Club and a member of the Met Church. Along with being a lifetime PRCA Gold-Card Member, Keith will be honored as an inductee into the Idaho Rodeo Hall of Fame in October 2019.

Keith made a difference in the world and had an uncanny ability to make people feel good about themselves, while positively impacting individuals of all ages. His brand was Positive Times, and he lived by this every day. He once said, "I've never had a bad day. I had a bad 15 minutes one time, and I will never do that again." His accolades will forever live on, and his contagious laugh and million-dollar smile will forever be in our hearts. As Keith's spirit is now with us, all his memories will forever be spoken, and we know he will be looking down on us with his 1000X halo.

Keith was preceded in death by his mother and father, Marjory and Dwight Maddox. SURVIVORS: Loving wife, Susan; daughters, Treasure and Mercedes; son, Bret, husband of Nichole, father of Easton, Lillie, and Sophie; sister, Vicki; brother, Dave; and numerous nieces and nephews



On the Trail WITH

DOUG CLARK

"WE GREW UP IN A BIG OLD RODEO FAMILY AND I MARRIED INTO A BIG RODEO FAMILY - MAKING A LIVING DOING WHAT WE LIKE DOING IS PRETTY AWESOME."

oug Clark will receive the coveted Ben Johnson Award at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum's annual Rodeo Historical Society's Hall of Fame Gala on November 9. Doug was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma. "I grew up in a saddle shop – Veach Saddlery – which belonged to my grandfather, Charley Beals, and was started 100 years ago by his father in law, Monroe Veach." He spent his summers and every day after school at the shop. "I helped make saddles and repair things. My dad tooled all the saddles for years there and it's a family business so we did a little bit of everything."

He started tie down roping when he was 10. At that same time, he started competing in the junior rodeos in all events. "They were called FFA rodeos," said the 57 year old that calls Wayne, Oklahoma, home. "I was fortunate enough to be around the right guys and my dad was quite a horseman. We are a huge rodeo family, so that's all we do." Doug and his family lived in Tusla and in the early 70s they moved 90 miles east of there to get out of town. They built an arena and that's where Doug really started honing his skills. He went one

year to the IPRA rodeos, competing in tie down roping and team roping (heeler), earning the title as Rookie of the Year in the tie down roping. He hit the road in the PRCA circuit in 1981, as soon as he was 18. He was ranked in the top 20 year-end standings for several years, winning the top rodeos and invitational ropings of the year, nationwide, while traveling on a part-time basis. He was the PRCA's Prairie Circuit Champion tie down roper and competed in many circuit finals in that event. He set an arena record at the Cheyenne Frontier Days in 1987 when

they roped calves weighing 280-300 pounds, as well as winning their coveted championship buckle for the all-around title in 1995. He added steer roping to his events entered and in 2005 earned the Pendleton, Oregon Round-Up steer roping championship. The win helped boost him to the qualification for the 2005 PRCA National Finals Steer Roping where he won second in the average and top horse of the finals.

"I went as much as I could – I never set a goal to win this or that. I was training and traveling with some of the top guys so I couldn't really go as much on my own." Doug was riding and selling what he was riding to those guys. Doug has had horses either owned or ridden by Clark Quarter Horses at the National Finals Rodeo and National Finals Steer Roping Finals for over 30 years. Much of Doug's career has been riding and training horses for the top

ropers of the day, like Trevor Brazile, Tom Ferguson, and Roy Cooper. Never 'living on the road' entering and competing in rodeos, Doug's real passion and specialty has been in training horses and people in a clinic format and one-on-one training in his home. "My dad was a great horseman — a quiet mild mannered gentleman — and learned how to be a good judge of horse flesh." Doug was influenced by the old timers — great horsemen and ropers.

Along with the pros, Doug and his wife, Linda, have had the privilege of helping kids along the way. "We've had a lot of kids come live with us over the years. We still take kids in who want to get better in rodeo – but really it's all about life – it all goes together." Every one of the kids that have come through his doors has learned

about everyday living. "That includes everything from riding 20-30 horses a day, shoeing, fixing corrals, cleaning pens – you name it." It's the Doug Clark school of hard knocks. The kids come in, learn how to be horsemen – sleep on a lumpy old couch and work alongside Doug to achieve their goals.

"The parents entrust us with their kids and that's a huge compliment," says Linda, who is the cook, but doesn't admit to being the cleanup. Doug and Linda have one daughter, Darcy, who

competed as well. Doug and Linda got married in 1985. "We met on Valentine's Day at Baton Rouge at a rodeo," he recalls. Six months later Doug and Linda were married. Darcy was born in 1991, and joined the rodeo road when she was young. "When Doug was horse showing, she went along. "We won a lot of awards including the Super Horse in 1999 one year, competing in all the roping events." He was a trainer and exhibitor and judge during his time at the AQHA. Darcy competed on Doug's old roping horses

and qualified for the CNFR in 2008 in the barrel racing. She also won the breakaway at the IFYR in 2006. Darcy and her husband, Billy Good, a steer roper, still hit the rodeo road. Linda works part time as well as running a courier business with her daughter, Equine Courier Services, driving 10,000 miles a month delivering semen and embryos.

Not only does Doug train horses and hold clinics at

training and even owning three of the many horses recognized as finalists for the AQHA/PRCA Horses of the Year, which is an award voted on, annually, by top ranked cowbovs.


Doug has enjoyed his entire career and life being around the horse industry as a fourth generation rodeo participant. "I enjoy what we do and I want to keep doing it. We've got some good kids and some good horses," concludes Doug. The Ben Johnson award is bestowed upon a person who has had a notable career in the arena, as well as,





every age and skill level in all roping disciplines, but for many years he showed horses in the American Ouarter Horse Association. He was one of the teammates winning the 1999 Super Horse Award showing the stallion, Look Whos Larkin. Doug also has been involved

working outside the arena helping others to achieve their rodeo and personal goals. "I was honored with the award - I didn't even know I was in there – it's not what happened in the arena as much as what you can do for other people and helping them get where they want to go."

ELIZABETH ANN KESLER

June 10, 1926 -September 7, 2019

lizabeth Ann "Liz" Kesler was born June 10th, 1926 in Clay County, Texas, to Chesley Russell and Irene Faulkner Russell. She died at the age of 93, on September 7, 2019 in Henrietta, Texas. She had one sister, Margie, two years older. Funeral services were held at Bluegrove Baptist Church on Saturday, September 14th at 2 PM. She will be buried in the Bluegrove Baptist Cemetery in the family plot.

Liz went to Bluegrove School until her last two years at Henrietta High School.

She then became Assistant County Superintendant of School for eight years. She attended Draughan Business School. She was an excellent administrative professional and later went to work for Standard Oil.

Liz's main love was rodeo, and the people in it. As a young woman, she and good friend, June Bull, a barrel racer, began to secretary and time rodeos. In time they worked rodeos all over the country. Liz often worked for Everett Colborn who had some of the biggest rodeos in the country. June married Buster Ivory and Liz was her maid of honor in 1954. In 1966 Liz met Reg Kesler, a three-time Canadian Champion All-Around Cowboy who had become a rodeo producer. They married in Bozeman, MT in 1971 and lived in Missoula, MT and Rosemary, Alberta, Canada. They produced rodeos in Denver, Houston, San Antonio, Idaho, Montana and Canada. Often Reg took stock to one rodeo and Liz headed to put on a second rodeo. Reg knew Liz was capable of handling any rodeo the right way. The young men starting their rodeo career admired and respected Liz and what she did for them in their early careers. They never hesitated to find her years later at a rodeo or rodeo reunion to pay their respects. Reg and Liz were instrumental in starting the PRCA Circuit Finals in 1987 held in Pocatello, ID. Liz secretaried the first circuit finals held in Montana. Liz also taught others in Canada and the U.S. to be rodeo secretaries. She and numerous other wives of important rodeo leaders started the Ladies Fashion Show at the National Finals Rodeo at Oklahoma City in 1967, that continues to this day during the National Finals with proceeds going to the Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund. Liz and Reg became involved with the Cowboy Reunion, with and other rodeo couples, which was held during the final days of the National Finals. The proceeds from the event were given to the Justin Cowboy Crisis Fund, the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, and the Rodeo Historical

Society. Liz was also a founding member of H.A.N.D.S., a fifty member group of rodeo women dedicated to helping rodeo families who have health problems, loss of a loved one, or other disasters.

When Liz' mother became ill she and Reg moved back to the ranch at Henrietta and Liz cared for her mother until she died at age 98. Reg, age 82, on a business trip to Canada in 2001 and was killed in a tragic automobile accident. Liz was always active in Clay County and became one of the founder of the Clay County Historical Society, and became the chairperson for the renovation of the museum in Henrietta. She was always involved in the Pioneer Reunion and Rodeo held each September and



was chosen Pioneer Reunion Queen in 2000. She was a member of the Bluegrove Baptist Church. Her greatgrandparents gave an acre of land for the Bluegrove cemetery and she was a member of the cemetery board. She was also a Memorial Hospital Foundation Board Member. In 2010 Liz received the Silver Award from the Retired Senior Volunteers of North Texas (which includes 17 counties). She was the 2013 Outstanding Senior Citizen of Clay County.


In the rodeo world she was honored by the Womens Professional Rodeo Association in 1984 for her contribution to them making Montana rodeos available for barrel racers. She received the Montana Governor's Award for preservation of our western heritage in 1986. In 1988 Reg and Liz were honored as Outstanding Citizens of Missoula, MT. Their outstanding bucking horse, Three Bars was inducted in to the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in 2004 and Liz accepted. Liz and Reg were inducted in to the 2008 Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame. Liz received the Tad Lucas Memorial Award at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in 2010. Liz and Reg were also inducted in to the Montana Wall & Hall of Fame in Billings in 2010. In 2013 Liz was honored by receiving the American Cowboy Culture Award as Pioneer Woman at the Cowboy Symposium held in Lubbock, TX.

She is survived by her niece, Phyllis Jones; Kasey, Brian, Asa & Roxy Byrne; Shane Patton; Jamie, Suzy, Rita Kenny, DJ Patton; Becca, Reg, Kaia, Leo; and numerous cousins and life-long friends.

Reg Kesler's children in Canada daughters, Jeanne Kesler Cesar (Lee), LeeAnne Lane (Keith), Pat Kesler Norton (Gary); Judy Kesler (Mrs.Greg), Dale Clifton. grandchildren Canadian Mark Cesar (Ashlev); Jesse Cesar (Amanda); Angie Cesar Nelson (Curtis); Allan Norton (Clarissa); Tim Norton (Pam); Steven Norton; Richard Norton (Michelle); Loni Norton Snow (Todd); Lori Norton Fowler (Sam); Christy Lane Boot (Henry); Lydsay Lane; Randy Brauer (Susanne); Wendy Fox; Shawna Tanner (Don); Duane Kesler (Margo); and Berva Dawn Kesler (Roy) and numerous great & greatgrandchildren.

Back When They Bucked with LYDIA MORE

"PRETTY GIRLS ON FAST HORSES."

ydia Moore was raised in a rodeo family in Missouri. Her parents, Hazel and Percy worked for many rodeo and wild west show companies traveling the country with her older sister, Maudie, and younger sister, Percyna in tow. Maudie was a trick rider and roper and Percyna had a goat act. In fact, Percyna was actually born in a tent while on the road for the Colonel Jim Eskew Wild West Show.

Lydia was forced to stay home most of the time as a tot with her grandfather, John Hickey, due to poor health. "I had no stomach lining when I was born," said the 80-year-old, who now resides in Wayne, Oklahoma. "I drank goat's milk and built up my resistance." She finally grew out of the condition when she was ten years old and learned the art of trick riding and roping. "My dad taught me trick roping and my mom taught me trick riding," she said. Rodeo season back then didn't last all year like it does now - her parents were gone from April until September and the other months they were home. When they were home, they trained horses that went on to perform in wild west shows, movies, circuses, and elsewhere.

Her parents, Hazel Hickey Moore, a noted circus equestrienne, who gravitated towards the wild west show side of entertainment when she married her husband, saddle bronc rider, and steer wrestler, Percy Moore, both instilled in Lydia a love of horses and all things western. Famed trick roping performer, calf roper, and steer wrestler, Billy Buschbom, also helped Lydia with her trick and fancy roping and gifted her with her first set of ropes. "The Buschbom's and my family were very close friends and worked for many different wild west show companies." As a youngster, Lydia performed with her family in dressage and trick roping acts, and won many talent contests as a teen with her skills.

Lydia's dad, Percy, broke his leg while competing on a saddle bronc, Preacher, Dun, at a rodeo produced by Monty Reger. The rodeo was in a resort called Sylvan Beach in Kirkwood, Missouri, a suburb of St. Louis. The family settled there while Percy recuperated, and afterwards was hired to manage the boarding stable. The entire family worked at Sylvan Beach. Young Lydia and Percyna worked as lifeguards, took riders from the boarding stable out on trail rides, as well as running pony rides. They also performed different circus and wild west show acts that Percy, Hazel, and Lydia were in.

Lydia was introduced to barrel racing by accident. "The annual St. Louis Fireman's Rodeo produced by Tommy Steiner, was in town around the early 1960's. Wanda Bush, Fanny Mae Cox, and Boots Tucker, all barrel racers from Texas, were in town for the rodeo. They didn't have enough barrel racing contestants, which was a new event for the rodeo. Wanda reached out to a local horse facility, Valley Mount Ranch, since Wanda knew they were starting to have barrel races at that arena. Lydia was one of the ladies invited to enter.

Lydia went to a few barrel races, but due to her own family responsibilities, she was unable to pursue it. "I wasn't driven like the

Lydia to Stanley Draper and Bobbie Steenbergen from the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce who worked with Clem McSpadden, Buster and June Ivory as the group managing the National Finals Rodeo. "It's hard to imagine, but during the early years of the NFR in Oklahoma City, there was little interest in the Finals. When it first moved there, tickets didn't sell well—we had dinners and parades in downtown Oklahoma City to sell the event."

With the NFR's move to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma barrel racer Florence Youree worked with Stanley and Bobbie to bring on the barrel race as one of its standard events. Florence's pitch worked and the event was sold as — "pretty girls on fast horses," Lydia said. Needing a liaison for the barrel racers, as a go between to handle any issues barrel racers had, Lydia was hired. She worked in that capacity until 1985 when the NFR moved to Las Vegas.

other girls were. I was more interested in the administrative side." In the early 1960's she helped form the first chapter of the Girls Rodeo Association. "A group of barrel racers in the St. Louis area got together, and since we all worked full time, we had some administrative skills and used the guidelines of the GRA to form the chapter. We had advisors that we knew could help us, and they were instrumental." While living in St. Louis she met one of her mentors famed rodeo secretary June Ivory. Lydia learned to secretary and time rodeos from June, and over the years worked for many stock contractors like Beutler & Sons, David Bailey, and Jim Shoulders' rodeo companies, and is a longtime PRCA gold card member.

After Percy Moore passed away in 1962 from emphysema, Lydia's mom, Hazel, moved in with Lydia and her toddler daughter, Linda. (Lydia only has one daughter, Linda). Percy had been a lifelong smoker. He started smoking as a teen like most young men of that era. He either rolled his own or smoked non-filtered cigarettes. He was even hired as a young man to model for a few Chesterfield cigarette ads.

When Lydia made the move to Oklahoma City in 1967, it was with her mother Hazel, sister Percyna, and daughter Linda. She worked as a secretary for an oil field company upon her arrival. Before moving to Oklahoma, June Ivory had introduced

Adding to her jobs at the NFR, Lydia was hired by NFR manager McSpadden and stock superintendent Ivory to handle all secretarial duties in preparation for the National Finals each year and also ran the NFR press room with Arlene Worley. "Two weeks before the finals as the livestock came in, Buster and Clem needed someone to type the stock lists, so since I lived there, I'd take my vacation during the Finals and type the lists as the contractors came in." "It was fun - Buster and Clem were wonderful. It was great to be part of it. They were so super to work with. And I knew all the contractors from

secretarying and timing rodeos.

Lydia also received the task in those early years of the NFR as the GRA Awards Chairwoman for the barrel racers garnering thousands of dollars of awards for the ladies each year. "I wrote letters to various companies and everybody I saw that had a business, I asked for awards. I was even able to get a car and a horse trailer donated. Imogene Veach Beals who owned a large western store, Veach Saddlery, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, was the first donor I got." Lydia's dedication came from her interest in doing something for the girls.

Continuing her interest on the business side of women in rodeo, she served five years on the GRA board of directors as Bull Riding and Southeastern Region Director, before being hired as the executive secretary in 1973. "At that time, the GRA had all of the rodeo events – we had a lot of all girl rodeos – we used to have approximately one a month back in the day – we had a lot of great girls. Unfortunately, they don't have any all girl or women's rodeos anymore."

GRA president Margaret Clemons hired

Lydia on a six month trial basis to be the secretary of the GRA – that tenure ran for two years and every two years they had an election. "I was at the meeting as the Southeastern Director and was hired by

the board. I was able to quit my day job and I really became involved in the women's rodeo part there." Since her position came up for renewal every two years, there wasn't a lot of job security in it. Her job ultimately lasted nearly 25 years.

When she got the job, she converted her garage into an office. "There were a few boxes of records, 400 members and \$800 in the bank. (A GRA card cost \$25 in 1971, for example.") (The WPRA card cost \$150 in 1995, the last year we were in the WPRA office). When she left there were 2,000 members and the association was financially secure. "We ran a very efficient office and did everything we could for the members - Jimmie Munroe and Pam Minick were great at promoting the association." She enlisted the help of her daughter, as well, along the way. "We all enjoyed working in the WPRA office," said her daughter, Linda Clark. "Percyna and I did the newspaper and we are all a very close unit. We've always worked together. I typed envelopes on an old IBM Selectric electric typewriter when I was 13 I totally loved it."

"She was the glue that held the WPRA together," said Pam Minick. "She ran the association like she ran her household she tried to save all the money she could. It was a 24 hour a day job for her." Pam went to her house every October to help stuff envelopes for all the contestants. A prized honor she received in 1991, known as the WPRA Coca-Cola Woman of the Year, was awarded to Lydia for her years of service, passion, and devotion to women in rodeo, and rodeo in general. "I was absolutely thrilled. When Coca Cola put together that award for our association it was fabulous. Wanda Bush was the first honoree, Jimmie Munroe was the second, Pam Minick was the third, and I was the fourth." The coveted bronze statue was created by artist and NFR qualifier Karen Galemba. Lydia feels fortunate to have seen firsthand the phenomenal growth in the sport of barrel racing that it enjoys today-barrel racing as a standard rodeo event, equal money at rodeos, and equal money at the National Finals Rodeo.





t is exciting to start the new college rodeo season. All of the returning team members are back in town, and all of the new team members are getting settled in. Just like any team the expectations are set high for the new year for every team across the country.

As I write this article we are just entering our third week of school, (by the time the article comes out we will have been to a few rodeos). The first few weeks of the new year are always an interesting time to watch and observe. For the past thirteen years each group has been different, and each group has shared many of the same characteristics.

For the most part everyone is excited to show up and go to work in the practice pen—in fact as a coach you usually see more people in the practice pen daily for the first few weeks than any other time of the year.

As a coach you learn a lot about your team and individuals during the first few weeks.

First of all you learn who your hardest workers are. Sometimes it takes more than the first few weeks to figure this out but usually by the first 2-3 weeks any coach can identify who the hardest workers on the team are. Most of the time the kids on the team also will realize who the workers are. It is interesting to note that students either gravitate to the hard workers, or avoid them.

Secondly you will have your team leaders emerge. The team leaders aren't always the most talented on the team, but I do believe that they are always the most passionate about their event. Their enthusiasm is usually

highly contagious for those who compete in their events.

After a few weeks of practice you will start to see some students weaken. Most of the time these students fit one of two scenarios. Their parents really want them to compete in rodeo and now that their parents aren't around to babysit them, they do not continue to put the effort their parents pushed them to. The second group had a lot of success in high school, now that the level of competition has risen they are not willing to put in the work to rise to the next level.

Then after the first rodeo or two the dynamics of the individuals really changes. It can go many different ways for anyone on the team. Those who have early success at the early rodeos usually stay energized and keep working hard in the practice pen. Those who didn't do well will either really buckle down and start to put in the work to improve and be competitive or they will go the other way and just continue to do the same things in the practice pen and expect better results.

I think that rodeo contestants should be able to look in the mirror and self-evaluate where they fit in this spectrum. If not sit down with your coach and make sure you are maximizing your opportunities.

or this article I want to give a little progress update thus far in our journey. I say our journey for a reason. There are so many people tied to this story other than just myself. I'm not the only one that has been impacted by this wreck. My wife, my family, my friends, the people I didn't know before that I have met since, the prayer warriors that are still praying and standing in agreement for the miracle, all the people along the way that have have helped us out, my doctors, therapists, and everyone else in between. I have been blessed with such a huge support group and I can't thank everyone enough for the prayers, kind wishes, help, and belief in me and what God is doing and going to keep doing through me for his glory at the end of this season. Thanks also, for following along checking in on progress. It's been a heck of a ride that's for sure. Bumpy at times with a few steep decline mountain switchbacks but, we're still on the uphill climb, and I'm not about to let off the throttle just yet.

So, this is the month that I'm going to have my one year anniversary, post wreck. September 22nd will mark 365 days since we began down this journey. I've came a long ways and have learned a lot in the last year. I've learned patience. I've learned perseverance I didn't know I had. I've learned how to adapt and overcome like never before. I've learned the ins one out of wheelchair life. I've learned how to be a dad (still learning this one). I've learned how to truly put everything in God's hands and trust his plan. I've learned how to place things so I can always access them. I was short before but the last year I've been really vertically challenged. But seriously, I thought I knew or had these characteristics before, but I have really learned them and enhanced them in the last year. Although, the situation isn't ideal for me. I would definitely rather be walking, running, jumping on my feet, I know my character has been refined, built up, enhanced, and made stronger. I know once I'm out of this waiting season all the lessons I've learned and the character that's been built in me will be used for something great down the road for God's glory.

On Labor Day, Shelby and I loaded up Ryatt (our son) and headed for Utah. I had been invited to a charity pheasant hunt, that Clint Robinson puts on for people with disabilities. Since I knew I was going to be there for the hunt, I scheduled a week of rehab at my old facility, Neuroworx. I wanted to get retested to see how much progress I've made since coming home in April, and see what their thoughts were and what to do moving forward. We checked back into our old apartment room Monday night and prepared for rehab the next morning.

The next morning it was like dejavu. The room felt the same. The stroll down the sidewalk to rehab was the same. Everything about the morning was like we had never left. We strolled into Neuroworx, and of course everyone was excited to meet the baby. They all came and said hi to the little man. Then, my former therapist from the time I was down before took me back to a mat for retesting. The moment was upon us. Had I made any changes since being home? Had I worked hard enough? Was I going to be able to walk? These thoughts began to flood my mind and I just said a quick prayer to myself and said "Lord, your will be done. Let any new results bring glory to your name. Bless his hands and the work we do this next week. And bless this place as it is changing lives, thank you. In Jesus name, Amen."

The first test was a sit up. With my legs hanging off the table, and arms crossed I tried to sit up. I got about half way or a little better. Matt, the therapist was impressed. The time before I could only sit up about a quarter of the way. Next test was a reverse sit up. So leaning forward laying on my lap trying to sit back up straight. I gave it a go and I made it about half way up as well. Time before I couldn't even get started off my knees. Next test was side to side and forward reach without losing control of my trunk. Each direction I could reach about five inches before loosing control. About four inches more then when I left. This concluded testing and Matt was happy to see I made so much progress. Doesn't seem like much but in this game progress is progress. He told us first of all we don't usually see people back when we send them home with an at home program, and we definitely don't expect to see this good of results from at home therapy. So, I had jumped a level on every test and was on the right track. I didn't have any new significant leg movements that they felt like I needed to stay and work there yet, but I had made leaps and bounds on trunk control and strength. So, the next step was to work our way down and begin getting more hip control. They said when I get hip

control and get those muscles stronger and firing better, it will be a game changer. So, we got to work. The next three days we put our heads together, tried new movements, and came up with a different set of work outs to head home with, challenging me and focusing on getting my glutes to fire, and gaining more control at my waist.

Then Saturday came. My old leather working buddy from down there, Kent and his son, Craig picked me up and we headed to the bird hunt. There was about twenty other people in wheelchairs all ready to shoot some birds. We gathered around had a little safety meeting, like don't shoot the vehicle next to you and don't shoot the dogs. We each loaded up in a side by side and in groups of five we headed to different fields. At each field there was dog handler and a couple dogs. He turned the dogs loose and away we went. We followed behind until the dogs got on point. Once they sniffed one out, a few gathered around it, got set and in position leaning the gun out the front window of the Ranger. Once we were set they would flush them up and the shooting would begin. It was an awesome experience. I hadn't been bird hunting since high school, so it was good to get back out and do some hunting. It was a great event, and all the help setting up, taking down, and everybody that pitched in to make it all happen is greatly appreciated!

Over all it was a great trip, filled with good news. God is good and he is faithful. He's still on the move. We're still believing in the miracle. We're back home and back to work, picking away. I'm excited to see where I'll be in 365 more days!



Meet the Member Oceane Veilleux

ceane Veilleux traveled 10 hours from Saint Alfred, Canada, to Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania, in May, qualifying for her first Junior World Finals and also winning the senior barrels. The 14-year-old heard about the qualifier while competing at the BFA World Show in Oklahoma City last year, and she and her dad, Julien Veilleux, knew they had to give it a try. Oceane and her mare Dr. Rise N Shine "Sid" ran a 16.022 to win it, a run that delighted Oceane in more ways than one. "I was very happy because she was very easy during the run, and she's not usually as easy as that," she says.

Only a week prior to the qualifier, Oceane and Sid took a fall when the mare slipped on some ice, but the pair was okay with the exception of a broken saddle.

With four horses to ride at the Bloomsburg qualifier and two saddles, Oceane and her dad had to hustle. Their next adventure starts in late October when they head to Oklahoma for the 2019 BFA World Championship, the first of several stops that will break up what would be a 48-hour trip from her front door to Las Vegas. "We're going to go to a ranch and a couple futurities, and then we're going to Las Vegas," says Oceane, who is switching to homeschooling for a semester while she travels for several months. She's also competed in Texas, and traveled as far south as Cancun, Mexico, for vacation.

When she's home, Oceane competes in youth barrel races, rodeos, and futurities. She started riding horses before she could even walk, and began entering competitions when she was 8. "My dad is the person who's always helped me with the horses and taught me how to ride. Caroline Boucher is one of my trainers too." Along with her main barrel horse, Oceane also has several barrel futurity horses coming up. She and her dad raise horses and purchase yearlings as well, training them for barrels. Both Caroline and Oceane ride for Julien at futurities, and Oceane exercises her own three horses every day. Her futurity horse Heaven Guy ran the fastest time at a futurity this summer and is currently in second place in the futurity standings in eastern Canada. "My horse My Derby won the BFA World Futurity with me last year," Oceane adds. "I have to do something with Sid every day because she has a big personality. Sid is the Latin word for one every day. We named her that because she requires attention daily." Oceane also enjoys swimming and water skiing in the summer, along with snow skiing in the winter.

"I have goals at the beginning of the year and I try to achieve them. And once I achieve one, I try to achieve another. One of my goals is to win a big youth race here in Quebec, the Legacy Cup. We have to accumulate points and right now I'm first, and in a couple of weekends it's state," she explains. "I love barrels because it's speed and I love speed, and it's really challenging. In futurities, your horse may go very well, and then the next day you could do anything. We always have problems to solve. I would like to one day go to the NFR. It was one of my goals to do the youth NFR too, and one day I hope I can win them. I want to continue barrel racing as I get older, and keep doing futurities too."





Win Three Consecutive WCRA Majors - Win \$1,000,000

he World Champions Rodeo Alliance (WCRA) recently announced the most athlete-friendly incentive in the history of rodeo: the WCRA Triple Crown of Rodeo (TCR). The TCR is an annual bonus that will pay \$1,000,000 to any one athlete or collection of athletes whom win first place in any three consecutive WCRA \$1,000,000 Major Rodeos. Two of the \$1,000,000 WCRA Major Rodeos next year will be coupled with a Professional Bull Riders (PBR) elite series event in a major U.S. market while three TCR events in 2020 will be broadcast on CBS Sports.

"We endeavor to lift the entire sport of Rodeo," said WCRA CEO Gary McKinney. "The WCRA Triple Crown of Rodeo is another tremendous advancement for all stakeholders; the athletes, the rodeos and the fans. Historically, outside of the road to the finals there has been no platform or continuity to align major rodeos – the TCR provides that vehicle."

The current 2020 schedule includes three major rodeos where athletes can qualify for the TCR \$1,000,000 bonus, beginning in Kansas City, Missouri for the Royal City Roundup on February 28. The Kansas City event will be followed by the May 17 Stampede at The E in Guthrie, Oklahoma. The 2020 series is scheduled to wrap-up in Tacoma, Washington on August 28 with the Puget Sound Showdown. The Kansas City and Tacoma events will be paired with the 2020 PBR (Professional Bull Riders) Unleash The Beast tour with all WCRA majors airing on CBS Sports. (The full CBS broadcast will be set and released at a later date and is subject to change.)

"The three rodeos CBS Sports brought to fans this past summer from Green Bay, Salt Lake City and Calgary, reached more than 3.1 million unique viewers, proving a strong market for major rodeos in mainstream media," said Sean Gleason, CEO, PBR. "The WCRA Triple Crown of Rodeo is an exciting addition that will bring more drama, news value and fan buzz to major high-payout rodeos."

The TCR bonus will be available to all athletes who nominate their current rodeo efforts through the WCRA Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) and are crowned champions at three consecutive WCRA Major Rodeos.



This revolutionary annual incentive is not limited to just the WCRA 2020 season, rather, it allows athletes to rack up wins on a rolling calendar basis. This means athletes' three consecutive wins can cross calendar years, however, the \$1,000,000 bonus will only be paid one time annually. If two or more athletes achieve this milestone at the same time, the bonus will be split.

"Our 2020 WCRA Major Rodeo Event Series is already scheduled to pay over \$5.1 million," said WCRA President Bobby Mote. "The TCR is the platform that links this on-going series of events together from a media and public relations standpoint – with athletes in pursuit of the \$1,000,000 bonus at every event. This is a big damn deal."

Athletes from around the globe have the opportunity to compete in the WCRA Major Events Series and compete for the TCR after qualifying through the VRQ. Qualifying for the Royal City Roundup is currently underway and athletes can continue nominating until December 1. All rodeo athletes interested in learning more about the VRQ should be directed to wcrarodeo.com while those inquiring more about the TCR may visit triplecrownofrodeo.com.

Fans will be able to witness the first Triple Crown of Rodeo stop at the Royal City Roundup at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Missouri February 28. Tickets for the one-day \$1,000,000 major rodeo go on sale Monday, Nov. 4 at 10 a.m. CT and start at \$10. All tickets for the event can be purchased at the Sprint Center Box Office or by visiting sprintcenter.com.

Since launching in May of 2018, the WCRA and its partners have awarded more than \$5,600,000 in new money to rodeo athletes. All rodeo athletes interested in learning more about the WCRA or the VRQ should be directed to wcrarodeo.com.

World Champion Cooper Lane

ooper Lane finished his rookie year in the NLBRA with two world titles, winning the junior boys bareback steer riding and saddle bronc steer riding. "I didn't even have time to come home from the Junior High National Finals. My good buddy Benny Proffitt won the saddle bronc steer riding and I was second, so that made me more hungry to go at it at the Little Britches Finals," explains Cooper, who spent more than two weeks on the road this summer. The 13-year-old from Keller, Texas, won the first round in both his events at the NLBFR and went into the short round sitting first in the saddle bronc and second in the bareback. He emerged the winner with seven buckles, two sets of spurs, two saddles, two hats, and several college scholarships. "It was really great! I'd never been to the Lazy E Arena and I really liked it. I ended up roping some goats, and getting some snow cones and spending time with my friends."

Cooper rides tall in any of his champion buckles, but saves his world saddle bronc steer champion buckle for special occasions. He rode bulls for a short time, but bronc riding has always been his goal. "My cousins did saddle bronc, and I just love getting on the backs of saddle broncs and bareback horses and getting to spur. I live towards the city, so it's fun to get out there with my rodeo friends, and I just enjoy living that lifestyle.

"My main coach is my dad, and my uncle Justin. I've also been coached by Bret Franks, and Billy and Robert Etbauer. The person I look up to most is Brody Cress. He's good family friends with us, and I look up to him as he rides broncs. Robert Etbauer and Bret Franks were my uncle's traveling partners, so that's how

I got to know them. My uncle Justin has a daughter my age, Jaylee Lane, and she won the pole bending at the NJHFR, so my uncle was there to help me out," says Cooper. "I also want to thank American Hat Company for sponsoring me." He traveled to the NJHFR and NLBFR with his parents, Brent and Pam Lane, while his 17-year-old sister, Macy, held down the fort at home and practiced with her high school dance team.

Along with his many coaches, Cooper attributes his success to practice and the help of his steer, #27. "We have some ponies if I need to get on bucking ponies, and a few good steers helped me get my mark out down, like #27." Cooper qualified for the NLBFR in nine or ten rodeos, competing at the NRS Ranch Arena. "I wanted more places to ride, and Little Britches was right by the house. I thought it looked like fun and I really got to liking it. I'm planning to do Little Britches again

this season, and hopefully I can win both events again."

Along with rodeo, Cooper loves to play sports at Keller Middle School, where he recently started eighth grade. "Rodeo is my main sport, but I also do football, basketball, wrestling, pole vault, and track. It's never a dull moment. A lot of my friends live in the neighborhood behind me, so I also like hanging out with them and going to the gym or playing games," says Cooper. "I would like to win high school state for Texas (THSRA), and maybe go into Nationals and win that, Hopefully I'll get a scholarship to college rodeo for Texas Tech. I want to be an engineer, but I also want to be coached by Bret Franks. Hopefully I can be coached by him and then go pro and go to the NFR."

World Champion **Ben Kramer**

en Kramer is the 2019 NLBRA World Champion Bareback Rider. The 18-year-old represented his hometown of Denbigh, North Dakota, while competing in his first NLBFR this summer. He qualified within five rodeos at the Northern Plains NL-BRA in St. John, North Dakota, before making his first trip to Oklahoma with his parents, Shawn and Melissa Kramer. "It was kind of all out on the table—I was just going to see what horses I drew and let everything sort itself out," says Ben. "I drew a couple of the nicest horses there probably, and that really helped me out. I made some pretty decent rides on them, and everything just worked out in my favor. I hung around the rodeo grounds quite a bit and saw a lot of good friends from North Dakota."

Ben and his older brother, Parker—the 2018 NL-BRA World Champion Saddle Bronc Rider—are the third generation of their family to ride rough-

stock. "My dad, my uncles, and my cousin all rode bareback, and my grandpa too," says Ben. "Rodeo was just something I was interested in since I was a little kid. We got some practice horses and it took off from there." Ben started riding broncs when he was 16 and joined the North Dakota High School Rodeo Association. He was the NDHSRA state champion bareback rider all three years he rodeoed with them, and competed in the NHSFR each year. He made the short go in 2018 and finished in the top 10 in the nation. Ben also joined the NLBRA in 2018 with his brother. "High school rodeo and the NLBRA has taught me a lot of life experience, and I've made a lot of good friends and gotten to know everyone in the rodeo family."

That rodeo family includes Steve Waagen, owner of Wild Man Rodeo Company, who, along with Ben's dad, has helped Ben advance his rodeo career. "My dad is always there for some good advice and support, and Steve is the contractor around here, so he has practice pens and puts on rodeos. He brings really good horses, and if you don't have good horses, it's really tough to learn." Ben also rides the bucking machine at his uncle's home when he needs to practice, and works on the spur

board at home. "There's usually a couple rodeos a weekend, and there's quite a few places Parker and I will go and ride at together," says Ben. "I watch videos of my rides. My mom videos every ride that she's there to watch."

When they're not rodeoing, Ben and Parker run the fencing business they started a year ago, building cattle fences around the state. Ben,

who was homeschooled and just graduated this spring, also enjoys carpentry and taking on odd jobs. Riding his family's saddle horses and starting colts occasionally also keeps him busy, but his main focus is furthering his bareback riding career. "I love the excitement and the thrill," says Ben, who recently started pro rodeoing on his PRCA permit. "I really like the way Orin Larsen rides. I haven't met him yet, but I'm thinking I'll run into him at one of these pro rodeos. I've been to three pro rodoes so far and I've finished in the top three in all of them. It's very official and everything is a little bit stepped up, so you have to step up too and that's good for you. Next year I'd like to win the circuit finals."

GROWING IN ALL SEASONS OF COMPETITION

["Always do your best. What you plant now, you will harvest later." - Og Mandino]

e have all witnessed seasons of winning and harvesting our hard work, be it someone else's season or our own. The problem is a winning season does not last forever. During times when we are not winning it's important to plant seeds and fertilize them so you can grow.

How do we start planting seeds?

Seeds in barrel racing are knowledge, horsemanship, fitness and mental strength. Any time you find yourself at the end of a harvest season it is time to prepare the field to grow and begin planting these seeds.

Today it is much easier for barrel racers to seek out knowledge and self-improvement strategies. The internet is full of videos, tips and tricks by some of the greatest riders and barrel racers. Many accomplished riders have written books,

compiled DVDs and host clinics. Take advantage of these! Much can be learned from those who have experienced multiple winning and planting seasons in their life. Another helpful tool is watching film. Study your winning runs and the winning runs of tried and true champions. Watch their hands, their feet, and their cues. Compare them to yours. What differences do vou see? There's never a wrong time to advance your knowledge. Even for the seasoned competitors, learning never stops. You will always encounter a horse with a style you have yet to master or arena conditions that you have never competed in. Don't make the mistake of thinking you are done learning.

Horsemanship is often an area that is forgotten. It is not glamorous and it requires consistency and patience. Not evervone is a horse trainer and that is ok, but to be successful in the arena it's important to understand what goes into a horse's foundation. Spend time with the people who put a handle on a horse. Ask them questions about what exercises they like to do to keep horses soft and supple. These basic techniques are essential tending to those seeds you are planting and preparing to enter into your season of harvest.

I like to remind everyone that we and our horses can never be too fit. Fitness stems from great nutrition and proper exercise. Are your runs technically correct but your times not as fast as you want to

be? Take some time to work on your horse's fitness and strength. Seek out training programs that will strengthen specific muscle groups used in turning a barrel. You will always reap the benefits of strict exercise program. However, don't forget yourself as a rider. Just like you work the muscle groups in your horse, focus on working out your legs and core. These muscles help you to grip and stay centered during a turn, and in an event where every millisecond counts you need to be at the top of your game. Furthermore, nutrition is vital. We feed our horses the best feed and supplements that money can buy, but all too often we take the easy route on our own nutrition. Take vitamins, meal prep

so you know you are getting the nutrition you need each day, and make sure before you ride that you have eaten and drank plenty of water. If your sugar gets low or you are dehydrated you will not have good reaction times.

In the barrel racing industry nerves and mental blocks never completely go away, but harnessing them and making them work for you and not against you is key. Speaking only positive things especially on race day is important. Never allow thoughts of "I'm not good enough", "what if I hit a barrel", or "my horse may not be fast enough" to creep into your mind. Coach yourself to a place where you can mentally push those negative thoughts aside. Remember, not every horse is in a season of winning all the time and some horses are just a stepping stone to your champion horse. Your job is to go in there ride your horse to the best of your abilities. If you can make a good run on an "ok" horse imagine what you could do on a GREAT horse. Riders get so busy wishing they had a better horse at times they never master the horse they have. Be the person that can make any horse look good and one day a horse will come along and make you look GREAT!


Every crop has a different growing season. Some crops are ready to harvest in a month or two while others may need to grow for a while longer! Remember; do not compare yourself to others. You are fertilizing, planting, and growing something of your own. Be faithful to grow the horse you have in this season and you will enter into your harvest season at the right time.



Braxton Corman of Burlington received the Rod Hinman and Carl Ellerman Memorial scholarships.


The Penny Corman and Doug Konkel Memorial scholarships were awarded to Kodey Hoss of La Junta.

Now in his 6th year of competition with the association, he is excited about this season's start in tiedown roping and team roping as well as serving as student board member for the first time. "I had a great first rodeo this season and am hoping to qualify for nationals this year. I'm heeling for Cooper Smith this season and looking forward to a great year in both my events."

David lives in Dolores, Colorado with his mom and stepdad, Stephanie and Shelby Rowe, and has a stepbrother, Pacen Rowe, who also competed in the CSHSRA association along with him before graduating last year. David is inspired by professional ropers like the legendary Cooper family and has developed a relationship with Roy, Tuf, Clif, Clint and the rest of the family as he has attended their family roping schools and spent time at their ranch roping with them. While there he's also received help with his horsemanship from Robert Johnson, known as R.J., and he appreciates all that he and the Coopers have all done to take him under their wing. He also appreciates all his stepdad's help with his rodeo career, horsemanship, and the mental aspect of competition. "I try to rope the dummy before I compete and look at the arena while I visualize my run. I like to look at the stock and talk to the stock contractor to get his opinion of the cattle."

David is looking forward to being a more active part of the association with his role as a student board member. "We'll get to attend meetings and help make decisions on national shirts, stock contractors for state finals, and help put on fundraisers."

eenan Hayes is going into the CPRA Finals as the All Around Champion as well as the Bareback Champion; he is also sitting sixth in the bull riding. This is his third year in the CPRA. His rookie year he only hit a few, made Finals, but had a high school rodeo the same weekend. "Last year it was a tight race between me and David Strewler, but I broke my jaw right before Finals, so I couldn't go to Finals."

The 16-year-old Hayden, Colorado, cowboy spent his summer concentrating on that goal in order to continue his aspirations to make the WNFR as a Rookie of the Year and continue his career in the bareback riding and bull riding.

Keenan finished out this year in the CSHSRA second in the bareback and third in the bull riding. Keenan took his talents to Rock Springs, Wyoming, for the National High School Finals and ended the year as the National High School Finals champion. He was reserve champion last year in Rock Springs as was determined to make it different this year. "It was a goal to win the Nationals - I hate not winning - especially being second last year – it drove me crazy all year, so I just really worked at getting on as often as I could and getting on the best horses I could. I just keep grinding and getting better." At the National High School Finals, it came down to the short round, where he was just a couple points behind the leader. "I drew phenomenal this year - the horses were wild - and that's what the judges liked."

Keenan, started on bareback horses eight years ago, and had already been riding bulls. He learned to ride from a lot of



different people. He went to Casey Colletti's school when he was younger and his parents got some practice horse for him in order to concentrate on his rodeo goals, Along with Casey, Keenan relied on Jake Booco to help him learn how to ride bulls. "I go through and watch videos from the year and watch and see what I have to do to improve. I never have been one to get hung up on what I did wrong but look forward to what I can improve on. You can cover a lot of horses if you are lifting and being strong in your legs. That should keep you mostly square and in time with them."

Keenan is enrolled in Goal Academy, finishing his high school requirements through that avenue. "It works pretty good – it gives me enough freedom to go rodeo."

His start comes from his dad, Donnie, who rode saddle bronc and bareback in the day. "He got me the right stuff to get started and a few practice horses when he was younger." His mom, Jackie, had never been around rodeo, but has always been around cows and horses due to the family ranch that they still run. He has an older sister, Kaitlynn, who runs barrels and ties goats.

Keenan is not sure about college. "I know I should go get something under me, but I'd rather just hit the rodeo road. He works out some, but gets the majority of his exercise from building fence and bucking bales on the ranch. "The ranching lifestyle has kept me in shape – and I like having the freedom to do what I want when I need to."

When he's home he also does a lot of mechanicing for his dad — we have a bunch of trucks and I spend a lot of time doing that. I learned that from working with my dad and granddad, who used to have an excavation and trucking company. We've always been around trucking and I've known how to drive them forever."

He has a schedule to get his schoolwork done before he goes to a rodeo. Right now he has a bunch of mini broncs (Rocky Mountain Mini Broncs) that he uses to help little kids get started. "We used to hold practice pens a few years ago, between me and my sister. She went to college and I went on the road. This year we had a few fair rodeos that we hauled them to. If we worked it more, I think it would be a lot more profitable."

He wants to ride bulls and bareback horses professionally and after that, he hopes to have a few bucking horses and bulls and start with the amateur level."



Don King Days 2019

on King Days began over Labor Day in 1989. It gave people a chance to honor Don King, the founder of Kings Saddlery in Sheridan, Wyoming. It was a one day event that year and Patrick Murphy of the SHERIDAN Press wrote "one of the largest crowds in the history of the Big Horn Equestrian Center showed up to watch the Wyoming Steer Roping Association Finals" Murphy also wrote that "Birney, MT cowboy Mike Lohof was the average winner" in 1989, his first of 3 DKD titles.

Prior to the festivities this year, the cowboys presented a large bronze statue of a steer roper set on a wood base with all the names of the previous winners inscribed. (there are 15 similar bronzes available for \$4500 each. Check with Kings for details. The sale will benefit the Wyoming Steer Roping assn.)

Will McBride first contested at Don King Days in 2000. Overall he's roped at Big Horn, Wyoming 15 times, compiling a 68% rate of qualifying on his steers. In 2013 he lost the title to Reo Lohse by 9/10ths of a second. He finished 4th in both 2014 and 2015.

Aside from Don King Days he has had good success in steer roping. In 2018 he claimed the title at the National Circuit Finals Steer Roping in Torrington, Wyo-

But Don King Days in special to steer ropers, much like The Ben Johnson in Pawhuska, Oklahoma. Though not a sanctioned PRCA event, it nonetheless holds great meaning. Wearing that buck-







le from Big Horn is a big deal.

And Will McBride had seen it elude him too many times. 2019 was to be different. Will roped and tied his first steer on Sunday afternoon in 16.8 to place 3rd. He improved to 16.0 for 2nd in the second round. And ended the first day of competition in first place in the average. Ora Taton was 6/10th of a second behind and 6 other men had 2 down.

Monday, Labor Day, was hot. Temperatures in the 90's early with little breeze. There were few fast times as the 3rd round began. Midway Ora Taton took the lead with 16.9, but Tim Tillard, 66 years old and roping in his 31st straight Don King Days, showed the boys he could still handle the rope. He took a slow loping steer and posted a

13.9 which eventually finished 2nd in the round. And when Will McBride backed in the box he knew he had a tough steer, one that hadn't been tied down yet. With his horse 8-Bills he was cautious and made sure the steer was caught and tied. And stopped the clock in 22.8. He now trailed Ora Taton by a bit over 5 seconds as the 4th round began. And those two weren't alone. If anyone faltered there were 5 other men who'd qualified on 3 steers. It was still anyone's game. When you're roping on grass with a long score the variables aren't to be ignored.

Round 4 began with JR Olson, a 2-time DKD champion, marking a 15.1 to set the pace. When Ora Taton roped he had the steer that had given Will trouble in round 3. Ora has never won at Big Horn, though he's qualified on 73% of his runs and is among the leaders in almost every category. He roped the horns, set the trip, turned the steer just as he wanted to do, but the steer hit the ground harder than Ora had expected and as he dismounted to go tie him, the steer bounced up and Ora took a disappointing no-time and fell from contention.

Several ropers later it was Wills turn. With Ora now out of the running Buck Meckleburg was in the lead on 4 head. Will had 28 seconds to play with. And he went about his business as he has on countless other occasions; nod, rope the

horns, trip the steer, tie 3 legs together and sweat out the 6 seconds given the animal to kick loose if he can. He couldn't and when flag judge Ted Thompson okayed the tie, Will McBride was the champion at Big Horn. His 15.3 on the last run gave him 3rd in the round and



70.9 on 4 head was first in the average. The money won during Don King Days also allowed Will to overtake Chris Glover to win the WSRA season championship.

Dane Noyce, who's originally from Wyoming, but now lives in Texas and runs the Senior Steer Ropers Association, came home to rope this summer and qualified in 2nd place in the Wyoming Steer Ropers Assn coming to Don King Days. He roped well, caught and tied 4 steers and finished 2nd in the average in 81.2.

Buck Meckleburg was 83.9 for 3rd place. Buck was 2nd in 2015.

And Brad Gjermundson had his best ever Don King Days, qualifying on 4 steers and placing 4th in the average. It's been a few years since Brad was the class of the PRCA Bronc Riding. He won the rookie of the year in Pro Rodeo in 1980... and won 4 saddle bronc championships, the final one in 1985. Three decades later he is still competing.

The hard luck place was Merritt Harris, the 2014 Don King Days champion caught all 4 steers in 98.4 but failed to place. Winning the go-rounds: Ora Taton in round 1 of 15.2 second. Tim Tillard in round 2 in 14.6. Casey Tillard 13.3 sec-

onds to win round 3. This also was the fast time of the event. It's the 2nd year in a row that Casey Tillard has had the fast time and 4th time overall.

And round 4 went to Troy Tillard in 14.8 seconds When the dust settled on the field, 79 of the 136 attempts were successful, far better than the norm. 13 of the ropers earned checks.

There are youngsters participating as well. They call them Steer Pushers... finding the steer ropers numbered steer, cutting him from the herd, and running him out the gate for the roper to compete on. In that category Andy Tillard was the winner.

Another feature of Don King Days is the bronc riding. A ten second competition just like the old days, with the horse saddled in the middle of the field between the 2 pickup men. Six riders entered and



each rode two horses. Colt Hamaker was 157 points on 2 to win the event.

Officials included Ted Thompson as the field flagger, Ray Mader as the line judge, Melanie Jones served as the secretary, Tera Anderson and DeeDee Dickinson were timers, Dalton Beasley announced the bronc riding, Jim Thompson, for the 27th time, was the steer roping announcer.

Cecile Pattison and Vicki Kane represented the Don King Days Committee.



Meet the Member

Sydney Veldhuizen

ydney Veldhuizen knows God has a plan for her life, even if it's not what she has planned. That truth became evident to her five years ago, when, while riding her barrel horse, the animal slipped and fell. Sydney fell with the horse, breaking her collarbone, knocking her unconscious and causing brain bleeds and a traumatic brain injury.

She spent a week in the hospital and another two weeks in rehab, learning how to walk again, to communicate effectively again, and working on her hand-eye coordination. "It was pretty rough at first," she said. She returned to riding, even though she didn't want to. A friend and her mom took her out to see her horse. Sydney insisted she wasn't going to ride. "I was pretty scared," she said. "They encouraged me to get on, and I did." She asked them to walk alongside her, and it wasn't long before she told them to leave. "By the time I got to the end of the arena, I was loping circles."

During her high school rodeo career, Sydney, a resident of Curtis, Neb., competed in the barrel racing, pole bending, breakaway roping, and team roping (heeling for Hayden Jennings).

Her barrel and pole horse is a race track horse the family got when she was two years old. Revy, as she is known, is "feisty," Sydney said. "She's a sassy mare."

Her rope horse is the opposite. Poco, a dun gelding, "is chill. He doesn't get rattled about anything. We put little kids on

him all the time, and he'll mosey around."

Sydney is a 2019 graduate of Medicine Valley High School. She played volleyball for four years, basketball for three years, was in FFA, serving as her chapter's president last year, was in FCCLA, on the student ambassador committee, flag corps for three years, in student council, and on the Honor Roll with distinction.

She is a student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, where she is majoring

in pre-veterinary medicine. She's known since the third grade she wanted to be a vet, as she tagged along with her dad, who is also a vet, when he made calls. "I wanted to follow in his footsteps, and I've never once changed my mind." She especially enjoys going with her dad during calving season.

The best meal her mom makes, in Sydney's opinion, is steak, mashed potatoes and gravy. Her all-time favorite vegetable is carrots, and she loves kiwi. Her favorite beverage is sweet tea, a taste she acquired from the two years her family lived in North Carolina, and her favorite dessert is cheesecake, made by her dad, who is a really good baker. His homemade buttermilk biscuits are also towards the top of her list.

One of the hardest things to overcome after her traumatic brain injury was learning to focus again. Conversations and peripheral noise distracted her, and she had to learn to concentrate again.

She also had to study harder than she'd ever studied before. In junior high, school came easy and Sydney didn't need to spend so much time studying.

But the accident made her stronger. "I do think (the accident) is part of the reason I have the work ethic I do, for getting better." She wouldn't change suffering through the repercussions of the injury. "Some people say they want their past to change. I don't ever want my past to change, because God has a plan for everyone, and His plan was for me to get hurt and to learn from that experience, and to help other people with what I've been through."

It's made her more compassionate. "If I see someone get hurt, I try to help them get through it."

Sydney has a younger brother, Clayton, who is thirteen years old and competes in junior high rodeo. She is the daughter of Brian and Shelly Veldhuizen.


Justin TeKrony

eing with the friends that I make in rodeo and trying to make Vegas someday (motivates me), so you have to keep going and keep getting better as you go along," says Justin TeKrony of Clear Lake, South Dakota. The 18-year-old's hard work took him to the national level for the first time this summer, where he competed in two rounds of steer wrestling. "It was a good experience out there and I saw a lot of new things there and met some new kids," says Justin.

His game plan for his senior year is to return to the NHSFR through strong and consistent runs. Justin also competes in tiedown roping and team roping as a header, but team roping and steer wrestling are his favorite events. "In team roping, the fun part is that I get to do it with my brother Jace—he's my heeler—and the challenging part is scoring cattle to get a good run. Jace started hazing for me this year, and he just started steer wrestling, so I haze for him every now and then. A lot of my family and hometown friends have really helped us," Justin adds. "I also go to a clinic every year with Josh Peek—he's been to the NFR and he's helped me a lot in steer wrestling. Matt Zancanella is also an NFR qualifier and he helps me with roping and steer wrestling. He helped me find my steer wrestling horse, and he lives a half hour away, so we go there for team roping practice."

Justin, Jace (15), and their brothers Kaden (14) and Kaleb (11), travel to many of their rodeos together with their parents, Lane and Jess TeKrony. They

also compete in 4-H rodeos, were Justin won the team roping with heeler Seth Bach in 2016. "We all practice together. We don't have an arena at our house, so we go to an arena about a mile from us," Justin explains. "Most of the time the boys will load the horses and cattle and we meet them there and practice."

The TeKrony family operates a feedlot and runs a registered Simmental cow/ calf operation, and the brothers' riding time tends to reflect whatever jobs they're doing, "The first part of April and May we're breeding cows and we ride every day, and in the summer we practice two to three times a week. Now we ride whenever we can because we have football too, and we're weaning calves, so we're riding and checking on them." Many of Justin's horses are used on the ranch as well, with the exception of Zanc, who is primarily a steer wrestling horse. Justin and Jace haze off their buckskin gelding Casino, whom Kaleb also rides in the flag racing and goat tying, and the brothers both rope calves on a mare named Mesa.

During summer break, Justin and his family spent every weekend from June until late August at a rodeo, from 4-H to amateur rodeos, and even several pro rodeos. His focus now is his senior year at Deuel High School, "Metal fabrication has been my favorite class. We just started making bale feeders. I'm mostly polishing my skills now and getting more experienced. Especially when you're trying to farm, you never know when you're going to need it." Justin also loves football and plays right guard and defensive tackle on his school's team. He uses his three study halls to stay on top of homework so he can focus on the ranch when he gets home, while he and his brothers also enjoy hunting together in their spare time.

"I want to make the College National Finals in a few years and from there, see how it goes," says Justin, who plans to compete in all three of his events in college. "I want to get a good education."

Dylan Fulton Memorial Recipients: Kylee Crago, Kvler Carmichael





racing and the top 7 in breakaway roping. Preslie competes on three horses: Ducky the barrel racing and breakaway roping horse and Magic the trusty goat horse. She is also working with a 5-year-old gelding, Percy, that she is hoping can step up to compete soon. Preslie practices every day, sometimes focusing on fundamentals by roping the dummy, and regularly exercises her horse to keep them in racing shape.

She also practices the groundwork of goat tying every day; even if she needs to do it alone. She lives by the saying, "Buckles are earned in the practice pen. If you want something you have to work for it. If you want that gold buckle you have to prove it when no one is watching."

Rodeo has taught Preslie to value a strong work ethic and to appreciate the power of positive failure. "You have to work hard for it, and nothing comes easily, but you learn from your mistakes and you keep trying to get better." Preslie can set herself apart from most rodeo contestants by staying calm under pressure. She can focus on what needs to be done in the moment and allows her muscle memory to overpower the nerves of important runs. Preslie also loves that rodeo allows her to spend time with some of her closest friends, connect with her family and get to know her horses.

Preslie's family members are her heroes, and she is grateful for their support of her gold buckle dreams. She would like to thank her family for helping her compete, as well as the Watterson family and her grandparents. She is thankful for the chance to compete in the greatest sport on dirt and for the people that help make it so great.

aylor Porter is a high school rodeo athlete from the postcard town of Morgan, Utah. She is the daughter of Matt and Kellie Porter and has an older sister named Madi. As a family they spend a lot of time on the road, headed to various high school rodeos or cuttings across the state. Taylor says, "My family is just overall amazing. They haul me all over and are always so supportive, no matter how I do. They push me to be my best." This fall, Taylor will be a junior at Morgan High School, and she is looking forward to another season of high school rodeo. After high school, Taylor would like to attend Colorado State University and study veterinary science. She would also like to continue working with her horses through the NCHA and UCHA.

Taylor has been riding horses as long as she has been walking, following in the footsteps of her parents and grandparents. She currently competes in the girl's cow cutting and pole bending. Cutting is her favorite, currently, because she has done it the longest and found success in the cutting pen. Pole bending is a recent addition; Taylor has been training her own pole horse and has discovered a love for the speed event. Cutting is different than the typical rodeo event because, although its roots are as old as any event it is, "More competitive and harder, in a way. You are judged on every move, and you earn a score rather than a time." Taylor competes in the cutting on a horse named Fidge, a tiny, sorrel mare with a big heart and a feisty attitude. Her pole horse is Duck, a 14-year-old gelding and ranch horse. "People told me Duck would never be fast enough. They are starting to regret saying that now."

Taylor finished 12th in the world at last years National High School Finals Rodeo, and this year she fought hard to make it back. Early this spring, about a week before the first qualifying rodeo, Taylor

was messing around on a motorcycle and broke her collar bone. "I went to prom in a sling and had to stay off the horses for almost the whole season." She healed up in time for the final qualifying rodeo of the season. "I was very lucky to make it to state and nationals." At nationals this year, Taylor finished 2nd in the first go-round with 148, tied for 6th in the 2nd go-round with a 145, 15th in the final go-round with a 135, finishing 8th in the world for the NHSFR Girl's Cow Cutting. This year nationals was a wonderful experience for Taylor, "I made friends from all over, and one of my best friends came and watched for a day." She was prepared for the level of competition at nationals. "Utah is very competitive, especially for the girls. You had to have a 151 to win at state, which isn't easy. The girls are so competitive, which is great."

Taylor lives by the saying, "Smooth and aggressive." In the cutting pen you, "have to make smooth cuts but be aggressive with the cows to win." In life she tries to be smooth, rolling with the punches, but being aggressive enough to go after the things she wants. "Do your best, and work until you don't have to introduce yourself. Rodeo is hard but you work at it hard enough and long enough, people will

eventually know your name. Push yourself to always be better and it will pay off."

Taylor's hero is her father, who she says is, "always in my corner." Regardless of the situation, her dad is there to support her or guide her." Taylor would like to thank her parents for being so willing to help her chase her dreams and for always cheering her on. She would also like to thank her friends, especially Spencer Belinski, for encouraging her at nationals and through out the season.

aylor Winn is sitting third in the RMPRA team roping header standings. The 26-year-old from Annabella, Utah, has competed in the RMPRA finals in both heading and heeling in years past, and this year he's headed to the finals alongside his heelers Jace Nielsen and Dylin Ahlstrom. Taylor started competing in the RMPRA in 2011, and enjoys that the rodeos are close to home. "The people there are fun to be around, and it's more rodeo opportunities closer to home."

Rodeoing closer to home also means rodeoing with his family. "What I love most about rodeo is that it's a family thing," says Taylor. His dad, Brian Winn, is a team roper who's won the RMPRA finals at least five times, while Taylor's mom, Shelly Winn, is a breakaway roper. His brother, Kycen Winn, is also a team roper and competes in the RMPRA. "We do rope together occasionally, and we travel together. It's fun to be together with your family all summer long," says Taylor. "Rodeo is what I've done since I was in a stroller, so I've grown up in that lifestyle, and I love the atmosphere and competing." Rodeo also introduced Taylor to his wife, Shianne. They were married in early September, and Shianne served as Miss Rodeo Ogden in 2018, among holding other rodeo queen titles.

Along with the RMPRA, Taylor is a #7 header in the USTRC and a #8 heeler in the WSTR, and he's competed in the WSTR Finale the last four years. He also won state team roping for Utah in 2010 and 2011, and qualified for the CNFR in 2016 and 2017 while rodeoing for Southern Utah University. "We compete at the ACTRA association here in Utah and go to their finals in Reno. My family all goes down to Las Vegas, and my brother won the 13 and 14 qualifier down there last year," says Taylor. "We like to watch the rodeo when we're down there, but for



me, I'm a school teacher and I don't teach during the summer, so roping is my second job. It's less of a hobby and more of a profession. What I like about rodeo is if you put in the hard work and the effort, you can get out of it whatever you want."

Just as roping is a family tradition for Taylor, so is teaching. His great-grandfather, grandfather, and father were all school teachers, and Taylor is entering his third year as a math teacher at North Sevier High School. "I teach the juniors and seniors. When I was growing up, every night I would go home and practice and my dad would be there. We pretty much had the same schedule. I love the lifestyle and family atmosphere of school teachers, and it also works out great for rodeo. There's quite a few of my students who compete, and when I do ropings around here I get to compete with some of my students.

"My horse, Showtime, is 6 years old, and last year was my first year to rodeo on him. He's probably the best horse I've ever had, and it's been challenging because he's young and still has a lot to learn, but he's got so much talent. We went to Cheyenne and made it back to the short round this year. When he was a 4 and 5-year-old I won \$12,000 on him heeling in the World Series until he got too big and he became a head horse," Taylor describes. osh Siggins is leading the open team roping header standings in the GCPRA. The 29-year-old from Coolidge, Arizona, started off the season strong, and he and his two main heelers, Victor Aros and Junior Zambrano, haven't let up since. "I've had good horses and good partners," says Josh, who started competing in the GCPRA when he was in high school. "When it comes together at the end of the year and we've made the circuit finals and amateur finals, and we can look back on the year with where we started and how we finished, that's what makes it worth it. Whether it's the horses that year that needed to step up, or me, or my partner, at the end of the year I like to look back and say that was worth it."

A rodeo competitor since childhood, Josh especially took to roping when his dad, a horse trainer, started taking in roping horses. "We got into it as a family and that's what we've done our whole life is train rope horses and compete," says Josh. "I was not one scared to ask questions. My dad, Ray Siggins, for sure helped me, and Brent Lewis has been there since I was a little kid. Victor Aros has helped me these last three years take my roping to another level. He's been to the (NFR) Finals once, and he's inspired me to take the next step. I was happy in my circle and he told me I needed to get out and go."

Josh competes in World Series and USTRC ropings, as well as the Turquoise Circuit, while open rodeos take him be-

yond Arizona to New Mexico, Colorado, and Utah. His dad also puts on team roping jackpots in the winter. Josh college rodeoed for Howard College in Big Springs, Texas, then picked up with the GCPRA again when he moved back to Arizona. "I like the president and the people in the office, and the secretaries. They're dang sure for the cowboys and always out there trying to get more money and sponsors they work hard at it."

Through college, Josh team roped and tie-down roped, but when he got in an ATV wreck and broke his leg, he decided to quit roping calves. "I enjoy training my roping horses. I enjoy starting them from scratch and going through the process, or watching them get with somebody and progress. And it's a real friendly sport—it's getting big and a lot of people are getting in to it." His main rope horse is a 9-year-old sorrel gelding, Louis, that he started training 2-and-a half years ago. "He's really taken a step

up in the last 6 months, and he's awesome. I've just started letting guys get on him at rodeos, and he's dang sure making a name for himself."

Along with rodeoing and training horses, Josh recently started a hay trucking business, with welding on the side. "I try to stay busy with everything, really. The business is headed in the right direction, and we also build buildings and horse pens—whatever people need us to put up for them." Josh also enjoys golfing, or floating the river with his friends. "Roping is not all of life. You have to get out and do other things."

But roping is definitely a passion, and one of Josh's goals is to win the Turquoise Circuit and compete at the RNCFR in Florida. "If we get in there I know we can get to Houston and San Antonio. I want to win the GCPRA year-end—that was my and my partner's goal at the beginning of the year—and this will be my first time going into the finals sitting first."



oing into state finals I was on the bubble and then I had two really good rounds. I was in third and all I had to do was get my short round calf tied," said Cade Figg. In an instant, Cade's dreams of his first trip to Nationals in his favorite event were dashed. "I missed my short round calf, I think because of a lack of focus and determination. It only knocked me out by one or two points. I went back home and started working harder." It was this lesson learned back in May that Cade understood the phrase: "get knocked down seven times and stand up eight." This Clovis, New Mexico, cowboy has experienced his share of the roller coaster ride that is rodeo, but this was one of the toughest heart breaks yet.

The 13 year old competed in his first rodeo when he was six. He wasn't just roping a dummy though, he was chasing a full-fledged calf. "Ever since I was young, all I can remember doing is riding horses and roping calves and the dummy." Cade's dad, Ryan, grew up roping and started all three of his sons – Colter, 18, Cade, and Cross, 10 – at an early age. "My siblings are out it in the practice pen every day too, they both rope with me. I always have a partner for the team roping."

In addition to heeling and tying calves, Cade also competes in the ribbon roping. "My older brother helps me out a lot, he

shows me what I need to do to get better." Cade gets to be the older, wiser brother for Cross and enjoys helping him as much as he can. "My mom (Lauri) is super supportive. My parents both make sure I display good character both inside and out of the arena."

One other family member has made a tremendous impact on Cade as he advances in his roping. "My cousin Logan is a professional team roper and he went to Eastern New Mexico University in the town next to ours. He came over all the time and he would give me tips when I was first learning." Now that Logan lives in Stephenville, Texas, Cade doesn't get as much help in person. "I still send him videos and he gives me tips, but it's not as much as it used to be." Each year, Cade travels to Abilene, Texas, for the OTRA finals. "It is a whole week of just team roping down there. Besides the junior high rodeos, that is my favorite event of the whole year."

Even though Cade enjoys heeling, tie-down is his favorite event without question. "It's more of a personal event; it's just me against the clock." It's also the most physically demanding of the three. "It makes me work a lot harder. From the point of dismounting to running down and flanking the calf, it's all equally difficult." As Cade works to become a top-notch tier, his flanking form is what he focuses on the most. "Getting the flanking correct determines how well I flank those bigger calves."

Two years ago, Cade experienced one of his highest highs. "I think I won seven saddles in just one summer. Everything was really going my way that year. It was in the HPJRA and some other open junior rodeos in New Mexico." Despite how state finals turned out this year, the NMJHSRA is still this eighth grader's favorite place to compete. "There are a lot of places in New Mexico that I would have never seen if it wasn't for rodeo. The competition really pushes me to be at the top of my game. That makes it more challenging and that makes it fun because it gets interesting really quick." Cade isn't exactly sure what he wants to do when he grows up but he knows he wants to continue to rodeo. "I want to college rodeo and maybe get a business degree. I am thinking about starting my own business, one that is similar to NRS."






eading the NMHSRA bull riding almost the entire season was Stanley, New Mexico, native Caleb Griego. Things got a little rocky in the spring season, but Caleb managed to turn it around, in a big way. "I lost focus towards the middle of the spring season and I got bumped down to second. I pulled through and went into state in first place," said the 16 year old. Even though it wasn't the performance Caleb wanted to give, he still took home the state championship buckle. "I was expecting to ride a lot better at state finals. Going into it I was riding really good so I felt confident."

While in Rock Springs for Nationals, Caleb drew some rank bulls. "I drew a really good bull in the second round and I would've scored really high, but I got a little behind and I bucked off around the seven second mark." Caleb ended up with a mild concussion from that ride. "In the end, Wyoming was a great experience and I learned a lot. I will come back strong next year and God willing I will make a better showing in Nebraska."

Bull riding skills run deep in the Griego family as his 15-year-old brother Cade won the bull riding in the NMJHSRA finals this year. "Cade is very good competition, he is always keeping me on my toes." The brothers got into bull riding at about the same time and as Caleb enters his junior year of high school he is now competing against his brother. "We are always after each other so it makes it fun. I am excited that he's in high school. He is fun to be around."

A practice arena sits on the Griego property and is regularly buzzing with activity. "A lot of people in the commu-

nity come to our house to get on practice bulls every week." One of those community members is PBR bull rider Scottie Knapp. "It's easy to get excited about a sport when a professional is in your backyard. He always gives us great advice and words of encouragement." For Caleb, his parents (Robert and Tammi) are the ones who truly inspire him each and every day to be his very best. "They are great role models and they set the bar high for me. They influence a lot of what I do or don't do both in and out of the arena."

As Caleb enters his last two years at Moriarty High School, he is beginning to think about making plans for the future. "It would be nice to become a professional bull rider, but I will probably do some sort of trade." For now, Caleb is fully immersed in sports: football, basketball, track and rodeo.

"I have always wanted to try bareback, it looks like fun and I enjoy watching it. There are not alot broncs where I live for me to try out."

For now, strapping into a suitcase handle will remain a pipe dream. It's no

matter to Caleb though, he puts his heart and soul into riding bulls. "The fun rides always go by way too fast. I love the thrill of making a good one. My favorite part is when I hit the 5 or 6 second mark and I know that I have him rode."

As for the ride that seems to drag on, Caleb has fine-tuned his short-term memory skills. "When I have a bad weekend, I do my best not to let it hold me down. I shift my focus to the next one." This is some of the wisdom Caleb passed on to the large number of new bull riders in the NMHSRA. "We had maybe two bull riders last year and we had around 17 this year. The bulls started the season off slow but they just got better and better all year long because they were being ridden so much more."

yler Montano is shooting for the stars, to land among the rodeo ones that is. This Gallup, New Mexico, troubadour has set his sights on breaching the top fifty PRCA ropers in the next five years so he can hit the bigger rodeos. For now, he spreads his time between Arizona, New Mexico and Stephenville, Texas. "I did junior rodeo for a while but then I quit. In seventh grade my family went to the NFR and I caught the bug. I picked up a rope and got really serious about it again," said the header and calf roper. This recent Central Arizona College graduate found his groove by roping calves in rodeo and making a living at team roping jackpots. "My first winter in Arizona I won about \$22,000 at jackpots, which led to multiple qualified runs at the World Series of Team Roping finale."

It was after Tyler's first world series win that he realized his proudest moments were always accompanied by his dad's watchful eye. "I wasn't lucky enough to be roping with my dad for that one, but I realized that all of my proudest accomplishments happened because my dad was there. I just want to do well for my family and make a good name for them." At just 21 years old, Tyler has his priorities in order. "School was a big part of my life up until May. I didn't really rodeo outside of New Mexico or Arizona. I wanted to get school done before I started traveling far." Tyler graduated with an associate's degree in agricultural business and another in equine behavior. Both should come in handy as he begins the slow, but progressive climb to the top of rodeo. Tyler's time in college taught him how to be coachable and find value in any and all advice he receives.

"My plan for the next few years is to keep perfecting my loop and my horsemanship so I can be confident in my abilities when I get out on the road and I can be there for the long haul." When things have gotten slow in the past, Tyler comes back to Gallup and works for his dad or some friends while he regroups.

"I compare rodeo to golf a lot. On any given day the best guys in the world can rope or golf well and then turn around and be at the bottom the next day. It tests your ability to stay positive and it is a lot easier said than done." Tyler draws some of his inspiration from the greats. Two that stand out for him are Fred Whitfield and Brent Lewis. "Fred came from the very bottom and Brent didn't have the most opportune upbringing, but they both just kept their heads down and when the world said they couldn't they said they could."

Tyler identifies with the work ethic of Brent and Tom, but his upbringing was everything he could have ever asked for. The son of a rancher, rodeo was woven into the everyday routine while growing up. Tyler also essentially cut his teeth at NMRA events as a kid and into adulthood.

"Everywhere I go for the NMRA it feels like a hometown event. Sheldon and the entire board and committee are doing a great job with the association. The goal for the past few years has been to get it going again and the association is better than it has been in a long time." This is Tyler's seventh year as a member and in 2016 he was the All-Around Cowboy.

While biding his time in Arizona, Tyler entered a handful of PRCA rodeos in the turquoise circuit. He's been a member of the Grand Canyon association for the last three years. "I am just working towards the NFR right now. I know it won't happen overnight, so I am focusing on progressing my knowledge of the sport." Tyler loves both roping calves and steers almost equally, but it's the tie-down roping he plans to be doing inside the Thomas and Mack one day. "Team roping has allowed me to fund a lot of my calf roping; it sure pays a lot more. But I really do love calf roping the most."



Meet the Member Kendyl Hutton

ounted on a little bay of her late grandfather's stock, Kendyl Hutton is following in the footsteps of the man who got her family hooked on rodeo. "When I think of anything I have learned growing up, I think of him [grandpa] first," said the Sperry, Oklahoma, breakaway roper. "Grandpa did a lot of match racing when he was growing up in Pawhuska and he started roping calves." Many a barrel horse started out proving themselves in those match races for Kendyl's mom and aunts. "I grew up learning about horses from my grandpa. I wanted to make him proud and knew I could do that by taking his horses down the road and making sure they were successful. It is a blessing to be able to do that for him."


Own Hartness, Kendyl's grandpa, passed away on August 13, 2017. It was just the day before when Kendyl purchased Taz from him. "He is a little ball of fire," she said of the five-year-old gelding. "He has not messed up one bit out on the road, he gives me every opportunity to win." Kendyl and Taz made history together this past July when they roped calves at Chevenne Frontier Days in the breakaway. Taz attended his first rodeo in May and has only proved he's worth his weight in gold at every stop. "Grandpa wouldn't want it any other way. It's neat that I am able to take one of his horses down the road to be successful. I know he is smiling down on us and that I have made him proud."

If her accomplishments had anything to do with that pride, then Kendyl has always put a sparkle in her grandpa's eye. "I've made the Indian finals the past two years, on two different horses. And last year I won the year end and average at our regional finals." With countless ACRA final rodeos under her belt, Kendyl is working towards another appearance this year. "I jumped into the WCRA this year and made it to Salt Lake. I didn't have much luck there, but I was blessed to be there." The daughter of a life-long barrel racer, Kendyl just has a strong affinity for a solid calf horse. "I like to team rope on both ends too, but I just really like to rope calves."

Kendyl's older brother was starting to rope calves during the formative years of her rodeo career. "I like the challenge of breakaway roping and it was kind of new back when I was getting started." Kendyl has continued to stick with the event and she's had plenty of success as a result of her hard work. Taking after her grandpa, Kendyl trains a handful of outside horses every year. Some for barrel racing and others for breakaway roping. "I rode outside horses through high school and college for a bit. I worked for a team roping trainer for a few years and I just started training on my own eventually." Kendyl said training colts is simply how she funds her rodeo habit. "I like the process and watching them grow. It is really humbling."

With a degree in education, Kendyl is naturally drawn to teaching of any kind. She attended Fort Scott Community College on a rodeo scholarship in the fall of 2006. She also rodeoed for a semester at

Pitt State College so she could finish her teaching degree. "I won ACRA rookie of the year in 2010 and I have been a member ever since." The location of the rodeos are convenient, but it's the fact that the ACRA has had breakaway roping for more years than most amateur associations in the area. "They have given us a good opportunity as breakaway ropers to compete. We are thankful the ACRA gives us the option because otherwise we would only be able to run barrels. The association gets better every year and it keeps growing. I will continue to support them for as long as they support the breakaway ropers."



season in the AJRA with four saddles and five buckles to his name. The 12-year-old from Albany, Texas, lead the standings in all of his events throughout the season, and he was neck and neck with his fellow competitors when the AJRA NFR rolled around. "I don't think there was ever more than two points between us the whole year," says Will, who competed in tie-down roping, ribbon roping, and the optional in break-away roping and double mugging.

"It was pretty exciting because he had some tough competition and roped against some really good boys that were close to him," adds Roxanne LeMay, Will's mom. "He didn't win as many rounds as he would've liked to because he slowed down to make sure he didn't have any no-times."

Will tied one particularly wily calf just seconds before the timer, and his diligence paid off, sending him home the year-end champion in tie-down roping, ribbon roping with Kreece Dearing, the optional roping, and the all around. "This was my first time to win a title at the AJs and it was really exciting!"

Finals week is fun and full of exciting activities like the basketball tournament and swim party." Another highlight of the week for Will was running the bucking barrel for the exceptional kids rodeo the AJRA hosted during the Finals.

He's moving into the 13-15 age division this season and plans to compete in all the same events. Will practices as often as possible, waiting until evening to rope in the summer when it's cooler. "I look up to my mom and dad, and John and Cody Owens. They have really helped me sharpen up on some things, and we've been roping with them a lot lately. My mom and dad help me with practice and turning out calves, and hauling to rodeos," says Will. "(My drive) is the love for the sport and getting to spend time with family and friends at the rodeos, and getting to be with the animals and traveling. Everyone helps everyone out in rodeo.'

Alf, Will's 12-year-old gelding, carried him to the AJRA Finals and all of his year-end titles. "I've been riding him for probably two years, and he knew a little bit about roping, but we got him working

the rope and all that," says Will. He also brings his family's horse XL along as a backup horse and a companion for Alf when they're on the road. Alf and Will also won the short go in the 2019 Joe Beaver Easter Weekend Roping.

Along with rodeo, Will is often on horseback helping his family run their ranch and raise cattle. He enjoys being outdoors, from fishing and hunting with his family to playing baseball on his school's team. A seventh-grader at Albany Junior Senior High School, Will likes math, and plays pitcher and short-stop in baseball. "I want to make it to the Junior High National Finals Rodeo," he finishes, "and then one day get to rope in Vegas in the tie-down."



retchen Todd is no stranger to nationals of any level even though this past June was the first time this Tuttle, Oklahoma, cowgirl wore a back number at the national junior high finals rodeo. "I have watched my sister (Kathryn, 19) compete at nationals the last seven years. So I feel like I have experience, and know what to expect." Thirteenyear-old Gretchen "inherited" her sister Kathryn's horses when she graduated in 2018. This includes Dually, a sixteenyear-old pole bending horse that Kathryn won a national title on in 2013. She had big shoes to fill, but Gretchen thoroughly enjoyed her first year of junior high rodeo and the road to a state title. "I was winning poles about the entire year, so I was kind of nervous that something would happen and I would drop." Gretchen was the champion OKJHSRA pole bender this year. "At state finals I had a big bobble in barrels and didn't do so well but poles went smoothly and I made it to nationals."

Gretchen is following in the footsteps of Kathryn, 19, and her older brother, Haines, 23. "My siblings have been rodeoing for as long as I can remember and so did my parents. I always went to rodeos with them and then I started riding. I was having fun with it, so I just kept riding and then my dad taught me how to rope a little bit." For now, Gretchen is focused on perfecting barrels and poles. "My first pole horse was an appaloosa pony and he was really good. He was my favorite, so I really liked the event." It's no surprise that pole bending continues to be Gretchen's favorite. Gretchen started running Dually just a few weeks before her first OKJHSRA rodeo. "Kathryn and Dually won state 7 years in a row so I was a little nervous to see what he and I could do." The team con-



tinued the Todd tradition by winning state and finishing eighth at nationals.

Gretchen is excited about her seventhgrade season where she will add ribbon roping as an event. "I don't have my barrel horse figured out quite yet. But my mom (Nancy) is always helping me perfect my game in all of my events." Gretchen is looking forward to running ribbons for Reagan Price this year and plans to add breakaway roping by next season. "I just go out there and do my best to get better and work my way up. I am trying to be patient and do things one step at a time." Learning how to ride each horse as an individual has contributed to the evolution of Gretchen's patience. "My favorite part of rodeo is learning from it. I enjoy being able to get better at it and learn how to work horses differently. They all ride so differently."

Gretchen's favorite OKJHSRA event is in Woodward, Oklahoma. "I grew up going to junior rodeos in Woodward. The arena is huge, so that is a bonus. I also like going to the water park with all my friends." With plans to rodeo through high school, Gretchen isn't so sure she

wants to compete in college. As of recently, Gretchen has decided she might pursue a law degree eventually. "This is kind of a new idea for me, but I like what my dad (Jeff) does and he is a lawyer, so it just makes sense to me."

In the meantime, when Gretchen isn't going to or practicing for a rodeo; track and volleyball keep her busy. "Running is fun, but I think I just like going to the meets. Volleyball is my favorite school sport just because it is more fun to play with a team." Every Tuesday this Tuttle Middle Schooler can be found in art class, something she has enjoyed for the past couple of years. Gretchen splits her time between painting and drawing.

Taitum Thomas

eing a four-event rodeo athlete is no small feat, but Taitum Thomas of Coalgate, Oklahoma, takes it all in stride. This homeschooled senior placed in three rounds of the goat tying at state finals, which put her in second in the average and third overall. "I had some trouble with barrels all year. I hit a few barrels for the win at a couple of rodeos." Long-standing consistency is the name of the game in the OHSRA. "I started out in the breakaway last fall, but I decided I wanted to concentrate on my other events for most of the year." In both barrels and poles, Taitum finished seventh. But it's goat tying that took center stage this year for the 17 year old.

"This was my first trip to Nationals, so I didn't know what to expect. I didn't go into it thinking I could I win it; I just wanted do well and have a good time with my family." Taitum says it was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that she just wanted to soak up. As it turns out, there was a national title waiting for her at the end of it all. "After the first two rounds I was sitting sixth in the average and the goat I drew for my last round was decent. That was in my favor a bit." Times were tight between the top six goat tiers. Having a good goat helped Taitum relax going into the short round.

"I knew I had a shot at the top five, but I didn't want to get too excited. I was trying to be really fast of course, but I fumbled a bit and ended up with a 7.5-second run." After her final run, Taitum thought maybe she lucked into third place and so she headed to the stalls. "I thought maybe I should go back up there and just see where I landed. Rowdy Jones told me I won it and I didn't believe him at first. I



had to make some calls and get verification. It was a lot of fun all around though."

It's tough to take your first Nationals by storm, but Taitum believes the high-level of competition in the OHSRA prepared her for it. "Oklahoma rodeo is tough. It makes you tougher and opened my eyes to how hard I needed to work to really perform and be consistent all year long." Growing up the daughter of horse trainers – Mark and Robyn Thomas – Taitum has learned the value of a hard day's work. "My uncle is in the race horse hall of fame as a trainer and my family on the other side own Ward Rodeo Company."

Taitum got her start in rodeo on the barrel pattern and it's easily the event she loves the most. "When I started junior rodeo, my parents wanted me to do the allaround so I added the other three events. But barrels got me started and it has just stuck with me." When Taitum was eleven, a Lynn Smith goat tying clinic gave her the fundamental skills she relied on this July at Nationals. If it wasn't for all the sponsors and supporters of Oklahoma rodeo, the national team would not have

gotten to focus on their events and do so well. "If it wasn't for them this wouldn't be possible at all. I want to thank everyone for their support and congratulations after Nationals. I also want to thank my parents for all of their support."

Naturally, making Nationals in barrel racing is Taitum's ultimate goal for this upcoming season. She wouldn't mind a shot at defending her goat tying title next summer though. "I train my horses with my parents, so I would like to hit some of the bigger barrel races this year." Taitum's life goal is to become a successful barrel horse trainer. "I am sure I will go on to college rodeo, but I have not really decided on all that just yet."





Beau started competing early in life. "I couldn't tell you an age - as soon as I could sit on a horse I was competing – both my parents rodeoed so I grew up around it." Matt and Dustin run a ranch now, so they no longer compete, but they still come and watch Beau whenever they can. "I have a college rodeo the same weekend as the KPRA finals, so they will come with me and help get back and forth – the two and a half hour drive between the two."

Beau lives in northeastern Kansas, but staved in Oklahoma this summer so she could go to rodeos. She is riding a younger horse for both barrels and breakaway. She is riding a barrel horse that is only six and this summer Beau helped season her on the road. "Barbie has taken it like a champ." Beau has been fortunate to have Marc and Kim Harland as part of her family – they asked her to ride their horses in high school and it's just gone on from there. "They say I'm part of the family and they let me ride her." Her goat

tying horse is 23. "He's done it all - my dad team roped on him and passed him down to my sister (Michaela) and I and it's his turn to retire, so I'm riding a young horse that I bought and started in breakaway and goat tying."

Beau loves all her events, but breakaway is her favorite. "It's busted wide open this year and its exciting. It feels more challenging to me and a lot has to go right and a lot depends on me as the rider and roper. As breakaway ropers, we've never had the chance at the kind of money that WCRA and other events have set up and it's pretty exciting."

She is going to school to be a CRNA, with the hopes to make enough money to support her hobby. She will get her prerequisites out of the way at Panhandle and

rodeo her way through school. "Rodeo has opened so many doors for me and has allowed me to meet so many great people and families along the way! It's so cool to watch this sport grow and I can't wait to be a part of the growth," she said. "Work hard and trust Gods plan! Everything happens for a reason."



Four Shoes Leather Work

odeo and the western lifestyle wasn't something that Tim Morris of Four Shoes Leather Work was born into, but it was definitely a world he was born to be a part of. Originally from Farmington, Missouri, in his late teens Tim joined in on the "8-second" movie bandwagon and became a part of the explosion of young men across the country with the dream of being a cowboy. "When I was about 21 the group of friends that I hung out with all wanted to be cowboys. We rode a lot of mechanical bulls to try to learn, and I rode bulls for a couple years. I just had a passion for it that I couldn't explain, I wanted to ride all the time." Once Tim's oldest daughter, Kellsev, 24, was born, he started riding bucking horses. "I was about 24 when I switched to riding saddle bronc horses, thinking it may be a little safer than getting on bulls. I attended rodeo schools put on by the Etbauer brothers, and others, and I really found a deeper passion for riding bucking horses than I ever had for bulls. I would get on anything I could whether I had to pay to do it, or they paid me. I don't think I was ever really good at it, but I sure loved doing it for a few years."

Tim earned his degree in Commercial Engineering and Drafting Design from ITT Technical Institute in Missouri, and for over 15 years he worked as a mechanical engineer drafter, designing transformers for utility companies. He and his wife, Julie, met on a trail ride in southern Missouri, and 20 years ago, when an opportunity for a job in Texas came up, the couple relocated to the Salado, Texas area. Julie competed some as a barrel racer and now works in public education for the Killeen School District. Just two years into his new position life was great, but after the 9/11 attacks, the business he worked for was severely affected as their orders suffered, and he was laid off from his new position. "I had left a very comfortable position in St. Louis, Missouri to come to Texas, but it was a chance we took. I got laid off just after our daughter, Ainslee was born, and decided to take some time to redirect, and began to piddle around with leather as a hobby." Shortly after, Tim began working at Dale Martin's saddle shop at the Wildfire Arena in Salado; his skills grew while he worked for Dale and he ventured off on his own. Although he is in quite a different industry than he started out initially, he uses his past experience in his leatherwork, drawing out his designs in Auto-CAD so that he can quickly make changes to designs and patterns.

"Initially I thought I would make tack for the horse industry, which is why I named the business Four Shoes Leather Work, and I've built and made about every type of tack except a saddle, which I've never had interest in building. But over time, things changed, and I mainly stayed with building custom belts and wallets." Tim travels the country each year, attending approximately 8 western trade shows to showcase his wares. He generally starts the year in January, attending the Fort Worth Stock Show, followed by the Timed Events Championship at Lazy E in Guthrie, Oklahoma; and over the years he has also been a regular vendor at the Texas Junior and High School rodeo finals, National Junior High and High School Finals, College National Finals Rodeo, National Little Britches Finals Rodeo and WNFR in Las Vegas. "Ainslee is 16 now and brought us back into the rodeo world when she started competing, so I often plan to attend trade shows where she is competing so that I can kill two birds

with one stone." Ainslee competes as a breakaway roper, goat tyer, ribbon roper, barrel racer, and team roper in the THSRA, CPRA, CTYRA, AJRA rodeo associations.

Tim doesn't have a storefront for his business, his leather shop is on the side of the family's horse barn, and he is grateful to work from home so that he can also help Ainslee with her homeschool lessons. Ainslee often helps sketch designs out for Tim, and he hopes that one day she'll use her leather skills to potentially earn income while she's in college. The family also stays busy managing their animals; they have horses, goats, and a small cattle operation.

"I see these young athletes at rodeos, and they're all wanting a unique and customized belt, and they generally want a new one each year. I am so grateful to have such a great customer base with repeat customers that also refer me to their friends. I build an enormous number of belts, but also have a line of wallets and dog collars." Tim does virtually no advertising besides the trade shows, his Facebook page; Four Shoes Leather Work, and his website; www.fourshoesleather.com. He often has 8-to-10-week wait times on orders, and although he's tried having a small staff to meet the demands of his orders, he's opted to stay small so that he can control the quality of every order he produces rather than try to expand his opera["I am so grateful to have such a great customer base with repeat customers that also refer me to their friends."]

So, I do take some pride in the fact that customers return for another order and hope that means they are happy with what I do for them."


outh Dakotan Don Reichert is the newly elected President of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association Alumni and he brings with him a lifetime of leadership and rodeo experience. He was president of his high school FFA chapter, Great Plains Region NIRA Student Director, Advisor for the FFA while teaching vocational agriculture, Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association Badlands Circuit Manager, Chairman of his church congregation, and Chairman of the Stewardship Ministry Team at his church. Don retired in 2012 as National Accounts Sales Manager of the Animal Milk Products Division after 41 years with Land O'Lakes, Inc.

"My key objectives are increasing scholarships awarded to student athletes and increasing membership in the NIRA Alumni, Inc." Said Don. "These objectives are important to our success. I intend to continue helping organize and host an annual reunion of NIRA Alumni during the NIRA College National Finals Rodeo."

This year scholarships totaling \$30,000 were awarded to participants at the CNFR. The NIRA Alumni Board of Directors again voted to award at least \$30,000 in scholarships in 2020.

Don urges young people to go to college and join the rodeo club. "I learned to thrive on a challenge when I rodeoed. When I had a tough sales call, I would think of it as facing an unridden bull. That would give me the determination to figure out how to accomplish the sale."

Don started riding bulls at age 14 in Lee Crowser's practice pen and from there he went on to championships in regional high school rodeos and in the Northwest Ranch Cowboys Association and the South Dakota Rodeo Association. Don traveled with

his brother Duane (Rodeo Clown and Bull Fighter) in the mid 1960s and rodeoed from Canada to Texas and Colorado to Michigan helping Duane with clown acts.

Bull riding was not his only talent. Don won the bareback riding at the Jackrabbit Stampede at South Dakota State (now University) in 1964. From 1966 to 1968 he won numerous all-around, bareback riding, and bull riding championships in the NIRA Great Plains Region rodeos. He also competed in the saddle bronc riding and wrestled steers, winning the steer wrestling at the Jackrabbit Stampede in 1967. He competed in three College National Finals Rodeos, winning the National Bull Riding title in 1966 and 1968. He was the NIRA Student Manager for the Great Plains Region from 1967 to 1968.

Don filled his PRCA permit it in 1968 and competed in many PRCA rodeos in the Badlands Circuit and surrounding states, riding bulls until the fall of 1984. He was the first person to make a qualified ride on Sutton's unridden Booger Red (five years in the bucking string) winning the bull riding at the Corn Palace Stampede in

Mitchell in 1971. He competed in the Circuit Finals in 1978, 1979, and 1981. From 1980 to 1984 Don served as Badlands Circuit Manager and was named Outstanding Member in 1980. His wife, Pat, was given a Badlands Circuit Special Award in 1981 for her service to the circuit.

Another bull rider, Butch Bratsky, preceded Don as NIRAA president. Butch stated "After being on the Alumni Board for over 20 years and as president for over 8 years, it's time to pass the torch to Don Reichert, who is fully capable of taking us to the next level! He has many skills and ideas and with the current Officer Crew and the balance of the Board, the NIRA Alumni is in good hands to advance even more under his new leadership. Please help me welcome the new President of the NIRA Alumni, Mr. Don Reichert."

Don and wife Pat have four children and six grandchildren who live near them in the Sioux Falls area. He is enjoying time with his grandchildren and has recently taken up metal sculpture, specializing in rodeo silhouettes, of course!

othing can keep a good man down and that's exactly the case for Brad McReynolds. Ranching, roping and riding is just how he moves through each day and that's been his normal for the last 65 years. "My great, great grandfather homesteaded our ranch in 1854 and we have kept the 1,200 or so acres together so far," said the life-long calf roper from Groesbeck, Texas. Once Brad's older brother started roping it's all he wanted to do also. "It wasn't until I went to college at Sam Houston State University that I really got interested in roping. They had a really good coach - Sonny Sikes Junior - and he was a huge mentor for me. That is where I learned how to rope." As a sophomore, Brad won the tie-down roping at the College National Finals in 1974.

He made the finals his last two years of school and placed in the top ten. He was trained to be an agricultural education teacher, but the ranch was calling his name the loudest. "I became a fulltime rancher and never looked back. I just roped as a hobby on the side for a long time until I got married in 1984 and bought my PRCA card." He was always hovering around the twentieth hole, but never could quite breach the top fifteen for a shot at the NFR. Team roping wasn't a big event back in the day, everyone was a tie-down roper but Brad chose the latter simply because he liked it. "I just like getting off and tying them down. It is more exciting to me." Brad and his wife, Sarah, spend their weekends at NSPRA and Texas old timer rodeos.

"Sarah runs barrels and I rope calves and then we do the ribbon roping together. It is fun to have something that we can do together and compete." Escaping the late summer Texas heat landed Brad in northern Colorado for their run of NSPRA rodeos in August 2010. That atmosphere, competition and lack of heat caught Brad's attention and got him hooked on the association. In 2012,

an almost fatal horse wreck resulted in a severely crushed pelvis that Brad wasn't sure he would ever recover from. The driving force behind his recovery? His wife, Sarah, and the unyielding will to rope and ride again. It's all Brad has known and he wasn't ready to give it all up just yet.

Almost ten vears after his accident and Brad has undergone two hip replacements so far, but he doesn't let that slow him down one bit. He's still the head rancher on his family operation and competes in the tie-down roping every weekend. "We run 200 mama cows and about 1,000 head of crossbred vearlings. We keep them for six months and then we sell them and buy another 1,000. I guess you could say we run 2,000 head of yearlings every year." His heated passion for cattle ranching is just a touch warmer than the fire burning for roping and rodeo. One full-time employee allows Brad to fulfill his roles with the NSPRA on executive board and as the tie-down roping director.

"Serving on the board is a lot of work if you do it right. It's a lot of responsibility." As the tie-down director Brad is responsible for making sure all the calves are in order for each NSPRA event. He doesn't have to attend every rodeo, but he manages to get to a majority of them. "Usually I know someone at the rodeo that I can have put eyes on the calves and I just have to make sure the stock contractor brought enough for the event." As a member of the executive board, Brad and the other members keep the interest of the other competitors at heart while making decisions. "We vote on the different things that come up and try to keep frustrations as low as we can. It's common sense really." One board member is an inspiration for Brad: Kyle Jumper. "He probably works harder than anybody else on the board."

Entry fees will be the same as 2018: Timed Events - \$500 per event entered Rough Stock - \$400 per event entered Everyone will pay a one-time \$50 office charge.

Fees may be paid by cash or check at the finals. Fees may be prepaid at the National Office before October 31st. Credit card prepayment will only be available at the National Office before October 31st. Any event with combined age categories shall take 14 contestants per region. Events that do not combine age categories shall only take 7 contestants per region. Example: 40-59 Tie Down will take 14 from each region, 60 Tie Down will take 7 from each region. However, unfilled spots will be filled with lower, or unranked, contestants until all spots are filled.

You must have competed in 5 NSPRA sanctioned rodeos in an event to be eligible to enter the finals. You must compete in 10 NSPRA sanctioned rodeos in the timed events, or 7 rodeos in the rough stock events to be eligible to win a World Championship. An event is defined as including the age category, i.e. 60TD, 50 LBR, 40-59TR. If you have met the five rodeo requirement and would like to go to the finals, you must enter on October 15 and 16, 2019 even if you are not in the top 7 (or 14) in a region. Call the office at 928-684-9566 if you have any questions.

2020 RULE PROPOSALS

The following rule proposals will be reviewed and acted on by the Board of Directors at their meeting to be held November 4, 2019 in Duncan, OK. All or part of the proposed rules MAY be incorporated into the 2020 Rule Book.

- Change Bull Riding age categories to the following: 40-49, 50-59, and 60+ . (Rule 22.1.0)
- Delete Rule 10.2.2, Each judge must be paid \$200 per day by the local committee in addition to the \$1 per contestant to be split among all judges.
- Delete Rule 9.1.2 and 9.1.2.1, A \$100 sanction fee must be returned to the Na-

tional Office with the completed contract. 9.1.2.1 Only rodeos that originally paid the blanket sanction fee prior to January 1, 1982, are exempt from the sanction fee. And Change Rule 9.4.1, A \$20.00 office charge per contestant will be assessed as follows: \$1.00 judge's fee, \$.50 secretary fee, \$5.00 \$6.50 to General Fund, \$6.00 Central Entry Fee, \$2.50 Association Fee and \$5.00 Awards Fee.

- The \$1:00 judges fee and the \$.50 secretary fee would be used to offset the \$100 sanction fee.
- Change payoff to pay one place for every three contestants. (Rule 15.6.0)
 - 1-3 entries pay 1 money
 - 4-6 entries pay 2 monies

- 7-9 entries pay 3 monies
- 10-17 entries pay 4 monies
- 18-24 entries pay 5 monies
- 25-49 entries pay 6 monies
- 50+ entries pay 8 monies
- The field judge will pass on the tie of the calves through the use of a stopwatch, timing 6 seconds after the roper takes one step up the rope towards the horse in all age groups. (Rule 24.2.0)
- Allow members to make two payments on their membership dues, the first payment due when they enter their first rodeo and the second payment due within 30 days.

WIN SOMETHING OR LEARN SOMETHING

I'm writing this article right after that guy got mad because he lost in a video football game and shot all of those people. Two of them died and then he shot himself. That incident inspired me to write about learning to lose in competition. I don't mean learning how to be a loser but learning from our losses, so our winning percentage goes up.

My motto is win something or learn something. One of the biggest obstacles in learning when we fail to execute is proper analysis. I was practicing at a friend's arena recently. My friend had also invited another team to practice with us. The heeler of this team was struggling to catch. His header friend was trying to help him, but his knowledge of heeling was limited. This header kept saying that the heeler was out of time with his horse. He would say, "You are either to close or too far away." No one asked for my advice, so I kept quiet, but I could see some things that needed to be changed.

First off, this guy was swinging his rope

very slowly as he was going down the arena. My second observation was that this guy's hand was about eighteen inches out to the right of his head instead of over the top. Also, I did not like the angle of his heel loop. When I watch good heelers swing their loop it is over their

horse's left ear. This guy's rope was over his horse's right ear. This is a typical example of poor advice and poor analysis. Until this guy fixes his swing, his catching percentage will remain low. Another thing I noticed was this guy's entry. He was getting to his position before the steer was ready to be roped. His horse would recognize distance from the steer and set off. Now this guy is sitting still and the steer is shooting away from him and he is trying to pick the steer off as he leaves. If this guy happened to be in time with the steer's feet he might catch, but most of the time he was not in time and would miss.

When I find myself in this position at a roping or a practice session I need to get back to basics. For me I go back to the stationary target and rope it horseback. Once my swing posture and delivery are correct then I go to the sled moving and then the bad steer. Then I go back to live cattle and film it. But most guys

do not want to work at their roping as I have just described. Roping is something that is fun to do with their buddies on the weekend.

I listened to just such a roper answer a question recently. Someone asked him what the secret is to being a successful roper. I overheard

the question and my brain went into overdrive. My first thought was we sure need a good horse, then we need to have confidence in our swing and delivery and then we need to practice and have good partners. But when this guy answered I was shocked. He said the secret to being successful at roping is not to take to too seriously. He continued by saying, "If you take roping too seriously and work at it, it will drive you crazy."

In the beginning of this article we talked about how to handle losing. Well, in this guy's case it's easy. He will just say it wasn't my day, or I had no luck today. On the other hand, my approach is different. I want to figure out why I didn't win and fix it. But that is what is so good about living in America. We all get to choose how we play the game.



'm not much of a 'bucket list' type person; however I do have a few things that have been on my list for a long time. One of those was attending the Pendleton Round-Up. I've always heard it's something you have to see in person and the other piece of advice was to stay on the grounds. I had the opportunity this year to stay with some friends in their trailer so away to Oregon I went. I had originally bought a plane ticket and after realizing I couldn't fit all I wanted to take on a plane I found someone that was driving up. I'd asked him if he had room for a bag or two and to make a long story short next thing you knew I was in a pickup headed to the northwest.

Everything from the grand entry to the team roping to the Indian relay race was like something I've never seen. The entire crowd which is roughly 20,000 starts the countdown before 1pm and then they blow cannons. The royalty is announced and they all run out and jump over a big piece of pvc pipe that makes up the track. The team roping is set up to where they run the steer out an alley, same with the





calf roping and steer roping. It's the largest barrel pattern and some of those horses were pretty winded by the time they were coming home. In the bull riding they set up a small pvc fence around the bucking chutes and everyone gathers around to watch it. The parades are amazing as well. All of entries ride through downtown and there is nothing motorized, so

everything is done with livestock, everything from mules, donkeys, ox, horses, etc.

The culture and history in Pendleton is incredible and the locals are very proud of that. It's nationally famous for the Round-Up and is an old cow town where settlers actually passed when traveling on the Oregon Trail in the 1840's (for those that used to play this on their old Macintosh computers). It's also strong in its Native American culture with Indian relay races, Native Dancing and an incredible Tipi Village as well as Tribal shopping in the park. In the arena there is no advertising, so no sponsor flags, sponsor banners, and each and every person working in and out of the arena are all volunteers.

It did not disappoint and I now know why I'd had it on my bucket list, what a fantastic rodeo!!



WHEN THINGS DON'T GO ACCORDING TO PLAN

y daughter has been very excited about her first high school rodeo because the Breakaway and Team Roping is pretty tough in Region 10. During her first year in junior high rodeo, a young man, Logan Moore, talked to her about them roping together her first year of high school rodeo, which is also his last. He's a senior this year and already a #9 heeler. She's fortunate to have a partner of that caliber.

Between practicing for breakaway and heading she over did it practicing. This is the third time her shoulder has locked up. The muscles get tight and it's very painful. The chiropractor blames overuse and a growth spell. Needless to say, when you're hurt before the weekend starts, things tend not to go according to plan.

In the breakaway she got a great start and took an extra swing. Her horse got her a little because she was going to throw and then second guessed herself. In the team roping they were second team out of forty. Last year you could almost use a World Series start. This year the steers were on the fresher side and I wanted her to be aggressive. Score let him take a step and go to him. Our steer didn't run and she broke the barrier. There were some steers that hauled butt, ducked and dived. For the most part it was a good set of steers and if we'd had a rerun it would

have been outstanding.

The second day Hali drew a calf on the slower end that ran with his head on the ground, then checked off and came right. She had a rerun on him. She missed the barrier and was a hair late because he was slow the first time. She was 3.6 and didn't win anything. In the team roping she got a great start and the steer stepped right just as she roped and it waved off.

She was devastated by her first high school rodeo weekend. We talked about being hurt before you start. Sometimes you have to do the best you can. We went back and watched the video and we talked about each thing that happened. It's going to happen in rodeo because you cannot control all the obstacles. It's difficult to second guess yourself, especially in a one header. You have to gamble a little bit and the draw plays a major role.

In my opinion the worst thing you can do is get mad at your kids when they have a bad weekend because they're already devastated. In my case my kids really want to rope and they work very hard at it and not just in the roping pen. Every day they do their drills on the Speed Trainer without being made to. It would upset me if they didn't want to work at it. But I know the time and effort they put in, and from my own experience I'm very aware of the variables that can cause you to have a bad weekend.

the variables is one reason I'm such a big believer in video. It enables you to break it down, frame by frame if necessary, and see the little things that happening. Being aware of what's happening helps your odds of having a successful run. It doesn't make having a bad weekend any easier to accept. Whether you're wounded, not at the top of your game, or riding a green horse.

We've been two full weeks without riding or roping. We're hoping to get the green light to start back in a couple of days, but we're not going to be able to practice a lot and possibly overdo it.

Like I tried to explain to my daughter, she has ten rodeos. "Think about the long term, short term and overall goals you're trying to accomplish. You can't dwell on last week. You have to block that out and move forward. In your mind you need to believe you did good last week so you have the confidence to take that throw the next time."

COOPER FREEMAN

aking history at the 2019 National High School Finals Rodeo in Rock Springs, Wyoming was a pretty stellar moment for Smarty Young Pro Member, Cooper Freeman, in his first year with the association. All eyes were on Cooper and team roping partner, Coy Rahlmann, also a Smarty Young Pro, as they roped their steer in the second round of the NHSFR competition in 4 seconds flat, shattering all team roping arena records in the history of the association.

"Coy and I have roped together for several years, but this was the first year I had roped in the NHSRA. When Coy asked me to partner with him this year it was such a good opportunity that I couldn't turn him down. We won the 2019 Missouri High School Rodeo Association Champion Team Roping titles and were planning on doing great things at nationals. Our first round we had some tough luck and didn't get a time, so we planned on coming in pretty aggressive on our second. We knew we didn't have a very good shot at making the short go, but we drew a good second steer and knew we had a chance to win the round. We didn't know we'd be that fast going in, but as the run was developing, in my head, I knew it was going our way. Coy roped him fast and handled the steer and I knew I just had to take my shot and we'd have a chance to

win some money. We won \$1,760 each in that round, and to find out we also made history was a really cool feeling. Knowing that everyone is behind you and rooting for you, and to make a run like that following our first round, would make anyone feel better about themselves. It made the whole week better."

Although he was a rookie sophomore with the MHSRA, 16-year-old Cooper was not a newbie to roping or rodeo, which have both been a part of his upbringing and family history. His dad, Matt Freeman, rodeoed, and his mom, Jessie Freeman, has parents that owned a sale barn, but built the Lucky J Steakhouse & Arena in Carthage, Missouri, after selling the sale barn in 2001. At the Lucky J, they have an indoor arena where they hold roping and barrel racing events on a regular basis, and also rent out the

facility for events and shows. It is a family affair, with Cooper and his 14-year-old sister, Colbi, and their parents living on the property. "I've been here pretty much my whole life and have helped with the family business. We have the steakhouse and a boot store, plus the arena, so I rope quite a bit. I've been riding horses since I could get out of the house and roping since I was 5."

Cooper and Colbi are both homeschooled, and he'll be a junior this year while Colbi starts her freshman year. "Homeschooling works really well for us, because I can get up and get schoolwork done and still be able to help my family get stuff done around here, so it works better for all of us. My favorite subject is science; I like learning about the different chemicals and everything going on in nature."

This next season with MHSRA, Cooper will be heeling for his sister. He hopes to join the professional ranks for a couple years after graduating and then plans to attend college to get a degree to fall back on. His ultimate goal is to rope professionally and take over the reins at the Lucky J one day in the future.

"Being on the Smarty Young Pro Team has been the greatest opportunity, and I encourage anyone that thinks they want to rope to use their products. I practice on a Smarty Xtreme at the house, and they have great products for headers and heelers. Smarty has great mentors, their pro team is outstanding, and they give us opportunities to learn and get in with people that can get you going through life. They are all about being good in and out of the arena and really that's the most important thing for kids to learn."



he Southeastern Professional Rodeo Association has been a great rodeo home for first-generation cowboy, Cody Stubbs, of Odenville, Alabama. Cody is the son of Dale Stubbs, a retired Birmingham fireman, and Shawn Stubbs, a chiropractor. Although rodeo was not a part of his family history, when Cody saw a youth rodeo flyer in Tractor Supply when he was in the 6th grade, he convinced his parents to let him go. "I wanted to ride a bull, steer wrestle, and do the calf scramble. My parents were supportive of my rodeo dreams and I got a horse and some help, and it has led to where I am now. Not having a parent in rodeo already, made me work harder to figure things out on my own since I wasn't born into it. But it also showed me how much I wanted to rodeo. I had to cowboy up and figure it out."

Cody competed in the Alabama Junior High School Rodeo Association in 7th and 8th grade, and also competed in the high school division his junior and senior year of high school before graduating from Briarwood Christian High School in Birmingham, Alabama. He was the 2016 AHSRA Champion Header and 2017 AHSRA Reserve Champion Heeler, Cody traveled to Shawnee, Oklahoma for the International Youth Finals Rodeo and to Gillette, Wyoming for the National High School Finals Rodeo his junior and senior year. He placed in the top 20 in the world as a junior in team roping at the 2016 NHSFR and split 5th in the first round of team roping at the IFYR in 2017.

Cody is currently in his junior year at the University of West Alabama in Livingston, Alabama, where he is a student athlete on the rodeo team. He currently team ropes, mainly heading at rodeos but also heeling at jackpots on the weekends.

Cody's heeler is J.T. Ellison, and the team not only competes in college rodeos, but also all of the SPRA rodeos they can fit in their schedule. This is Cody's second season with the SPRA, and he is hopeful to qualify for the season finals. "There are some really good teams in the SPRA so every rodeo you compete against them it makes you better. Everyone there is super nice and easy to talk to, it's really like one big family. The SPRA has offered a lot of very good rodeos at good locations."

Cody has been competing on a big 13-year-old bay gelding named Jeffrey for a little over a year and recently added two sorrel geldings, Mayhem and Wee-Man to his lineup for practice and jackpots. Rodeo family has helped Cody get to where he is. Rodney and Will Sanders have helped him with team roping, "They started out as strangers but have turned into family." Cody also gives credit to 9X WNFR Team Roping Qualifier, Tyler Magnus, who he lived with last summer. "I went to one of his clinics a couple years ago and he invited me to come stay when I could. Guys like Tyler eat, sleep, and breathe team roping; you can't help but absorb knowledge being around him." Cody is also appreciative to his rodeo teammates, his rodeo coaches, Alex Caudle and Daniel Poole, and his partner J.T. and his dad, Kenny Ellison, for their help with his roping.

"I thank God for the blessing of living this lifestyle that not everyone can. My parents have gone above and beyond to support me, always keeping good horses underneath me and giving me the opportunity to enter all that I can."

Although he tries to deer hunt when he has free time from rodeo and school, Cody focuses most of his time on obtaining his degree in exercise science, so that once he graduates in 2021, he can transfer to a chiropractic school for nearly 4 more years of schooling. Once he has his chiropractic degree he plans to work with his mom in her Moody, Alabama chiropractic office, and eventually take over her practice.

otsford Performance Horses represents a lifetime of horse passion for Emily Botsford of Sparta, Michigan. Horses have been a constant in Emily's life, which started out in Bailey, Michigan where she competed for many years in Appaloosa breed shows in multiple disciplines. However, she moved to Sparta 12 years ago, and in addition to showing, Emily started barrel racing approximately 7 years ago, and rodeo has become a major part of the 23-year-old's life since then. "We have a 25-stall barn where I give riding lessons and do training and boarding. My mom, Becky Botsford, manages and runs the barn, and I do lessons and training. I was homeschooled my senior year and graduated in 2014; homeschooling enabled me to focus on my passion and ride and show horses full-time."

As a third-generation trainer, Emily has learned much about the business from her grandfather, Sam Bull, who owned a breeding and training barn in Bailey. "He gave me a strong foundation in horses and in helping build the horses' foundations." She has also ridden with a multitude of different trainers and in different disciplines to help build her foundation along the way. "I believe we never stop learning and can always learn something from others. You have to be open minded."

Emily joined the Mid-States Rodeo Association 3 years ago, and took her liver chestnut gelding, Refined Cowboy, to his first rodeo. She bought Cowboy off the track and raced him at barrel racing jackpots for over a year before joining the MSRA. "His first rodeo he got scared at the first barrel and I wasn't sure he was going to make a rodeo horse, but I was

determined to do it and started going to rodeos and getting him used to the sights and sounds. He settled in and we started doing well at the rodeos, but then he was hurt in November of 2017, and he was off for 6 months. He wasn't quite the same horse when he came back last year and we were working through it, but then I had a freak accident at a barrel race, and broke both my tibia and fibula and had my own 6-month recovery to deal with." After her long recovery, the pair started out together once again and Emily found out how mentally tough coming back from injuries can be. "It's not an easy road, and I've had to take baby steps in gaining my confidence back. I actually thought about selling Cowboy and had the ad written up, but I couldn't do it, he's my special horse and I knew I needed to keep with it." She was able to get back to her first barrel race again this past April, and after getting back in the saddle both physically and mentally, she and Cowboy have found their way back to themselves. "I had a tough year last year, but I've got my goal set on making the MSRA finals this year, and I'm raising some barrel racing bred babies that I'd like to do some futurities with, and I'd like to see how far I can get in the rodeo industry."

Emily is appreciative of her supportive family; her dad Tracy who works in excavation, and her brother Connor, 17, are not into horses, but cheer her on in all she does. She's also grateful for her boyfriend, Dallas Winkelman, who helped her immensely during the time she was injured.

Emily enjoys the friendly people in the MSRA and likes traveling the rodeo trails. As a youth competitor, she went to the Appaloosa Youth World Championships many times and has been in the top 5 and 10 in the world. She's grateful to be sharing that passion with many of her students today, as she coaches them at horse shows and barrel races. "There's a big difference between the rodeo and show world, rodeo is a little more laid back and doesn't require the same level of grooming. But the foundation of horses is the same, just movement and carriage is different. I'm on the road a lot with horses for work and play, but I love it and am passionate about it, so I wouldn't want it any other way."

"I've just been going to every rodeo and focusing on riding that bull at that time, and making sure I don't worry about anyone else, just myself," Colten explains. "My favorite rodeo this year was a new onethey haven't put it on since the 1980s—in Utica, New York. It's cool to have a hometown crowd, and it was a pretty big arena and it sold out. I won it."

Watching his dad, David Brown, ride bulls for several years cultivated Colten's fascination with the sport, and his dad later put on two to three local bull ridings a year and several PBR events. A young Colten dressed up as a rodeo clown for one of the bull ridings, and later climbed on his first bull when he was 16. "My cousin Zach Brown started riding bulls, and I went to a rodeo with him at Painted Pony and he asked if I wanted to get on one. I'm pretty competitive, so I like the challenge," says Colten. "I like getting on and getting the adrenaline rush, and if I could choose, I like to get on the ranker bulls because it's fun and a challenge. One of Rafter Z's bulls I've gotten on two or three times, Mellow Yellow, bucks pretty good, and I've ridden him each time."

Along with the APRA, Colten competes in International Bull Ridings, and he plans to expand his résumé to include the IPRA and PRCA as well. He practices as often as possible when he's home, either on his automatic drop barrel, or one

of his five practice bulls. "We have some family friends come over and my dad will fight bulls and another kid will fight bulls," says Colten. "When I was younger my dad helped me out and went to all the rodeos with me. I'm trying to win everything and be better than I was the day before. For right now it's me traveling solo—I don't live in a big rodeo area."

Colten traveled to at least four or five rodeos a week all summer, rodeoing full time as much as possible, though he enjoys the rare break to go to the lake and spend extra time with family. During the slower times, he works alongside his dad as a farrier. "We travel quite a bit—

most of the barns we go to are two hours away. We shoe show jumping horses, so most barns have quite a few horses. I've worked with my dad, and then I worked with one of his friends in Georgia, Bud Adams, who travels all over to Florida and Texas to shoe." Colten also wants to college rodeo next year, possibly in Tennessee or Texas. "I'd like to win the College Finals in the average, and I plan on making it to the RAM Circuit Finals, as well as becoming Rookie of the Year in the First Frontier Circuit. I'd like to steer towards the PBR if I can and have a fulltime bull riding career," he finishes. "For the AFR, I'd just like to ride all three of my bulls and win it."

PRCA & THE COWBOY CHANNEL AGREE TO LANDMARK TV DEAL

oday, the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) and Rural Media Group (RMG) announced a multi-vear agreement which will see the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo (NFR) move to The Cowboy Channel (TCC) and RFD-TV beginning in 2020. The ultimate annual rodeo event will now be seen by millions of people live simultaneously on two national TV networks. Also included in the deal is a wide variety of other PRCA programming, including expanded live coverage of the PRORODEO TOUR and the PRCA's Xtreme Bulls Tour events which will result in a huge increase in the amount, availability and quality of PRCA PRORODEO coverage on The Cowboy Channel, including:

- All 10 nights of the NFR live, and a new East Coast Prime Time encore airing the next day
- Live coverage of at least 18 PRORO-DEO TOUR final performances each year plus a taped highlight show for encore airings on both The Cowboy Channel and RFD-TV
- TV coverage of 10 episodes of PRCA's Xtreme Bulls, including the Xtreme Bulls Tour Finale with encore airings on both TCC and RFD-TV.
- Extended pre- and post-coverage of the NFR each night (RODEO LAS VE-GAS)
- A new weekly pro rodeo studio show, PRORODEO Tonight
- Heightened event production across all events, including the use of Sky Cam
- Enhanced fan experiences through programming that highlights the uniqueness of local rodeo communities, their organizing committees, and the charities they support, plus special access to the PRCA athletes and other PRCA members whose contributions are key to the sport of PRORODEO
- New national coverage of PRCA PRO-RODEO on one of the major broadcast networks will be announced at a later date

"This is a huge milestone in the growth of the PRCA," PRCA CEO George Taylor said. "Never before has PRORODEO assumed the prime placement and coverage that will be seen under this deal. Our hats are off to Patrick Gottsch and his fam-



ily, the owners of Rural Media Group, for their enthusiastic interest, support and devotion to our sport."

"We are so proud and excited to partner with the PRCA, the rodeo committees, and of course all the PRCA cowbovs & cowgirls to aggressively produce and distribute original programming that will support rodeo 365 days-a-year, on networks that are totally dedicated to serving and expanding the western sports community," stated Patrick Gottsch, Founder & President of Rural Media Group, Inc. "There is a Golf Channel, the NFL Network, a baseball network, a tennis channel, and so on. Now rodeo has its own channel(s). RMG plans to do everything for rodeo and the PRCA that these other media partnerships have done for their sports."

The deal will begin early in 2020 and will be preceded with the launch of the weekly PRORODEO Tonight show on The Cowboy Channel. The PRCA regularseason coverage on The Cowbov Channel and RFD-TV is planned to begin in Januarv. The finals of each televised PRORO-DEO TOUR event will be shown live on The Cowboy Channel and will be seen in taped highlight form later in the week in prime time and weekend afternoons on RFD-TV. Regular-season coverage also will include 10 episodes of the PRCA's Xtreme Bulls series, each with multiple runs across dayparts. The coverage will be a co-production of PRCA and RMG.

NFR programming for 2020 will start with a 24-hour marathon of prior NFR finals, leading up to a red-carpet pre-event show, and the live NFR simulcast on both RFD-TV and The Cowboy Channel for 10 straight nights. Each episode of NFR coverage will conclude with a one-hour postevent show. Replays of each episode of the NFR will take place the next day on both

networks, including in East Coast and West Coast Prime Time.

"Our new state-of-the-art studio in the Fort Worth Stockyards will serve as the base for producing the daily PRCA programming, leading up to and culminating each year with the National Finals Rodeo," added The Cowboy Channel CEO Raquel Gottsch. "The massive volume of programming expected to be generated from this 6-year agreement will serve to populate both The Cowboy Channel and RFD-TV with original, unduplicated 'live' sports-related content which is very much desired by all cable, satellite, and distribution companies. We expect our distribution to grow substantially as a result."

The networks are seen in a combined 94 million US TV homes. One or both are distributed by DISH, DIRECTV, Comcast, Spectrum, Cox, Sling, Verizon, AT&T, Mediacom, Suddenlink, AT&T Now and Roku.

"We expect a significant increase in the viewing of PRCA programming as a result of this groundbreaking new deal," Taylor said. "This is one of the most exciting moments during my time leading the PRCA."

Viewers tuned in to The Cowboy Channel, RFD-TV and Rural Radio on Sept. 18, at 5pm CT/ 6pm ET for Western Sports LIVE with RMG Founder and President Patrick Gottsch and PRCA CEO George Taylor, from the new Fort Worth Stockyards studio. 

lthough the Oubre Rodeo Company, home of the 2018 IPRA Bucking Bull of the Year, 125 Tear Jerker, has put on hundreds of International Professional Rodeos since Bubba Oubre started the stock contracting business in 1990; the Troup County First Responders Crisis Fund Rodeo they are presenting in West Point, Georgia October 18th and 19th is for a cause near and dear to their hearts.

Bubba Oubre, who bought his first IPRA card in 1970, the year of IFR-1, retired from a career in law enforcement. His son, Matt Oubre who has grown up in the stock contracting business, has also been a long-time IPRA competitor, qualifying for the IFR in steer wrestling in 2004, 2006, and is currently sitting in the top 20, hoping to qual-

ify for the IFR-50 this year. Matt is a City of LaGrange, Georgia, fireman; and after a devastating fire that caused multiple injuries to firemen in his department last year, he and Bubba were compelled to use their years of experience in the rodeo world to create an event that would give back to the first responders they love and have so much respect for. "The crisis fund is similar to the Justin Crisis Fund for cowboys and will support the multiple first responders across the board; police, fireman, paramedics, state patrols, and the Marshall office. First responders are the real heroes, they run towards the fire and bullets, and when something catastrophic happens, they often lose second jobs, and have expenses that are not covered. We wanted to have a fund set up to assist them. We want them to know how much they are appreciated for all they do, and that they are supported if a time of need comes for them."

The rodeo will be held in an arena right along the Chattahoochee River in West Point, Georgia and has received incred-

ible community support. "I haven't spoken to anyone that hasn't been on board to help. Some can give a little, and some can give more; either way it is appreciated because every dollar earned at this rodeo will go to support this great cause."

The Oubres have planned a top-notch event with \$5,000 added money for the IPRA contestants, (\$600 added in each event and \$800 added in ladies breakaway roping.) The crowd will enjoy hearing about all the rodeo action from IPRA rodeo announcer. Mark Northall, who was an announcer at IFR-48 and IFR-49; and will be entertained by IPRA rodeo clown, Radical Ryan Rodriquez. They will have a calf scramble for kids to participate in each night and will have pony rides and other activities for families to enjoy. "We look forward to this becoming an annual event and anticipate watching it grow each year." The rodeo will begin at 8 PM on October 18th and 19th, and cost for admittance is \$15 for adults, \$10 for children, with kids 5 and under getting in free.

Matt Dewetering

att Dewetering from Mitchell, Ontario, is leading the IPRA World Standings in the steer wrestling. The 25 year old learned how to steer wrestle from his Uncle Ed Dewetering. "He's a stock contractor (Big Easy Stock Contracting) up here, but he used to steer wrestle. I went to his place for a while and started competing in junior steer riding, and he kept hounding me to come back and I did."

Matt grew up on a farm, his family raised beef cattle. He was 14 when his father, Ben, passed away and the family moved into town. "I was very active on the farm, that's why it was so good to have my Uncle take me under his wing." About five years ago, Matt started entering IPRA rodeos, he competed at his first IFR last year. "It was great – and I hope to keep going back." He won the Canadian IPRA in 2017 and 2018.

"Matt is a natural and pound for pound he's stronger than anybody," said Ed. "He's a real athlete and is very dedicated. He comes out three or four times a week to practice." Ed started steer wrestling when he was 37. "I saw it one day around home and thought well I should be able to do that. I won my first rodeo with a 3.6 – I'd never jumped a steer before. I thought it was pretty easy." Since then, Ed has opened his place up to help the next generation of steer wrestlers. "We drag on sticks and have steer savers and horse savers – I train young guys all

the time. I've always had a pair of bull-dogging horses to mount them on. Matt was one of those guys. He's well on his way." Ed goes to haze for Matt as often as he can. "I provide timed event stock for two rodeo companies so that keeps me pretty busy."

Matt spends about half his year in the US, but still competes in Quebec often. "I head south in the spring and fall, leaving the snow behind," he said. He travels with his girlfriend, Madison Dow, who competes in barrel racing. His

Uncle comes along to haze for him and they also travel with Tim Kemp, who is sitting second.

"I also have a phenomenal set of horses - Smokey and Jack - that belong to my uncle. I hauled them all summer long," he said. The group will haul up to 2,000 miles a weekend making the rodeos, some in the states and some around home. "I don't like the driving, but I like to rodeo, so that offsets it." His favorite rodeo is St. Tite. "It's crazy – the atmosphere – so many people. When the tractor works the arena, everybody gets up and dances. That's the rodeo that will set the standings for the IPRA."

Matt has a great support system behind him. His mom, Jo Anne, his sister, Emily, and brother, Jeremy support him on the road. "I'm very blessed," said Matt, who works construction when he's not on the rodeo road. He went to one year of electrical engineering, but college wasn't for him, so he got a job in construction. "I'm gone to a rodeo every weekend, and my boss works with me if I have to have time off."

IPRA PROPOSED RULE CHANGES 2020

Contract Acts Page 43

- 1. All non-contesting Contract Personnel (CP) (Specialty Acts, Bullfighters, Barrelmen, and Announcers) at an IPRA rodeo must be approved.
- A. Approval will be granted upon receipt of the following for each separate CP category:
- 1. Payment of membership dues (one time per dues paying
- 2. Payment of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) approval fee per category (new members only).
 3. 1 signature from any 3 of the following groups (new
- members only):
- a) For Announcers, Barrelmen, and Specialty Acts: Any previous IFR Announcer or Announcer of the Year
 - (2) Any previous IFR Barrelman or Clown of the year
 - (3) Any previous IFR Specialty Act
 - (4) Any approved IPRA Stock Contractor
 - (5) Acting Contract Personnel Director
 - b) For Bullfighters:
 - (1) Any previous IFR Bullfighter
 - (2) Any previous IFR Barrelman or Clown of the Year
 - (3) Acting Bull Riding Director
- (4) Any Top 20 Bull Rider from the previous or
- (5) Acting Contract Personnel Director
- 4. Once completed and the office has received all proper paperwork and finances, member will be placed on Permit Status for their first dues paying year and acting Contract Personnel Director will be notified that said member has been granted Permit Status. A permit holder is not eligible to work the IFR, any region finals or finale, or receive year-end awards. Member will be placed on full status for their second dues paying year should member remain in good standing. Acting Contract Personnel Director shall have full discretion to revoke a contract personnel membership at any time should he/ she deem necessary due to conduct, unprofessionalism, rule infraction, etc.
- B. A family membership card will be issued for one price for family members who participate as a single act together. This card cannot be used for contesting; however, each member of the act must purchase IPRA member insurance. If a family member leaves the group to perform on their own, he/she must regain membership as an individual.

Contract Acts Page 43, Rule 2

Add to Rule: \$150.00 fine

New Rule will read: All contract personnel, photographers and pickup men must show their current IPRA card to the rodeo secretary. Contract personnel and photographers failing to comply with this rule will be subject to a fine of \$150. All contract acts card numbers and names are to be recorded on the results sheet.

Page 43, Rule 3

Delete Rule: An IPRA contract performer may not fulfill a contract with a suspended producer and/or rodeo. Contract Performer failing to comply with this rule will be fined.

Contract Acts Page 43, Rule 4

Delete Rule: All contract acts MUST use contracts provided

Contract Acts Page 43, Rule 6

Rule Reads: Contract acts who do not live up to contracts signed with IPRA rodeos, and/or producers will be answerable to the Executive Committee and subject to suspension and a fine. Further, the Executive Committee will be empowered to fine the contract act an amount in addition to the total contract price, which will be paid by the IPRA to the rodeo committee and/or producer.

New Rule Reads: Contract acts who do not live up to contracts signed with IPRA rodeos, stock contractors, and/or producers will be answerable to the Executive Committee and subject to suspension and a fine of \$1,000.. Half of the fine shall go to the IPRA, and the other half shall go to the rodeo, stock contractor, and/or producer who hired said contract act.

Contract Acts Page 44, Rule 7

Rule Reads: IPRA rodeos and/or producers, stock contractors and committeemen who do not live up to contracts signed with IPRA rodeos and/or Contract Acts Personnel will be answerable to the Executive Committee and subject to suspension and fine. Further the Executive Committee will be empowered to fine the Producer and/or Stock Contractor and/or Committeemen an amount in addition to the total contract price which will be paid by the IPRA to the Contract

New Rule Reads: IPRA stock contractors and/or producers who do not live up to contracts signed with IPRA rodeos and/ or Contract Personnel will be answerable to the Executive Committee and subject to suspension and a fine of \$1,000. Further the Executive Committee will be empowered to fine the Producer and/or Stock Contractor the total contract price which will be paid by the IPRA to the Contract Personnel.

Contract Acts Page 44, Rule 8

Rule Reads: There will be no animals or objects other than a barrel or dummy brought in the arena by a contract performer during the bull riding event except that a bullfighter may use an inner tube on a bull when he is turned out to fight, never when a rider is on a bull. Contract performer will be subject to a fine for failure to comply with this rule.

New Rule Reads: There will be no animals or objects other than a clown barrel and/or dummy brought in the arena by a contract performer during the bull riding event. Contract performer will be subject to a fine of \$250 for failure to comply with this rule.

Contract Acts Page 44, Rule 9

Rule Reads: All IPRA sanctioned rodeos must have an approved bullfighter (clown) in the arena during the bull riding event for each performance and slack. Failure to comply with this rule will subject the producer to a fine. Judges will be responsible for reporting infraction of this rule.

New Rule to Read: All IPRA sanctioned rodeos must have at least one approved bullfighter in the arena during the bull riding event for each performance and slack. Failure to comply with this rule will subject the producer and/or stock contractor to a fine of \$250. Judges will be responsible for reporting infraction of this rule.

Contract Acts Page 44. Rule 10

Rule Reads: Photographers will be issued an IPRA card which identifies him or her as an approved IPRA photographer. Cost is one hundred and twenty-five (\$125) per year, which includes IPRA insurance coverage. Press passes may be used by photographers but the committee has the right to refuse arena entry to anyone using a press pass,

New Rule Reads: Photographers will be issued an IPRA card which identifies him or her as an approved IPRA photographer. Cost is one hundred and twenty-five (\$125) per year, which includes IPRA insurance coverage. Press passes may be used by photographers but the committee, producer, and/or stock contractor has the right to refuse arena entry to anyone using a press pass whether they are an IPRA approved photographer or not. Any photographer inside the competition arena must be in full western dress except for the cowboy hat or will be subject to a dress code violation fine.

Bareback & Saddle Bronc Riding

Rule Reads: The contestant must have both spur rowels touching the animal, one on each side of the animal, anywhere above the break of the shoulders when the animal's front feet touch the arena floor the first time out of the bucking chute. Failure to do so will result in a five (5) point deduction per side that mark out is missed. Either judge will have the option to waive the mark out rule if the contestant is fouled or the animal stalls

Take Out: Failure to do so will result in a five (5) point deduction per side that mark out is missed

Replace with: Failure to do so will receive a NO score. New Rule Reads: The contestant must have both spur rowels touching the animal, one on each side of the animal, anywhere above the break of the shoulders when the animal's front feet touch the arena floor the first time out of the bucking chute.

Failure to do so will receive a NO score. Either judge will have the option to waive the mark out rule if the contestant is fouled or the animal stalls.

Cowgirl Breakaway Roping - PAGE 137, RULE 4

RULE READS: Rope will be tied to the saddle horn with braided nylon string. A visible cloth or flag must be attached to rope within 6 inches of the saddle horn so that judges can tell when the rope break from the horn.

ADD TO THE END OF RULE: If the flag or cloth falls off of the rope after the contestant calls for their animal, it will not result in a disqualification.

IFYR Rules - Cowgirl event/Breakaway Roping

Delete Cowgirl Breakaway Rules under the IFYR section and adopt all rules for Cowgirls Breakaway roping rules on page 137,138,139 and 140

If above rule is passed then Delete Rule 20 Page 140

Cowgirl Breakaway Roping

Add New Rule: Judges have the option of using a different barrier in the Breakaway event then the Tie-down event in order to be more suitable for the calves.

Page 23, Rule 8

Rule Reads: All IPRA rodeos must have seven standard events. BB Riding, Tie Down, SB, SW, BR, CBR, and TR.

Change rule to read: eight standard events, adding Cowgirls Breakaway Roping.

Delete: Cowgirls Breakaway Roping will be an added event, points will be kept and world champion awards at the IFR top 15 will compete at the IFR: Event will NOT be mandatory at all rodeos. If passed Rule 10 will need to be amended.

This rule is under each event rules as well as judging methods/ timed events. It needs to be added to Judging methods/Riding events and cowgirls Breakaway Roping.

Rule Reads: A contestant shall compete in the performance in which they are entered and be ready when called upon to compete or be disqualified from that go-around of competition Add to rule: Once a contestant is determined to be a "Turn Out" then the contestant will not be allowed to compete.

The following are not rule changes, they are corrections to the rule book

Delete Rule 1-D page 85: Should the automatic timer fail, and is no loner serviceable, the barrel race will be paid on hand flagged times, which must be recorded in tenth.

Replace with Rule 13 Page 133: Barrel Racing shall be timed by automatic timer. Automatic timer shall be backed up with a flag and two (2) timers. Manual timers must be recorded in hundreds and one zero (0) added to have a time recorded in thousands. Contestant will not be given a re-run due to malfunction of timer. Backup time will be the contestants official time. If timer fails to work, the judges must make at least three (3) attempts to readjust and reset the timer and check the power before going to watches. Manual times will be used for payoff only when the automatic timer is no longer serviceable.

Note: The conflict between these two rules is tenths vs. hundredths.

A contestant shall compete in the performance in which they are entered and be ready when called upon to compete or be disqualified from that go-around of competition.

The above rule is under each event rules as well as judging methods/timed events. It needs to be added to Judging methods/riding events and cowgirl breakaway roping.

Chocolate "Go to Heck Cake"

with Raspberry Filling & Pioneer Woman Best Frosting

Recipes courtesy of Gerda Dickinson

"This cake recipe comes from jane Mickelson, my cute mom, who got it from the Z-U Guest Ranch near Cora, Wyoming, many, many years ago. It was originally called "Go to Hell Cake"

INGREDIENTS:

½ cup butter

1 ½ cup granulated sugar

2 eggs

½ cup of milk.

1 tsp. vanilla.

2 cups all-purpose flour

pinch of salt

2 tsp. baking soda

4 T dry cocoa raspberry seedless jam/jelly

fresh raspberries

DIRECTIONS:

Cream together ½ cup butter and 1 ½ cup granulated sugar. Mix in 2 eggs, and add ½ cup of milk.

Add 1 tsp. vanilla.

When wet ingredients are mixed, add: 2 cups all-purpose flour, pinch of salt, 2 tsp. baking soda

Combine 4 T dry cocoa with enough water to dissolve, add to above ingredients and mix well. Pour batter evenly into 2 round cake pans that have been greased and floured. I like to coat my pans with a mixture of flour and sugar. You can also pour into a 9x13 pan if you don't want to deal with layers.

Bake at 350 for 20 for rounds, -25 minutes for bigger pan, check middle with toothpick for doneness.

Allow cake to cool almost completely and then put a layer of raspberry seedless jam/ jelly - Smuckers or homemade). You'll want to refrigerate the cake or even put it in the freezer to set the jam up before frosting it about 30 minutes. I do a layer on top of the 9x13. When making the rounds, I put a layer of jam in between the layers of the rounds as well as on the top layer. It should be just enough jam to make a nice thin glossy coat. When the frosting is ready, take the cake out



of the cold and apply the frosting. You can put a thin layer in between the layers of the round cake, but make sure that you have enough to frost the entire thing. Dust with cocoa powder and top with fresh raspberries.

This cake can be make the day before and refrigerated. If you do refrigerate overnight, it may be best to wait to garnish with the raspberries just before serving.



"That's the best frosting I've ever had" Frosting

INGREDIENTS:

5 T flour

1 C milk

1 tsp vanilla

1 c butter

1 c sugar - NOT powdered

DIRECTIONS:

In a small saucepan, whisk flour into milk and heat,

stirring constantly, until it thickens. You want it to be very thick, thicker than cake mix, more like a brownie mix is. Remove from heat and let it cool to room temperature. (If I'm in a hurry, I place the saucepan over ice in the sink for about 10 minutes or so until the mixture cools.) It must be completely cool before you use it in the next

step. Stir in vanilla. While the mixture is cooling, cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. You don't want any sugar graininess left. Then add the completely cooled milk/ flour/vanilla mixture and beat the living daylights out of it. If it looks separated, you haven't beaten it enough! Beat it until it all combines and resembles whipped cream.

Apple Salad

INGREDIENTS:

4 Granny smith apples

4 Red Delicious apples

2-3 king sized Snicker bars

1 large container whipped topping

1 small container whipped topping

DIRECTIONS:

Core and cube apples. Sprinkle a bit of fruit fresh over them and gently stir them so all are covered. Cut candy bars into bite-size pieces. When you are ready for the salad, combine and stir the ingredients and serve. You can use any variety of apples! Add coop whip to suit your own personal taste.
