PROFILE: **JOHN KORREY**

*Ritchie Bros.
auctioneer started as
a country boy.*

John Korrey is a native of Iliff, Colorado, living on the same farm he was born on 64 years ago, but his voice has been heard throughout the United States and internationally as far as Dubai, the Netherlands, and Australia. Since 2003, he's worked for Ritchie Bros. Auctioneers, one of the world's largest auction companies of heavy equipment and transportation equipment.

The team roper and auctioneer of more than 40 years grew up helping his dad farm and raise livestock, and he was intrigued early on by the auctioneers he heard when they went to livestock auctions to sell produce. Even his classmates in grade school told him he'd make a good salesman. John graduated from Northeastern Junior College in 1972 and attended Reisch Auctioneer College soon after, but the work was barely beginning. "This occupation is no different from other occupations – you have to pay your dues," says John. "You're sometimes selling people's whole livelihood, or a year's wages, and it's really crucial. For someone to give you an opportunity to go up and sell is tough, so you practice on your own. I went to an auctioneer school and they teach the basics, but you can't leave there and be an auctioneer. You have to practice and get better. I was pretty determined and I listened to a lot of auctioneers. I thought if I was going to do it, I would try the very best I could.

"I went to different markets to try and get a job. My dad was one of my biggest fans, and he and my mom helped me get started and hooked me up with some livestock markets, and I went to various livestock auctioneer contests in the country,"

John explains. With his background in rodeo – competing during his childhood, and team roping and tie-down roping on the college rodeo team – John found he was equally competitive in the auctioneer contests. He also found the bond between livestock auctioneer families much the same as with rodeo families. "I competed quite a few years before I won the contest and realized it wasn't about me, it was about meeting other auctioneers and families in the business. I finally won it (World Livestock Auctioneer Champion) in Dunlap, Iowa, in 2002, and it didn't skyrocket my career, but I had more confidence. People won't hire you because you're a world champion or not, but because they trust your ability to do a good job."

John also won the Calgary Stampede International Livestock Auctioneer Championship in 1998, among several other championship titles, and he was inducted into the Colorado Auctioneer Association Hall of Fame in 2009. He and his late wife, Janna, were married for 35 years and owned and operated Korrey Auctions for 23 years until he started working for Ritchie Bros. John's specialty was in livestock and farm equipment when he started with the company, but he says it was an easy transition into selling industrial equipment. "My chant is diverse enough to sell livestock, real estate, equipment, and charity. I've done all those in one week, and you have to do them all different. Sometimes you're dealing with novice buyers, or buyers who go to more sales than you do. Especially with the diversification between Colorado or Washington or Dubai or the Netherlands, communication is crucial. If you can't communicate, there's nothing. I

can change my chant to work with all aspects of the profession, but still create urgency to bid and be entertaining."

Another challenge is working not only with bidders and proxy bidders at the actual auction, but also internet bidders, where the rapport with the crowd and the eye contact isn't possible via the computer. "There are so many tools, and whether you're selling livestock or equipment, it's pretty competitive," John adds. "People have said the auction pro-

fession won't need any more auctioneers with computers now, but I hope they're not right. I still think there's a need for that excitement."

John shares some of his auctioneer knowledge in his instructional DVD Chant of a Champion, which was released in 2007. "It's not to take the place of a school, but to help with things that might be missing," he explains. "I'm working on putting out something else like a CD that people can listen to in their vehicles." Along with helping the next generation of auctioneers, he's passionate about giving back to the community. One of his favorite events is auctioneering at the National Western Junior Livestock Sale in Denver for the last 15 years, where 90% of the proceeds from sales go to the young exhibitors, and the other 10% is donated to the National Western Scholarship Trust.

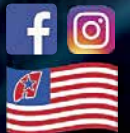
When he's not traveling to the next auction, John enjoys roping in the NSPRA and local jackpots. He competed on his PRCA permit one year shortly after college, but he didn't like the intense traveling. "And now what am I doing? I'm traveling!" he says with a laugh. A few of his horses have been ridden by professional ropers Troy Pruitt and Chris Anderson, while John is the rodeo chairman of the PRCA rodeo in Logan County. One of his goals is to qualify for the World Series of Team Roping Finale in Las Vegas, but his main priority is spending time with his two daughters and sons-in-law, and his five grandchildren. They also run a small cow/calf operation on John's farm.

"I feel so blessed with the things given to me in the auction profession," he finishes. "Who would ever dream that the little country boy with no experience in the auction business would be doing what I'm doing. I have to pinch myself sometimes." 🐾

WHEN YOU RETURN

It was by far the worst season of my life. I thought I would never be used by God again. I reasoned my life was destined to be on the margins. God had other plans.

At 50 years old I was starting at the bottom with a new job, a new home, new city, new church, new grocery store, barber, banker and new status. I never imagined I would be where I was. It was not in the long-range plan of how life was supposed to be. But there I was: Single.

There were some mighty dark times then. A few “dark nights of the soul” as one ancient writer put it. My 6 foot frame dropped 20 lbs. The vibrations of the ache, an undefined quivering anxiety and unrelenting uncertainty tried to eat me alive. The loss felt like an overwhelming tide.

Every day I woke up, showered, went to my new job and put myself on a routine so I'd be sure to stay reasonably healthy. Yet my heart and soul felt as if they were buried and suffocating. I was scared it was too much. Phrases like “why try,” “what’s the use,” “who cares” and “how much longer can I live with the loss” haunted me. Shame, loneliness and heartache were my companions. Dark days.

I took a leave of absence from a Theological Masters Degree program. The University was gracious and understanding. Dr. Lowell Bakke, the professor in charge of my program, was passing through town and we decided to meet and so he could catch up on my journey. We chatted for a while and I told him how futile life seemed and that Sisyphus’s uphill push was getting to me. Really.

The specifics I will leave to the imagination of my reader. Understand that, although I don’t feel it now, I was in a bad spot then. Imagining how to end the pain told me I was in trouble. I knew that much.

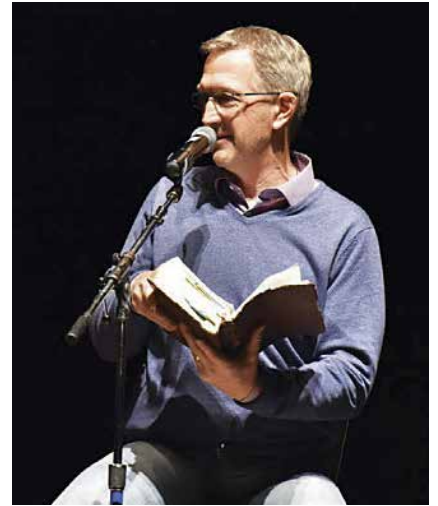
Dr. Bakke picked up on that. He casually mentioned the conversation Peter and Jesus had the night of the Last Supper.

“Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift all of you as wheat. But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers.” Luke 22: 31-32

A kicker here is what is not said. Notice there is no mention of an exhortation to pray, be accountable, come before the church for discipline, report to his small group, study, pray, go to church or memorize a passage. Jesus said simply: I have prayed for you. It is assumed that Peter was going to fail and even Jesus’s own prayers were not going to stop him. (I’ll save that seeming theological conundrum for another time.)

Then, hope and life enters the passage. The hope appears just after what was not said. It seems out of place. It is such a switch and unexpected statement from Jesus. We almost expect him to say repent, apologize, don’t do it or your fired as a disciple. There’s none of that. No shame. No guilt. No long, not-so-subtle manipulative speeches about how God has high expectations, wants more commitment, you owe God and what will others think.

Rather the next sentence is a call to hope. A call to become something more. A call to Peter’s strong heart. An invita-

tion to grace. A display of trust in Peter’s character and a deep knowledge that Peter needed to fail before he could lead.

All the disciples fled that night. Peter was the last to go. He lied to stay close to Christ. He fought and hung on. Until finally it happened. And he must have remembered Jesus’s words to him.

“When you have turned back, strengthen the brothers.” Bam. Jesus showed grace and hope even before the event of the fail. He called him to somewhere forward. He didn’t shame him into compliance or pressure him with preemptive guilt. Just an affirmative call to return.

I had to return. If I took my life I could not return. How could I walk with my daughters and son through their life trials if I did not return? There was something bigger than the pain and loss. Jesus gave me the invitation, like Peter with wounded failings, to strengthen the brothers.

Hope awakened. Jesus was not flinching at human failings.

Neither should I. Neither should you. ■

BLAISE BERCEGEAY

Blaise Bercegeay went to her first Josey Ranch clinic in 2002, a 7-year-old newcomer to the barrel racing world. Two years later, she won the 2004 Josey Junior World, and today she's astride three of Martha Josey's horses, who have put her high in the standings of the PCA and T-SRA.

Blaise was raised in Summit, Mississippi, by her grandparents, Fred and Elaine Boyd. They ran cows, and when one of Fred's employees learned that Blaise was interested in horses, she started riding with his wife, who was a barrel racer. "We ended up selling all of our cows – we had over 1,000 head of mama cows, and we bought horses for breeding and training from the Dixie National Quarter Horse Sale. We bought 26 horses not having the first clue about horses' pedigrees! We ended up with a stallion, which we still have today, lots of broodmares, and several horses in training.

"When I first got into horses, I did slow stuff like halter and pleasure, and after I ran my first set of barrels, I came out and I told my Pawpaw that I'd been going too slow!" Blaise learned about Josey Ranch through the woman who taught her to ride, and Blaise's grandpa paid for both to attend a week-long clinic. "After that, I went back every year for the week-long clinics," says Blaise. "I really look up to Miss Martha and R.E. over anybody else. In the beginning, they helped me with leaning – I had the worst problem with it! Miss Martha still to this day calls me, and we work on things together if I'm having trouble with something. She's always there to help out and give her opinion, and I think her opinion is something anyone would treasure."

The skills she honed at Josey Ranch earned Blaise multiple titles during her junior high and high school years, winning the NBHA Youth World Championship in 2005 and 2007, as well as the Josey

Reunion Round-Up twice in 2014 and 2015. She high school rodeoed for Mississippi her senior year in hopes of winning a jacket. "They gave away jackets at Nationals, and I had won a saddle and a trailer, but never a jacket," Blaise explains with a laugh. "I got third at Nationals and ended up winning a buckle and a jacket in 2012."

Blaise and the Joseys really bonded when she bought Red Man Bay from them several years ago. "Riding him just got me so close to the Joseys – they're like family to me. I think it was sharing all the joy we had with Red Man Bay. I have several horses from her, and they all fit me like a glove. The horses I do the best on are the horses I get from Miss Martha. She knows exactly what I like!" Blaise calls Smash (Easily Smashed Toast) her main man. She loads him up every weekend for rodeos, while she saves another horse Title for barrel races. "I also have two horses cloned out of Red Man Bay. My Pawpaw actually bought Red Man for Martha to try to make the NFR again, but unfortunately, they got into a very bad accident at Rodeo Austin, which put a halt to it. He became ours, and we cloned him. They're 5-year-old's this year – BR Three Peat, and BR Fred Douglas after my Pawpaw. Last year I took them to some futurities, and some

derbies this year, and I want to start taking them to some rodeos. It was my Pawpaw's idea to clone them. He talked to Gary Steinhoff about doing it, and we were all curious to see what would work out. There are several other clones out there, but nobody does anything with them. I'm the only one that put them in the barrel pen."

While Blaise would like to visit Josey Ranch more often, she still always goes down for the week-long clinic and takes two of her younger friends, who participate in the barrel racing and roping. She has eight horses and colts to ride and train, but her main focus this summer has been preparing for her wedding on September 2. She and her fiancé, Sawyer Sparks, met in high school. They enjoy riding together, and Sawyer tournament fishes. He travels with Blaise to some of her rodeos, and her grandma and her 15-year-old sister, Shelby, come watch as many of her rodeos as possible.

"All the years I've been going to the PCA and Tri-State rodeos, I've won a bunch of rodeos, but never the year-end," Blaise finishes. "I'd really like to do that this year, and my next goal after I win one of those is to make the (Southeastern) Circuit finals. I'd like to go to some pro rodeos next year." ■

ON THE TRAIL *WITH*

JORDAN DRIVER

[“I appreciate my parents taking me to all of my rodeos and helping me succeed more and more as I grow as a competitor.”]

Jordan Driver is the product of seven generations of cattle ranching and rodeo heritage. Jordan is involved in basketball, track, cross country, hunting, fishing, competitive light rifle shooting, and 4-H. However, the majority of her time is split between ranching, rodeo, and school.

“It gets hectic sometimes but it is really how we live. There are busy times like branding season that we don’t get to practice as much and I have to do my school work late at night,” Jordan said. “Sometimes we have to drive all night to get to a rodeo and drive all night to get back to school. It all kinda equals out, we do what needs to be done.”

Her parents, Dane and Jennifer Driver, both come from ranching backgrounds and continue the family traditions. “The Driver Ranch was homesteaded in 1878 in West Texas, so Jordan’s dad is a sixth generation rancher on his families working cattle ranch,” Jennifer said. “My family’s cattle ranch is located in Central Texas, where I am the fourth generation. So to say that the western way of life is what we know would be a very true statement.”

“This ranch has been in the family for close to 140 years,” Dane said. The Driver Ranch runs around 1000 head of cattle, depending on the yearly rainfall. Jennifer and Dane pass down their family history and tradition to Jordan, in the hopes that she will continue the western lifestyle.

“Hard work, dedication, and responsibility is something that is learned and cherished in living the western lifestyle,” Jennifer said,



“Having Jordan learn and appreciate her family’s history and hoping she will continue to carry on the traditions is something that her father and I truly hope she will want to do.”

This deep appreciation also comes with a set of responsibilities,

which Jordan does with pride. “Some of my responsibilities on the ranch or at the barn include getting home from school every day and riding all of my competition horses,” Jordan said. “I make sure everything has blankets, feed, and that [they are] sound before I head to the house.”

Jordan, who started rodeoing at just five years old, is a member of the American Junior Rodeo Association, and the Texas Junior High Rodeo Association Region 2.

This year she won the All-Around Cowgirl title in both associations as well as then taking home that coveted title at the Texas Junior High Rodeo Association State Finals where she qualified in six events; barrel racing, pole bending, breakaway roping, ribbon roping, goat tying and team roping. Jordan took home the World Champion Barrel racing title at the 2016 American Quarter Horse Youth World Show on Honors Past Due, then came back in 2017 and defended that title on her horse Ever SoZippy (aka. Sergio). She also qualified two horses last year for the 2017 American Semifinals and has already qualified one so far for the 2018 American Semifinals. Competing in The American as an eighth grader can be a daunting task, “It was overwhelming,”

Jordan said of last year's semi finals. “It wasn't the best runs I've made but I was proud of my horses and myself at the end.”

She qualified with her best friend, Karsyn Daniels, last year and this year as well. Jordan and Karsyn met through barrel racing, and became friends while competing. “Since we live a long ways apart we don't get to see each other unless we are at a rodeo,” Jordan said. “But



sometimes Karsyn gets to come out to our ranch, and we hang out and go hunting.”

Jordan attributes a lot of her success to her biggest supporters, her parents.

“My parents have listened to me and know what I like to ride, and they found me some of the toughest rodeo horses,” Jordan said. “I appreciate them taking me to all of my rodeos and helping me succeed more and more as I grow as a competitor.”

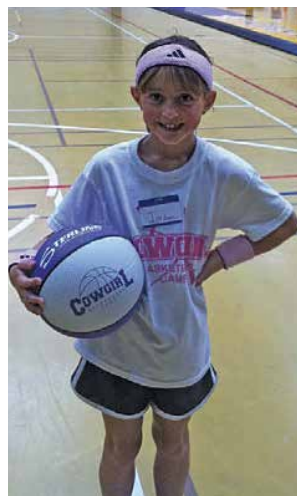
Jordan and her family train some of their own horses, although they find most of their horses through other rodeo contestants. These tough horses include; Ever So Zippy “Sergio”, TK Judges Easy Money aka “Price”, VF The Final Design “Final”, and May B Noble “Missy”.

“Finding the right horse is hard. Trying horses is exciting and makes me nervous. My parents know a lot of people because they rodeoed as well, [so] we look for horses all over,” Jordan said. “My mom found Sergio and got to know Billie Ann Harmon, she was showing him for a friend of hers. Angela and Jackie Ganter have helped us find some of our horses and Price was the latest they help us find.”

It takes a team to keep Jordan’s horses ready for competition, but she’s got

team roped, and bulldogged,” Jennifer said. “I went to the College National Finals Rodeo all four years and was the 1999 CNFR Champion Barrel Racer and the 1999 CNFR All-Around Cowgirl.”

Jennifer was also inducted into the Tarleton State University Hall of Fame in 2015, and continues to show horses. However, she also enjoys helping Jordan prepare for her competitions, and cheering her on.



plenty of help. “I am lucky to get to spend some time with some barrel racing greats Talmadge Green and Dena Kirkpatrick,” Jordan said. Talmadge also helped the Drivers find Final, who is one of Jordan’s barrel horses.

Jennifer and Dane both come from rodeo backgrounds, and rodeoed for Tarleton State University. “Dane qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo five times and was the Student Director for the Southwest Region; he roped calves,

“We have a daily schedule for all the horses, as far as what they need, how they need to be worked and when they need to be practiced on. But in addition to the horses, her dad and I split duties in helping Jordan practice,” Jennifer said. “I try to be her number one supporter on and off the road. Keeping everything on track and on schedule helps keep Jordan focused on her event and allows her to be a kid.”

“It has been a true blessing to watch her grow and become the competitor and

horseman she is,” Jennifer said. “With her dad and I both being from ranching and rodeo backgrounds, having her to continue the family heritage is a dream come true.”

Jordan and her horses have big goals for the coming years, and she has faith that they will accomplish great things together. “I completed one of my goals this year - competing at the national level in my last year of junior high.” She not

only competed, she and her ribbon roping partner, Jacob Walters, won the National title. “Texas is expected to do good - and the second round was a muddy mess - it was a mental game.” They duct taped their boots on so they wouldn’t come off.

Later in her career, she wants to rodeo in college and hopefully pursue her goal of winning the rookie of the year in the WPRA, and then also making a trip to compete in Las Vegas at the WNFR.

Along with all of her rodeo dreams, Jordan also plans to stay involved with the family cattle ranch. “I love it! Being a seventh generation Driver is definitely in my blood,” Jordan said. 🐾

2017 ProRodeo Hall of Fame inductees

PRORODEO HALL OF FAME

Stars converged at the ProRodeo Hall of Fame Saturday as a new class was enshrined into the prestigious Hall.

Randy Corley, a 12-time PRCA Announcer of the Year, joined five world champions to headline the 12-member 2017 induction class.

Corley, along with gold buckle winners including the late Buck Rutherford (all-around, 1954), Enoch Walker (saddle bronc riding, 1960), Tommy Puryear (steer wrestling, 1974), Mike Beers (team roping, 1984) and Cody Custer (bull riding, 1992), were enshrined with rodeo notable Bob Ragsdale, a 22-time National Finals Rodeo qualifier in three events.

Also inducted into the Hall were four-time bareback horse of the year, Christensen Bros.' Smith & Velvet, and the committee for the Ogden (Utah) Pioneer Days.

For the first time in the history of the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, barrel racers from the Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA) were amongst the class of inductees. Their inaugural class was comprised of Wanda Harper Bush, Char-mayne James and a joint PRCA/WPRA equine inductee - Star Plaudit "Red."

Corley's résumé is ProRodeo Hall of Fame worthy. He has been selected PRCA Announcer of the Year 12 times (1984, 1990-96, 1998, 2003, 2011 and 2015). He also has been an announcer at the National Finals Rodeo 16 times (1985-86, 1992, 1994-96, 2007-2016).

"It was the worst night of sleep I had (Friday night) in 45 years," Corley said. "I just think it was nerves. There are 259 people in the Hall and that's not a huge number for a Hall that opened in 1979. I'm in a pretty select group and I'm so honored. My whole thing is cowboys are the stars. When they are nodding their head, you've already told everyone who they are."

"That's what I strive for, and have forever, and to be a good person to everybody, inside the arena and outside the arena. Those are the deals that I think make you a better announcer because then you're true, and true is the best way to announce."

Puryear qualified for the NFR nine times, eight of which were consecutive, from 1971-78, and then again in 1983. The Texas bulldogger also won the gold buckle in 1974 and the NFR average title in 1976.

"This day is something that you never plan for when you're out rodeoing. I've been ready for this to happen so I can stop thinking about it - it's something you think about every day since the call that you're in the Hall of Fame," Puryear said. "One of the main reasons I'm here today is because of the people I had around me who supported and helped me. So many friends and family contributed to this. I never owned my own horse - I always

traveled with horsemen and stayed in a positive rig. We'd go to 120 rodeos a year, and we loved every second of it."

Puryear first joined the PRCA in 1970, and now, 47 years later, he's recognized as one of the best steer wrestlers in PRCA history.

"Leon (Bauerle) and I rode up to Colorado Springs together - we didn't fly, we drove up in the truck from Texas together just like we used to," Puryear said. "It was one for the road and to relive the old times, and we still get along really well. Leon was always easy to travel with, as long as you agreed with him. But a great deal of the credit for me being here is due to Leon and his horses."

Rutherford was inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame more than half a century after he was topping the world standings across four events - bareback riding,

saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling and bull riding.

The Oklahoma cowboy was in the Top 5 of the world standings 11 times between 1949-57, and was the 1954 all-around world champion and the first cowboy to ever win more than \$40,000 in a single year (approximately \$362,235 in 2017 dollars, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics).

"It's quite an honor, and he's a part of history," said Claudine Rutherford, Buck's sister-in-law. "He could do anything."

Becky Raetzsch, Rutherford's daughter, also was thrilled about the honor bestowed on her father.

"It's exciting, and it gives us a chance to learn more about the history of him," she said. "It really is quite an honor. I have his grandchildren here, all of his great-grandchildren are here, so it's really exciting for all of them."

Although he never won an individual event championship, he placed second in the bareback riding standings the same year he won the all-around title.

Rutherford twice finished third in the bull riding world standings (1951 and 1954).

His rodeo earnings fell flat after a bad spill slipped a disk in his back in November 1958. He then retired from rodeo and resumed ranching in his hometown until his death at 58 years old on April 28, 1988.

Walker, who won both the 1960 saddle bronc riding world championship and NFR average title, took to the skies in his ascent to ProRodeo fame - qualifying for 10 NFRs during his 20-year tenure with the Rodeo Cowboys Association.

"It's a pretty cool deal and pretty humbling to be around the guys who are world champs. I knew a lot of them like Cody Custer and Mike Beers, and you look up to a lot of those guys. My father would have been humbled to be with them," said Jack Walker, one of Enoch's sons.

In 1960, the 28-year-old Walker had been knocking on the door of a gold buckle for years, placing third in 1957, second in 1958 and third again in 1959.

Walker entered the 1960 season with a plan for earning the gold buckle that literally took flight. He teamed up with Paul Templeton, who flew him from one rodeo to the next when his rodeo road trips got too hectic.

Walker arrived at the NFR in Dallas, Texas, leading the pack with \$20,832 earned that season by placing 126 times at 56 rodeos and winning 21 rodeos throughout 1960, including Salinas, Calif., and Fort Worth, Texas.

He rode all 10 horses at the NFR in

Dallas, placing on five of them - winning the NFR and the world title.

"I think it would have been great if he could have been here," Jack Walker said. "It would have meant everything to him because of the caliber of people in the (ProRodeo) Hall of Fame; he would have thought it was really cool. These guys were all top of the world in their day, and I was on the bottom looking up, so it's humbling for me to be here, but it would have been special for him to have seen it."

Beers, a heeler, won his world championship while roping with header Dee Pickett, who was inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in 2003. Beers qualified for the NFR 23 times in team roping (1980-95, 1997-98, 2000-03, 2007). He also qualified for the NFR in tie-down roping in 1981, 1983 and 1985 and for the Clem McSpadden National Finals Steer Roping in 1992.

"I'm going into rodeo immortality and 50 years from now, they are still going to remember my name," Beers said. "That's something you never think about when you're a kid growing up rodeoing. You want to win a championship or make the Finals, but it is never a thought of being in the Hall of Fame. There's three things I guess in my career I really remember. One was winning the world championship with Dee Pickett, the second one was making the Finals with my son, Brandon, in 2007, and now being inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. This is the icing on the cake."

Custer's eight trips to the NFR and 1992 bull riding world championship win landed him in the ProRodeo Hall of Fame.

"I found out that my permanent position will be next to John Quintana, and that's a big deal because he was my hero as a kid," Custer said. "It's one of those deals where I've looked at the stuff here

(at the ProRodeo Hall of Fame) and to see it next to a guy like that and then Ronnie Rossen and Charlie Sampson, it's a cool deal. I took a picture of it, and I'll send it to his (Quintana's) son. I never met John as an adult, but I knew him as a kid and he made me feel like I belonged. I remember how he made me feel as a kid, and I try to do that for kids now."

Custer first joined the PRCA in 1985 and went on to qualify for the NFR from 1987-92, and again in 1998-99. He remained an active competitor through 2002.

"The people that have come here to be with me - everyone has a piece of this and it's not just mine," Custer said. "Corey Navarre is here too, I rodeoed with him and if it wasn't for him I wouldn't have gone to the NFR in 1999 because I had wanted to go home."

"I told everyone here with me that this is theirs too - everyone from my mom and dad to the guys I rodeoed with, it's an awesome thing. I've said it before and I'll say it again, everything I accomplished in the arena was because of my hard work and some talent. Being inducted is just a gift in my book."

Ragsdale, for most of his adult life, has served the sport of rodeo as a competitor

and as an ambassador. On Saturday, the cowboy they call “Rags” added “Hall of Famer” to his one-of-a-kind résumé.

“It’s been a whirlwind,” Ragsdale said. “It’s just been a great experience. Kind of the last of the big events probably, for me. I’m not rodeoing anymore, so I’m reminiscing like we used to in the old days.”

Ragsdale, a 22-time NFR qualifier in steer wrestling, team roping and tie-down roping, recognized he will forever be cemented into history among the legends of the sport he holds so dear.

“Going through the Hall, that’s what’s amazing,” he said. “I know so many of them, and I can remember stories, and when I see someone, a story will pop up in my head or some event that happened. It’s neat. Even though they’re gone, I relive that in my mind.”

Ragsdale became the first and only left-handed roper to qualify for the NFR for 15 consecutive years from 1961-75. He also served as both the Vice President and President of the Rodeo Cowboys Association in the early ‘70s, and is credited as the one to propose the association include “Professional” to the organization’s for-

mal title.

Smith & Velvet was the definition of a late bloomer.

The horse, which was honored as the PRCA’s top bareback horse four times (1977, as Mr. Smith, and then 1979-80 and 1982, as Smith & Velvet), didn’t become an award-winning buckner until he was into his 20s.

This is Bobby Christensen’s third horse to be inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. Christensen also has saddle bronc horses Miss Klamath (1998) and War Paint (2011) in the Hall, but Smith & Velvet is his first bareback horse to be enshrined.

“Early on, I never would’ve believed that he’d be in the Hall of Fame, but after he won horse of the year a few times I was thinking it would happen. It’s been 34 years since the horse died - I think the best way to describe this is late in coming, but well-deserved.

“When Smith & Velvet was in his prime, everybody wanted to see him and everybody wanted him at their rodeo. I could go to a committee and say, ‘Hey, I have the bareback horse of the year if you want to hire me to bring stock to your rodeo.’ That worked a lot of places.

“Smith & Velvet knew what he was doing, and liked what he was doing. He was even-tempered, and I rode him in his early years. But I wouldn’t have wanted to ride him in his later years, that’s for sure.”

Smith & Velvet died in 1983 in a tragic car accident that killed many of Christensen’s prized NFR horses. He says the horse was the pride and joy of his rodeo company.

The Ogden (Utah) Pioneer Days celebrated its 83rd year of existence July 20-24.

The event has come a long way since its inception in 1934, when Ogden City

Mayor Harman W. Peery organized a Western festival to boost the spirits of the locals and entice tourists to visit the city.

“We just got done with this year’s rodeo, and it really settled in with the community and the rodeo and the committee,” said Dave Halverson, the rodeo’s director. “We have had honors and people have shed tears of joy. People have been outstanding, and we are humbly honored to be recognized.”

The Ogden Pioneer Days is more than just a rodeo, it’s an event. It includes concerts, parades, farmer’s markets, and, of course, the rodeo at historic Ogden Pioneer Stadium.

“When you look at the community of Ogden - this is one of the biggest awards this city will receive, and so on behalf of the committee and the city, we’re honored and delighted to be so recognized,” said Alan Hall, chairman of the Ogden Pioneer Foundation. “We appreciate the (ProRodeo) Hall of Fame and the committee for the selection and all those who make this organization world class.”

Bush was multi-talented, becoming the most decorated cowgirl in the history of the WPRA (formerly the Girls Rodeo Association).

When the GRA first formed in 1948, Bush was one of the first to sign-up. All totaled, she won 32 world titles - nine all-around (1952, 1957-58, 1962-65, 1968-69), two barrel racing (1952-53), two cutting (1966, 1969), one flag race (1969), 11 calf roping (1951-56, 1960, 1962, 1964, 1966-67) and seven ribbon roping titles (1951, 1953-54, 1956-59). She finished as reserve world champion in barrel racing three separate times.

While Bush’s barrel racing world titles

came before the NFR began, she qualified seven times (1959-60, 1962-65, and 1974) for the NFR during her career.

"I'm honored to accept this honor for my mom, a famous legend, an icon, and my very best friend," said Shanna Bush, Wanda's daughter, who qualified for the NFR in 1984. "For my dear uncle, A.C. Harper, who said my mom was a world champion sister. How deserving to be the first woman inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame. History is made today, and she did it by being just Wanda."

Bush was inducted posthumously, having passed away Dec. 29, 2015.

"She was one to shy away from publicity, interviews and pictures," Shanna said. "Material things just didn't mean much to mom. She taught many movie stars, singers, governors, vice presidents and their kids to ride, or they bought horses from us. But no one ever knew when they came or went from our ranch, that's just how our family was. She was a really appreciative person always content with just what she had."

James may have had to wait 22 years to join her legendary horse, Scamper, in the ProRodeo Hall of Fame, but was ecstatic to be a part of this historic class.

"I finally get to join him (Scamper), and that's emotional," said James, who now makes her home in Boerne, Texas. "Today is really a big deal, not only for me, my family, but I think for all the barrel racers of the WPRA. I couldn't be more proud and humbled to be one of the first inductees as one of the barrel racers."

James, who grew up in Clayton, N.M., the home of the very first barrel racing National Finals Rodeo in 1959, won the first of 10 consecutive world titles at the youthful age of 14 in 1984.

James was the first WPRA member to wear the coveted No. 1 back number in 1987, and became the first barrel racer to cross the \$1 million mark in career earnings. In addition to the 10 consecutive world titles (1984-1993), James and Scamper won the NFR average title six times (1984, 1986-87, 1989-90 and 1993). In 1996, Scamper became the first and only barrel horse (until 2017) to be inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame.

James would add a cherry on top of her illustrious career, returning to the top of the sport aboard Cruiser (Cruisin on Six)

in 2002, winning her 11th world title and seventh NFR average title.

"My mom traveled a million miles with me and my whole family sacrificed, so this induction is not just about me, but also your family and friends," James said. "The horses along the way, I couldn't have been here without the great horses. Obviously, Scamper was a godsend. This is just like icing on the cake getting up here today and accepting this honor."


Star Plaudit "Red" holds a very unique record in the world of professional rodeo, one that is not likely to ever be duplicated. The bay gelding won two world championships in the sport in a single year and contributed to a third, at the age of 12.

In 1962, Red, as he was affectionately known, carried his owner Sherry (Combs) Johnson to the GRA world title in the barrel racing. The horse also helped close family friend Tom Nesmith to the RCA world title in the steer wrestling, as well as the RCA all-around championship.

Johnson credits the steer wrestling with teaching Red how to run hard through the pattern.

"He (Red) was such a special, special horse," Johnson said. "He was a really good bulldogging horse. We went to Denver, his first rodeo, and we won the go and I found out that day what run meant. He always ran his hardest. He was the best horse. I never had a horse like him, and he had heart. I believe that a barrel racer better know her barrel horse better than her husband, and I think we do."

Red passed away at the age of 22.

With the 2017 class, the ProRodeo Hall of Fame now has enshrined 259 people, 33 animals and 28 rodeo committees.

Ryder Ladner is going to be a sophomore this fall at college, Pearl River Community College in Poplarville, Mississippi. Ryder won the National Little Britches All Around Junior Boy his eighth grade year and came back this year to win the Senior Boy All Around, a goal he set for himself in order to be invited to the Junior Iron Man. "I was out there helping Marcus Theriot with the big one, and I tried my hardest to get this done."

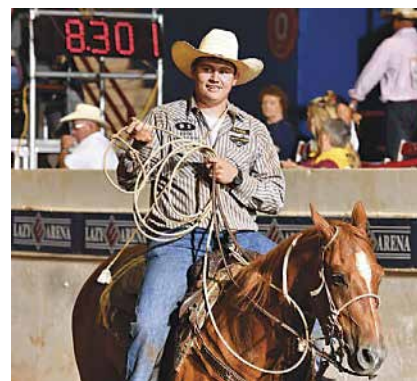
He has classes on Tuesday and Thursday and spends the rest of the time practicing. He is going to school for Business Administration and minor in marketing. "I want to have my own equipment auction business." Business is not new to Ryder, he and his brother-in-law owned a rope company, Riviera Ropes, for three years. "We were presented with an opportunity to purchase it and start it, so we did. We got it going well enough to sell it." They made ropes the entire time they had the company and with Ryder's involvement with rodeo, it became too

The future will certainly include rodeo, he competes at the college rodeos as well as the PCA rodeos. "Ryder stays focused on the job at hand," said his rodeo coach, Robby Shaw. "He is a humble young man."

steers for Tucker to practice on before the rodeo. It was then that he fell in love with the sport of bull riding.

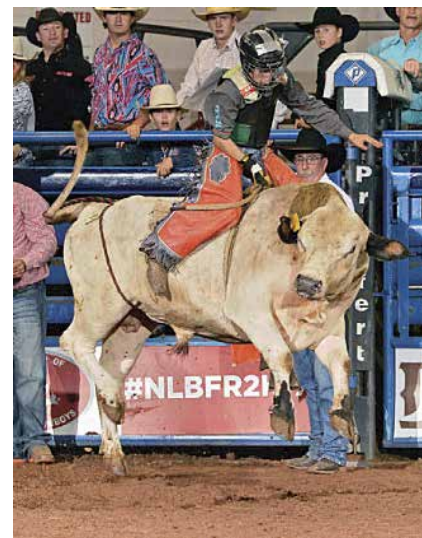

pole bending, goat tying, breakaway roping, team roping, ribbon roping and trail course. Her best events are the breakaway roping, goat tying, and team roping and she likes breakaway roping the best.

“It is the fastest event in rodeo! When you nod your head, you have less than three seconds to get one roped.... It’s the adrenaline rush of it all that I love!”

Bailey says she and her family haul a full load of horses to each rodeo, four of them are for her. She told us about each one and why they are special to her.

“My barrel and pole horse is “Driving Miss Shadow”. She is about as solid as they come! I grew up riding her and she has taught me a lot!”

Each rodeo competitor that handles equine athletes can tell you that there is always that special one that has a special story and a special place in your heart.

For Bailey, that is her breakaway and goat horse “Buck.” Bailey tells us the story behind Buck.

“Buck is not like most horses; he’s got a pretty cool story behind him!”

Buck was given to Bailey after her goat horse at the time had gotten hurt and she needed a new one. She said Buck was retired and turned out before she got him, but he came out of retirement to give Bailey a chance to continue goat tying and breakaway roping. The story gets deeper when Buck’s previous owner that gave him to Bailey suddenly passed away in an accident. Since, Buck has helped Bailey in winning every one of her state breakaway and goat tying championships!

NLBRA is a family association and she wanted to compete with her sisters. The family affair is shown in the trail course event because Bailey shares her younger

sisters’ trail course horse. “It would be a long ride home from the rodeo if one of my sisters beat me on the same horse because they could say they beat their big sister.”

Bailey’s biggest rodeo role model is Jackie Crawford. “Just to see how humble she is and how she tackles life is awesome! If I could ask her anything, it would be... What were some of the challenges you had to face as a young kid in the rodeo world?”

Bailey has put a lot of time and effort into perfecting her talents and plans to continue doing so. She is setting a great example to her younger sisters in the sport of rodeo.

Bailey attends a special school in Las Vegas designed for athletes and rodeo kids to be able to commit the time necessary to be successful at their sport. Bailey does most of her work at home and will see a teacher once a week for help.

What a great thing to see in the sport of rodeo; support from family, love for the sport, and young athletes getting to learn the meaning of hard work and seeing results in the form of championships from their long hours spent in the practice pen. Six months ago history was made at the Lazy E Arena...the inaugural year of the Junior Ironman competition came to fruition March 3- 5, 2017. 10 All around high school rodeo athletes were selected to battle for the highly sought after title, 5 of those were the best of the best from the National Little Britches Rodeo Association. An impressive crowd of spectators including the Cinch Timed Event Pro's helped and cheered on these young cowboys. "It's a great thing to spread out opportunities for these kids, to let them know they can compete in more than one event. Other kids will see these guys doing more than one and they will want to too. It helps the sport grow all together. The world has taken a lot of true cowboy out of the rodeo athletes. And this event showcases the true cowboy. You have to bear down and grit your teeth and do what you need to do regardless of the situation," says long time TEC competitor Cody Doescher. Even though the company has grown so much, the family has continued to be the only members on the payroll. He prides himself in the fact that Total Feeds is completely family owned and operated. It is a family affair, just like the National Little Britches Association. Dr. Anderson and his wife, Margaret, run the business

from their home in Weatherford, Texas with only the help of their two sons, Eric, and Corey.

Dr. Anderson was more than happy to spend his time with me and share all the information he had about Total Feeds. He was very humble and passionate about his product. It is apparent that Dr. Anderson is involved with the youth in the sport of rodeo. He certainly holds the characteristics that the young people in the rodeo world look up to.

Meet the Member Jessie Stillings

Jessie Stillings of Cedaredge, Colorado, started rodeoing when she was 6, and today, the 12-year-old competes in the CJHSRA in barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying, breakaway roping, and ribbon roping. She was inspired to rodeo by friends and family, and her uncle Joe Norris in particular. He took rodeo to the next level in the family growing up, and encouraged Jessie in her rodeo career from the start, giving Jessie her first rodeo horse and even one of the headstalls his best roping horse wore. "He wrote her a long letter about it and the money he'd won using it, and gave it to her for luck," says Kacy Stillings, Jessie's mom. "It's her most prized possession, and she runs it on her barrel and pole horse now. Jessie's a hard worker and she puts a lot of time and effort into her schoolwork and practice. We get her and her brother help and work with them, but she's pretty self-motivated."

Barrels and poles are Jessie's favorite events, especially working as a team with her horse. "We try to ride almost every day. My parents, Keith and Kacy Stillings, and my friends, John and Lana Sulkey and Jody and Jesse Sheffield help me, and Brittany Brasfield is helping me with goat tying," says Jessie. "My goal is to make it to Nationals and to keep having fun, and what makes me want to do it is that I get to spend more and more time with my horse every day."

Her barrel and pole horse, Tres, is a buckskin paint. "He can act like a baby-sitting horse and he gets really excited before going into a run. He's the best horse I've ever ridden," Jessie describes. "For goats and breakaway, I have a sor-

rel horse named Lena. She helped me and my brother go through gym-khanas, and she's really calm and mellow but she gets excited to run. I use my mom's horse, Jojo, as a backup barrel and pole horse. My mom and I are very competitive in barrel racing.

Along with their four horses, Jessie's family has goats, chickens, cats, and dogs, including Jessie's dog, Zoi, who travels to rodeos with them. One of their goats goes to rodeos as well for Jessie to practice on, and she and her 9-year-old brother, Logan, take turns doing animal chores. Logan is a junior boy in the NLBRA this fall and competes in flag racing and goat tying, while Jessie competes in many of her same events in the NLBRA, along with trail course.

A seventh-grader at Cedaredge Middle School, Jessie enjoys playing trumpet in band. She also plays basketball, and hopes to add volleyball and track to her sports résumé this school year. Before school started, she and her mom competed in the Southwest Desert Classic barrel race in Salina, Utah. This summer, Jessie and her family went to the Glenwood Hot Springs and Glenwood Caverns Adventure Park, along with going fishing and boating with her

Meet the Member Tyler Boxleitner

Tyler Boxleitner started roping just two years ago, and this summer, he's competed on three of the largest stages in youth rodeo – the Best of the Best in Gallup, New Mexico, the IFYR in Shawnee, Oklahoma, and the NHSFR in Gillette, Wyoming.

The 17-year-old from Loveland, Colorado, grew up watching his mom and older sister barrel race in amateur and professional rodeos, and decided he wanted to start tie-down roping. He junior rodeoed for several years, but didn't find his niche until he was a freshman. Tyler went into state finals this spring leading the tie-down roping and made two clean runs, but a mishap in the short-go cost him the average and quite possibly the state title. "My coil wrapped around my leg – it was kind of a freak deal – but I ended up hopping back on my horse and somehow getting out of it. I got my calf tied only two or three seconds over the time limit – I dang sure wasn't giving up after that happened! It was a little heartbreaking, but it's a lot easier to accept that it just wasn't our time. I was pretty happy to make it to Nationals," says Tyler, who finished third in the year-end. "It was cool to rope at that level of competition (at the NHSFR). Roping in the jackpots was definitely a highlight, and being able to rope with those guys and watch them was awesome. I'm pretty motivated to do what it takes to make it back next year and hopefully do better!"

A number of people have helped Tyler start his rodeo career, and he especially looks up to Trevor Thiel and Ace Slone. "Trevor lives right here in Greeley, and he's a great calf roper and really inspiring. He'll make me work, but it's a lot of fun. Ace Slone is another buddy of mine from Texas, and I met him through buying one

of his horses. I'll stay with them and rope for a week, and he's helped me with my roping for sure. A huge part in getting me down the road are my sponsors – Willard Ropes and Slone Saddles. Being able to rope with best ropes and strings from Willard, and Slone always keeping me mounted in a good saddle that fits my horse, makes a huge difference on the road."

The other half of Tyler's team are his horses. Sleepy, a 15-year-old gelding, is his main horse, whom he bought from Ace Slone last fall. "I won quite a bit on him in the spring, and he's pretty talented. I think some days he loves it more than I do. He's got that sixth sense a good calf horse needs. The only thing about Sleepy that drives me crazy is that in the box, he'll turn his head to the left and won't look straight ahead. My backup horse, Faith, is 19 this year. She was my first calf horse, and she's done a lot for me. I call her Old Reliable because I feel confident in her, but she's older, so I save her for the important rodeos."

Tyler also competes in the CPRA and open rodeos in the area, and he and Sleepy placed 7th out of more than 70 ropers at the rodeo in Brush, Colorado. "There's a lot of things that keep me going, but one of the biggest things is mak-

ing all the people that have helped me out proud," says Tyler. "My mom, Kari, or my sister, Taryn, will work the chute for me, and my mom unties my calves for me – she's my number one supporter and biggest fan. My dad, Bruce, comes to a bunch of the rodeos and helps

me as much as he can."

Since he spends several weeks in Texas every winter roping, Tyler, a junior, does online school through Loveland High, and particularly enjoys social studies and politics. If he has a free moment, he goes hunting or fishing, but prefers to spend the bulk of his time improving his roping. "I'd like to keep working hard and get my pro card and be able to rodeo for a living," he finishes. "It's definitely a goal to win state in the calf roping, and I'd like to qualify for Nationals the next two years." 🐾

Meet the Member Kylie Wells

“I really enjoy working with the young horses and watching the light bulb come on for them, and seasoning them and getting to compete,” says Kylie Wells. “I’ve made a lot of friends, and in rodeo in general you’re like a family. That’s one of the things that’s kept drawing me back to compete in rodeo, and of course, the crowd. You can’t really beat a Saturday night under the lights.”

This is the 31-year-old’s first year competing in the CPRA, returning to the rodeo scene for the first time since high school. “My parents knew nothing about horses, and my older sister got involved in horses and we went from there,” Kylie explains. “We joined 4-H and high school rodeo and it’s been in our blood ever since! I have two sisters and we all still barrel race to this day.” Kylie high school rodeoed for her home state of Ohio and qualified for the NHSFR twice, once as the Ohio High School Rodeo Queen, and the second time in the barrel racing. Following high school, she focused more on barrel races. “My parents were very supportive and gave up a lot so us girls could have our horses and go down the road. My sisters kept it at friendly competition, but you still wanted to beat them. If they were out practicing, you were definitely out practicing.”

Kylie came to Colorado for the first time in 2007 for a job and moved back to Ohio several years later. She returned in the last year after her boyfriend took a job with Black Mountain Drilling in Divide, Colorado. Kylie’s mare she raised from a yearling was showing such promise that she decided to join the CPRA. “Her reg-

istered name is Dashing For Dinero, but we call her T. She’s a nine-year-old AQHA palomino mare I bought as a yearling from Grace Ann and Deke Walker. I started running her late in her four-year-old year and that first weekend I ran her, we won the 2D both days. I’ve won a couple saddles on her and a buckle. She had a foal that’s a little over a year old now, and I’m hoping he’ll be my next rodeo mount in a few years.” Kylie also travels with her beagle, Kippy, and her backup barrel horse. “My boyfriend, AJ, is very supportive and I wouldn’t be able to go up and down the road without him,” Kylie adds. “My sponsors have helped me out a lot this year. Schumacher’s Alignment and Tire in Woodland Park keeps my truck and trailer going down the road, and The Laser Lady out of Peyton, Colorado, keeps my horses feeling good, and so does Nutrena Feeds.”

During the week, Kylie is an electrician apprentice for Elk Valley Electric in Woodland Park, Colorado. This is her second year in the apprenticeship, with three more to go. “We do mostly residential and custom homes and everything from the start to trenches to the very end. That’s

one of the most rewarding things when the owners turn the lights on.” Kylie also enjoys meeting up with her barrel racing friends and riding, or hiking and exploring Colorado. “You get a lot of sunshine here, which is a big thing for me, and if you want to go to the plains or the mountains, it’s not that long of a drive to get there. There’s so much history here – you drive through these small towns and they still have old mining buildings, so you get to see all that history in front of you.” Kylie is also on the board of the Ute Pass Saddle Club, home of the Ute Trail Stampede Rodeo which they are excited to have sanctioned as a CPRA rodeo this year.

Kylie’s ultimate goal is running down the alley of the Thomas & Mack at the WNFR. “My goal is to make the CPRA finals this year, and I qualified for the NBHA’s World Championships this October, so I’ll be taking both horses to Perry, Georgia. I want to have clean runs and qualify for the finals from there, and keep my horses working and healthy.”

Meet the Member Lori Ann Klinglesmith

Lori Ann Klinglesmith from Meeker, Colorado, is the 2017 WHSRA Breakaway Roping Champion. The 18 year old stopped at nothing as she pursued her goal of qualifying for the NHSFR, including foregoing her senior prom and graduation ceremony to compete in as many high school rodeos as possible. But when Lori Ann found out she'd won her first state title, she says it was still a big surprise. "I went into state finals tied for eleventh and twelfth in the standings. I went in there with the attitude that whether or not I made it to Nationals, my season was already a success because I'd made my own horses and I'd already made myself better. That took a lot of pressure off, and after I won the first round, I felt more confident in the next two rounds. I ended up second in the short-go, and that and the average is what gave me the edge."

Lori Ann has grown up in a ranching family, including her parents, Lenny and Jackie Klinglesmith and her 16-year-old sister, Lila. Though she's been roping since she was six, Lori Ann didn't start rodeoing until her junior year of high school. She played sports like basketball and volleyball all through middle school and her first two years of high school before switching to rodeo. She admits missing practicing with a team, but says her passion is training horses. "As I got more serious in rodeo, my dad has been the person I look up to, but I've also had a few outside coaches, Travis Anderson and Dee Norell, who have helped me with barrier work and little mechanics like that." Lori Ann also competed in team roping as a header with Ira Dickinson and competes in team roping jackpots, but break-

away is her favorite. "I can do it by myself and rope the dummy by myself, and it's an I-get-out-of-it-what-I-put-into-it kind of thing," she explains. "I like the horse training aspect of rodeo. I enjoyed starting the year before with a prospect and seeing him develop. It's not really the winning – I love to win and I enjoy that – but more the progression and improvement that I enjoy."

She credits her calf horse, Boots, with much of her improvement. The palomino gelding, a son of Genuine Hombre out of a Mr Baron Red mare, came from Pitzer Ranch in Ericson, Nebraska. "He was a stud for a while, and I got him a year and a half after that. I had a lot of help from my dad in coaching, and I ranched on Boots for a year. I was able to rope calves on him this last year, and he was part of my success because he's cow horse bred and he can really stop, and he's what made me ride better and rope better." Lori Ann has another horse from Pitzer Ranch, Bay Buck, whom she trained with her dad

and now heads off of. She also has three younger horses she's training or seasoning, including her breakaway prospect, a Joe Jack Red son.

One of Lori Ann's favorite parts of the summer is an annual camping trip into the White River National Forest with her dad and best friend to season her younger horses. She particularly enjoys looking at the stars, and takes time every night to stargaze and think about the day. She also helps run her family's ranch, and is growing her own herd of registered Charolais cattle. Lori Ann was very involved in FFA during high school, doing entrepreneurship and beef production, along with community events. She is rodeoing this fall for University of Wyoming, and double majoring in animal science and Ag. business. "I would like to get more informed on the technology of the agricultural industry," she finishes, "and I want to come back and ranch and run a high quality cow herd, both registered and commercial." 🐾



Meet the Member Karissa Rayhill

Karissa Rayhill finished out her senior year as the 2017 SDHSRA Goat Tying Champion, along with winning reserve champion in the barrel racing and all-around. The 18-year-old from Martin, South Dakota, also won the SDHSRA 20X Extreme Showcase the last three years, twice in goat tying, and this year, the barrel racing. "With it being in the middle of wintertime, I'm eager to be there and away from school, and there's a lot of people there with the pros competing. I like to step up my game and see how well I can do." At the time of the 20X Extreme Showcase, Karissa was still recovering from surgery on her ACL, which she tore in October, but she was back to her favorite event of goat tying this spring. "You have more physical control over what's going on, and it takes a lot of dedication," she explains. "It seems like it's more rewarding than other events. Even though you work hard in all of them, you have to work a little harder at goat tying."

Much of Karissa's inspiration comes from goat tying clinician and rodeo coach, Lynn Smith. "Before I met her, I was pretty decent, but she gave me a kick in the butt to be a little better." Karissa also competes in breakaway roping, pole bending, and team roping, heeling for her younger sister, Keisha. Rodeo started with their dad and his family, and Karissa also competes in the SDR and 4-H rodeos, where she won goat tying at

state finals in 2012, 2014, and 2015, and her arena record of 6.49 still holds. She qualified for the NJHFR twice and won Reserve National Champion in goat tying her eighth grade year, and competed at the NHSFR for the second time this summer, placing second in the second-go. Prior to that, she competed at the IFYR and finished fourth in the goat tying.

"Rodeo is my way of life since I live on a ranch and we run a lot of cattle. I'm always

riding horses and playing with colts, and I've raised a bunch of goats that I'm running this year. It's just become what defines me." Karissa trained her barrel and pole horse, Vegas, as well as her 5-year-old breakaway and heel horse, Gizmo. "He was kind of a challenge, so it's pretty rewarding to have him. We traded some hay for my goat horse, Doris, who came from Allen, South Dakota. She's won me all kinds of state finals and taken me to Nationals." Karissa also has 30 head of goats, which she's raised over the last two years. Her family runs cattle and farms, growing crops like wheat, oats, and hay, and she rides colts and trains horses in the summer.

Rodeo is a family-wide affair, including Karissa's older brother and sister, Kyler and Kaitlyn, their parents, Kory and Angela, and grandparents, who come to many of Karissa's and Keisha's rodeos. "Our extended family comes to quite a few rodeos too, and sometimes we have friends tag along, so whoever wants to go we put in the truck!"

Karissa graduated from Bennett County High School in May, and she's attending Eastern Wyoming College in Torrington on a rodeo scholarship this fall, also pursuing a degree in animal science. "I'll be doing barrels, breakaway, and goats. From there, I'd like to win the CNFR and do good in all my events," she finishes. "For my long-term goals, I want to become a vet specializing in horses, and give back to them for all they've done for me." 🐾

In consideration of "permissive entry" to minor into the restricted area, which is the area from which admission to the general public is restricted, which includes, but is not limited to the rodeo arena, competition area, chutes, pens, adjacent walkways, concessions, and other appearances, we, the undersigned, on behalf of the minor and for ourselves, our personal representatives, heirs, next of kin, spouses and assigns, do hereby:

1. RELEASE, DISCHARGE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE the rodeo committee, stock contractor, rodeo association, sponsors, arena operators or owners, and each of them, their officers, agents and employees (all hereinafter collectively referred to as "releasees") from any and all claims and liability arising out of strict liability or ordinary negligence of releasees or any other participant which causes the undersigned injury, death, damages or property damage. We, the undersigned, jointly, severally, and in common, covenant to hold releasees harmless and to indemnify releasees from any claim, judgment or expenses releasees may incur arising out of any of the minor's activities or presence in the restricted area.

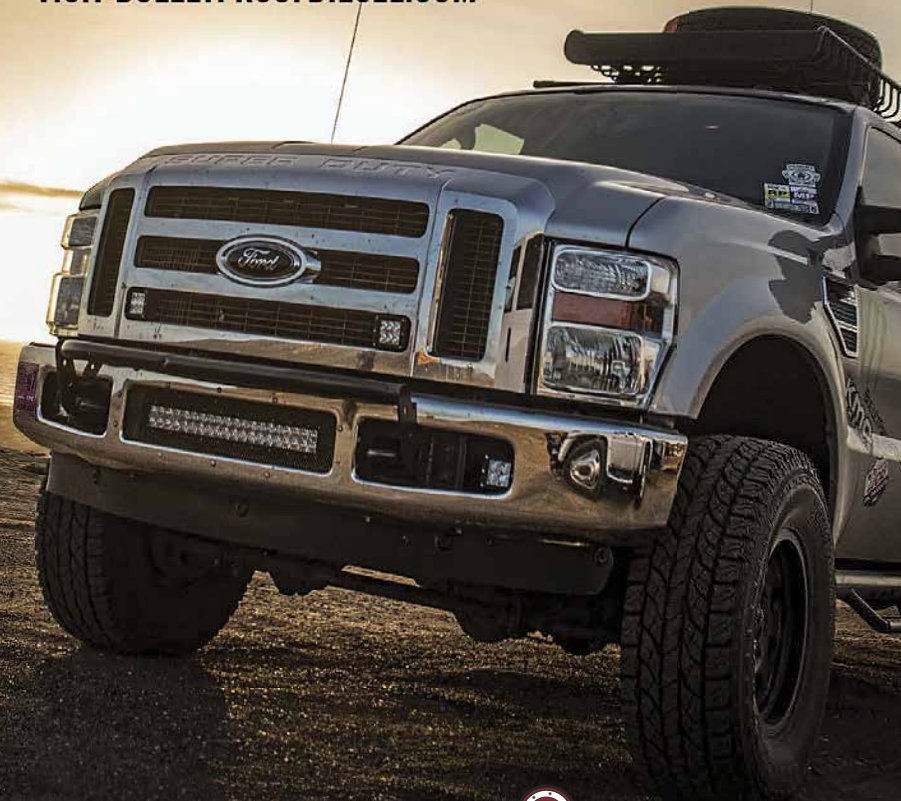

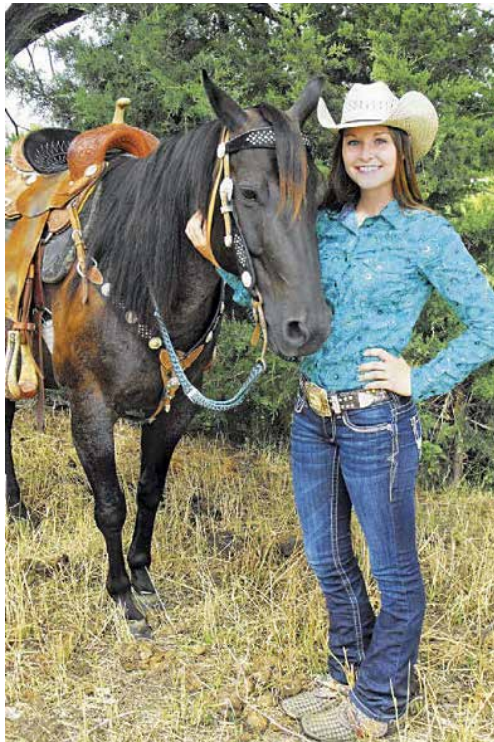

Her dad, Mark, was the one who got her started riding, and when he passed, it was hard. "It was tough to keep riding once he was gone," she said. "But now, that's what I do to keep going."

The seventeen year old, a resident of Cedar Rapids, Nebraska, competes in the barrel racing, pole bending, and occasionally the breakaway roping.

"Blue," her eight-year-old blue roan, is her barrel and pole horse. She put the barrel and pole training on him when she got him four years ago, and the horse has a huge personality. "He loves attention and he's the goofy one of the herd. He'll pick up his food pan and toss it around. He's pretty comical."

Macy will be a senior at Riverside Public School this fall, where she'll have a tough schedule: anatomy and physiology, accounting, college algebra and college English.

In high school, she is part of the dance team, FFA, one-act play, and on the honor roll. She also shows horses in 4-H.

This summer, Macy took a fun trip with classmates to California, where she loved the beach, and visited Alcatraz,

the San Diego Zoo, and a Padres game. But she found out that the traffic in L.A. is terrible, compared to the traffic in Cedar Rapids (no stoplights, only a four-way stop), and the sunsets in Nebraska are much, much better than the sunsets in California.

Macy had two jobs this summer, lifeguarding at the pool in Cedar Rapids and working at the Countryside Veterinary Clinic in Fullerton. She's seen some interesting things: surgery on a cow with eye cancer, a horse on an IV, and a dog that ate clothes.

In 2013, the Western States Ranch Rodeo Association added a women's division to the association that brought 8 women's teams to the finals. The WSRRA continues to experience rapid growth in the women's division. At the 2016 WSRRA National Finals 22 women's teams had qualified for the finals. The WSRRA currently has sanctioned events in thirteen states plus Canada.

One of these cowgirls that qualified for the 2016 WSRRA Nationals rodeo is Taylor Teichert. You can't miss this 25 year old cowgirl from Mackay, Idaho. She is a very talent cowgirl and photographer. Her smile and positive attitude is contagious. Taylor grew up as a cowgirl and that is all that she needed to have the cowgirl fever. She is the youngest of 7 kids. She has lived and worked from Nebraska to California and all over in between. Along with being a handy cowgirl, Taylor is also a freelance photographer, a freelance writer and an E4 Ropes sales rep. One of the things that I appreciate about Taylor is her attitude about life. "I love dancing, cooking, eating, family, thunderstorms, God, new baby calves, branding, fall, a horse with some heart, a Canadian man, right after the sun goes down, and roping," she explains.

One of Taylor's qualities is roping and right fully so, she loves to rope. "Well I love roping and I have had a goal to become a better roper for years. Ranch rodeo is just another opportunity to rope and I will jump on any chance I get to rope

something," she states. The love of roping has brought Taylor to the ranch rodeo arena.

"I love the high speed intensity of ranch rodeos; they are so fun to watch but way more fun to compete in."

Family values are important to this cowgirl. "I never participated in High School Rodeo, my dad said he needed my help on the ranch, branding and turning cows out on the range," she states. For years Taylor would watch ranch rodeos from the stands until one day she was asked to be on a Women's WSRRA Ranch Rodeo team in Bridgeport, Nebraska. "I

was 22, had moved to Lakeside, Nebraska where I was working on the Rex Ranch when I was asked to participate on a team. Bridgeport was the first rodeo I had ever entered, it was actually my whole team's first times ranch rodeoing so we were very nervous! First event was the trailer loading and I went into sort and blew all the cattle across the line. We got a no time so fast! I wish they would have given an award for how fast you can get a no time! My rodeo career was looking bright," Taylor says.

That first ranch rodeo was all that it

took for Taylor to start on the ranch rodeo trail. She explains that you don't need much to participate in a ranch rodeo, you need a horse, a rope, and about \$125 for entrance fees, that's it! What makes you successful at ranch rodeo? Taylor tells me that you need more than a horse, a rope and money to be successful at ranch rodeo. "You need confidence, hours of practice, a horse that will put you in the right position, a rope that you can feel the tip with, and the ability to read a cow. All of these skills are things you can't buy, you need to put in the time practicing with

your rope, training your horse, spending time ranching and learning the way a cow thinks." Tayler noticed that the top 5 teams usually were ranchers that also team roped. So she decided to start team roping. "I've only done it in the practice pen so far but I know it has helped my roping an incredible amount. Once I realized all of this, it made me realize why ranch rodeo is so fun, because it is hard! The things that bring me the most joy in life are the ones that I work the hardest at", she states.

On the ranch rodeo trail, Tayler has a list of things that she takes on the rodeo trail:

1. A wicked sorrel mare named Rosie ("I ride a lot of different horses but she's my new go to.").
2. E4 Ranch Ropes.
3. Her favorite hat and jeans.
4. Lots of snacks and my favorite mix tape.
5. Confidence.

Tayler qualified for the 2016 WSRRA National Finals. She has been participating in sanctioned events since she started on the ranch rodeo trail. "I'd have to say my favorite part of the association is the finals every fall in Winnemucca. It's a great place to see all my friends across the country. It's fun to watch the different

styles people bring to the event. You can learn a lot by watching others compete," she says. Tayler's proud win was the 2017 Sean Miller Memorial Rodeo in Lovelock, Nevada. "I won my first buckle this past June and I am still giddy about it. I've been to the finals in Winnemucca every year since 2014 but this is the first year I have actually qualified with my team. I've always just been an alternate in previous years," she states.

At the 2016, WSRRA Finals Tayler had plans to ride a big, blue gelding of hers but her gelding ended up getting sick. Tayler ended up borrowing a horse from her boss. "He gets pretty hot in town, so the day before I decided to wean a bunch of calves on him to take the edge off. When we were headed out to gather that morning he tied up on me, so I took him to the vet and got told he was out for the weekend. My boss, Tim, offered me any of his horses I was comfortable on. I ended up riding his big beautiful sorrel head horse named Sizzler. He took great care of me and put me in position every event".

Tayler's 2017 ranch rodeo goals include winning the WSRRA National Finals in Winnemucca. "Someday I plan on being on the winning team at the finals and I'm going to keep working on it till that day comes," she says. Tayler's team named Mori Range Cows consists of

team members Sandy Kiel, Katie Cavin and Andrea Sestanovich. These cowgirls all have the same goal. To win the gold buckle at the WSRRA National Finals in Winnemucca, Nevada this fall. "Well we have never sat down and had a team goals pow wow but I think it goes unsaid that we all want to do our best and help set each other up for success. Before each event we make a plan but we each know that if it doesn't work exactly as planned don't doubt yourself, if you're in good position, rope it! When our team got together we all said that if we were yelling during an event it wasn't out of anger so no one is allowed to get their feelings hurt", she states.

I am going to leave you all with this awesome quote from Tayler. This quote sums up why this cowgirl is such an inspiration to me. "I've had a goal since my first ranch rodeo in 2014 to win a buckle. Thanks to the handy women on my team, the grace of God, my boyfriend's horse and coaching, and years and years of wanting it and practice I finally achieved my goal! Ranch Rodeo has made me push harder and learn what confidence is!"

On behalf of the WSRRA, good luck at the national finals and we will be watching Mori Range Cows at the WSRRA National Finals in Winnemucca, Nevada, November 1-4, 2017. 🍀

COMING TOGETHER

One of my favorite quotes is "Success is not a goal, it's a by-product."

So what is success a by-product of? Your daily effort at practice?

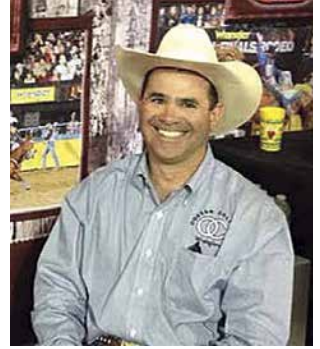
One thing that always amazes me every year is how much time some students are willing to spend in the practice pen. They spend a lot of time there, and they don't accomplish much because of their approach to practice. Here is my advice to many students every year it's not how much time you put into your practice that counts.

[Practice with the purpose and intent to get better. Don't just go through the motions.]

Practice with a purpose, other than spending a lot of time in the arena. Just because you spend a lot of time in the arena does not mean you are making progress or even improving.

It's always what you put into that time in the practice pen that matters. It is how you practice that ultimately makes the difference between your success and failure, between you reaching your goals or falling short. Time is a terrible measuring stick in the practice pen. Progress and improvement are what you should strive for.

When you commit yourself to train mentally and physically the quality of your practices will improve. Make your runs

matter in the practice pen. Make consequences for poor runs or poor efforts in the practice pen. Eventually you will perform like you practice. You can't practice on cruise control and then go expect to perform at a high level.

As a high level athlete you need to be willing to directly connect what you are doing in practice pen with the ultimate performance that you're training for in the future. When you are able to do this you will get the very most out of each practice session.

Don't just practice. To be a top competitor you must have a practice plan and be able to prepare to get better. Don't practice and hope to get better, Practice with the purpose and intent to get better every day.

Don't just go through the motions.

Understand why you're doing what you're doing in the practice pen today and how it will help you when you have entry fees up in the future.

Success is not a goal, it's a byproduct of your daily practice efforts. What are your practices producing? 🐾

I love to rodeo – I love it with all my heart,” says RMPRA barrel racer Laynee Giles. “I love the excitement and the competition, and I love that I can do it with my family.” The 16-year-old from Lake Shore, Utah, competes in the RMPRA with her mom, Brandi Giles, as well as the UHSRA. Her sister, Oaklee, 12, also runs barrels, and their dad, Shane Giles, is a team roper. “It’s the greatest thing ever when I can compete against my mom and sister, and even though we’re competing against each other, we’re still on the same team,” says Laynee. “We practice and train and do all that together. I love that, if one of us is struggling, we can give each other advice, and once we fix things, it’s really fun to see all the pieces put together and how each of us has improved.”

Laynee started rodeoing on her pony when she was 5 or 6, and one of her goals that’s driven her the last several years is qualifying for the RMPRA finals. “The last two years, I’ve been thirteenth, and I’ve been so close. That’s been my goal, just so I can improve and get better every year.” She also competes in pole bending, breakaway roping, and team roping as a header in the UHSRA, but barrels are by far her favorite. “I love how it gives me a new run each time to try and improve myself and get better. I love the excitement and rush I get just before I walk in the gate, or as I’m coming home and knowing I had a good run.” Laynee’s mom has competed in the WPRA as well as the RMPRA, and she is Laynee’s inspiration. “She comes with me to every rodeo, and most of the time we compete together. She always makes sure I’m taken care of and I know what I need to do, and gives me a little pep talk.”

Annie, 10, is Laynee’s barrel horse. The family bought her from a friend last year, and she and Laynee hit it off instantly. “My mom ran her two times before I

started running her, and we just clicked. I think her personality and my personality match.” She’s ridden her breakaway horse, Stella, 13, the last eight years, while Laynee runs poles on Toaster, an 8-year-old gelding. “We raised him from a baby, and my dad and grandpa raced him on the track for two years. They ran him in California at Los Alamitos, and when he came back, we started playing around with him. He’s fast, but he travels at his own pace. My team roping horse is Hank. He’s fifteen, and he was my dad’s head horse, but my dad builds pipe fences and we have a trucking company and a gas station. He’s super busy, so I stole Hank and started heading on him, and my dad was glad.” Laynee also never leaves for a rodeo without the family’s corgi/red heeler, Cowgirl.

A junior at Spanish Fork High School, Laynee likes floral culture or any of her other art classes, and she’s taking as many college classes as possible before she graduates. She played accelerated softball for five or six years, but decided to focus on rodeo when she started high

school. Laynee also enjoys being with her friends and going out to ice cream, as well as traveling with her family to rodeos or horse races in California.

“I finished eighth in the high school rodeo standings last year, so I’d like to work my way up in the standings and try to qualify for Nationals,” says Laynee. “I made it to Silver State in Winnemucca this year and ended up winning the average in barrels there, so if I end up going back to Winnemucca, I’d be grateful for another win.”

3. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS the releasees and each of them from any loss, liability, damage, or cost they may incur due to the presence of the restricted area and/or while competing, officiating, observing, or working for or for any purpose participating in the event and whether caused by the negligence of the releasee or otherwise;

4. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY ASSUMES FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR AND RISK OF BODILY INJURY, DEATH OR PROPERTY DAMAGE due to the negligence of releasee or otherwise while in or upon the restricted area and/or while competing, officiating, observing, or working for or for any purpose participating in the event.

THE UNDERSIGNED HAS READ AND VOLUNTARILY SIGNS THE RELEASE, WAIVER OF LIABILITY, AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT, and further agrees that no oral representations, statements, or inducements apart from the foregoing written agreement have been made. Execution of this Agreement constitutes consent for the use of each of the undersigned's image for any purpose.

Wyatt Rindlisbacher spends his days riding horses, roping the dummy, and working on his family's mink ranch. "Mostly I scatter feed, fix pens, or whatever needs to be done," said the 13 year old. "It's fun – I like being with my family and I'm learning a good work ethic." Wyatt is the middle child and likes that role. "I have a younger brother (Rylan, 8) that looks up to me and I have an older sister (Jade). I look up to her; she has won a lot in her career. Jade has really helped me the last couple years with my horsemanship. Now I feel like I'm a pretty good horseman, but my dad still teaches me."

Wyatt competes in ribbon roping, tie down roping, team roping, and goat tying. He belongs to both Utah Junior High and National Little Britches. He made the National Junior High Finals both years. "It was a really good experience. I didn't do any good, but I met a lot of cool neat friends. I learned that the kids that excel are the kids that work really hard and go to bed early. They do what they need to do. I try to be one of those kids." He likes team roping and calf roping, and really likes the team roping. "When it works it's really fun," said the heeler. He has nine horses on the place, three are

his. He tie down ropes and team ropes off the same horse. He's got his dad's old horse as a backup and has a young one coming along. "My dad (Jason) is a #8 heeler, when my dad was going a lot he said if there was a roping within six hours he was there. He doesn't rope as much now as he used to. He works and keeps track of us. He taught me how to rope, tie, and ride a horse." Wyatt ropes with a Fast Back Red-line soft, 31. "My dad is sponsored by Fast Back so it works good."

He practices every day with Willy Reid and his sister. "Sometimes other people come, and my mom (Natalie) opens the chute – she videos us too – every run. We watch the videos that night or in the morning depending on when we get done. I try to stop the video and break it down to find anything I do wrong. If I miss, then I see why." Wyatt wants to be a mink rancher when

he grows up and rodeo for a living. "I'm trying to figure out how to be gone and rodeo – if I make the Finals while my dad is still here, he can take care of the ranch. He won't do any of this until he serves an LDS mission for two years. He leaves for that in five years. He starts school in about two weeks. "I like school – I like to hang out with my friends and I like math the best. Science isn't my strongest, but I like learning new stuff I can use in my daily life."

Wyatt started roping when he was four. "I started roping steers and trying to learn." The thing he likes about rodeo is hanging out with his friends. "The thing about rodeo that's different from other sports is that if you don't do good, you don't get paid." He plays football with his friends and plays basketball with his Youth church group. "Work hard and let your dreams come true. Thanks to Willie Reid for turning me hundreds of steers – he's my adopted grandpa, and my parents for supporting me. 📺

My mom has been barrel racing at some jackpots and Sam has been roping a lot. I like getting to rope with him."

That is definitely an accomplishment for me." This year Ryker qualified for the Utah Junior High state finals in breakaway roping, team roping and bull riding. "I try to find local bulls to get on and local rodeos to go to so I can get more practice on

Ryker plans to try his hand professionally in all his events but would choose bull riding and team roping over all the others to continue into the future. His favorite part about the UJH-SRA is getting to spend time with friends in far corners of the state. "I like going around to places in Utah, especially the ones I have never seen before. It is fun to be there and see how they rodeo in that part of the state." Sam always reminds Ryker of their shared favorite quote: "hard work beats talent when talent does not work hard." 🐾

Meet the Company Slash M Rodeo Company

Thirty-four years ago in August of 1983, Scott McDaniel put on his first full rodeo with his newly minted rodeo company, now known as Slash M Rodeo Company. He has nearly as long of a history with the Arizona Rodeo Association (now the GCPRA), putting on rodeos for the association the last 32 years. "The Grand Canyon membership is outstanding to work with," says Scott, 59, who hails from Sonoita, Arizona. "It's really been a strong organization. Just about every year, I take stock to the finals, and it's always been a good production. I don't get to make the finals every year, but in the last few years I've sent stock with my son and some of my help."

Scott rode steers and junior bulls growing up, but he was primarily a team roper through his early twenties. "It was a lot of fun, but when I got married and had a family, it was hard to compete due to my job," he says. Scott started his rodeo company soon after, having originally leased timed event cattle out to stock contractors in the late '70s and early '80s. "I really appreciate what my partners and family have done with me. My family's been in the beef industry forever, so we had ranches and feedyards and I had a place to hold my roping calves and steers. I made decent money at it, but I had no idea about the mechanics or business end of it!" When Scott put together a herd of bucking bulls for a client who changed his mind at the last minute, Scott decided to lease the bulls out and start putting on a few rodeos, and the company grew slowly but surely.

While he explains that Arizona can be a challenging area to produce rodeos in because of the scattered rodeo season, Scott still contracts out 16 rodeos a year, having scaled back from the 20 – 25 a year he did in the past. "This is real manageable for me," says Scott, who also works for his family's beef industry brokering firm. "I import cattle out of Mexico, and I'm in a partnership on a livestock auction in Willcox, Arizona." Though Scott can't make all the rodeos, his son, Jake, is his right-hand man. "Right now I have a hard working young crew. It's a lot of fun being around them and working with them. They're good help, and I'm thankful for all of them."

Likewise, Scott enjoys working with the many rodeo committees he's come to know over the years. "The committees I work with and for are outstanding, and they have a lot of hard working men and women. They have some really good sponsors, and I'm appreciative of all that. I put on my own events, and I learn to appreciate everything they do. It's like putting on three rodeos to put on one of your own from start to end. It's a lot of work transporting in and out, but I am thankful for the contestants and the people that

work for me, and the committees and all the hard work they put out."

Scott also puts on rodeos with the Arizona Cow Punchers Association and NIRA. He even has several racehorses running in Arizona and California, but his latest venture is raising his own bucking horses. "My family has raised running horses, and the bucking horses are different, like learning the bloodlines and crosses when you've just heard about them, but never experienced them. We're going to use our own colts this year, and no matter if it's a race horse or a bucking horse, what turns out to be a strong competitive horse is a real accomplishment."

Along with developing his bucking horses, Scott's goal is to continue producing quality rodeos. "We very seldom cross a state line, and we enjoy what we have right here. There's always room for improvement on my part," he finishes, "and we want to hold on and do the best job we can." 📺

Meet the Member Kaylee Hargis

“All I remember is my horse flipping end to end, I could not move and I could not get out from under him,” said 13-year-old Kaylee Hargis of an accident the first day of last summer. The Aztec, New Mexico, cowgirl was helping bring “bounty-steers” back in the team roping pen with Salty, her dad and Calvin, her brother, when one stopped and her horse did not, resulting in her broken leg. “Of course I got on my horse with that big cast on! It was the last two weeks of summer that I could finally ride again without a cast.” Swinging back up was not just difficult physically but mentally as well. “I was scared to get back in the saddle even though I knew my horse would not hurt me. I felt accomplished that I got right back on and roping again. Everyone told me not to but I am determined to go pro one day and I am not going to let a little accident stop me.”

The 2017 New Mexico State Pole Bending Champion likes to go by her middle name, Shianne. Her first horse was a partially blind, 24-year-old Appaloosa mare she ran barrels and poles on for her first year of rodeo. “My mom picked me up from school one day and surprised me with a 20-year-old sorrel gelding I had fallen in love with at a barrel race. I roped and tied goats on him for about three years.” A mare from a friend gave her the opportunity to set her sights high in her favorite event, poles. “My goal was to win state in poles on her before I had to give her back, it took us four years but I was determined. Poles was our thing and we worked hard at it. I lost my hat in the alley and hit poles all year, I was not consistent at all but we had a good state finals and ended up winning.” Pole benders share an understanding of



the thrill of the event, agility and control of the horse necessary to be great at it, and that is why Kaylee loves it.

The Hargis-Cox family recently moved to Snyder, Texas. “There are definitely more rodeo opportunities here and that is what I am looking forward to.” She has not yet decided if she will rodeo her eighth grade year in New Mexico or Texas. “Everyone in the NMJHSRA was kind and helpful. When I won the state title I qualified for nationals but I could not financially afford to go. The board came together to help get me a ride there and the finances to go.” Though Kaylee did not take the generous offer, the gesture meant the world to her. “I felt like I could not accept that generous of a gift. I am saving everything I win this year so if I do qualify again, I can afford to go.” New competition and meeting new people is appealing for Texas junior high rodeo but something about NMJHSRA tugs at her to continue in her home state.

Kaylee has never spent more \$2,500 on a horse and she plans to keep it that

way in the future. “I like to get horses that do not know much and make something from them. I feel more accomplished when I win off a horse that was not finished when I got it.” She aspires to start training and selling rodeo horses in the near future and continue to step-up her rodeo game every year. Along with going pro eventually, Kaylee plans to pursue a career in law enforcement.

Determined in everything she pursues; Kaylee is setting her sights for nationals next year on a barrel horse she plans to turn into a pole bender. “Everything that gets me down just pushes me to work harder and to train harder. My brother and Elise Brown, my best friend, inspire me to be my best at everything I do. They encourage me and are the shoulders to cry on at the end of a tough rodeo. They are there through it all. I have my parents and God by my side.” 🐾

Meet the Member Stran Thompson

A phone call from people like Russel Sullavian, Taos Mumcy and Jerrad Focstetter meant the world to 17-year-old Stran Thompson from Estancia, New Mexico. "I have known Taos since I was a little kid but when he won the college finals in 2007 that was a big factor in what made me decide to rodeo." Stran ropes with both Jarrad and Russel on occasion to improve his heading and his calf roping. "Russel is a nine plus heeler so he knows how it all works. He shows me how to turn steers for different number heelers." Stran has always loved the calf roping. "I have a great calf horse, we just click. I have roped calves ever since I started rodeo in the second grade." Stran woke up one day and decided that he wanted to rodeo, his parents thought it was a great idea and they have not looked back since.

A 600-acre ranch gives Stran the ability to practice on more than just a dummy. "My grandpa has a ranch in Colorado with some steers. I went up there a lot when I was little to rope with him. Roping and ranching is something we can all do as a family and we all enjoy it." Shane, his dad, and Shannon, his mom, used to rodeo when they were younger. They now live on a ranch in Mountain Air, New Mexico, where they run 25 longhorn cows they breed to get roping steers and calves out of. "It is hot and dry here but we have gotten a lot of rain so it is starting to green up. We used to have beef cows but sold them before we moved to this smaller ranch." Shane is a welder and farrier and Shannon is a librarian for the local high school.

Stran is a senior and is starting his third year of online schooling through Dora High School. "I wanted to be able to rope more and not sit at school for eight hours. It is easier because I can work at my own pace." He used to be a basketball player but is now focused only on rodeo. He aspires to attend Eastern New Mexico University

and major in fiber optic wiring while being on their rodeo team. "If I can make good money at a job and still be able to do what I love then I cannot complain." His major role is to be the best he can be in rodeo.

The tough competition of NMHSRA helps push Stran to work harder on his roping. "It is a tough state; you have to be on your A-game if you want to make nationals. It is a lot of friendly competition though, every one is there for each other at the end of the day." All through middle school Stran had a goal of winning the state all-around cowboy title. He won cutting his freshman year at state but finally won the all-around the following year. "We roped everyday and it paid off that year. I won both the cutting and the all-around titles." A third state title in the cutting with a second in calves and a sixth in team roping led Stran to his second state

all-around title. "My goals for this year are to make it to nationals in team roping and win the state calf roping." His sights are set on getting saddles for team roping and calf roping. "Watching guys tie calves consistently and quickly at nationals made me want to work at it that much harder so I can go to nationals next year and be right there with them." His favorite part of rodeo is when all the hard work finally pays off. "My best advice is that when you miss a calf, keep your head up. There are thousands of calves out there to rope. Missing the calves that you need the most should send you back to the practice pen to work even harder. It will all pay off in the end." 🐾

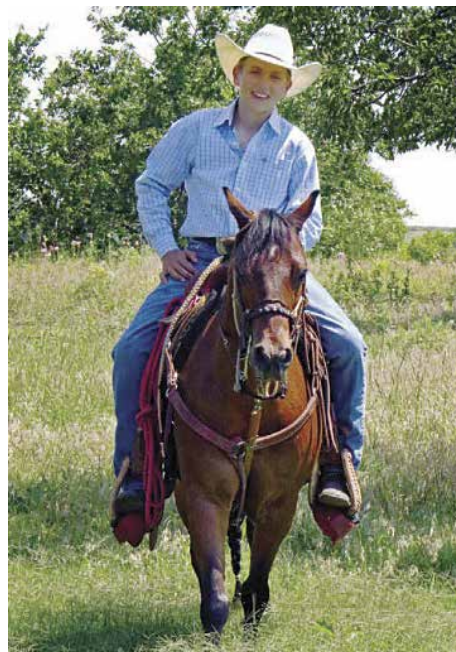

Kathryn Todd, from Tuttle, Oklahoma, recently captured the OHSRA championship title in pole bending and the reserve title in goat tying, leading her to the All-Around Cowgirl title and another trip to nationals where she ended up 20th in the goats, and 5th in goats at the IFYR. Kathryn is a junior at Connections Academy, an online school she started her freshman year. "It has been great for my rodeo career, I can travel and practice on my own schedule." The seventeen-year-old's favorite subject is math because she likes to problem solve. "I would like to get a computer science degree and then maybe go to law school to become a patent lawyer." Kathryn's dad, Jeff, is a lawyer, working with agricultural businesses. Her mom, Nancy, stays at home with Kathryn and her younger sister, Gretchen, while her older brother, Haines, is finishing up an engineering degree at Oklahoma State University. Her parents met while attending Northwestern Oklahoma State University on rodeo scholarships. "My mom made it to the CNFR and my grandpa, Henry Hangzinger, almost made it to the NFR. He was an amazing calf roper and won a lot of rodeos back in the day."

Kathryn works out a few times a week to keep herself at the top of her game. "I work out a lot for my goat tying, to protect my knees. It helps with all my other events too and it has helped me improve as a competitor." Her favorite road snack is beef jerky because it is packed with protein and keeps her healthy as she is always on the go.

"It seems like we are going to a rodeo or barrel race every weekend." Kathryn spends her time outside practicing every chance she gets. "It feels like I am doing something for rodeo 24/7. Growing up in rodeo has helped me develop skills that I hope to use my whole life. I have also met life-long friends." Kathryn runs barrels, poles, ties goats and breakaway ropes, but her favorite event is the pole bending. "I have a really nice horse and he makes it pretty easy for me. I have been working really hard on my barrel racing so I like that event too." Both grey Quarter Horses, Kathryn rides ten-year-old Phoenix, a mare, for barrels and a 13-year-old gelding named Dually for poles. She rides 17-year-old Smarty, a sorrel Quarter Horse gelding, for goats and 20-year-old Ruby, a bay Quarter Horse mare, for breakaway. "I like all of my horses but I am most proud of Cowgirl. She is the first horse I trained for barrels and is doing really well. I would love to train younger horses, maybe for futurities, in the future."

It is no wonder Kathryn's favorite rodeo to compete in was junior high nationals in 2013. She was the all-around cowgirl and won the pole bending at the Gallup, New Mexico event. "I have always loved nationals; it is so much fun. There are so many kids to meet and lots of great competition." This June Kathryn returned to the Red Rock Arena in Gallup for the Best of the Best Timed Event Rodeo where she won the breakaway roping and was reserve champion in the pole bending.

For the last six years she has won the Oklahoma junior high or high school championship in pole bending, a streak she wants to keep alive for another year. In 2014 she was the reserve champion all-around cowgirl at junior high nationals. "Since we are not separated by regions like Texas, I think that allows us [OHSRA members] to get to know

"My grandma taught all the girls in my family how to peyote stitch, which is different from loom work. I usually bead headstalls and bracelets and then sell them online. Some of my headstalls have been used at the NFR, which is pretty special." 🐾

GUS DUNCAN

[*Passionate about wildlife and rodeo*]

Gus Duncan grew up in Oklahoma with an arena and a roping in his backyard every weekend, but while his family grabbed their ropes, he grabbed his rifle and spent his weekends hunting. “I’ve always had such a passion for wildlife, and that’s what’s important to me,” says Gus, a Cargill Feed Consultant who focuses on equine and wildlife. “My passion for the rodeo industry is helping, not necessarily roping. I love the sport, but I get more of a thrill helping those people win, as opposed to roping myself.”

Rodeo companies, equine breeding operations, and wildlife and equine ranches all run on the well being of their animals, and Gus shares the same commitment with his customers. He’s been in the feed industry for 15 years, and since joining the Cargill team in 2013, Gus has worked alongside prestigious companies like Beutler and Son Rodeo Company and the Lazy E Ranch. “The focus on my equine customers is 100 percent performance driven,” Gus explains. “I work with large bucking stock and performance animals, whether it’s barrel horses, rope horses, or bucking horses, and I work with many large racing facilities. With horses, we look at everything from the outside and take a wide view, then trim it down and look at individual animals and how they perform and move. By talking to the customers and finding out their goals, I can go more in depth to get to those goals. It may be a horse that needs more calories, or a horse that has a digestive problem. I work with some of the largest of the large, and it’s very exciting to see what they do.”

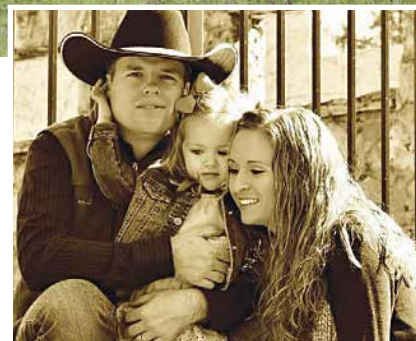
Along with his work feeding all of the breeding horses at Lazy E Ranch, Gus also works with Nutrena, the official feed sponsor of The Lazy E. “I work directly with the arena, providing feed for events and marketing, and we’ll do a lot of giveaways for fans, so it’s anything we want to partner on with them,” says Gus.

In the wildlife field, Gus focuses on wildlife breeding operations of white tail deer, mule deer, and elk. “The number one thing I’m always looking at first is herd health, and then antler growth. Without correct herd health and a management program, you won’t get the antler growth you want.” Though Record Rack feed has been around for many years, Gus feels it has improved greatly as the research in wildlife nutrition continues. “I feel like we are leading the way when it comes to wildlife nutrition. I work hand in hand with another gentleman that works for Cargill, Bobby Deeds, and he has made leaps and bounds in the wildlife nutrition department. In my position, you have to be passionate about whatever it is you do, and knowledgeable. You also have to be a likeable person that people trust – you have to be genuine – and if you can tie those three together, you can be successful.”

Gus traverses the entire state of Oklahoma and the Texas Panhandle visiting customers, which are roughly 60% large equine ranches and 40% wildlife ranches. “With Cargill, we have a no-phone policy in our vehicles, so I listen to music. I love every genre – it doesn’t matter if it’s classical to rock and roll. Music is how we keep our blood pumping.” Since Gus and his wife, Chelsi, have jobs that involve traveling between Oklahoma and Texas, they have homes in both states. In the fall, Gus also enjoys guiding deer hunts for ranches in Oklahoma, Texas, and Colorado. “In Texas and Oklahoma we don’t pack on horseback,



but in Colorado when we go on big elk hunts, we pack in on horseback and camp in the mountains. I like the peacefulness, and the outdoors in general. It’s just relaxing, and a lot of the time when I’m hunting, I’m taking someone who hasn’t had the opportunity to hunt and harvest animals like I have. To see the passion and excitement in their eyes when they do it – there’s nothing better than taking a kid hunting that loves the outdoors and hasn’t had the opportunity to do it.” On weekends when he’s not hunting or fishing, Gus travels to barrel races around Oklahoma and Texas with his wife, who competes, and their 4-year-old daughter, Bailey. Chelsi worked in medical research with animals until they started their family, and she now works in the commercial industry, while their daughter loves to go shed hunting with Gus.

“I want to provide the best service possible for everyone I work with, and to be known as the guy who is honest and up front about everything,” Gus finishes. “I want people to know I have their business in mind first hand. I love working for Cargill, and I strive to be the best and I want my customers to have the best. Same with my family – I strive to be the best husband and father that I can. Those are the things that are important to me. 🐾

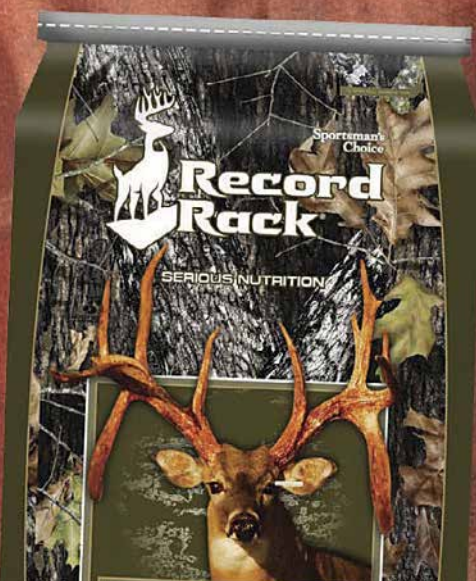

Meet the Member Billi Halverson: *Living on the Edge*

Some women are born to fly. Billi Halverson is one of those. Her small North Dakota hometown of Hazen couldn't hold her. They miss her smile and genuine enthusiasm every day.

Now she calls Fort Worth, Texas, home for a variety of reasons. Years ago, the access to bucking bulls and Professional Women's Rodeo Association sanctioned bull rides drew her like a moth to the flame. She was serious, rode like it and has the hardware in her right forearm to prove it. She's won Mesquite, been 6th in the PWRA standings.

In fact, during her bull riding career, she broke her riding arm five times and lives the usual chronic, daily pain all roughstock riders accept. What she finally couldn't do was put the kind of grip and arm strength together that it takes to win in the bull riding. When that happened, Billi was looking for a new challenge and has found it nodding for ranch broncs, but not before she fell in love with roller derby.

"Just for fun, a friend invited me to go watch a derby with her. Sure, why not? I'm forever grateful because I was so impressed with those ladies. They were amazing skaters who put everything into the game, banged on each other hard and walked away smiling, as friends," Billi remembers.

She wanted to be part of that kind of a fully physical, bonded team of athletes and started to apply herself to the goal.

Billi Halverson had never laced on a pair of roller skates. She signed up for lessons, learned alongside first graders. She hung onto the walls while they skated circles around her. She persisted. Today, she's one of the top scoring jammers in the

league, beloved by her team mates, the fans and respected by the opposition.

"Women's sports have always been treated differently. Stories about us always talk about our age and our weight. I've rarely seen a male athlete written about in quite the same way," Halverson said. "I don't tell reporters my age because the conversation ought to be somewhere else. In fact, I believe that talking is meaningless. Proving what you do is what it's about."

"One of the coolest things about the derby revival is these women in Fort Worth made it happen. They got this league together, manage the tour, the venues and promotion. Now men want to put leagues together and play. For the first time in sport-

ing history that I'm aware of, they're coming to us to find out how. We blazed this trail and love that they want to be involved."

The RIDE TV TBRA Ranch Bronc Riding was about the same kind of introduction. When promos started appearing on the social networks, Billi's friends encouraged her to give it a shot. Some thought they were teasing her. Most knew better.

"It had nothing to do with the TV show. In fact, that was one of the negatives for me at first. I'd seen a few girls who'd come out and enter the bull riding for the attention, not because they were serious about the competition, bettering themselves, or challenging themselves. The kind of girls who'd buck off then lay there," said Billi. "I'd also been disappointed in reality shows that focused on women in rodeo."

"Actually, drama is minimal on the women's rodeo trail. It's very positive between competitors. We lift each other,

laugh with each other, we don't cry because cowgirls don't," Billi said. "The RIDE TV production crew gets that and treats our sport, our horses and us respectfully. We've become friends and grown as competitors while the cameras roll."

Halverson has a way to go to learn the craft of the ranch bronc rider and that's part of what she loves. The other part is

the horses. She broke her spine earlier this season when she had one of those 'hit just wrong' buck offs and fractured her spine in several places. She's on the sidelines at the rink and the arena wearing a lot of fiberglass and steel exoskeleton until that heals but expects to be ready to ride at the Texas Bronc Riders Association Finals in Fort Worth in November.

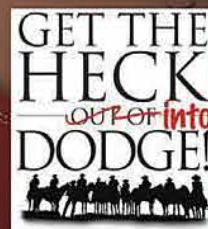
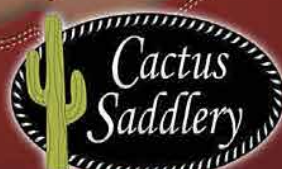

Meet the Member Libby Berger

Third generation rodeo competitor 13-year-old Libby Berger from Udall, Kansas, has a need for speed. "Barrels or breakaway roping is my favorite because I like to go fast, I just love roping too." Libby is also a pole bender and heels in the team roping with her partner, Mason Stueve. "He has been a family friend forever; he is like my little brother." Libby currently rodeos in the CePRA and the KHSRA, along with open rodeos and jackpots sprinkled in. She is most proud of making the CePRA finals when she was only 12 and finishing eighth in the nation in barrels last year. "I started riding when I was only 18 months old and youth rodeos when I was probably two or three. I ran barrels for awhile and then I started doing flags and poles when I got a little bit older."

Libby's parents taught her just about everything she knows. Her dad, Monte, was a rough stock rider and her mom, Kristy, was a barrel racer. "My great Uncle Bobby Berger was a bronc rider, he made it to the NFR several times." Marley, her brother, is a calf roper and a team roper in the CePRA. "My brother is very helpful, especially with my breakaway horse. He is bad in the box sometimes so my brother will get on him and fix him or set barrels for me. He just does everything."

Libby's favorite part of rodeo is getting to spend time with her family, they rodeo almost every weekend. "I like everything about going to rodeos with my family: going to new places and helping each other practice."

Libby will be a freshman this fall in Andover E-Academy, her homeschooling program that allows her to rodeo full-time. Her favorite subjects are math and history. The very little down time Libby has she spends with her family, some-

times they like to go fishing. "We practice something every single day. We rope calves every day and team rope probably twice a week. I exercise my barrel horse every day and then run him twice a week before a rodeo." Libby has three sorrel Quarter Horse geldings, she runs Twister in barrels, breakaway ropes on Rascal and heel off Lunch Pail.

"He came with that name because his dad, Snack Box, won quite a bit. So they called him Lunch Pail." With four all-around titles and saddles to her name, Libby is no stranger to the winner's circle. "I was the all-around cowgirl at the Border Bash last year and reserve all-around this year." Named the Kansas state champion barrel racer and pole bender, Libby earned another ride to nationals. She also placed third in the state in team roping. Libby ended up third at nationals in the barrel racing this year.

"I look up to Sherry Cervi, she is my idol in the barrels. I look up to Fallon Taylor too, she has done a lot for the sport of rodeo." This will be Libby's third year running in the CePRA, very few people her age run in the association. "I like the competition, it is tough and gets you ready for the next level. There are a lot of people that I have made friends with that I will be friends with forever. People that will help whenever they can. I just like the environment of them." Libby plans

Meet the Member Morgan Gorman

Morgan Gorman and her older brother are the first generation of their family to rodeo. Morgan, 14, followed in her brother's bootprints and rode sheep at the start of her career before learning to ride horses. Today, the cowgirl from Calumet, Oklahoma, competes in goat tying, break-away roping, and team roping. "This year, I started heading and practicing more than I used to. I practice with my older brother, Garrett. He's roping and riding saddle broncs at NCTC (North Central Texas College) in Gainesville, Texas," says Morgan. "My favorite is definitely goat tying. I like the rush of getting off your horse and flying nine-oh down the arena and putting a fast run together. It's exciting! I've learned being aggressive and keeping up even if I have a bobble because every second counts. Smooth is always fast."

Morgan's speed sent her to the NJH-FR for the first time in goat tying this year. "I have improvements I'm working on for high school rodeos, and I liked hanging out with friends and taking everything in," she says. "My mom, Eileen, is always out there when I'm practicing, and my brother, and we go down to Texas a lot to a rope horse trainer, Rick Rosaschi. He's been a huge part of where I've gotten in my roping, and my brother has been a huge help too." Morgan has also gone to the Camp of Champions rodeo school in Sayre, Oklahoma, several times, and she's also worked with Laramie Zant on goat tying.

"I'm motivated by the people I get to meet along the way, and the friendships I

make, and my parents are supportive, so that helps a lot," says Morgan. She also has an older sister, Mary. "I've grown up rodeoing, so that's what I like to do, and we started homeschooling so we could practice more and spend more time on the road. I get to go to more rodeos, and I go to USTRC's all week." Morgan, a freshman, does much of her school on the road if needed, and she especially enjoys math. "It's not the easiest, but it's always been my favorite. I like problem solving, and the satisfaction of knowing those hard an-

swers and being able to do them. It helps with knowing how much money you've spent on rodeo entry fees or gas mileage."

Morgan's goat tying horse, Coco, is a former racehorse she started competing on last year, and even when Morgan's older goat horse needed to retire unexpectedly, Coco, rose to the challenge. "I ride my brother's heel horse, Sister, and she's really good for being three years old," says Morgan. "I like that he'll let me ride her. He takes her to school, so we have a new horse, Magic, I've been barrel racing on a bit, and a new horse for high school rodeos this fall for me to rope on named Hot Rod. I think he'll be a good one." Morgan's family also has dogs, as well as goats for her to practice on, and she goes to her neighbor's arena to work on her roping and goat tying.

"I like hanging out with my friends or just riding my horses, and I like shopping," Morgan adds. "I play basketball sometimes so I stay in shape for when I'm rodeoing. I'm excited for high school rodeos – I just need to stay focused. I for sure want to get through high school and go to college and pursue rodeo. I'd like to make Nationals and even be a National Champion throughout high school. I want to get with my new horses and continue heading and get better, and just stay with it!"

This is only Sierra Fearno's second year roping, and even after an injury set her back during the fall season, the 18-year-old finished third at state finals in breakaway roping, and she competed at the NHSFR for the first time. "I'm so happy I got the chance to experience the National High School Finals!" says Sierra, who hails from Lakin, Kansas. "After the high school state finals last year, I had surgery on my leg, so I didn't rope at all last summer. I definitely had a lot of ground to make up when this season started. I had to practice harder because I felt like I was behind all the other girls, but I still had a really good year."

Sierra also competed in team roping with heeler Wacey Dorenkamp, and her sophomore year, she ran barrels and poles. She competed in trail course when she was a member of the NLBRA, but found a love for roping as a junior in high school. "I've found that if you want to be a competitive barrel racer or pole bender, you have to have a pretty nice horse," she explains. "Since my dad is a cowboy, we've always had rope horses, and it's something he can help me do. I found when I started roping that I liked it, so that's all I do now."

Sierra loves how competitive rodeo is, and her competitive side drives her to practice every day. "I love going out to rope calves every night – that's not practice to me. I think it's fun," she says. "It's fun to grow and see how my roping has improved. Even just going out twenty minutes a night makes a huge difference. I definitely look up to my dad. He works all day long and gets

home at six o'clock and still wants to saddle up horses and rope with me, or go to those late night rodeos. He definitely gives me a confidence boost before I go, and my parents, Kevin and Kristi, are really good about getting me to rodeos no matter what." Sierra has also gone to several clinics put on by Mid-Plains college rodeo coach, Garrett Nokes. "I've gotten to know him really well, and he's helped my roping a lot."

Her breakaway horse, Cody, is a 10-year-old red roan. "He's pretty cool, and he likes to buck me off on occasion," Sierra says with a laugh. "If you don't get him warmed up really good, he'll definitely buck you off, but when he's warmed up, he works super good for me. He didn't know how to track a calf either when we started roping, so we learned together, and he's turned into a super nice horse." She team ropes on another red roan, Tango, who is 12. "Dad rode him for years, so he's super cowy, and we learned how to team rope together too for the most part." Sierra helps ride her family's other horses, while her blue heeler, Punch, travels to all her rodeos. Punch

was a gift from her boyfriend last year after Sierra had her surgery.

When she's not headed to the next rodeo, Sierra prefers to be outside playing fetch with her dog, and she goes to watch her sister, Bailey, 14, play volleyball and basketball. "She comes to most of my rodeos, and we try to make it a family thing," says Sierra. She is rodeoing for Jim Boy Hash at Garden City Community College this fall while majoring in accounting.

She then plans to transfer to Oklahoma Panhandle State University to get her bachelor's degree. "I'm sad my high school career is over," she finishes, "but I'm definitely looking forward to being at the CNFR one day!"

Meet the Member Jesse Hopper

Jesse Hopper covered two of his three bulls at the 2017 AJRA Finals to win both the year-end and the Finals champion titles. The 17-year-old from Mangum, Oklahoma, went into the finals tied for first with Tanner Jones, but Jesse was the only contestant in his age division to ride his bulls. Last year was Jesse's rookie year in the AJRA, where he won the finals in the bull riding, while this year he finished fifth in the OHSRA bull riding. "Wanting to be a world champion one day drives me," he says. "I'm not going to get there without hard work, and that drives me to practice and get on as many bulls as I can. I love getting on bulls. It doesn't really feel like work – it's just fun for me."

Jesse and his older sister, August, also a bull rider, are the main members of their family to rodeo. Their cousin and several of their uncles rodeoed, either team roping or riding bulls, while Jesse started his career riding sheep. "Once upon a time I thought I was going to be a team roper. But I was told I couldn't because I was left-handed and I'd have to switch hands, so that was the end of that." But the dissuasion proved constructive for Jesse, who plans to make a career as a professional bull rider. He's competed in the Youth Bull Riding World Finals the last eight years and finished fourth in the junior bulls last year.

"My dad has always been the first one there to help me. He got me started and is there for every bull I get on," says Jesse. "Cody Custer has given me pointers and I've gone to his Camp of Champions in Sayre, Oklahoma. My Uncle Eugene

has helped me and Clay Taylor is always inviting me to his house to get on bulls. There's tons of people wherever I go always helping me. I've met a bunch of PBR guys, and I like to follow Justin McBride and Jess Lockwood." The Hoppers also have several head of their own bucking bulls for Jesse and his sister to practice on. "I can practice whenever I want, usually once or twice a week, and my dad is always there to help with gates and flanks, and my sister can spot me and give me a pull – anything I need. We started out by using my Uncle Eugene's roping steers (for practice), and now we've transitioned into buying actual bred bucking bulls. They're mainly for practice, but we do take them to some smaller rodeos if they need bulls."

Jesse is one of a handful of students at Mangum High School to rodeo. A junior,

his favorite part of school is football practice, playing for the Mangum Tigers. He explains that he'd much rather be working on his family's farm or riding bulls. "We mainly grow hay to feed the bulls and calves through the winter, so I swathe and cut hay." Jesse and his parents, Doyle and Lisa Hopper, make their home near Reed, Oklahoma, 15 miles outside of town. "You probably couldn't find Reed on the map," says Jesse. "There's not a lot of people, and since it's mostly farm land, there's lots of things to do outdoors, and places to go swimming." Though Jesse's friends prefer to do other sports like baseball or power lifting, many of them enjoy hunting and fishing together, and he'll occasionally ride his family's horses by the river.

"I don't ever leave my house without a cross that I wear, everywhere and every day," says Jesse. "I'd like to go to Nationals, if not win a National title in high school, and continue my rodeo career and win a PBR World Championship." 🐾

Meet the Producer Barnes & Sons

The humble beginnings of 17-time ACRA Producer of the Year, Barnes and Sons Rodeo Company from Tahlequah, Oklahoma, is a testament to the family-owned and operated business. The late Thelbert Barnes, founder of Barnes and Sons, had five kids with his wife Wanda: Wayne, Ray, James, Ronda and Donna. They all grew up on the ranch, taking on the heavy responsibilities of the operation early on. "It was hard work, but I would not trade it for the world," said Ronda Teague, Barnes and Sons secretary and Thelbert's oldest daughter. Their father worked on the pipeline and had a cattle operation at home that they managed while he was working in the oilfield.

"The ranch was our responsibility; Wayne is the oldest so a lot of that responsibility fell on his shoulders when we were just teenagers." In the 1970s, the boys started riding bulls. "Dad bought some practice bulls and built an arena for the boys to sharpen their riding skills and Donna and I to train horses in." Rodeo quickly became a big part of their lives as the practice bulls started bucking exceptionally well.

Thelbert made the decision to start producing rodeos after someone suggested his stock would be ideal for it. He invested in some bucking horses to go along with his bulls officially starting Barnes and

Sons. "It took off from there, we started putting on junior and open rodeos and eventually moved to sanctioned rodeos."

After 30 years, Barnes and Sons is a well-oiled machine, producing rodeos in Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri and Arkansas. "We try not to get

what they love.

Those practice bulls started a breeding program Barnes and Sons became known all over the country for. Some went on to buck at PBR events and the NFR. "There were pastures full of yearlings, two, three and four year olds just waiting to buck out. It was a big deal for awhile for us." The economics of breeding bulls led to a reduction in the program, most of the bulls they use now are purchased instead of raised. Thelbert also raised quality saddle horses, he let his kids pick them out from the pasture and then they had to train them for their rodeo events. "Donna is a better hand than any of us, she raises and trains barrel horses still today." Wayne lives on the same ranch he grew up on, managing the cattle operation and the rodeo company. "They run about 200 beef cow/calf pairs along with the bucking stock. When Wayne is not producing a rodeo he is taking care of them." Three years ago the middle Barnes' brother, Ray, passed away. A year ago Wanda, their mother, passed away and Thelbert followed her this past April. "We are continuing our parents' legacy through the ranch and rodeo business, that was always important to dad and to us." 🐾



too far from home since all of our workers have regular day jobs and families." They usually stay within a three-hour radius but travel up to seven hours for some events. "I think our crew is what sets us apart. We are a very close family and the crew that works with us is either family or just like it. We surround ourselves with people who are good at their job and that makes it easy for us."

Many of the rodeo committees have contracted with Barnes' from the very beginning, some are just like family now. "When

you surround yourself with good people it makes for a memorable experience for everyone. It is something you cannot find anywhere else." Some of the rodeo committees put the family up in cabins and they get to spend the entire weekend together doing

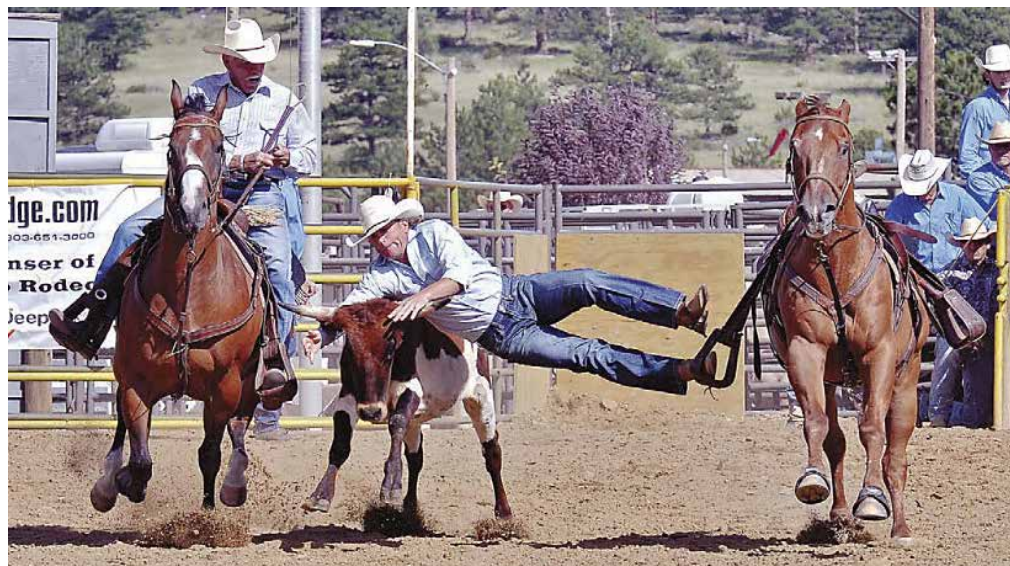

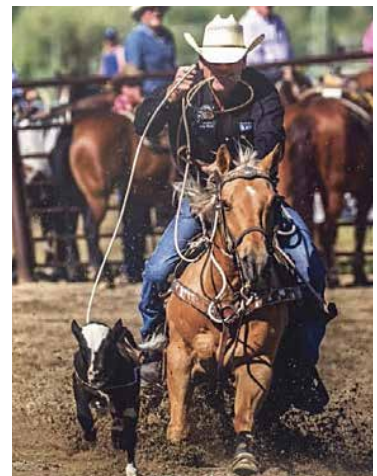
ENCOURAGEMENT FROM THE BOX!

The following rule proposals will be reviewed and acted on by the Board of Directors at their meeting to be held October 2, 2017 in Panguitch, Utah. All or part of the proposed rules MAY be incorporated into the 2018 Rule Book.

- NSPRA shall only "co-approve" an equal number of rodeos with CSPRA as CSPRA "co-approves" with NSPRA
- Bring back Section 8, adjusted points throughout the year will be carried into the finals and combined with any adjusted finals points to determine world champions. I propose to pick your region at the time you pay your membership dues.
- Any board member or event director who resigns before the end of their term will not be eligible to serve on the board of directors for 3 years.
- Do not co-sanction or co-approve any rodeos held the same time as a NSPRA sanctioned rodeo.
- First run on all cattle must be completed before any second run can be drawn.
- No drop down at the finals.
- Change 9.4.1 (pg 24). A \$20 office charge per contestant will be assessed as follows: \$1 judges fee, \$.50 secretary fee, \$4 to Gen Fund, \$6 Central Entry Fee, \$2.50 Association Fee, and \$5 Awards Fee
- At a rodeo over a few days, if no times are made, the money from that rodeo rolls over to the next day's rodeo purse. At the end of the rodeo series, if no times are made, the money rolls over to that year's finals.
- If the ground is deemed unacceptable by the event director and/or judges, the contestant will have the option to compete or to draw out. If they draw out they are still liable for their \$20 office and the rodeo will count for the finals.
- Hazer must be at least 40 years old AND hold an active membership in the NSPRA.
- Policy and Procedures (modify) #27. Any contestant entered in a rodeo that is cancelled can count that rodeo as one of their five qualifying rodeos, subject to paying the NSPRA fee.
- Policy and Procedures (New) #28. Any contestant entered in an event where they are the only contestant entered in that event when the books close and therefore cannot compete per Rule 15.6.4 can count that rodeo as one of their five qualifying rodeos, subject to paying the NSPRA fee for that rodeo. This policy only applies to the specific event and does not allow contestant to draw out of any other events with at least one other contestant.

His name is Rafael. I could see the lady gathering up her cleaning supplies in a bucket and heading into the house to get started but I stopped her. I asked Rafael to explain to her that the house smelled bad and that I was sorry about that fact but a plumber was on his way. Rafael relayed my message to this lady and she gave a reply back in Spanish and smiled at me. I asked Rafael what she had said. He translated she said, "Because of houses like this, I have a job." Man, I almost got choked up when Rafael told me what she had said. I thought to myself that if more people had the same mindset as this lady, our nation's unemployment rate would be almost zero.

This lady is an example of someone who is willing to do jobs that other people choose not to do. If I were a betting man, I would bet that this lady ends up living the American dream of a very successful life. 🐾

CATCHING IS THE EASY PART

I think I'd been roping for about three years when this gentleman came up to me and said, 'you're finally catching. Now, that's the easy part. Once you get that figured out the real challenge comes in handling your cattle.' I'm sorry, sir, what?! Are you kidding me? I thought catching was the hard part... Fast forward

another few years and I'd have to agree. Handling your cattle is the challenge because you are setting your heeler up to catch. If he doesn't catch you stand no chance. I didn't realize the amount of truth that came out of his mouth that day and I've thought about it a lot this summer, it's actually been my main focus.

It's easy to blame your heeler for not catching as to why you didn't win but I know for me personally, most of the time they miss it's because of me. They have to be in such time with the steer in order to catch and a header has everything to do with that. If they drag, did you not get the steer's head up and turned before you started moving him out? Or did you jerk him out of the corner setting

him up causing his back end to lose time with his front, therefore he quits hopping. If you watch a really good header they are so focused on that steer, making sure they pick his head up, turn it, have the rest of his body follow, all while doing it at the same speed. It's like artwork really.

[Handling your cattle is the challenge because you are setting your heeler up to catch. If he doesn't catch you stand no chance.]

It comes down to horsemanship, how well you can ride your horse and handle your horse through the run. My buckskin is really strong, so it takes a lot to get him to rate back after I've thrown. He is a big horse so it doesn't take much to get him to move across the arena, especially if the cattle are smaller. My sorrel, she's really good with cattle. Therefore, when the money is up I'm usually on her because my heelers have a better chance of catching. My goal is to be consistent, to handle my cattle for my heelers, and well to catch first and foremost! 🐾

local calf horse trainer, where his horsemanship made vast improvements.

"We would show up and he would put us on his horses. I might ride a horse once and never get on him again," explains Wes. "He would mount us whenever we needed. He helped us a lot and gave us a chance to practice."


"Riding so many different horses has helped my confidence. If I show up at a rodeo, it doesn't bother me to ride someone else's horse, even if I've never been on him. Last fall my horse got crippled the day before a college rodeo. I got on roommate's horse, that I'd never ridden, and placed."

“**T**hey call me Jet at rodeos, those are my initials. I learned how to write them in kindergarten and asked my mom to enter me as that,” said 14-year-old Jake “Jet” Toberer from Mount Ulla, North Carolina. A bull rider through and through but Jet is also an accomplished chute dogger, breakaway roper, ribbon roper, and team roper, on both the heading and heeling side. “I started riding calves when I was about six and roping when I was seven. Just about every week-end of the year the whole family is on the rodeo road. “It is fun to have them all there to support me and help get ready for the next events.” The family homeschools through Western Classical Academy to have more time for roping and riding. Jet will be a freshman this year and enjoys math the most. “I like to know how numbers work and I would like to be an engineer some day. I might make some roping dummies and sleds to pull behind the four wheeler, engineer the new brand of dummy maybe.” Jet produces his own goat roping events, a precursor to building his own roping series in the future. He aspires to rodeo professionally in the future as well.

There is a tie between team roping and bull riding for Jet’s favorite event. “Team roping is fun because you can do it with

family but I like the adrenaline rush from bull riding.” Three trips to the junior high national finals left him with some tough second go rounds but ultimately good trips. This year his calf horse, Rio, was named the AQHA Reserve Champion Horse of the Year while at nationals. “I was leading the all-around after the first round at nationals because I placed in the top four of the bull riding and goat tying. I had a tough second round but finished 13th in the breakaway roping. This was my third trip to nationals, and it was the best of the three.” Jet also took home third place honors in the talent contest because of his skills on a five-foot-tall unicycle. “My grandparents wanted to get us all something and I asked for a unicycle. I watched videos and taught myself how to ride it. I can rope goats tied to a stake from it but I can juggle on my shorter unicycle.” Jet’s role model is his dad, he admires his work ethic most. “He teaches us that if we work hard we can achieve anything we want.”

Jet has always wanted to go watch the Pendleton Roundup, the grass adds a

degree of difficulty he would like to see and experience in person. Jet originally learned how to rope in the branding pen but got his competitive advice from Gerald Kimber while living in California. “Rio came from Gerald. Rio just runs hard to the calf and scores well, he is a great horse to ride.” Jet’s family frequently visits Gerald in California. Zack spent the summer with him before heading back to college in New Mexico. “My brother told me I could use Rio full-time once he went off to college so it was fun to do that this year. Zack has helped make me into the roper that I am today.”

The highly competitive nature of the JSRA calls for talented horses and riders. “The competition in the JSRA makes me a lot better. I have to work a lot harder to get to finals at the end of the year. Plus, there is a lot to do at all the rodeos.” Jet is thankful for his sponsors at American Hat Company, Pheonix Performance Products and Outlaw Spirit for helping him up and down the rodeo road this year. Jet also wants to put credit where it is due: to God, his family, friends, Jerold Camarillo and Ryan McClure for helping him through each rodeo season, propelling him to the next. 🍷

Meet the Member Gabby Gunter

Lucky for Gabby Gunter from Sulphur, Louisiana, her mom's side of the family is big enough to put on their own rodeo, and that is exactly what they used to do. High Hope Rodeo was started by the Martin family 30 years ago and has continued for more than 40 grandkids. "My whole family lives right around us, they started this for us and it happened every weekend," said the 14-year-old. "It was kind of like our own Little Britches rodeo. Our friends would join us, they would call our names and give us money when we won and everything." Once most of the High Hope Rodeo participants started riding in junior high events, the family could no longer put on the rodeos. Gabby gets to rodeo with two of her four sisters and two brothers: Lexi, 18, Brooklyn, 16, William, 11, Presley, 9, Sianna, 7, and Jessy, 5. "It is fun getting to rodeo with Lexi and Brooklyn. They are always there when I need them. Sometimes it can be aggravating though, since we argue about who gets to ride which horse."

Gabby shares her pole horse, Blaze, with Brooklyn. "I never used to like poles until I got Blaze. I ride her one day and then Brooklyn rides her the next. When you saddle her she knows what she is about to do, she gets excited." Once Presley gets into middle school she plans to use Blaze for poles also. "Last year at nationals I won the first round of poles with a 19.2 but broke the pattern in the second round. The 19.2 holds the record for the fastest time ever ran in poles on the junior high level." A lot of arena records broken in junior high led Gabby to win the 2017

national champion pole bending title and the 2017 reserve champion cowgirl title. "LJHSRA is very competitive, you go out and run a 19.9 and it still might not hold. The people are also great. I am looking forward to high school but I know the competition is going to be a lot harder." Gabby plans to focus on barrels and poles, she used to breakaway and ribbon rope. She looks up to her uncle, Casey Martin, a PRCA bull dogger who has made it to the NFR the past two years. "He is still pursuing his rodeo dreams and he has seven kids. When he is not on the road he works so his kids can have what they want also."

When Gabby is not on the road or practicing for rodeo she likes to play basketball. She played at her middle school and was MVP four years in a row. She will continue basketball at Sulphur High School as a freshman. "I like history and science. Learning about the past and how it effects us today. We used to do all kinds of hands-on stuff in science class so I like that one also." Born and raised in Sulphur, Jessica, Gabby's mom, grew up in

rodeo while Jason, her dad, was a baseball athlete. During the summer, Gabby spends most of her time with her cousins, her "built-in best friends."

Every spring the whole family goes to the Houston Rodeo to watch Casey bull dog. "It is a huge rodeo and we always get dressed up, shop at the trade show and then sit up in one of the boxes and we can eat all sorts of ice cream." Gabby's favorite part of rodeo is the people. "They become life-long friends, they are always there for me. And I get to hang out with them every single weekend." Though she loves rodeo, if Gabby was to do anything else it would be gymnastics. "When I was three, my mom put us all in gymnastics but we had to quit because of rodeo. All my friends used to do it, I would watch them practice and perform. I always wanted to do that but I would not trade rodeo for the world." 🐾

Meet the Member Zeb Corkern

“My favorite part of rodeo is the travel and the people I have met, especially in the LHSRA,” said Zeb Corkern from Zackary, Louisiana, who has made two appearances at nationals, in his eighth grade year and freshman year, making his trip to Gillette, Wyoming, the furthest he has traveled for rodeo.

Zeb now drives a 2016 black Dodge dually down the road as a result of his hard work on the heeling side of team roping. “The high-point roper of the day at Brother-In-Law roping event won the truck. I won a first, fifth, sixth and fourteenth in the number eight roping to do it,” said the 16-year-old. That hot day in Ada, Oklahoma, in 2016 is Zeb’s proud-

est moment in rodeo to date. Zeb went to Walt Woodard’s roping school in Texas in 2012 to polish-up his competitive edge and seek advice from one of his role models. “Both my dad, Jud, and grandpa, Ivan, are team ropers. Grandpa is really good friends with Walt so I figured I should get advice from him on my heeling.”

Zeb has tried his hand at heading simply so he would have the skills on both sides of a steer. “I started out as a heeler but switched to heading and then switched back again. I have just always liked heeling better and my dad is a heeler.” He first learned how to rope and ride from his dad when he was little but lost interest to pursue baseball for five years. “My sisters, Lexi and Taylee, quit rodeo about the same time I did. They started cheerleading and

never quit that but I eventually got back to it.” Some local high school boys wanted to learn how to rope and knew that Zeb used to so they came over to the house and practiced. “I started to rope the dummy everyday with them. I was ten and they were in high school so naturally I wanted to be like them. That is basically how I got back into it and out of baseball.”

Being homeschooled allows Zeb to go to team roping jackpots in the US-TRC and World Series year round. “I try to practice everyday, either roping the dummy or steers. That is my basic mental game for roping, knowing that I am prepared when I go to compete.” Not only did Zeb learn from Jud and Ivan, he also gets to rope with Jud at practice and competitively. “My dad is definitely one of my role models. He has taught me just about everything. He knows how to correct me when I am wrong, especially when I cannot feel the error.” Ivan and Jud go to almost every roping event with Zeb for both the support and the sideline advice. Roping with his dad is great, until one of them misses for the other, making for a long ride home. “What helps me when I am having bad luck is to go back to the basics. I go back to the dummy and slow everything down to figure out what I am doing wrong. I spend those long rides home thinking about fixing things so I am ready for the next steer.”

On the rare occasion Zeb is not roping or traveling, he likes to hunt and fish. “My uncle has a hunting camp up in Mississippi so I go up there during deer season a lot. I go fish for bass with one my friends in a neighbor’s pond quite a bit.” His favorite subject in school is world history, he likes to learn about far away places.

“I plan to go to college and rodeo, probably at McNeese State University. I am not sure what I want to study yet but I will figure it out.” 📧

Meet the Member Nickie Smith

Nickie Smith started competing in the SPRA when the association was formed in 2011, and today, she's the SPRA Breakaway Roping Director. "The main thing is being the spokesperson and voice of the breakaway ropers throughout the year," says the 37-year-old from Athens, Alabama. "At the end of the year, a big responsibility is helping with the sponsorships and promoting the finals, bringing in rodeo support, and making sure our event runs smoothly."

Nickie has competed in the SPRA finals every year but one since joining, and as a rodeo mom, she's passionate about sustaining the sport for future generations. "I'm all about jumping in there and keeping the sport of rodeo going strong. Without people that will step up to the plate, you're not going places. The future of rodeo is our kids, and I enjoy the SPRA and want to see the association stay strong. We as a family can all compete at one location – me in breakaway, my husband in team roping, and my little girl in barrel racing. Over the years, your rodeo family becomes family, and that's the camaraderie I like and want to bring my little girl up around." Nickie also got to know her husband, Sam Smith, through team roping. "The first thing we did was go to a team roping pen and I wrapped some steers and turned him some steers, and I think he was kind of hooked from that point forward!"

She grew up showing horses and competed in all the speed events, and later college rodeoed for East Central Community College in Decatur, Mississippi. After starting nursing school, Nickie sold her barrel horse and focused on team roping instead. A few years later, her daughter, Shadda Claire, was 3, and Nickie's friend Stacy Burney told her about the SPRA, which had just formed. "She invited me to

go to some rodeos, and at the time, I had my two head horses. Stacy mounted me on her breakaway and barrel horse until I could find one, so that's how I got back on the rodeo trail. I was fresh out of college and just starting my career. I felt with roping in general, it's more about horsemanship, along with your ability. I was able to take my talent, along with my horse, and come up with a competitive skill instead of breaking the bank on a horse."

Midget, Nickie's 18-year-old breakaway horse, came from Mr. Steve Chapman in Georgia. "He makes an honest run every time. I've had several opportunities to sell him, but I knew the day would come – as in this year – that my daughter would need a good honest breakaway horse to rope calves on. She'll probably be entering on him in the next couple of weeks." Shadda Claire, 9, competes in the Alabama and Mid-South Little Britches franchises, as well as the SPRA. "When she's home from school, she takes a few minutes to get homework finished and then we head out to the barn. I try to have most everything saddled by the time she gets home," says Nickie. An

RN, she works from home, training staff and nurses to use the medical record system. "Being a nurse helps with knowing how the records are, and bridging the gap on compliance and being able to use the system," she explains.

"My goal as a rodeo mom is to support my little girl and make sure she has all the tools she needs to go as far as she wants with her rodeo career. At this point, if I get out there and make a few rodeos in between my little girl's, then I'd be happy and honored again to go to the SPRA finals. If not, this year my focus as a director is to put on the best possible finals, recognize the breakaway ropers, and get support from the community to make a great finals." 📷

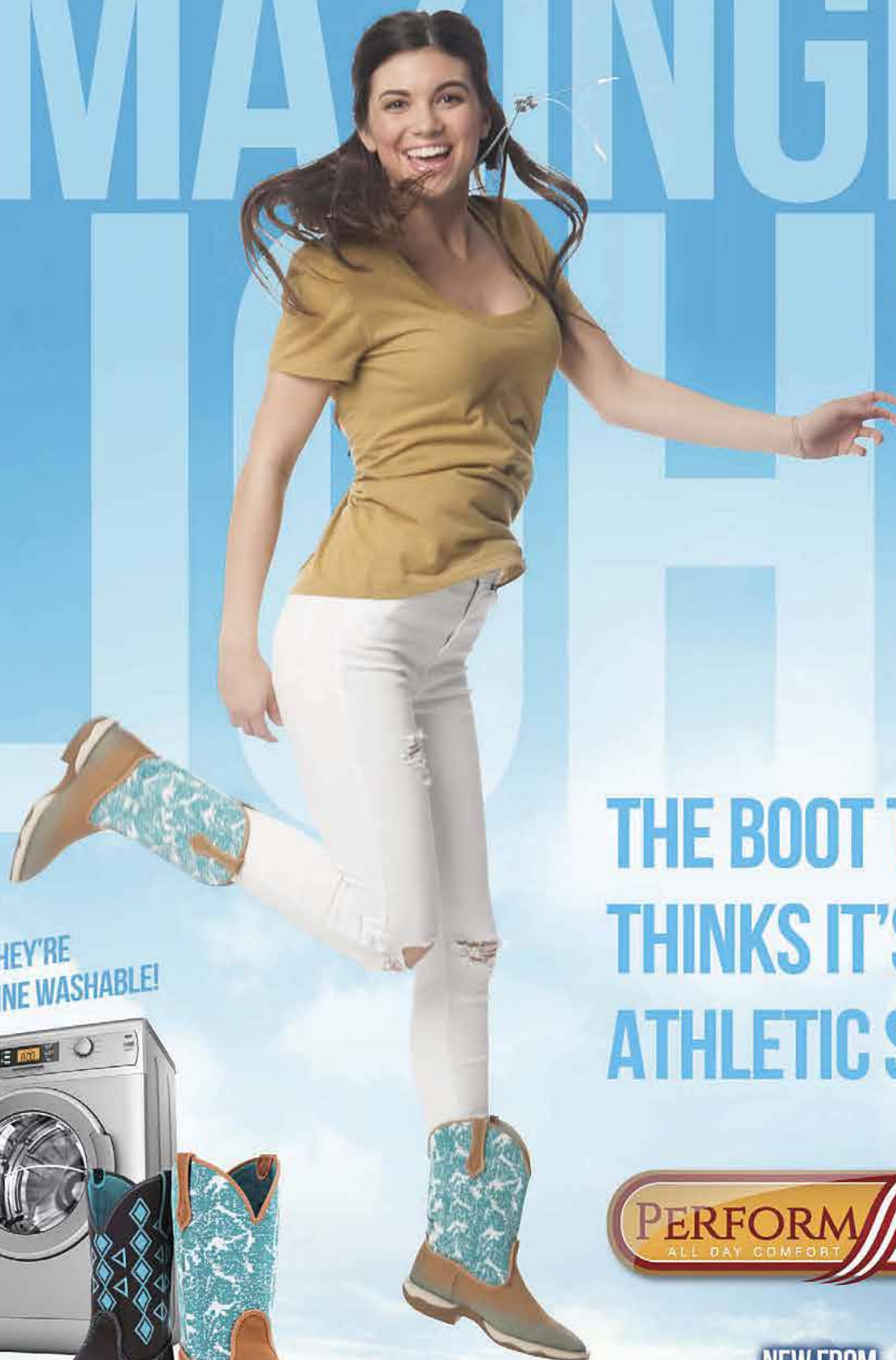

Meet the Member Chelsey Alex

Chelsey Alex credits rodeo and horses with turning her life around. The 23-year-old breakaway and team roper from Watsonstown, Pennsylvania, grew up riding horses at her Uncle Ken's home. After being abused as a child, it was the sport of rodeo that became her focus. "My uncle introduced me to Roger and Lisa Pontius, and they took me in like a daughter and got me into rodeo," says Chelsey. "I did the Keystone Junior Rodeo Association, and I started there when I was 11 and I've been doing rodeo ever since. It was the support system that everybody gave me that I liked, and the friends I made from all over."

Chelsey competed in the KJRA until she turned 18, then joined the APRA. "Going into the APRA and competing against different age groups is incredible. It was me at 18 going against 40 year olds and they were kicking my butt!" she says with a laugh. Currently, she's sitting in the top ten of APRA breakaway ropers. "I'm hoping this will be the first year I make it to the finals. I've been pushing a lot and going to every rodeo I can." Chelsey, a header, ropes with Roger Pontius, and keeps her horses at the Pontius farm just a few miles away. "He's pretty much my uncle. He and I travel everywhere, and I call him Uncle Roger. Breakaway is more my favorite, but only because in team roping, you have five minds to deal with, whereas with breakaway, it's me, my horse, and the calf. It's the adrenaline rush of going out for that two second run."

"My mom and grandmother have definitely inspired me to keep going," Chelsey adds. "I always quit at sports when they weren't going good, but with rodeo, they

really pushed me to do the best I could. Lauren Wagner was a huge coach to me – last summer I didn't catch at all and she kept pushing me and told me the things I did wrong and how to fix them. She was great!" Chelsey's mom and grandmother come to as many of her rodeos as they can, while her boyfriend, Jake, travels with her often. "I call him my good luck charm, because every time he's been with me, we place at every rodeo. He's a big supporter, and he drives while I sleep."

Both of Chelsey's roping horses are in their early twenties, but she says her palomino gelding, Dakota, still has the heart of a 10-year-old. "I don't practice too much on him because he gets too antsy in the box, but when it comes to performances, he can time the barrier out without me kicking him. My head horse, Copper, is blind in one eye, and he's the first horse I owned myself. He knows his job too and puts me right at the tail end of the steer and waits for me to turn him off. He's been blind ever since we had him, but it's the opposite eye from where the steer comes out, so he can still see the steer coming."

Along with rodeoing, Chelsey started a new job this summer as a correctional

officer at a women's facility. She graduated from Bloomsburg University with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and wants to become a counselor. In her spare time, she enjoys hiking at Ricketts Glen State Park, visiting wineries, and running in 5K's. Most recently, she ran for the Wounded Warriors, and she and her boyfriend also like to take his boat out. "I have a 9-year-old head horse I'm trying to get on the road because I want to retire the other one I have now," she finishes. "We also have a 13-year-old I want to become my breakaway horse, so I'm just trying to get some young horses to step up and compete as good as the others." 🐾

Meet the Member Cody Sauls

With baseball being known as America's pastime, the transition to another heritage-driven sport like rodeo was probably familiar territory for Georgia athlete Cody Sauls.

Cody grew up in Villa Rica, Georgia playing baseball since he was 3 years old, a sport he took all the way into competing in college. Also active in football, he developed an athlete's mentality early on.

"Preparation is domination, so you've got to prepare to dominate. You can't just go out there and expect to have good results without putting in any work," Cody says. It's a lesson that bull riding was quick to reinforce for him.

Though Cody came from a rodeo background, his dad was a bull rider up until Cody's early childhood when he quit to focus on his family, and Cody even has early memories of mutton bustin' and riding calves, but school sports quickly took priority. He didn't gravitate back to rodeo until the age of 20 when he went to watch his dad's bulls buck in the practice pen. That's when he got the itch to give it a try. "I was like 'man I'm an athletic guy. It can't be that hard, and it was. It was definitely that hard,'" Cody laughs recalling.

But he was used to training and putting in the effort it takes to succeed in sports, and since he was done playing baseball and football, Cody turned his focus to bull riding. Now 25, his focus is paying off.

Cody came close to qualifying for his first International Finals Rodeo his rookie year, then achieved the goal his second year. He's had some big wins in

well and keeping in shape during the year with a cardio-based training program. He also keeps busy giving baseball lessons and studying in the library as he finishes up his last year at the University of West Georgia.

But as soon as summer hits, Cody is on the rodeo road non-stop. This year he's traveling up north with IFR qualifiers Ross Burney and Cody Brewer. It's aligning with good people that contributes to his success, he says.

the IPRA, including a round win at the Lakeside, California Bulls Only Rodeo and Canadian Cup qualifier wins in Quebec that led to a round win in the Coupe Canada. In addition to making the IFR, his favorite moment was perhaps making the short go in the IPRA's biggest rodeo of the year, Festival Western de St. Tite in Quebec. This season is his third year with the IPRA, and Cody has shot to the top of the world standings with a winning streak over the Fourth of July run.

The difficulty of the sport motivates Cody.

"I'm just a competitor. That's all I've done all my life, win or lose, everything is a competition. [Bull riding] just motivates me to keep bettering myself."

Like any sport, Cody prioritizes eating

"I've always been on a team. All of my sports before have always been team-based, and bull riding is individual, so my biggest hurdle is, I don't like rodeoing by myself, because I feel like if you're going through slumps or down, it's hard for you to pick yourself up. It's easier to have somebody there to encourage you," he says and adds, "I feel like I rodeo better, anybody rodeos better, if they have a team with them."

He credits his traveling partners and his family with their support and will no doubt pass that appreciation for teamwork and dedication to a tough sport like rodeo on in his future plans to become a baseball coach and own his own baseball facility. But first he's after a world title in the arena. 🏆

FRACTURED

Tooele, July 3rd, 9:15 am. Legacy aka Legs just got off a break for two weeks after Reno. He felt amazing warming up and I knew he was ready for a run. We won Tooete's Rocky Mountain Pro Rodeo last year so of course we had that competitive spirit in high gear for this year.

Legacy inhaled the first barrel which for us is not an every day occurrence. Legs likes to roll a stride by that barrel, so when he sat and turned I knew he was feeling great. He was running hard across pen to our second barrel. I lifted him a stride out and was ready for him to sit to turn.

The next moment, we were on the ground. Usually when you fall, you feel a stumble or a trip or some sort of warning. But this fall was not the same for us. I was on the ground, but my hands were still in the same spot I had been preparing for the turn. It happened that fast! One second I was sitting to turn, the next the barrel is by my head.

Being strapped in, I could stay centered on Legs as he got back up. We got ourselves together to exit the arena. The judge asked me, "Are you okay?" I replied, "Does my leg look straight?" He said, "I think so." "Then I am sure I am okay." I reassured him as we walked out.

I have always thought if I broke my femur I would feel it. I have regained sensation to my knees since my accident. Not perfect everywhere, but an improvement from being completely numb from the waist down the day of my wreck. I have also learned that when something does hurt that I cannot feel, I will get a headache and in more severe cases it will make me nauseous.

When I fell around that second barrel I had no pain or headache so I thought I must be okay. I couldn't have been more wrong. By the time I reached down to loosen my cinch, my whole lower leg was covered in blood. We rolled up my pant leg to find a knee that looked like it was in the wrong spot.

Last October, I broke my kneecap hitting a barrel. When the doctor repaired my kneecap he told me that if I shattered it again, he was not sure how he would fix it. So when I saw my knee, I panicked. "My doctor is going to be so mad." I told

my mom, who had come to my side by this time.

We got help getting Legs to walk back to the trailer rather than prance so my leg wouldn't move so much. I was lifted off of Legacy and set into my chair to evaluate how bad my leg really was. There was a steady stream of blood from a hole on the inside of my knee. But still, no pain or headache so I thought it must not be that bad.

I wanted to rope my calf so I thought we could wrap it up and go to the hospital after. Two rolls of vet wrap later, the bleeding wouldn't stop. The argument to rope my calf first was becoming weak. My mom won the battle and once horses were unsaddled, watered, Legacy trotted

and buted; I agreed to load and go.

The first hospital was not quite what we expected. The doctor wanted to stop the bleeding so he decided to sew the holes up. After the x-ray, we found out I had a compound femur fracture.

The doctor didn't change his mind about the stitches though and wanted the hole to stop bleeding. He tried to compression wrap it, but the blood continued through all his attempts. It was truly a blessing that he couldn't succeed.

A higher emergency was coming into the Tooete hospital so the doctor told me that they needed all hands on deck for him. Which was fine, except I continued to bleed consistently. Anytime someone came in, they would just change the pad underneath my leg and leave. Finally, after my mom might have shared some strong words with the staff, they decided I needed to be treated.

I was informed I was a trauma and needed to be taken by ambulance to the

University of Utah hospital. By the time I left Tooele, it was 1 pm. I had been bleeding a consistent stream for 4 hours. My body handles accidents and shock extremely well so I did not feel pain, light headed or any terrible symptoms.

The rodeo world is such an amazing family. I had my mom, horses and trailer taken care of so she could follow me to Salt Lake. Of course during my drive to the University hospital, I called my vet, Dr. Beau Beck from South Valley Equine. I shared with him that I broke my femur, but wanted Legs to be checked.

"Wait, what? You broke your femur? Why are we worried about your horse? How are you?" he exclaimed on the other end of the phone. "I'm fine. Just heading to the hospital." I replied. We worked out the details so Legacy could be taken to him.

When I arrived at the University hospital, I had a team with all hands on deck. When they saw the stitches in my leg, the lead nurse was shocked. "Why is this stitched? You have a compound femur fracture!" she asked. I replied, "The doctor wanted to stop the bleeding." With

anger and concern, she told me, "If he had succeeded in keeping the blood inside, you would have bled internally this whole time. That could have caused you to lose your leg or have killed you!"

By 4 pm, I was able to go into surgery. During the procedure, I needed a blood transfusion from the constant 7 hours of bleeding. Surgery went well and I was kept for observation.

The first day after surgery didn't seem too bad. I could eat and get out of bed for the physical therapist. By that evening, I was starting to get weak. I couldn't keep food down and my headache had set in. During the night, nurses would come in to take my blood pressure and the results started to drop.

The automated system would read in the 70's over the 40's. The nurse would say she couldn't record such low numbers or it would cause too many red flags. They would ask me to sit up or move to take a different reading. When it would come in low again, they began taking my pressure by hand saying the machines were off.

July 5th was rough. The doctor called for another blood transfusion stat at

5am. I no longer could stay awake. I couldn't keep anything down, was constantly nauseous, had a continuous headache and was too weak to get up for more than the restroom.

When coming into the hospital as a trauma, they give you an anonymous name; mine being Trauma Abbey. On July 5th, they decided to move my records over to my real name and somehow lost all my blood information. Due to this mishap, the blood was not delivered until 2pm. By that time my blood count was down to 19; it should be 36. My blood pressure had dropped to 79 over 34.

It is so amazing how much blood can do. I already felt better when one unit was completed. By the second unit, the color had returned to my face and lips were no longer blue. I still couldn't eat, but I could stay awake. We were able to spend one more night and go home on July 6th to begin the healing process. I will share more of the story next issue!!
